World Press for 'Lies, Slander'

BERLIN, July 10 .- A vigorous campaign against the Jews is now under way in the Nazi press. The Jews of the country, and particularly Jewish refu-gees abroad are indicted as responsible for most of Germany's present troubles, including cir-culation of "horror stories" in the press of the world.

Almost without exception, Nazi newspapers in Berlin and other centers are devoting much space to vigorous attacks on the Jews for spreading throughout the world false reports of what

is happening in Germany.

An earlier drive saw welllaunched the charge that the Jews
were behind the storm troop revolt and were therefore responsible for the drastic actions taken by

for the drastic actions taken by the Hitler regime against its for-mer trusted lieutenants. Propagand Minister Goebbels, in a broadcast tonight, denounced the world press for its "lies, alan-der, and misrepresentation of the true factas." He did not, however, accuss the Jews directly as do the German newspapers with the approval of the Goebbels censor-

The unceasing attacks on the Jews now featured in the press are creating much concern among the Jewish population which is sadly aware of what repercussions may be expected.

Fascist Threat In United States

Blind Appeal to Prejudice May Find Success, Says Professor

Speaking before the Teachers' College branch of the League Against War and Fascism at the Horace Mann Auditorium yesterday, Professor George S. Counts declared that this country seethes with racial, religious and sectarian prejudices, and that any movement, prejudices, and that any intovenient, such as Fascism, if properly led, could succeed by making a blind appeal to the deep-seated preju-dices of Americans, just as the Ku Klux Klan did after the Civil War.

Fascism, he said, is one of the most powerful movements in recent years. The movement has a different appeal here than it has in Italy or Germany, he added.

"The racial question will have complete ramifications here not found in Europe," he stated. "The attack will be on Jews, Negroes and recent immigrants.

"In Germany, the attack upon the Jews was motivated in part by economic considerations. Many of the Jews held jobs. Some of these were wanted badly by members of the new group."

The liquidation of the Nara or ganization became necessary, Pol-ish officials declared, owing to the frequent street conflicts engineered by the anti-Semitic group; con-tinual violation of the Polish penal code, and their spreading of race hatred and anti-government feel-

The Nara organization has been under fire from the Pilsudski regime for some time. Numerous arrests of Naras have been made all over Poland and a number of Nara leaders sent to the concen-tration camp at Baraza Kartuska Sztafeta, Warsaw daily organ of the Naras, was suppressed two weeks ago and the editor, Sigmunt Dziarmaga is a prisoner, while the editor-in-chief and supreme leader of the Nara organization, Jan Mos-dorf, supposed to be the grandson of a converted Jew, has fled Poland.

Headquarters Closed

The headquarters of the virulent anti - Semitic, anti - government anti - Semitic, anti - government party were closed by government officials immediately after the murder of the Polish Minister of the Interior, Colonel Bronislaw Pieracki, supposedly by a Nara

Minister of Justice Michalowski announced to the press today that the murderer of the Colonel Pierthe murderer of the Colonel Pier-acki fied from Poland and that although his three accomplices, Ukrainians, were caught, there is no hope of arresting the actual

killer. The Nara organization was founded on April 14, 1934, by the militant youth wing of the anti-Semitic National Democrat political party, known from the party initials as Endeks. The Nara group felt that the Endek party was not sufficiently anti-Semitic. They adopted a program based on Hitlerism calling for the "immedi-ate elimination of Jews from Polish citizens and from all phases of Polish professional life."

From its very inception the Nara party entered on a campaign of terror and hooliganism against the Jews of Poland. Mass attacks were carried out by Nara bands against Jews in every part of the country. Nara tactics culminated in mass attacks on Jews, which began about May 1. On May 3, a number of young Jews were injured when Nara hooligans armed jured when Nara hooligans armed ambushed a group of young Jews, attackling them with knives. On May 7, thirty-four Jews in various parts of Poland were badly parts of Poland were badly wounded in a series of attacks carried out according to an or-ganized plan by Nara bands. The worst excesses occurred in Bialy-stok, where the Jews fought the

Streets Unsafe for Jews

Owing to Nara attacks it be-Owing to Nara attacks it be-came virtually impossible for Jews to walk the streets of Polish towns after nightfall unless they did so in large groups. Jewish shops were repeatedly attacked and looted. Even the government admitted that the Naras were recruiting the criminal elements of Polish population in their

Polish Jews formed self-defense organizations all over Poland to fight the Nara menace. Polish Socialist groups cooperated with the Jews in beating off Nara attacks

to combat the growing Nara hoold-ganism. Nara leaders were arrested in large numbers, their press was suppressed and it became a Scot Paper Points Out foregone conclusion that the party itself would be outlawed. Rumors of the outlawing of the Naras have been current in Poland for weeks.

