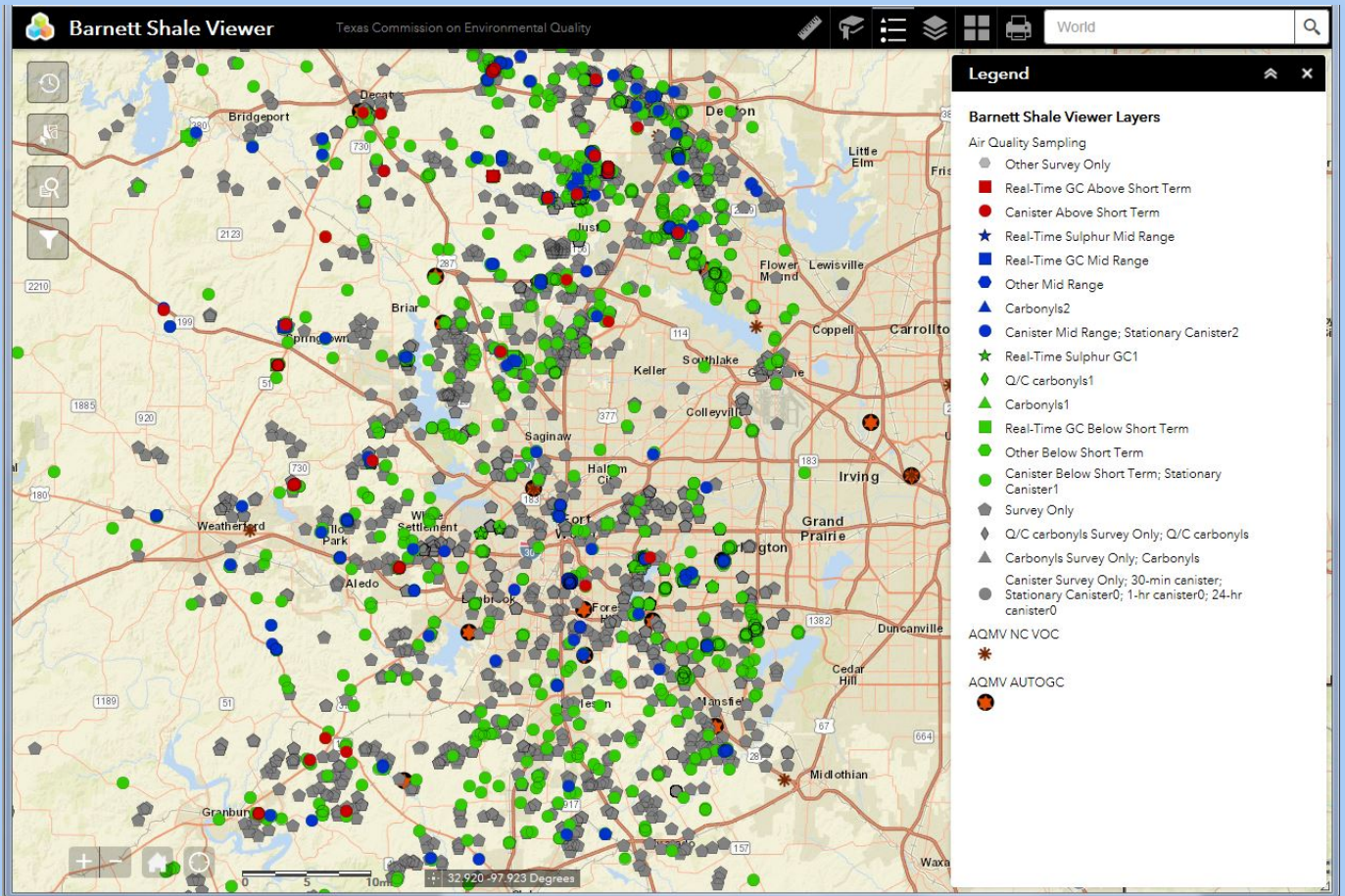

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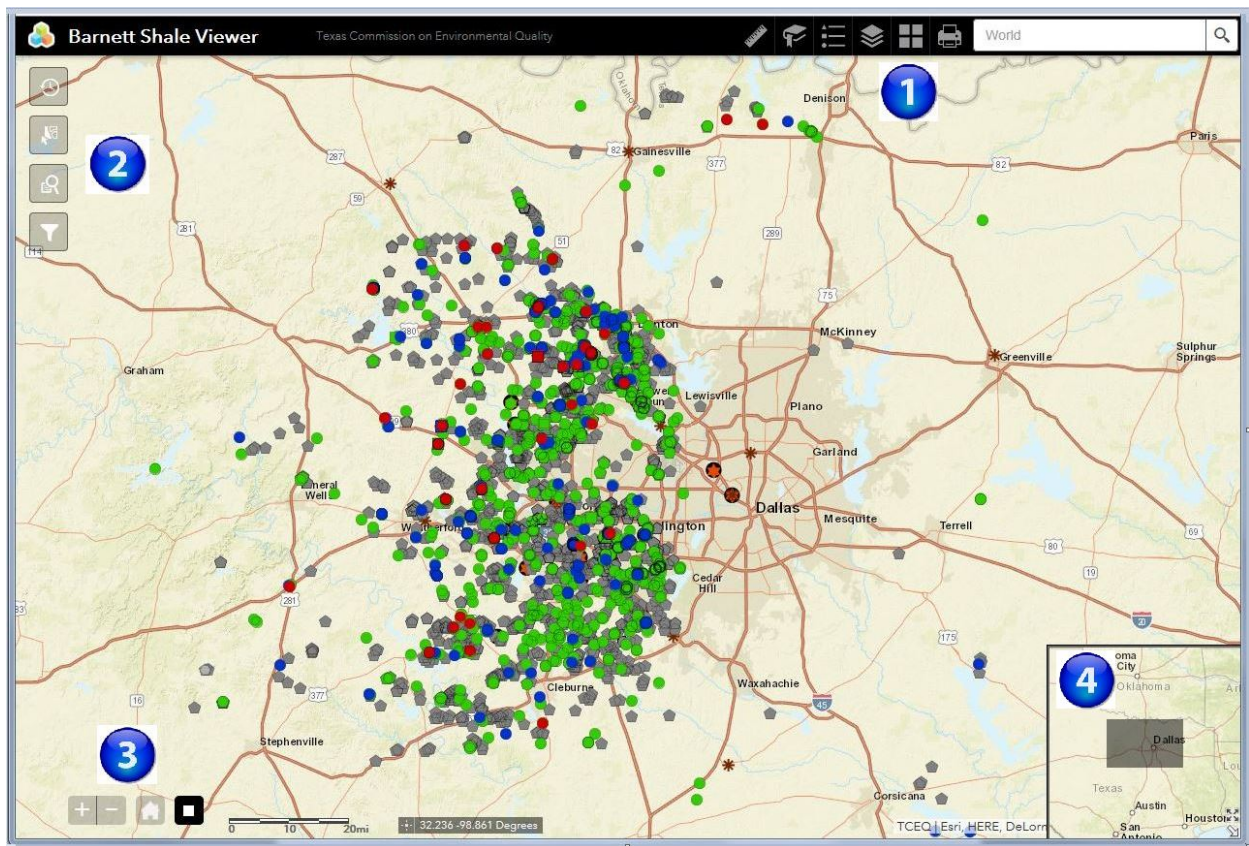
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# Application Overview

