Soviet Orders ICA to Cease Work

Claims Farm Aid Passed Usefulness

Body Was Liquidating for Years, Comzet **Declares**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) MOSCOW, Dec. 5.—After ten years of work in Soviet Russia, the Jewish Colonization Association (ICA), the first foreign Jewish relief organization to work under the Soviet regime, was ordered today to liquidate its activities.

The order was issued by the Comzet, the government committee for settling Jews on land, of which Peter Smidovitch, vicepresident of the U.S.S.R., is chairman. The order states that the Jewish Colonization Association must no longer continue its colonization activities in the Jewish autonomous regions in the Ukraine, where it has been operating since 1923.

An explanation as to what caused the drastic order was given by Comzet officials in a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. The statement points out that the ICA was actually engaged in selfliquidation during the past few years and was no longer sufficiently active in promoting Jewish colonization in Russia.

"The Jewish Colonization Association was merely camouflaging its self-liquidation activities by investing three hundred thousand rubles a year only in its colonization projects in Russia," the Comzet statement declares. "This sum is only one-tenth of the sums which the Agro-Joint, the American Jewish organization, is investing annually in Jewish colonization work in Russia. Canadians Importing More Palestine Fruit

(Special to the J.D.B.)
OTTAWA, Ont., Dec. 5.—Canadian imports of Palestine oranges are increasing, it was reported by the Department of Commerce.

In the first ten months of this year 47,172 boxes of oranges were brought into the country, a rise of 9,394 boxes over the same period last year. Altogether, during the same period, Canada imported 1,682,274 boxes of oranges, half from the United States.

Reich Schemes To End Boycott In British Isles

Requests Jewish Firms to Participate in Trade Plan

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, Dec. 5.—The Nazis are attempting to break the international boycott front by creating Anglo-German chambers of commerce in Great Britain and Ireland and inviting all firms, including Jewish concerns, to participate in a big trade scheme with Germany, The London Daily Herald revealed today. The plan has the approval of the German Ambassador, Herr Leopold von Hoesch, it was stated.

At the same time The Daily Herald printed a warning by the Jewish Representative Council, Anglo-Jewish boycott body, urging Jewish firms not to break the boycott front.

League Gives Its Approval To Saar Pact

Complaints Will Go to Plebiscite Group for 1 Year

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) GENEVA, Dec. 5. - The extraordinary session of the Council of the League of Nations today unanimously approved of the Franco-German agreement which limits the protection of the Jews in the Saar to one yearly only if the Saar plebiscite next month turns the territory over to Germany.

The supreme tribunal which the League of Nations has set up for the Saar plebiscite will be the organization to deal with every complaint coming from Jews or any other minority in the Saar and to decide whether the complaints are justified. A year after the plebiscite, this tribunal will be dissolved, since its existence will no longer be necessary.

Despite assurances given by numerous French and Czechoslovakian statesmen to Jewish delegates in the course of the last few weeks that they would see to it that Jewish rights should be fully (Continued on Page Eight)

Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of Dropsie College, presided.

Dr. Gates told of efforts to influence the 13,000 students at the University of Pennsylvania. He pointed out, however, that religious groups are left with the responsibility of furnishing students with religious and moral guidance. He spoke highly of the Jewish student house on the Pennsylvania campus and urged the Jewish community to increase efforts along these

Can't Prove Communism, **Snow Admits**

Raymond Healy's Police Record Also Brought Out at Probe

Equipped with the information turned over to it by the Jewish Daily Bulletin, the Congressional committee to investigate un-American activities yesterday afternoon questioned John B. Snow, peddler of anti-Semitic literature, at an executive session in the Bar Association Building.

Accompanying Snow, a statistician formerly employed by the brokerage firm of Reynolds, Fish & Co., was his attorney. Clifford H. Owen of 218 Fulton street.

According to Owen, the session lasted only about forty minutes, during which his client was asked to submit evidence of subversive Communistic activities in this country. Congressman Samuel Dickstein, who presided, said the witness admitted he had no such evidence.

Snow, who maintains friendly relations with his former employers and with many other important figures in Wall street, is using his own money to incite antagonism toward the Jews, employing anti-Communism as a blind, The Bulletin learned.

Doubts "Protocols," But Sells It During his testimony at yesterday's hearing, it was further revealed, Snow declared he pays only \$20 a month for his spacious office in the expensive Reynolds, Fish uptown suite at 18 East Forty-eighth street.

Until the Amateur Athletic Union passes a resolution to the contrary, the national sports body of amateur athletes will not certify its members for participation in the 1936 Berlin Olympic Games. This vote will be taken at the A.A.U. convention, which opens tomorrow in Miami.