Ancient Jews

Scot Paper Points Out Similarity of Names as 'Proof'

(J.T.A. Special Correspon EDINBURGH, June 30.—A the-ory has been advanced here in the Evening News to the effect that Gaelic was the language of the ancient Jews in Palestine.

"It is rather remarkable." says the News article, "that through-out the Old and New Testament the language of the Jews is never once mentioned. The prophet Isaiah alone gives an indication when he states that the Jews spoke the language of Canaan (Isaiah ix, 18), and the question then arises as to what the language was spoken by the Canaanites?" The author goes on to show the

similarity between place-names Palestine and Gaelic terms. " was king of the Amorites, and Endrei was his capital in Bashan. We are told by Josephus, the Jewish historian, that this town was also called Andrei. In Scotland at the present day either of these words may be used to indicate 'cattle king,' a strong proof that the lan-guage of the Scots and the Amorites were the same.'

The article further states that "from the dawn of history the River Jordan has been known by its Gaelic name, Ard-Ban-Eas meaning the high, white waterfall or torrent. Lebanon in the Gaelic means the white solitude; Tiberias-the well at the waterfall.'

The article further points out that "Isaiah provides another pow-erful argument in favor of this contention: Let it be borne in mind that all the nations speaking a dialect of the Semitic language, such as Syriac, Hebrew, Aramic, Arabic, and several others, could, without difficulty, hold a conver-sation with each other, yet when Rabshakeh, the Assyrian general, was offering terms of surrender to the Jews, the Jewish officers made the following request: Speak, I pray thee, unto thy servants in the Syrian language, for we understand it, and speak not unto us in the Jew's language in the ears of the people that are on the

greater harm than even some of the otherwise objectionable The film producers, Jews or

non-Jews, are chiefly interested in their productions not from an educational viewpoint, but from educational viewpoint, but from the standpoint of financial profit, As I pointed out before, al-though the artistic standard of some of the latest films has been raised, there are many films that distort life and overemphasize the sensual and criminal for box

office purposes.

While a way should be found to curb the money-making tendencies of the producers of im-moral and indecent films, it is well to remember that censorship, church censorship or any other kind of censorship, is one of the most dangerous weapons in a democracy. There is no in a democracy. There is no telling where such censorship may end once it is established. The greatest literary master-pieces, the finest plays, the most important books, may come un-der the ban of over-zealous or ill-informed censorship, however well-intentioned it may be.

This proposed censorship may also have the effect of drawing special attention to the objectionable films and thus making them even more attractive to the public, as forbidden fruit. It is more important to

It is more important to organize a campaign of education in order that the public may become its own censor. That is the only safe and sane censorship in a democracy.

Old Age Pensions and American Jews

Throughout the civilized world, with few exceptions, old age pensions for the needy aged, by the State, have been in force for many years. In the United States, however, this modern approach



to the problem was, until a few years ago, combatted as a socialistic importation from Germany. However, confronted by appalling sta-tistics on dependency, notwithstanding our boast-ed prosperity, Nevada, Montana and Pennsyl-vania enacted old age pension laws in 1923, with

Jest year. Over 100,000 di per lage, citimenship or residence relast year. Over 100,000 old persons in America are now receiving old age pensions of from \$20 to \$30 a month. In 1930 there were but 4,000. This will give some indication of the rapid spread of the

To what extent will the rapid enactment and enforcement of the old age pension laws affect the Jews among the poor aged and the Jewish institutions caring for the aged?

Who Is Eligible for a Pension? To be eligible, one must be a citizen of the United States. Most states require that applicants shall have been citizens for long periods of time ranging from ten to twenty years. Although the Jewish immigration in the past decade was not considerable (some 85,000) this provision will exclude a great many Jews, whose naturalization has been delayed, from receiving a

A parallel requirement is that of A parallel requirement is that of residence. For instance, an appli-cant must be a resident of New York State for ten years to be eligible. Most states require fifteen years, Massachusetts requires twenty years. All the populous states, which have thus far adstates, which have thus far acopted pension laws (New York,
California, New Jersey, etc.) have
established seventy as the pensionable age. The less populous states
have fixed sixty-five. The large
group of aged between sixty-five and seventy are, therefore, incligible for a pension. If faced with dependency, they would be forced to seek help either in a welfare agency or in a home for the aged.