4 Overview Map





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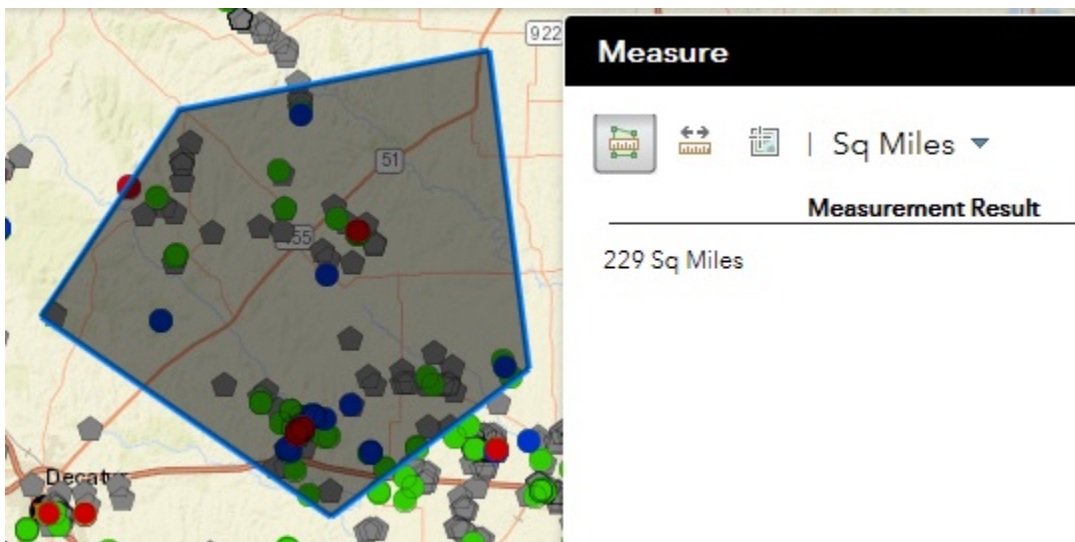
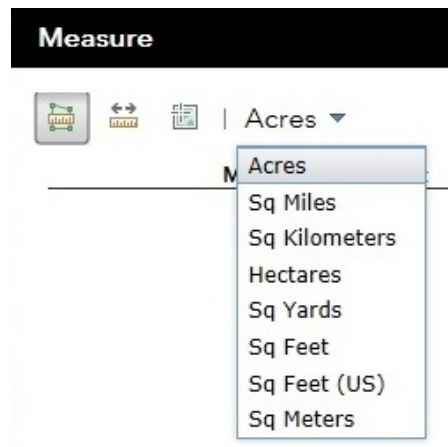
## Using the Main Toolbar