Daniel A. Ferris, secretary-treasurer of the A.A.U., in a statement to the Bulletin on September 28 said:

"The resolution adopted by the A.A.U. at its national convention

in Pittsburgh on November 30, 1933, against American participation in the Olympics still stands."

Binding Until Parley

Jews Are Not the Only Minority Group, He **Points Out**

Young Jews were admonished not to imagine that Jews are the world's only minority by Rabbi Israel Hoffman, counselor to Jewish students at Columbia University, who spoke yesterday in Milbank Chapel, Teachers College.

Asserting that many young Jews on the Columbia campus and elsewhere are confused, sick at heart, defiant, chauvinistic or borne down by a sense of despair and futility, Rabbi Hoffman said:

"Their bewilderment is the more tragic because they know so little as a background of their own people. They have no knowledge of the beauty and dignity once characteristic of the life of the Jew. They have lost their fath or never had it to lose."

The speaker said the majority groups should be made aware of deeply the minorities Catholics, Jews, Negroes and Orientals-feel about their status as minorities.

"The minority groups, however, should see how prone they are to exaggerate their plight to imagine themselves unique in their difficulties."

Vet, Bullet in Leg 68 Years, Goes to His Final Resting Place

the Union capital at Washington and Confederate headquarters at Richmond. The year 1862; the month, December. On one side the Army of the Potomac under Major-General A. E. Burnside. On the other the Army of Northern Virginia, General Robert E. Lee commanding. One of the most crucial battles of the Civil War at its height, with bullets flying thick and fast.

Raw but eager, a callow Jewish lad of nineteen wearing the blue of the Northern forces was in the midst of the fighting. A tiny rivulet of red ran down the lower part of his left leg. He paid no heed. Buddies were falling on all sides of him.

When the battle was over and the Federals withdrew to their camps about Falmouth after losing 12,000 men, doctors looked at the young warrior's leg and said:

"Just a scratch. That's all."

After 68 Years

And the Jewish lad of nineteen went on fighting for the right with the Army of the Potomac in every one of its major battles. He was Simon Pincus, who will be laid to rest in Mount Neboh Cemetery this afternoon. He was ninety when he breathed his last on Tuesday at his home, 34 Second street, Brooklyn.

And when the war was over he became associated with a cigar manufacturing business, which he remained until his retirement in 1919. Not until four years ago-sixty-eight years after Fredericksburg-did he learn he had been carrying a rifle bullet in the calf of his leg. Not until then did it bother him.

At first doctors called his ailment the result of diabetes or neuritis, but in spite of treatment the pain became steadily more

Anti-NazisContinue Picketing of Store

Minute Men Demand Novelty Concern Cease Selling German Goods

For the fourth consecutive day Anti-Nazi Minute Men yesterday picketed the Jewish-owned B. Schackman & Co., novelty and favor establishment at Thirtyfourth street and Madison avenue, demanding that the firm discontinue selling German-made goods.

Wearing blue and gold overseas caps, the Minute Men bore signs requesting the public not to buy in the Schackman store, reputed to be one of the largest retail and wholesale novelty shops in the country. Picketing went on peacefully and will be continued until Schackman capitulates, the Minute Men said.

Schackman yesterday admitted that forty per cent of the goods in his store are of German origin but insisted he can find no substitutes for Nazi-made articles. Until the inception of the Hitler regime, he said, all his goods were German made.

To the demand that he refrain from selling any more German goods, Schackman said: "We might. as well close up and go out of business." He claimed that before a sale is consummated the prospective customer is told the origin of the article.

Wallace Acts To Stamp Out **Poultry Racket**

Will Hold Code Hearing for East Friday in New York

(Special to the J.D.B.)
WASHINGTON, Dec. 5.—A new drive to stamp out racketeering in the live poultry industry of the Northeastern States to supplement efforts now being made in New York live poultry markets has been initiated by Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Wallace.

A public hearing on a proposed code of fair competition for the live poultry industry in New Jerthe metropolitan area of Philadelphia and the metropolitan areas of Boston and Providence has been scheduled by Secretary Wallace for December 7 at the Hotel New Yorker in New York. Elimination of unfair trade practices and rackets which have detrimental effects on producers, consumers and members of the poultry trade is sought. A large percentage of the live poultry in the three market areas is sold for kosher slaughter.

Poultry Dealers Back Code The proposed code is sponsored by the New Jersey Poultry Dealers Association, the Retail Live Poultry Dealers Protective Association of Philadelphia and the Boston Live Poultry Slaughterhousemen's Association. All persons engaged in the business of selling, purchasing for resale, handling or slaughtering live poultry, to the time the poultry is first sold in slaughtered form, and such related branches of the industry as may later be included

come under its provisions. Persons solely engaged in the transportation of live poultry would be exempt. Estimates made by the trade indicate that around 850 firms would be subject to the

Would Govern Hours, Wages Containing provisions aimed at correction of unfair trade practices and racketeering similar to those in the live poultry code now in effect for the metropolitan area of New York, this regional code would include an industry which annually handles in excess of 75,000,000 pounds of live poultry with a wholesale value of more than \$13,000,000. The New York live poultry code includes an industry which handles in excess of 190,000,000 pounds of live poultry walued at about \$30,000,000.