Effects on the Jewish Homes

Practically all old age pension Practically all old age pension acts definitely declare immates of public institutions, such as poorhouses and county homes, and or private homes for the aged, as ineligible for state pensions. Of course, this provision was adopted in order to limit the number of ngioners

Unfortunately, in New York City, with the exception of a few Jewish institutional heads, the superintendents of over eighty private homes were opposed to the state granting pensions to their inmates. Although almost all Jewish homes are facing grave financial difficulties, many non-Jewish homes apnes, many non-lewish nomes apparently were not in need of this additional money. As a rule, they have built up large endowment

The fundamental reason for the opposition is the unwillingness of the institutional heads to have the state interfere in their manage-ment. This i san erroneous view: ment. This is an erroneous view, a home for the aged is not a private affair any more than an orphan asylum is a private affair.

As things stand now, the great majority of the Jewish aged are

anyhow prevented from being provided for in the way of state pensions. Many persons, who are too aid to work and must be excluded by the present laws because of July 29.

by the establishing of old age pen-sion laws. It will probably take five to ten years before their effects are at all noticeable on the functions of our homes.

Experiences in New York

The laws, as they now stand, will for the next few years leave the Jewish homes for the aged in the position they have been previous to the enactment of such

legislation.
One of the large homes in New York has found, on the basis of first five months' experience, that there has ben no noticeable decrease in the number of appli-cations for admission, and only three inmates left voluntarily to qualify for a pension. They were actuated by a desire to live with actuated by a desire to five with their children, who formerly had been unable to provide for them. One of the large homes in Brooklyn finds that it has not been

affected to any extent by the pen-sion laws. In only one case of the 120 on the waiting list was there preference shown for a pension. In two cases, children of inmates made applications for pensions for their parents now in the institution.

A large institution in California a year and a half after the pas-sage of the pension act finds the demands upon it as heavy as ever. Thus with the completely neg-

ligible effects of state old age re-lief upon Jewish homes, and with the type of Jews (of strictly or-thodox religious observances) who make up the homes' populations, there need be no relation between the state law and the part played by these institutions in American Jewish life. The need for homes will in no way be diminished.

Outlook for the Future

The preference of the orthodox Jew for the home, as compared with private care in a boarding house, is well justified. With the gradual passing of the present generation, however, there will come a change in the attitude on this question. To the second generation the advantages of life in an orthodox home for the aged will not matter much. Then a decided preference for a pension will probably manifest itself. Accordingly, ablebodied aged persons will properly be taken care of in private homes, with relatives or strangers, with the aid of a state pension

One no longer hears this talk. Hitler's revolution has become bloody, and his supporters in this bloody, and his supporters in this country are wondering not only how bloody it has become, but how bloody it will be in the future. Hitler's early assertion that "Heads will roll!" has become a stark and unwholesome reality. They have rolled in the manner described by Nazis as attending a Communist revolution.

There has been a decided flag-ging of Nazi enthusiasm. But this can not be attributed directly to events in Germany. Perhaps the most important factor in the demost important factor in the de-cline of spirit in Nazi ranks here is the sweltering weather, which has discouraged attendance at meetings and other exercises that be considered strenuous with the mercury up to ninety. Open air features, such as the Friends of New Germany picnic on Long Island one week ago, are as

attractive as ever.
Support of the DAWA, antiJewish boycott organization, is also diminishing somewhat. A num-

ber of Yorkville merchants have quietly taken the DAWA signs from their windows. They give as their reason their desire to live at peace with neighboring Jewish and liberal merchants. New DAWA subscribers, however, have stepped into the ranks. He had leaped over-night from the chasm of obscurity to a position of public importance.

According to Christians, while Higgins is "economically positive," he is "psychologically negative." Authorities later attempted to blame "Communistic elements" for the affair, but it was shown that the soldiers made an unprovoked attack on the beach crowd, which included many foreigners, as well as a number of Americans.

Cuban Soldiers Bucharest Jews Help Children Fire at Bathers. In Scientific Choice of Vocation Medico Fired Rites for Bialik

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) BUCHAREST, June 25.—Before the war, finding a decently paid calling for our young people was not a difficult matter.

Since the war, this has been completely changed. The countries completely changed. The countries have isolated themselves from each other. The United States of America, land of liberty, was one of the first to issue rigid, incisive immigration regulations. The world econo

orld economic crisis did the rest. As a result the post war generation finds itself before locked portals. In their own country young people find prospects of earning a livelihood slight, while abroad the only country which seems able to absorb Jewish youth is Palestine. It is therefore easy to understand It is therefore easy to uncerstand the terrible disappointment which England's immigration policy is to these youths. To meet this situ-ation labor and professional bureaus have been created every-where to regulate the stream of where to regulate the stream those seeking work