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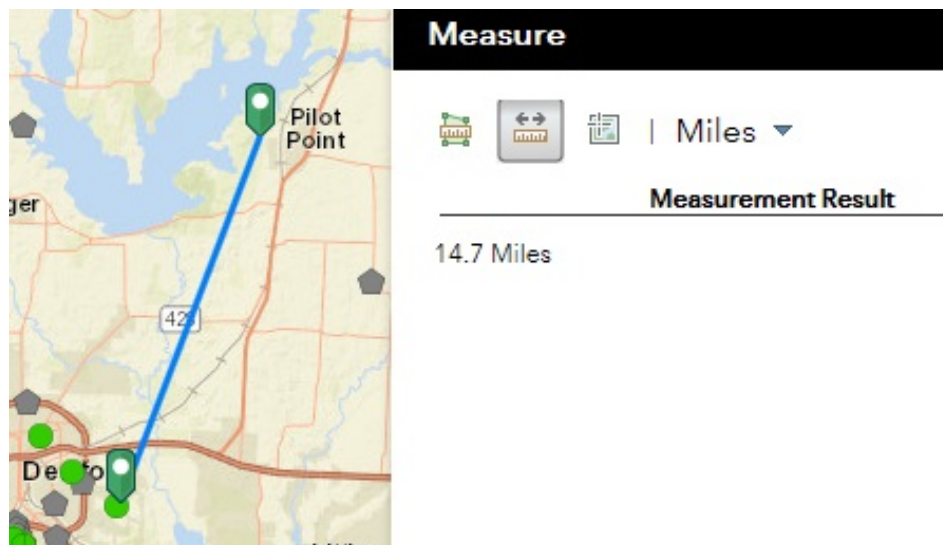
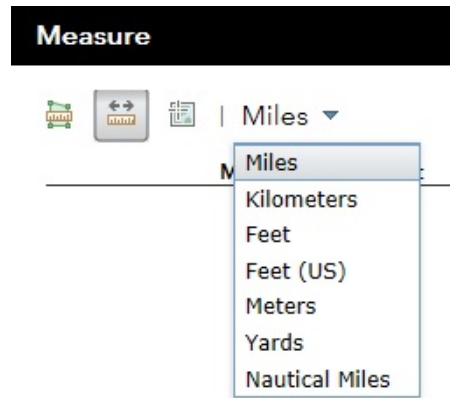