In addition to trade practice provisions, which would be under jurisdiction of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration, the proposed code contains provisions governing conditions of labor, hours and wages which would be under the jurisdiction of the Naional Recovery Administration.

BritonDeplores Lack of Ships in **PalestineTrade**

Dr. Burgin Informed of Condition by Visitor From Jerusalem

JERUSALEM.—Dr. Leslie Burgin, parliamentary secretary to the Board of Trade, was reported here to have shown deep interest when informed there is no regular British passenger service to Palestine. Colonel Kisch, who interviewed the Briton during a recent visit to England, gave the report in a speech at a meeting of the managing committee of the Palestine British Trade Association.

Colonel Kisch said he told Dr. Burgin that passenger lines flying the flags of several European countries and the United States had shown great enterprise in seizing the opportunities afforded by the opening of the Haifa port and the growing immigration and tourist traffic to Palestine, while British shipping companies had made no practical move in the matter and, in consequence, were losing their position in the eastern Mediterra-

The speaker also declared he had submitted information to Dr. Burgin relative to the handicap placed on the Jaffa citrus industry as a result of the exclusion of Palestine from imperial preference.

Proceeds will be donated to homes for refugee children.







The League's Failure

As it was expected, the Council of the League of Nations at its session yesterday unanimously approved in principle the Franco - German agreement which guarantees the rights of the Saar Jews for one year only.

This unanimous decision of the Council will provoke much doubt as to the actual strength oi the League of Nations. After all, one of the major functions of the League is to protect national minority rights. The circumstance that not even a single member of the Council raised objections to the fact that the Saar minorities will be protected for one year only will definitely be interpreted to mean that the Council of the League of Nations has not lived up to the principles for which it stands.

The Jews of the Saar may just as well now begin to pack to leave their homes. The anction which the Council of the League of Nations has given to the Franco-German agreement leaves nothing for them but "voluntary" exile.

It is highly regrettable that in the negotiations with Germany with regard to the Saar plebiscite, the League of Nations has proven itself so weak as far as the interests of the national minorities are concerned. This may certainly be utilized by those European governments which are so anxious to get rid of their national minority obligations.

It is the second time that the League of Nations is helpless when it comes to protecting minority rights. The first time was a few months ago when Colonel Beck, Polish Minister of Foreign Affairs, openly renounced the national mority treaties which guaranteed by the League of Nations. The announcement which Colonel Beck made was never withdrawn by the Polish government despite the fact that it constituted a slap in the face to the League of Nations.

With Poland's repudiation of its national minority obligations and now, with the League permitting Germany to obtain the Saar without guaranteeing permanent equality for the Jews there, why should Austria hesitate to discriminate against the Jews? Why should she not consider the St. Germain treaty a scrap of paper? Everybody does it and the League of Nations keeps quiet Why not Austria.

THE BLACK SHIRTS

When Sir Oswald Mosley's socalled New Party failed in the last general elections to put into office a solitary candidate, many people made so bold as to prophesy the demise of the Fascist movement in England within a twelvemonth. The idea of Fascism, they said, would never take in this country, regardless of the inroads it had made on the Continent. The Mosley cause was "utterly hopeless."

Thus it is not a little surprising to find, these many months later, that the movement has grown to the point where it has branches all over the land, plenty of money in its treasury and—most significant of all—huge membership. The movement. whatever else one may say about it, can no longer be described as a mushroom growth, and the time has come when some attempt should be made to estimate its strength.

More Like Italian Than German Model

Outwardly the party resembles the Italian model rather than the German one. The shirt is black, not brown, and instead of the Hitler symbol of the Hakenkrenz, Mosley has adopted the Roman Fasces. So, too, with policy. Hitler's program was an extraordinary hotchpotch of contradictions, impossible to understand unless the reader remembered that Hitler was exploiting a mass of class and national hatreds-hatred of the Jew, hatred of the "war profiteer," of the financier and the "internationalist capitalist."

Mosley's policy bears no trace of this hysteria, and indeed, compared with the Nazi program, it looks uncommonly staid and severe. Apart from the "reform of Parliament," Mosley preaches the ideal of the complete corporate state, a regulated economic life, and an observer will notice how subtly he has stolen the thunder both of the Left and the Right.

But Mosley's Tactics Resemble Hitler's

It is not, however, the actual program that is important, but the methods used to get it across, and here Mosley is more like Hitler than Mussolini. Like Hitler, he has learned all the popular Socialist jargon, and there is no one in England who knows how to play on the vague suspicions of a working-class audience better than he does.