Five years ago, the Union Five years ago, the Union of Rumanian Jews, recognizing the difficult circumstances of the younger generation, created a bu-reau for vocational consultation in Bucharest, calling it the "Institute for Professional Orientation" The bureau serves the Jewish population primarily, but is open to all To the Jewish masses this bureau here in Rumania fills a definite

need, for the Jewish population need, for the Jewish population lacks that asylum open to the Christian population: the land. Few Jewish Farmers Except for Bessarabla, where the ORT has founded successful Jewish settlements, Jews are not active in agriculture anywhere in Rumania; they are not permitted to be active and should not be. Because agriculture did not absorb any Jews there was the unwhole-some rush for higher education, after the war. But after intensive

warning and explanation this rush ems now to be subsiding slowly. What callings are left? Artisans traders, manufacturers, employes of stores, technical workers—the choice is restricted so that what the Institute most deplores is the case: its work is largely a matter of making decisions in the nega-tive. It is much more likely to decide what fields are not open than it is actually to suggest a vocation to an applicant.

The Institute serves the children of the schools maintained by the Jewish community first of all and systematically. In accordance with an understanding with the com-munity, 350 children are examined annually by vocational physicians who test the general physical state of the youngsters and their special physical aptitudes. Intelligence physical aptitudes. Intelligence tests are also given the boys and girls by trained experimental psychologists and give a very telling picture of the individual tendies of each child.

A comparison of the occupations of parents and those of their children, based on data obtained from 700 children, is very enlight-ening. It shows a definite trend towards the free professions which are socially of higher value Whereas, for example, forty-two per cent of the parents are artisans, eleven per cent of the boys and nine per cent of the girls go into the same field; and whereas but two per cent of the parents are in the free professions, twentyone per cent of the boys and twelve per cent of the girls choose callings in that category.

Of the 700 children tested

thirty-five per cent grew up in a single room housing parents and children; forty-five per cent slept two in a hed about fifteen cent, three in a bed; and about five per cent, four in a bed. About twenty-six per cent of the children already had contracted three serious contagious diseases, such as measles, scarlet fever and diph-

theria.

Eve-witnesses have brought distressing accounts of the intolerable condition of the Jewish community at Kabul and the other sixty towns in which they are concentrated. Their numbers have decreased from about 40,000 at the outset of the twentieth century to 5,000 at present. Their nearest refuge is Persia, but some have wended their way to Palestine, in which a few dozen families have settled in the past year.

Vandals Desecrate Reiser's Tombstone In Hamburg Cemetery

In addition Reisser once held the position of judge in Hamburg, his birthplace. He died there in 1863

The caretaker and gardener of the cemetery have frequently com-plained that they were being molested while at work in the ceme tery, that insults were hurled at them and stones thrown, and that they had been threatened with beatings.

victory was scored here today for the Jewish and partly Jewish officials dismissed from posts in Up-per Silesia by the Nazi regime when the German government, without awaiting the verdict of the Upper Silesian Mixed Commission of the League of Nations, sitting here, informed Dr. M. Perl of Beuthen, Upper Silesia, that he could return to his post.

Dr. Perl, who is a Christian, al-though descended from Jews, was dismissed from his post as head of the hospital at Beuthen when the Nazis assumed power. His case, as well as that of a number of other Jews and descendants of Jews, was placed before the Mixed Commission as constituting direct violations of Germany's agreement to protect minority groups in Up-per Silesia. Apparently anticipatper Silesia. Apparently anticipat-ing that Dr. Perl's petition would be upheld, the German government assented to his return.

In every case that has so far come before the Mixed Commission the Nazi regime has been forced to make restitution to German Jews dismissed under the terms of the "Aryan clause."

Herr Hitler should feel thunder hippodrome. Hitler and his stooges are becoming as tiresome a subject to write about as it must be for The Bulletin customers to read about.

Anyway, Hitler's far away — somewhere in a cozy little hide-away in the Bavarian Alps which may or may not become his St. Helena—and Westbrook Pegler is much nearer.

Pegler, in the event The Bulletin clientele is unaware, is a hardbitten young newspaperman, who under the title "Fair Enough," writes a daily column for the New York World-Telegram.

We're bringing him into the Day Book because of all columnists plying their trade in this metropolis he has given us the greatest amount of gripe. The most recent attack of that malady we suffered 3the hands of "Fair Enough" Pegler is his column in the Friday, July 6, issue in which he reverts to a favorite subject—the mental and moral gymnastics of the clan lawyer.

Before proceeding further with what may develop into a nasty nip at Peggy, let it be said that his attitude, if he has one, toward Jews does not enter into the matter. We don't know and don't care whether he loves Jews, hates them, or can take them or leave them As a matter of fact, most news-papermen are free of racial bias and we doubt if Pegler is an ex-

Peggy's column uses as a springboard Clarence Darrow and his re-cent denunciation of Hitler's "purging" as murder, for which the Nazi leader ought to be punished by death.