### Measure:

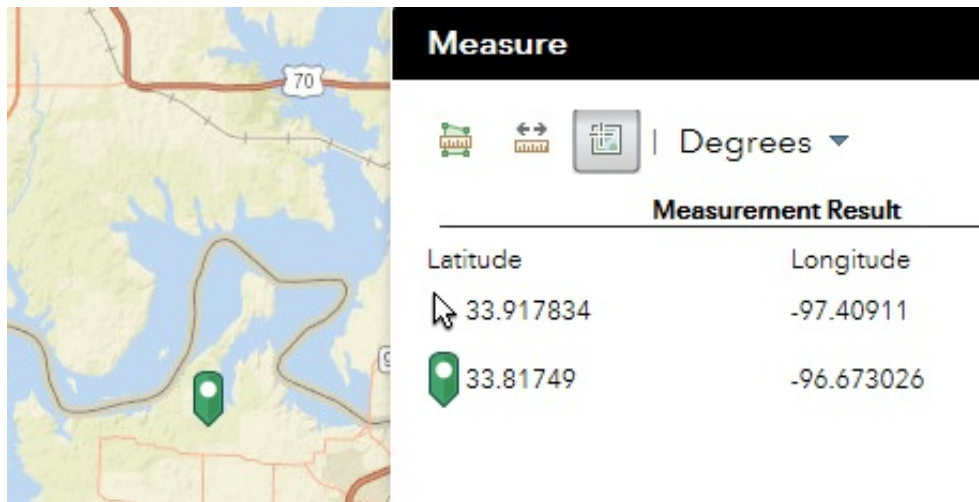
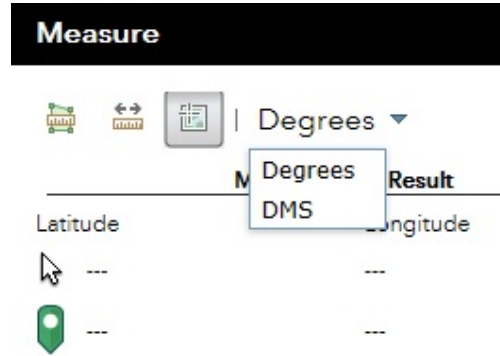
- Use the **Measure** tool  to measure areas, linear distances, and obtain coordinates for selected point locations.
- To measure an **area**, click the **Area button** , select the desired units, then digitize the area to be measured on the map.



- To measure a **linear distance**, click the **Distance button** , select the desired units, then digitize a line on the map.




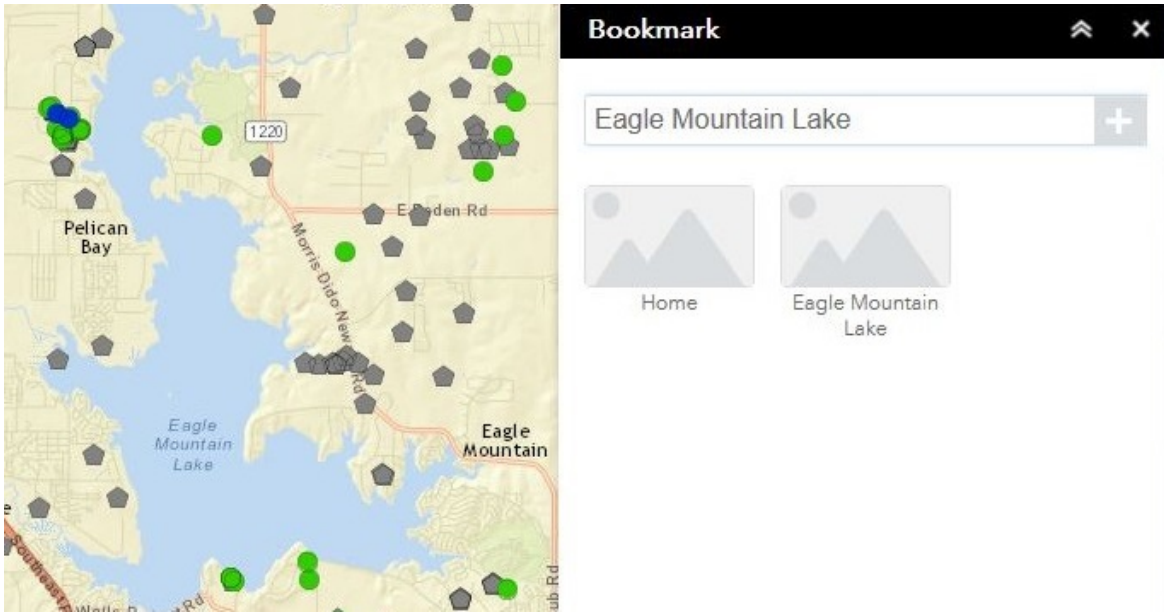
- To get the **coordinates** for a point location, click the **Location button** , select the desired units, then digitize a point on the map.