But he is more concrete than Hitler, whose whole object is to fill his audience with a vague sense of injustice, and thus to work them into a passion. Mosley seriously argues his case. He speaks with great sincerity-indeed, it is absurd to suggest that he is "insincere"—and-he has the art of illuminating his argument by a sudden brilliance of phrase.

His one fault as a speaker is that he is still too inclined to be clever at the expense of his opponents—a habit that amuses an audience but does not convince it.

Still Lacks Power Of Simplification

Mosley is particularly like Hitler in his sense of the dramatic. He has not yet shown the power of simplification that Hitler has: For instance, anybody can draw the Hakenkreuz, but few people can draw the Fasces. But in the art of creating an atmosphere, of managing the spotlight, Mosley has nothing to learn, and in a Fascist movement this is of very great importance.

The party also resembles the

Hitler movement in the type it is attracting. No generalization can be very accurate, but it can be said that, as with the Nazis, there is a reactionary wing, composed of violent anti-Socialists, and a revolutionary wing, recruited from the I.L.P. and the Communists.

Left Wing Adherents Are Stronger Than Right

So far as one can judge, the left wing is considerably stronger than the right, for when Mosley founded the movement he took over with him many disconnected members of the Lamovement. Tremendous headway, too, has been made in the big industrial centers of the north, where many of the unemployed have become disillusioned both with the Labor Party and the Communists. This success in the areas that have remained unshakably loyal to Labor for so many years is the most impressive fact about the Fascist movement. It is not surprising that he has been able to build up a strong organization in Manchester and that today he should be holding a mass meeting in Birmingham Bingley Hall, which accommodates 15,000 persons.

Area Branches Responsible For Subsidiary Groups

In the subsequent stages an area branch was made responsible for a given territory and for the setting up of groups and branches, subsidiary to itself, in the area under its con-

There are now 150 of these area branches, and many of them have three or four satellite branches. The official estimate of membership has been worked out from reports sent in by the local branches, and their optimistic estimates make up a total of 500,000. This is a figure that experienced political observers find it impossible to accept. It is clear, however, that the membership is large-far larger than many people be-

With this support it is not surprising that Sir Oswald has decided to fight both at the next general and municipal elections. Growing Movement Has

Elaborate Organization The organization has some in-

teresting features. The staff is highly centralized and highly disciplined. The huge building in London houses all the principal officers, and is completely departmentalized into treasury, accounts, branch organization, propaganda, research, publicity, legal department and defense forces. It is estimated that headquarters deals with 3,000 letters a week, and that the average number of meetings held over the whole country is in the neighborhood of 500 a week. Fifteen to twenty headquarters propagandists are always on tour, and smaller meetings are addressed by local speakers.

Two weekly papers are printed, the Fascist Week, at two pence, and the Blackshirt at a penny. These are sold on the streets by uniformed members wherever branches exist.

The Fascists deny allegation that members of the defense force are paid. It is asserted (Continued on Page Five)

Why Has Moscow Liquidated ICA?

The order which the Soviet government issued yesterday to the ICA to liquidate its activities in Soviet Russia will perhaps come as a shock to many. It will, however, not be surprising to those few who know of the differences which have arisen during the past few years between the Soviet regime and the administration of the ICA.

These differences originated soon after collectivization of Jewish colonies was demanded by authorities as part of the general collectivization plan. With the Jewish colonies gradually being collectivized, they fell more and more under the influence of the government and the control of local Soviets. The ICA was thus pushed out, little by little, from the sphere of its influence. It subsidized Jewish colonization, but it had practically no influence on the col-

ICA Money Under Soviet Control

Losing its control in the Jewish regions where it had been conducting operations even under the Czarist regime, the administration of the ICA saw no purpose in continuing to invest large sums of money to promote Jewish agriculture, where it had no say as to how their investments should be utilized. Giving money without actually having the right to administer it seemed a little queer to the administration of the ICA.

It was for this reason that ICA offices in Soviet Russia, little by little, began to withdraw their support from the regions in which they were active. Instead of investing more money in colonization projects, as originally contemplated, the ICA began to concentrate on collecting her debt from the collectivized Jewish colonists and taking as much of her funcs as possible out of Russia.

Mutual Dissatisfaction

Soviet authorities, dissatisfied with the change in ICA policy, were tolerant for a time. But when the sums which the ICA invested annually grew too small, the authorities began to feel it did not pay to let the world credit a foreign Jewish organization with achievements in the field of Jewish colonization at a time when the Soviet government was actually doing most of the work with its own funds.