"It must be a great blow to Adolf Hitler to hear that Clarence Darrow has denounced his purging process in Germany as murder," the columnist writes. "Coming from Mr. Darrow, 'murder' is a nasty word. And when he also said he thought Herr Hitler ought to be dead he must have been churned the depths of his remarkably tolerant soul. After all this time it is something to learn from Mr. Darrow that there is such a thing as murder and that murderers de erve to die."

Following this Peggy identifies Darrow as the attorney "who enabled two of the most distinguished assassins of our time in the United States to get away with a mis-chievous juvenile prank which to many other persons had some of the aspects of willful murder."

Pegler's plentiful store of irony is loosed on Darrow's venerable head because he successfully de-Leopold and Loeb in the sensational Bobby Franks murder case in Chicago. Successfully, that is, to the extent that Darrow's brilliant defense enabled his cli-ents to escape the death penalty demanded by the state and suffer instead, life imprisonment.

What Pegler is barking about is What Pegler is barking about is that Darrow, who helped to defeat the ends of justice by finding legal loopholes to poke his clients into, is the wrong person to rear up and shout "murderer" and demand the death penalty for any one else. He is surprised — academically speaking — that the Darrow who found it in his heart to be tolerant about the Franks boy's confessed murderers should be so intolerant about Herr Hitler.

"To be denounced as a murdere "To be denounced as a murreerer and recommended for death by Mr. Parrow is a fate," Pegler writes, "which is as bad as death itself. To be placed beyond the generous sion of the man wh ened the American respect for law and the sanctity of human life by enabling Leopold and Loeb to get away with the most frightful mur-

> This ironic shaft is meant to imply that Darrow is a hypocrite. imply that Darrow is a nypocrue. Because he played an important (and well-paid) role in saving the necks of the murderers Leopold and Loeb, and now declares that Hitler should be erased for his murders, Darrow is not playing milest in Daclarie area. cricket in Pegler's eyes.

This attitude of Pegler toward Darrow would be unimportant, but it happens that the journalist's opinion of the legal profession as a whole is considerably less than low. They're a lot of nasty men who get paid for shooting the law of the land full of loopholes for ratty criminals to escape through. This is an opinion that is held by others than Pegler. That there is some excuse for this opinion cannot be doubted. Lawyers, particu-larly the criminal specialists, do go in for hair-splitting in their go in for hair-splitting in their efforts to earn their bread and butter and yachts. But whether these hair-splitting activities makes them deserving of the opprobrium heaped upon them by Pegler who if he were unfortunate enough to get caught in the coils of the law himself would probably move heaven and earth to get a lawyer who knew his loopholes is another

Pegler's attitude, if placed in the light of reason, shows up rather frayed. He rebukes Darrow for his defense of the Franks' murderers. It enabled the murderers to get away with murder and thus set an example for Chicago gangsters. Disrespect for law has grown apace since that epochal trial. With this disrespect, Pegler more than strongly implies, Darrow has played a big role.

But the writer says nothing about the judge who was present at the trial, other than that he was dazzled by Darrow into a fa-vorable verdict. Nor does he men-tion the jury. Neither does he mention the fact of the law itself. With his worldly wisdom, he should know that a law is no better than its loopholes. But judge, jury and law are disregarded by Peggy, who blithely insists that since justice, as he sees it, was not done in that as he sees it, was not done in that case, then the lawyer for the de-fendant is the one to pounce upon. Making the law loophole-proof doesn't suggest itself as a solution to this brilliant young newspaper-man. That's too tedious a matter. The law's okay. but down with the lawyer, since he's bent on exposing weakness (to his own profit) that's a much more dramatic and popular way of obtaining respect for the law.

The Pegler lack of logic is apparent also in another branch of his treatise. What possible connection there is between Darrow the lawyer, practicing his profession and pleading the cause of humanitarianism in an attempt to save the lives of clients who are confessed murderers, and Darrow the private citizen who raises his voice against mass murder, is not very clear. It is the law of this country that even a murderer is entitled to the best legal assistance obtainable. Because his clients afforded the Darrow fee and retained him would Pegler have had Darrow lay down on his job and help the prosdown on any no and nep the pros-ecution, send the accused to the chair? Would that have been playing cricket? And if Darrow did that would he be any more entitled to call Hitler a murderer deserving of death?

Pegler is casting aspersions on e sincerity of Darrow's humanitarianism. We maintain that Pegler is not qualified to judge.