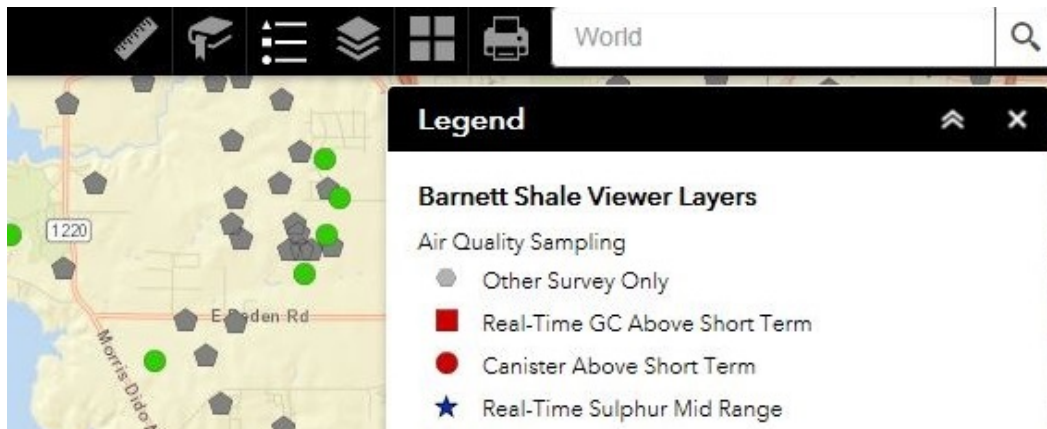
## Bookmark:

- Use the **Bookmark** tool  to save a selected area of interest to your list of bookmarks.




## Legend:

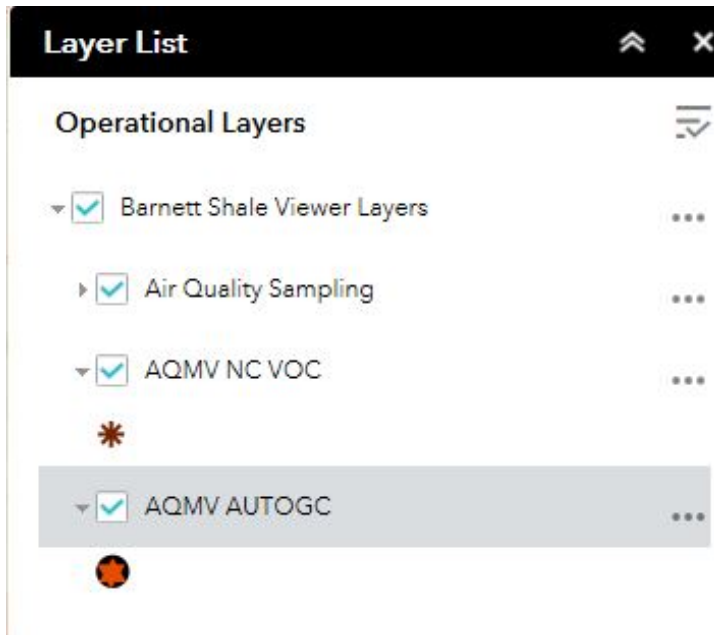
- Use the **Legend** tool  to view the key to symbols on the map.





## Layer List:


- Use the **Layer List** tool  to turn layers on and off on the map. You can also expand each layer to see the key to symbols.