In adopting this attitude, the Soviet government made it clear that it did not share this sentiment with regard to the Agro-Joint. Firstly, because the Agro-Joint spends, even now, ten times as much as the ICA, and, secbecause the Agro-Joint operates in Crimea and not in the Ukraine, where the ICA was conducting its work and where there is no more free land for Jewish settlement.

Agro-Joint Farsighted

It is very much to the credit of the Agro-Joint and of the farsightedness of Dr. Joseph Rosen, that the Agro-Joint has long ago withdrawn from its activities in the Ukraine and has limited itself to Crimea only. The unpleasant experience now faced by the ICA can, therefore, fortunately not be faced by the Agro-Joint.

It must, however, be stated that the ICA too, will not worry much about the fact that it is now forced to conclude its activities in Russia. The work started by the ICA can now be safely continued by the Soviet authorities and on Soviet funds.

"Can you mention any Jew who hasn't flinched in a crisis? Can you!"

"Yes, I think I can," I said, "Let me see . . . Well, I gently. can begin with Jesus Christ . . and end with myself."

At that point, son and daughter crowed their triumph over the old gentleman so openly that I was sorry for him.

Digest of World Press Opinion

Fanatic. Not Statesman

A special corresponent of the London Daily Express analyzes Hitler's Jew-baiting policy and comments as follows:

Leadership is not monopolized by men with deep powers of thought. It often falls to fanatics, men of lopsided mental development, men who are deeply deluded and can deeply delude others. Hitler is a fanatic, not a thinker. He has remained a Jew-baiter.

Whenever I find him hailed as a statesman I remember his actions against the Jews. I once described how, when he cries to a great audience, "Perish Jewry!" the whole force of his mind and voice is in the cry. The ferocity of the pogrom is in this horrible incitement.

Germans of the poorer classes have suffered almost unendurably since the war. Here is one who tells them with the utmost conviction that there is a simple and easily dealt with cause of all their troubles. Do you wonder the poor creatures prefer this simple creed to the compromise of higher politics? Or, at least, prefer it for a time?

Let me remind you of one of Hitler's platform devices. He will stand silent for a few moments; then, gazing into space, slowly raise his hand and ask of somebody at the back, in an angry, sonorous voice, "You — poor, half-starved workman-who has robbed you of your all?"

Thereupon a prearranged cry will come, "The Jews," and the audience will take up the cry and thunder it forth.

Origin of Scheme For Zion Council

The Manchester Guardian, commenting on the Legislative Council in Palestine, establishment of which is now reported postponed, states:

The project that is now being considered goes back to one that was proposed twelve years ago. The original scheme was based upon Article 2 of the mandate, which provides that "the Mandatory shall be responsible for placing the country under such political, administrative, and economic conditions as will secure the establishment of the Jewish national home . . . and the development of self-governing institutions." It was as a self-governing institution that the Legislative Council was offered to the people of Palestine twelve years ago, and as such it will presumably be offered to them again. The first attempt proved abortive owing to the refusal of the Arab population as a whole to take part in the elec-

tions, which were held in the spring of 1923. Only the Jewish population cooperated.

After the lapse of twelve years the attitude of the Arabs and the Jews to the creation of a Legislative Council is now reversed. It is understood that the Arabs are for the most part in favor of it, whilst the Jews have declared their determined oppo-

The reason why the Jews oppose the Legislative Council is that they consider the functioning of such a body, with whatever safeguards may be pro-vided, is incompatible with the principles underlying the establishment of the Jewish National Home. They maintain that their

National Home is only in its initial growth, and that, since the mandate provides for its establishment in fulfilment of the national aspirations of the Jewish people and formally recognizes their historic connection with Palestine, it is only reasonable to demand that there should be a much larger representation of the Jewish people in Palestine before such a fundamental constitutional change is introduced.

The League And Irag's Policy

The Jewish Tribune of Bombay, speaking of anti-Jewish measures taken by the government of Iraq, relates the following:

This attitude of the Irak government is not only confined to the Jewish press. It is also reported that Jews are being ousted from government service. Twenty Jewish officials in high government positions have been dismissed peremptorily. These measures naturally give cause for anxiety for the safety of the Jews in the country, who number over 100,000. That the position is grave no one will deny.

The next question that comes to our mind is where such steps are going to lead to. It is imperative that the fangs of this dangerous poison must be checked otherwise the situation will go out of control. Iraq is a member of the League of Nations and the protective provisions of the Minorities Treaties apply equally to her. The question must be taken up in the right quarters if more serious consequences are to be averted.

Ukrainian President Points Out Gains of Jews in Soviet Union

KHARKOV. - The tremendous gains made by Jews and other national minorities under the Soviet government were pictured here at an election mass meeting addressed by President Gregory Petrovsky of the Ukraine Soviet Republic.