In April, 1922, the Boston sporting pages headlined the fact that "A Schoolboy Jumper Startles Har-vard," with the following story appended:

'Harvard's varsity track letes stopped work yesterday after-noon at Soldier's Field to watch the broad jumping of a youth from the High School of Commerce, Dave White by name, who cer-tainly established himself as a tainly established himse 'schoolboy Ned Gourdin.'

"For the high school youth went out and broad jumped twenty-three feet, more than a foot and a half further than any man on the Har-vard squad can leap."

Exactly ten years after this story appeared, in April, 1982, an older and more experienced athlete jumped to a first place in the in-ternational Maccabiad at Tel Aviv. ternational Maccanad at Tel Aviv.
It would be thrilling to relate that
it was White's magnificent leap
that won for the Jewish-American
athletes in Palestine but such was not the case. The points that the track and field team amassed as a result of White's running broad jump helped roll up the tremendous score which the Jewish boys from the States garnered in interna-tional competition. However, it was fitting that this young man, as captain and manager of the entire American contingent, should take American contingent, should take a first place in his last active com-petitive event. It was a glowing tribute to his personality, leader-ship and athletic ability that the American team took a first place in the track and field events and a second in the final scoring among the nations of the World Maccabiad.

Enjoyed Brilliant

Athletic Career
We have written much on the
Maccabi movement in America but maccash movement in America on the hardest worker in the movement. We really didn't know very much about the athletic career of Dave White because he has been out of school for some time. Then again, White isn't the sort of chap to talk about his athletic achievemens. While we were wait-ing for a meeting of the executive council of the Maccabi to begin, we rummaged through the desk in we rummaged the deast in his office. In a bottom drawer we found his scrapbook, the sort of thing that every athlete keeps. However, this ran true to form, merely initing at the athletic achievements of White from 1917 *1.1020. Notarithetanding we manto 1930. Notwithstanding, we managed to glean some of the more important facts about the "man behind the Maccabi."

White earned recognition as a schoolboy jumper in the High School of Commerce but it wasn't until he entered Mercersburg Academy in Pennsylvania that he revealed his best form. In the two years that he prepped at the acad-emy, prior to entering Harvard emy, prior to entering Harvard University, he scored victory after victory and earned an enviable reputation as an athlete in the his-

reputation as an attack in the his-toric Quaker institution.

Mercersburg won the national scholastic track and field championships in 1924 and White helped the school win with his first place in the broad jump.

Upon his graduation from this school he was bewildered by the

nany offers that were made to him by several of the leading colleges in the East. He accepted the bid of Harvard in 1925 for a number of reasons, among which was the fact that he wanted to be under the track tutelage of Farrell, the Harvard athletic mentor. It wasn't long before he was known as top-notcher in intercollegiate mircles.

Greatest Athletic Success In Palestine

In Palestine

young man and finally got him
talking on the first Maccabiad

"Nothing ever gave me a greater thrill," he said, "than to watch the thousands upon thousands of Jewish youngsters from all over the world marching in the grand parade in their white uniforms through the streets of Tel Aviv, before the international games. It was an awe-inspiring spectacle and made me proud of the fact that I am a Jew and a Maccabi member

"When the American team, in its special uniforms, paraded in the stadium with the teams from thirty-three other countries I felt a spirit of kinship surge through me that left me breathless. Then again, the fact that I was able to win my event in the broad jump against the best Jewish athletes of the world made the trip a success

the world made the trip a success for me.

"The entire team had a grand time in Palestine. We toured Eu-rope and took in the Bar Kochba in Berlin and the famous Hakoah unit in Vienna. Yet if I can convey partially the feelings that possessed me in Palestine two years ago, the Jewish youth of the United States would rally 'round the Maccabi banner

When asked what he considered the greatest athletic success in career, he immediately replied, "The fact that I was able to participate with the American Maccabi team at Tel Aviv to me is and will be my greatest athletic enter-prise and victory."

A Hard Worker

When the United States team returned to America in the sum-mer of 1932 with such a splendid record behind it, the administra-tive board of the Maccabi determined that the time was ripe for a concerted drive for membership. However, due to one thing or another, nothing was done until the beginning of this year. It was then that Dave White was appointed executive director of the American association. Not long after he had taken this post the organization received its official charter. Since then the record of the Maccabis has been a splendid one and the credit is due to the personality, the energy and the executive abil-

ity of the man at the helm.

Plans for the second Maccabiad in 1935 at Tel Aviv have been way for some time. On this trip the American group will be composed of a team of twenty-five men and women representing track and field, swimming, boxing, tennis

and read, swimming, soxing, tennis and wrestling. The trip will be open only to Maccabi members.

