Apprenticeship training provides students with the learning they need to become skilled workers while building employment experience and gaining hands-on skills.

Apprentices have the opportunity to earn as they learn, making money while attending school, usually by accessing Employment Insurance (EI) benefits.

Apprenticeship starts by securing a job with an employer who is willing to sponsor you as an apprentice. Once this employment contract begins, apprentices are scheduled for their in-class education at a local Training Delivery Agent (TDA) such as Lambton College. This happens about a year after they begin working. Attending in-class training is part of certification and Lambton College makes your classroom experience worthwhile.

Still exploring the trades or having difficulty securing an apprenticeship position? Several of our full-time programs are designed to prepare you for an apprenticeship and to make you a better candidate for employment in a skilled trade. Earn a college credential while you prepare for your next step. Graduates of our preparatory programs may have more success in finding employers, contractors, or trade unions willing to register them as apprentices, and many have greater success applying their skills on job sites having already gained valuable hands-on experiences.