Under Czarism, he said, only rich Jewish merchants and professionals were permitted to live in Kharkov, now the Ukrainian capital. Today more than 125,000 lived in Kharkov. There has been a great increase in the number of Jewish workers employed in industry, he said. The Kharkov locomotive works employs 3,500 Jewish workers, while thousands published in Yiddish.

Jewish workers take a part in the city council and the political life of the country. Jewish clubs are conducting important cultural and education work. The Jewish choir, he pointed out, had become a great artistic force in the life of the city. A special Jewish militia has been created as well as a Jewish law court. President Petrovsky said.

This limited guarantee does not dispose of the most explosive element in the Saar situation. If Hitler at the end of a brief period rules the Saar as ruthlessly as Germany it will continue as a danger spot in Europe. And if Hitler is sincere in his persecution of racial minorities, political liberals and laborites in Germany, doubtless he will be tempted to extend that terror to the Saar in the name of Nazi kultur.

The Saar problem is essentially the same as the larger German problem. There is not apt to be a lasting and peaceful solution of either under a Nazi dictatorship.

Jews Thank Persia For Restoring Tomb

Israel's Messenger, a publication of Shanghai, reports that the small colony of Jews of Persian origin residing in China addressed to the Persian consul in Shanghai the following letter of thanks for the restoration of the tomb of Queen Esther in Hamadan:

Dear Sir:—The Persian Jewish community of China prays to God to grant long life to His Imperial Majesty Pahlavi, and thanks the Minister of Public Education for his decision to reconstruct the Tomb of Esther and to erect a monument thereon. This decision, coming as it does at the present time, stands as a shining example to the rest of the civilized world. It stands beautiful in contrast with some dark corners in this world where freedom and liberty are draped with the black cloth of hatred and prejudice.

From the immemorial, Persia had been the friend of the Jews. King Cyrus helped the Jews to rebuild their Holy Temple and to restore their kingdom on the soil of the Holy Land. Therefore the present decision of the Minister of Public Education, by order of His Majesty, revives memories of old and stirs in our hearts the deepest emotions of love and gratitude to Persia, to her Emperor and his Ministers.

(Continued from Page Four) on the other hand that, like all other members, they have to pay their membership fees to belong. In all cases the minimum membership subscription is one shilling a month, or four pence a month if the member is unemployed. Members must also buy their own uniforms, and this is often done by instalments.

Each Branch Operates Its Own Defense Force

Every branch has its own defense force. General instructions are given by the officers of this section at headquarters, and contact is maintained throughout the country by touring officers.

It is claimed that the officials of the movement are paid less and work harder than in any of the orthodox parties. The touring officers, organizers and propagandists are paid £2 a week and subsistence allowance of seven shillings a day. Higher officials get more, but there are no highly paid posts.

The movement has now passed through its first two stages, Fascist propaganda and Fascist organizations, and the next stages will be the building of an electoral machine in the constituencies. By the next election the movement hopes to have a virile machine and a sufficient number of candidates to prove it is seeking power through constitutional forms.

Critical Moments By GEORGE JOEL

Gambling With Cohan .

I shudder to think what the picture "Gambling," which is now being shown at the Mayfair Theater, would have been like had George M. Cohan been absent from the cast. Even with that great actor dominating the screen the film leaves much to be desired in the way of entertainment.

Mr. Cohan's play "Gambling," from which the film was adapted, is certainly not among that actor and playwright's major efforts. At best it was a fair melodrama. Its transcription for film purposes has not added any virtues to what is an implausible and stagey story. Briefly, "Gambling" follows the career of an honest upright gambler whom even police inspectors admire. His step-daughter is murdered and with the odds against him our gambler is able to bring the assassin to his just desserts. On the stage "Gambling" was fastmoving but thin, and now that it has been made into a film its competent parts have been drawn much too fine.

Messrs. Selwyn and Franklin, who produced the film under the Fox trade mark, may be, in fact, they are, very able theatrical producers, but when they went to Astoria to make "Gambling" they seemed to have left all their ideas on what makes a good production in their New York offices. Rowland Lee, director of the picture, was not much help. He permitted the limitations of the play to bind him closely, with the result that "Gambling" is little more than a photograph of a stage play.

Cohan, always an excellent actor, is unable to rise above the material. His emoting does nothing more than slow up a not-toorapidly paced film; however there are moments when his zest and charm are turned on and those moments are delightful and almost make "Gambling" seeing.

Post Road

At the Masque Theater Wilbur Daniel Steele and Norma Mitchell's comedy, "Post Road," was added to the current theatrical season. Its addition, although not an important one, should not go entirely unnoticed.

"Post Road" has some virtues. The plot is unusual, the directing fine and the acting, especially that of Lucile Watson, Percy Kilbride, Mary Sargent, Romaine Callender and Edward Fielding, fluent and convincing.