Already there are Maccabi groups in many of the principal cities of the country, with requests for charter memberships rouring for chapter memberships pouring in from various sectors of the country.



A few initial skirmishes with Congressman John W. McCor-mack of Massachusetts, who is presiding, deflated him, however, until one or two spasmodic kicks on the part of the Nazi-paid magazine writer were all that re-

mained of his antagonistic spirit.
Placed on the witness stand and asked to swear an oath that he would tell 'the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth," he refused. He did agree, how-ever, to make an unsworn statement to the same effect, and Mc-Cormack consented to allow him to testify on that condition.

to testify on that condition.

He readily admitted many facts concerning his connection as a mercenary in the employ of the Hitler web. Most of what was brought out during his testimony at yesterday's hearing aiready had been discloseed at hearings in Washington last month.

He corroborated evidence which

the committee had previously un-covered that he had received \$500 a month from Otto Kiep, former Nazi consul general here, as a re-tainer for advice on German

American relations.

Admits Cash Payments He said he had been under con

tract on these terms for four or five months, and while he had not entered money received for these efforts in a cash book, he had included mention of it in his income tax returns, he declared.

Viereck further admitted that he had received payment for these

services in cash.

Testimony in Washington last month indicated that the writer had received \$1,750 a month in salary from Carl Byoir & Associates, Nazi-paid publicity firm whose head is a Jew, and that he also had been given money to asso had been given money to cover the expenses of hiring a secretary and renting an office. This payment was in return for favorable publicity he presumably would be able to obtain for the Hitler regime. Viereck yesterday admitted that

he had been instrumental in pro-curing for the Byoir firm the contract to publicize German rail-ways and to do press relations and circular work for the German Tourist Agency.

McCormack Rebukes Attorney Langley, the writer's attorney, made persistent attempts to read a prepared statement before the committee. He finally incurred the rebuke of McCormack, who told the lawyer he was present only by virtue of the investigation body's

good nature.

Viereck testified that he was born in Munich in 1896. His father and grandfather, he said His were American citizens. This statement conflicted with what he had said in an interview with newspaper men on June 7. This interview was read into the record in its entirety.

McCormack took issue

Viereck over one statement the writer had made in this interview, as reported by the newpapers. The Naz. apologist had been quoted as saying, "If it is right for Russians to hire Mr. Ivy Lee, why is it wrong for German railways to hire Mr. Carl Byoir?"

The Congressman asked Viereck whether he had definite knowledge that Lee represented the So-viet government in this country. a number of false starts which caused McCormack to call him sharply to order. Viereck finally admitted his "knowledge" was purely a matter of hearsay.

This confession brought forth a stern rebuke from McCormack.

He had received payment for his services in cash, he said, be-cause he feared "the Jewish es-pionage system in Bolshevist banks," which he professed himself as believing is worldwide in

He told a touching story of his meetings with Hitler in 1926, and particularized about a conversation he had had with Der Fueh-rer at a German seaside resort in September of that year.

"When I pointed to a sign reading, 'Jews do not bathe here," Viereck said, "he (Hitler) replied that the sign was unauthorized. Herr Hitler then turned to me and asked whether it was not true that Jews were excluded from certain beaches in the United States

"Much to my humiliation I was forced to tell him that this was true. He later said that he did not persecute the Jews, but that the Jews persecuted him. Such Jews as were not opposed to the Nazi regime would not be troubled," he declared.

'Friend to Germany

He had refused to recommend Ivy Lee for the job of publicizing the German railways, the Hitler hireling explained, because he had been under the impression that Lee was in the employ of the So-

viet government.

He described himself as a per son who always has been a friend to Germany—first to the old Ger-man monarchy, later to the Ger-man republic and now to the New Germany.

He admitted he had aided Byoir in putting out economic bulletins designed to better Germany's trade relations with the world and to increase tourist travel in the

After Viereck left the stand After Viereck left the stand, Victor Ridder, one of the publish-ers of the Staats-Zeitung, was called to the stand. Ridder briefly reviewed the Nazi capture of the German societies in New York and particularly of the United German Societies, which he said were taken over by Nazis last fall, when the Jews were ousted.

He described a visit to his of-fice by Heinz Spanknoebel, former Nazi kingpin in the United States, who he declared had pre-This contession orought torth a States, who he declared had present rebuilder from McCormans.

Hang Reveals Methods

Werner Haag, who is not an American citizen, described his relations with Spanknoebel while relations with Spankhoeber white the latter was organizing and run-ning Das Neue Deutschland, pre-decessor to the Deutsche Zeitung, Nazi organ in this country.