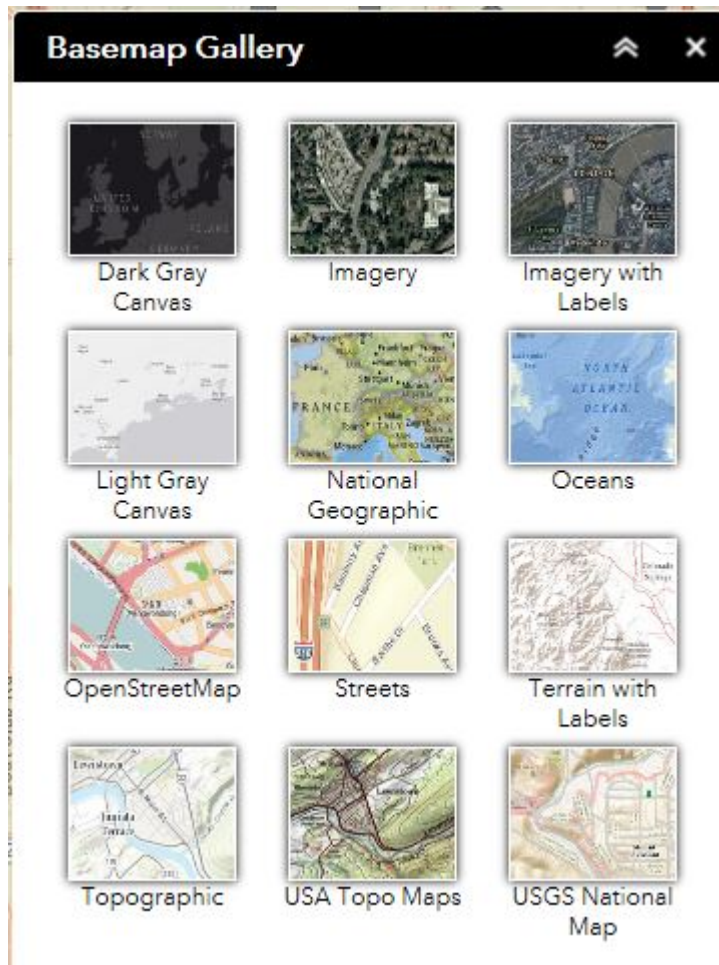







## Basemap Gallery:


- Use the **Basemap** tool  to change the background image in the map.

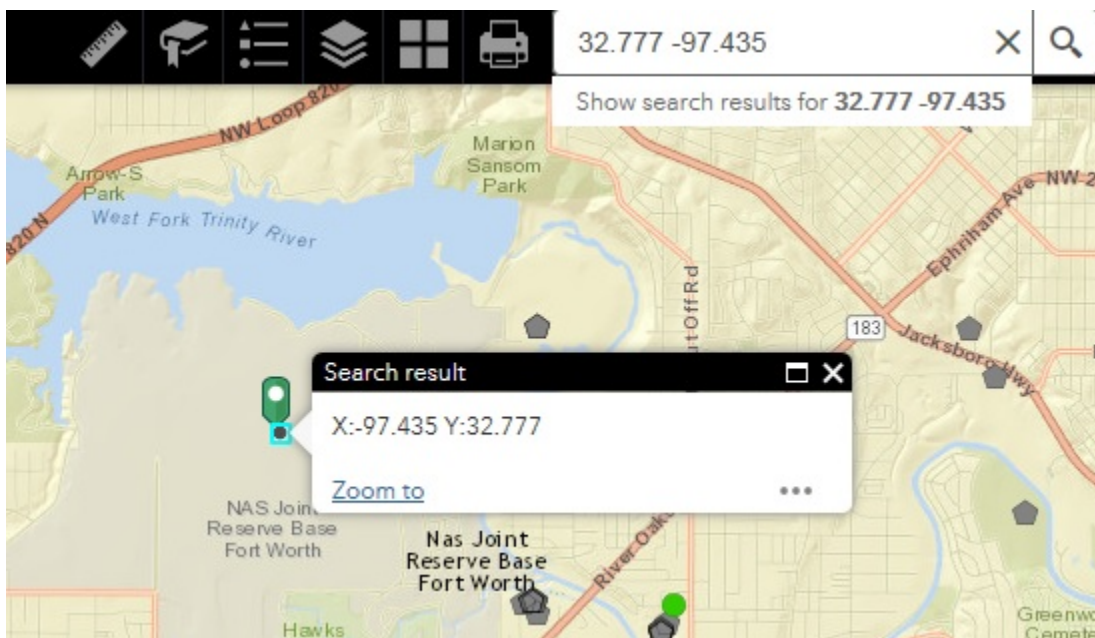
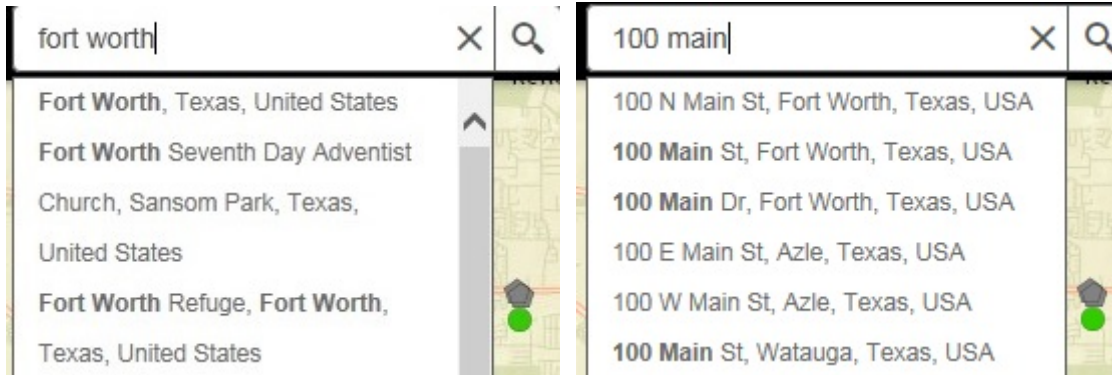

Use the **Search** tool  to search for addresses, coordinates, cities, counties, parks, and other named locations.