Baby kidnaping is the thesis of "Post Road." Miss Watson, a wise spinster who runs an inn, one night harbors a doctor, his wife and a nurse. No sooner are these people within her doors when the wife begins to scream and a few moments later the birth of a son is announced. But alas, it is all a plot. The baby is really the abducted son of a rich couple. However, Miss Watson circumvents the abductors, but not before there are a number of complications and some fire-works supplied by state troopers and other minions of the law. Some of it is a lot of fun, but the idea of the play is kept hidden from the audience until well into the middle of the proceedings.

"This huge amount must be raised before December 31, or we risk the most disastrous consequences.

"Failure of Federation's institutions would be nothing less than a community catastrophe. A quarter of a million unfortunates depend on Federation's, agencies for needed services which government does not provide. The serious situation of Federation places an inescapable obligation on the generosity and public spirit of us all."

EEE Circulating Anti-Semite Blurb

Four-Page Bulletin, Secretly Published, Recks With Anti-Jewish Attacks

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) SALONICA.—The E E E, Greek anti-Semitic organization, is publishing a bi-monthly bulletin secretely distributed to its members here and throughout Greece, it was revealed. The bulletin, a four-page paper, is distinctly anti-Jewish throughout. In the lead article Greece is described as a 'Jewish empire" and Salonica as a "fortress of Jewry" under the leadership of the "Jewish devil Freemason Manos," this reference being to Nicholas Manos, Mayor of Salonica.

The entire issue is studded throughout with insults to the Jew and such phrases as "dirty Jews" constantly recur.

Furtwaengler Quits Music Posts AAU to Weigh After Attacks by Nazi Press

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, Dec. 5.—Dr. Wilhelm Furtwaengler, vice-president of the Reich Chamber of Music and director of the Berlin State Opera, resigned both posts yesterday as result of attacks made on him in the Nazi press for his defense of Paul Hindemith, modernist German composer.

Herr Hindemith was "accused' of having Jewish blood in his veins, playing in a quartet two of whose members were Jewish, and making phonograph records with Jewish musicians. He was charged with composing operas to objectionable librettos.

Nearly fifty per cent of the monies, amounting to \$5,400, was allocated to the Jewish Agency for the Relief of German Jews. The American-Jewish Joint Distribution Committee received \$4,200, while \$1,200 each was given to Ort and Hicem.

Without the certification of A.A.U. athletes the American Olympic Committee cannot send any track and field men, gymnasts, wrestlers, boxers and swimmers to the Berlin games. This fact was pointed out to the committee by Sheriff William C. Haddock of Pittsburgh at the executive meeting of the A.O.C.

Brundage Statement

At the same time Sheriff Haddock declared that the A.A.U. will take up the matter of American acceptance of the Reich bid at this convention despite a statement by Avery Brundage that the action of the American Olympic Committee was binding upon all sports organizations.

"When this A.A.U. convention takes place," said Haddock, "the members will act upon this question once again. Where would that body be if the national A.A.U. decided not to participate in the 1936 Olympics?

Went Against Sport Code

"The A.A.U. last year adopted a resolution against participation of American teams in Germany until the German government in fact as well as in theory encouraged Jewish athletes to prepare for the athletic events. Germany violated one of the fundamentals of the democracy of sport by discriminating against

Westbrook Pegler, columnist for the Scripps-Howard papers, speaking of the assurances given the A.O.C. by the Nazi sport officials, declared:



Seek to Indict Quiz Peddler Simon on Bribe Charge, Report

Grand Jury Believed Ready to Act in Kosher Case

The New York County Grand Jury yesterday was prepared to return an indictment for bribery against Arthur Simon, former Health Department Kashruth investigator, it was learned authori-

The Grand Jury asked for an indictment blank after hearing testimony from Abraham Gellis, an official of the Isaac Gellis Kosher Meat Products Company, and Detective John Cordes, attached to the District Attorney's office, it became known.

Gellis was understood to have testified that he gave Simon a \$250 bribe to "fix" a kosher food violation charge brought against him by one of Simon's inspectors.

Simon yesterday countered with the accusation that he is being "framed."

"I emphatically deny the charge that has been made against me,' he said in a statement to the press, "and have been seeking to have this matter aired in open court. Gellis was asked to make a complaint to the Magistrates' Court, but he dared not do so. They preferred to take this matter before a secret body, the Grand Jury, where I would have no opportunity to offer my side of the story. This was the only course left for the District Attorney.

Claim Trap Set

"This is purely and simply a frame-up, and I shall prove this to be so at the proper place and time. I want all those in whose cause I have worked during my tenure of office to know that I have done nothing wrong and have nothing to fear."