He and Heinz Spanknoebel, he explained, were successful in persuading the Hamburg American and North German Lloyd Lines and the German railways to contribute \$800 monthly toward the newspaper for "advertising." Contracts for this advertising

contained no specifications as to lineage, Haag admitted.

At the time, he said, the flour-ishing little sheet was read by sev-eral persons. In fact, it had a total circulation of 400.

When Spanknoebel fled to Ger many, Dås Neue Deutschland was sold to its successor, the Deutsche Zeitung, for the somewhat exor-bitant price of \$1.

Fears Reprisals on Family Haag was with Spanknoebel when he made his intimidation skirmish into the Ridder offices,

which ended in Spanknochel's exit. Haag was followed on the stand by Walter II. Schellenberg, who told the committee that he had first come to this country in 1919, and that he had since returned to the Reich three times.

The last time he was in Germany, he said, he had drawn \$4,500 in five months from Robert C. Mayer & Co., Inc., a banking firm with offices in New York City, which he said employed him. Schellenberg testified that he

had aided Fritz Gissibl in organizing and promoting the Friends of New Germany. During his most recent trip to the Reich, he declared, he had discussed the "Friends" and its predecessor, the National Socialist Party in this country, with Rudolf Hess, Hitler's present minister without portfolio, and Wilhelm Bohle, head of the Nazi Foreign Department.

Saw S. A. Men on Ship Beatrice B. Beecher, a grand-daughter of Henry Ward Beecher, Civil War abolitionist, told the committee she had met Spanknoebel at former Consul General Kiep's home in New Jersey in company with Col. Edwin Emerson. They had advised her to go to

Germany to observe conditions there with her own eyes, she said. When she went aboard the S. S. Resolute of the Hamburg Ameri-can Line, she testified, she saw no less than 100 storm troops in uniform

uniform

In response to accusations made by George Sylvester Viereck during the noon recess stating that he considered the Jewish Daily Bulletin and the Philadelphia Re-cord as having gained access to records of the private hearings of the committee, Congressman Dickstein said later in the day that the particular testimony to which he referred had been taken by a non-governmental reporter from mon-governmental reporter from Washington. Both he and Con-gressman McCormack assured the public that they would bring the matter to the attention of authorities and demand that the proper action be taken with regard to the

reporter of the proceedings.

The last witness of the day was Miss Bertha Ziegler, who claims to be the owner of the firm of F. X Mittemeier at 229 East Eighty-sixth street. The concern imports from Germany and sells Nazi lit-erature, most of which is of a scurrilous anti-Semitic nature. The concern is known as the "custodian of books and literature of the Friends of New Germany."

A statement by the Reichsver tretung der Deutschen Juden, the all-German Jewish Representative Body, and the Union of Jewish Front Soldiers, only revealed that it had been impossible for Dr. Op-penheimer to resume his work or account of new obstacles raised by the Nazis

A written appeal by the textile trade group of Aschaffenburg urged today that measures be taken throughout the country against Jewish textile representatives and commercial travelers.

The letter complained that many manufacturers are not heeding repeated requests for the replace-ment of Jewish representatives by "Aryans." The appeal was directed to the

entire German clothing industry including the manufacturers of nationing the manufacturers of Nazi uniforms, and to the Nazi central offices asking that manu-facturers be forced to engage "Aryans" only.

Hitler Summons Reichstag

The Reichstag has been sum-moned to convene on Friday evemoned to convene on Friday eve-ning, probably in the Kroll Opera House, at which time Chancellor Hitler is expected to "go to the people" for approval of his acts in quelling the storm troop revolt and o review the developments of the last few turbulent weeks.

This is the first time since January 30 that the Reichstag, now composed exclusively of Nazis, has been convened. No legislative matters will be taken up and the body will be called on only to give its formal stamp of approval to the acts of the government.

The status of the storm troop army continued in doubt today. It

is evident now that the storm troops will be reorganized into a far smaller organization than their full strength of 2,500,000, eliminating all doubtful elements in the Hitler army's composition. A con-ference of storm troop leaders is expected to be held in the near future to consider ways and means of proceeding along this line.

The Stahlhelm, monarchistic organization of war veterans, whose status, theoretically, was as part of the storm troop army, was or-dered on vacation today by their leader, Minister of Labor Franz Seldte.

The two men received immigra-The two men received immigra-tion certificates at Trieste and re-turned to Palestine prior to the promulgation of a new immigra-tion ordinance August 31.

The magistrate before whom the case was heard ruled that the old law, providing that a charge is invalid if lodged later than three months after the offense, was ap-plicable, while the Trieste visas abrogated the previous deportation orders. Lawyers and jubilant spectators crowded the courtroom