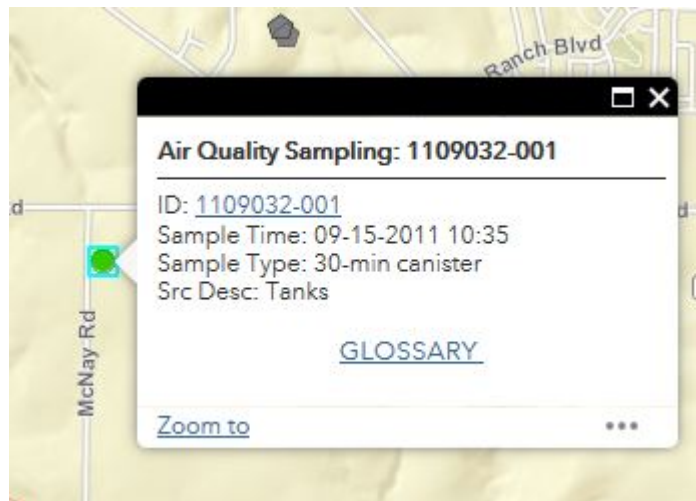
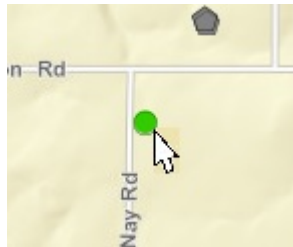
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# Query Tools

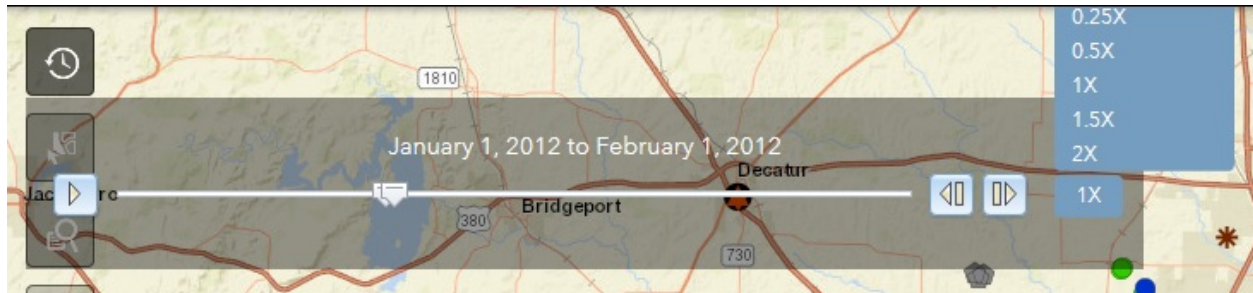

## Time Slider Tool:


- In the upper left corner, click on the **Time Slider** tool  to see the sample points by month.