The first complaint was made by Gellis November 9 when he appeared at the office of Assistant District Attorney James G. Wallace to complain that Simon had solicited a bribe. A trap was set for Simon by Gellis and Detective Cordes at the Broadway Central Hotel, the spot where, according to Gellis' story, the money was to change hands.

Simon was discharged recently from his post by Health Commissioner John L. Rice "for the good of the service."

Last week Gellis and his grandfather, Samuel Glass, were held for Special Sessions by Magistrate Jonah J. Goldstein on the kosher food law violation charge.

Immigrants, he said, came into Palestine legally by virtue of immigration schedules agreed on between the High Commissioner and the Jewish Agency.

"It is highly important not to reduce the number of legal immigrants, which must be done if illegal immigration continues," Sir Philip stated.

He indicated he is slowly becoming convinced that the "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," one of the books he sells, is spurious in origin. Despite this fact, he admitted, he continues to peddle it.

Healey's Record Bared

Prior to Snow's appearance, the criminal record of Raymond Joseph Healey, juvenile editor and publisher of Healey's Irish Weekly, was spread before an open hearing attended by an unruly mob of about 150 of the youth's sympathizers, most of them members of the Friends of New Germany.

The boy came garbed in a uniform consisting of black riding trousers and boots, a Sam Browne belt and a green shirt with a red, white and blue ribbon on one shoulder and a swastika on its

Testimony given under oath revealed that his father had died in jail and that his brother is now serving a penal term. Both were convicted of burglary charges, The Bulletin learned.

Young Healey himself has been arrested numerous times, it was disclosed at the hearing, during which four such cases were read into the record.

Arrested on Riot Charge

The thousands of Jewish colonies in the regions where the ICA was operating will now be taken care of by the Soviet government directly. The Jewish colonies which were administered by the ICA are located in the autonomous Jewish regions of New Zlatapol and Krivorog, Ukraine.

Many of the colonies, which will now pass from the supervision of the ICA to the direct supervision of the local Soviets, were established long before the Soviet government came to power. There are colonies which were started under the old Czarist regime. Some of them are over a hundred years old. The colony Dobroe, which is one of the oldest of these colonies, has a population of about five thousand Jews.

The Jewish Colonization Asso. ciation was active in Russia long before the war. It temporarily suspended its activities during the Bolshevik revolution. It however resumed its work in Russia in 1923, on the basis of a special arrangement made with the Soviet govern-

The order issued today by the Soviet authorities, although preventing the ICA from continuing its activities along the lines of promoting Jewish agriculture, does not interfere with the activities which the Jewish Colonization Association is conducting in Russia in granting credit and helping Jews to migrate from the country.

Founded by Baron Hirsch

In 1891 Baron Maurice de Hirsch decided to use his immense fortune to save the Jews of Eastern Europe from degeneration and ruin. In view of his knowledge of the historic fate of the Jewish people, he thought the best expedient would be the transporting of Jews into new countries and settling them on land.

He founded the Jewish Colonization Association (ICA) with an initial capital of \$10,000,000, to which he later added a further \$40,000,000. This was intended to serve as a basis for extensive colonization of Russian Jews in Argentina. During 1892-1897 5,000 Jewish families settled there, but ater the colonization stopped and the ICA limited itself to consolidating the position of the first groups of settlers.

In 1896 Baron Hirsch died and bequeathed all shares of the ICA to the Jewish communities of Brussels, Berlin, Frankfort, and the Anglo-Jewish Association of London. Each of the above received five thousand shares.

In the articles of the organization Baron Hirsch had stipulated that up to fifty per cent of the capital be spent on the purchase of land and the second half for colonization purposes and loans to Jewish settlers.

League Approves New Saar Pact

and indefinitely protected in the Saar, not a single member of the Council raised any objection today to the paragraph in the Franco-German agreement on the Saar which provides that equality for the national minorities is guaranteed by Germany for a period of only one year.

Interested diplomatic circles here were embarrassed by the fact that the League of Nations had found no way to force Germany to accord to the Jews in the Saar at least the same rights held by the Jews in Upper Silesia. Some of the diplomats admitted that by approving the Saar deal the League failed to live up to its fundamental principle of enforcing protection for national and racial minorities.

A sensation was created at today's meeting of the Council when Captain Anthony Eden, head of the British delegation at Geneva, announced that England is ready to send British troops to the Saar during the plebiscite if France will not do so and if Germany will agree to it. French Foreign Minister Laval declared to the Council that France is definitely determined not to participate in any international movement of troops into the Saar.

This statement by the French diplomat created a stir because only a few weeks ago the French government announced that it would be ready to send military forces to the Saar in order to strengthen the local police force there during the plebiscite next month.

The Saar report approved by the Council fails not only to protect Jewish interests but also the interests of American investors. Millions of dollars invested by Americans in Saar enterprises will cently protested officially.
