Current studies show that 1 in 4 people will be affected by a mental health challenge at some point. The past four years, NC has prioritized students support on all levels: spiritual, social/emotional, academic, and behavioral. Our student services team processes referrals monthly working closely with administration, our campus minister, academic intervention and guidance departments. This is our third year for our school-based clinical counselor as well.



As your child's first teacher, we partner with you in supporting students in all of these areas. Parenting adolescents can present unique challenges. This section of our newsletter this quarter shares a plethora of resources for mental health needs from a faith-based organization, The Association for Catholic Mental Health Ministers.