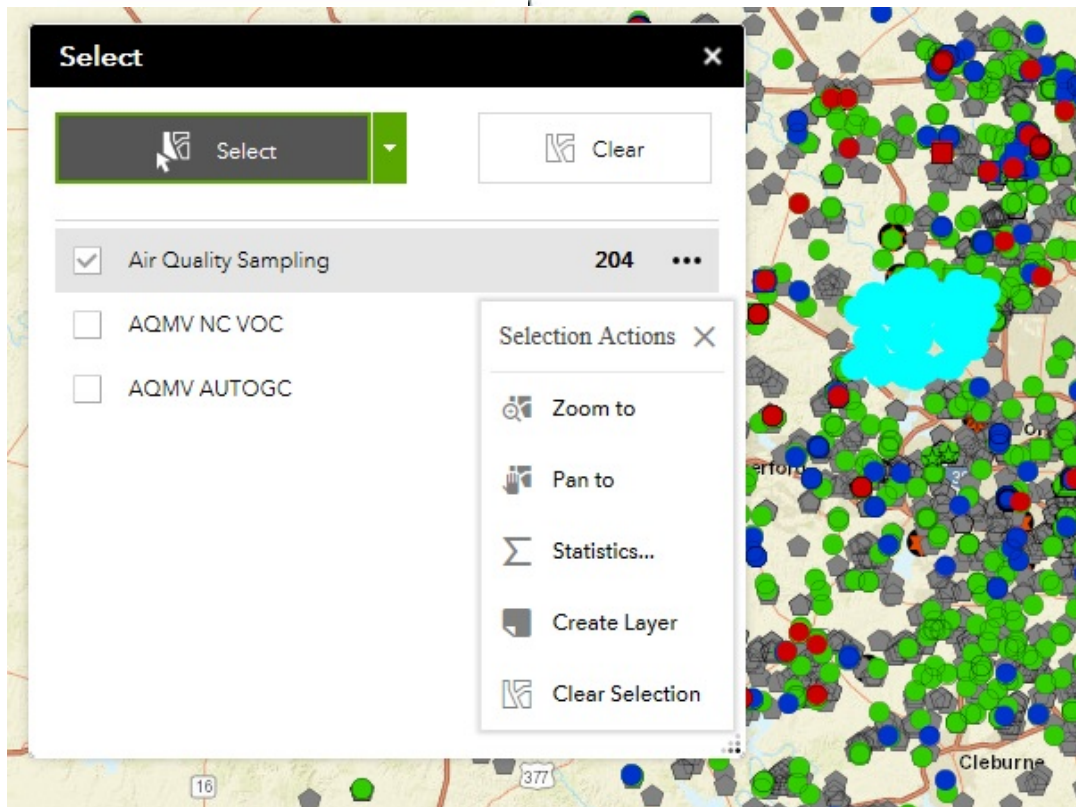
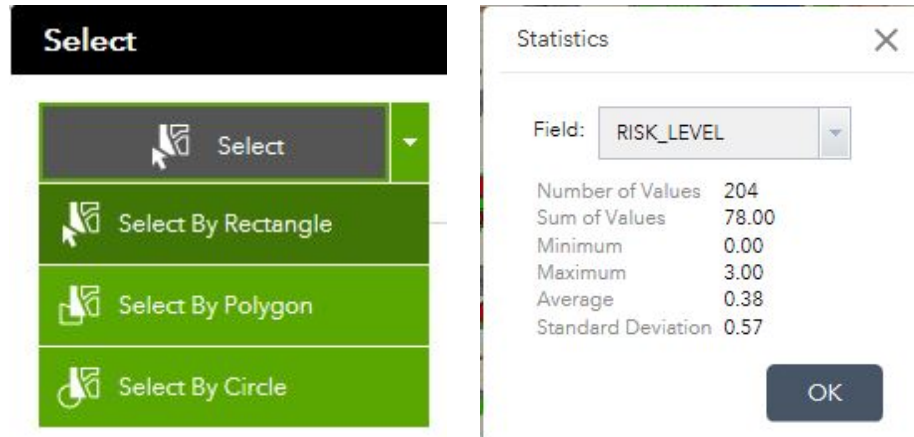


- Click on the play button to watch the monthly changes of sample point distributions. The play speed can be adjusted.
- Alternatively, you can click the forward and backward buttons to manually see the changes by month.
- Though the anchor points can be adjusted to see more than one month per frame, they are typically set to one month apart as show above.
- To turn the Time Slider off, simply click the Time Slider tool again.




## Select tool:

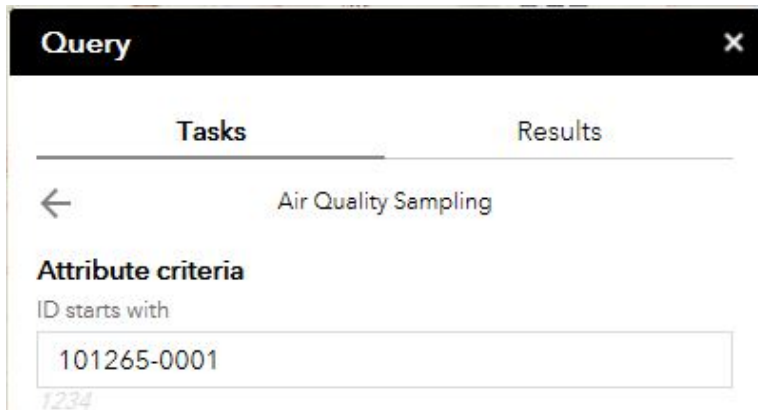
- In the upper left corner, click on the **Select** tool  to select and view statistics for specific group of sites. These can be selected by Rectangle, Polygon, or Circle. Clicking on **Statistics** will allow you to view the statistics for any field, for instance Risk Level.



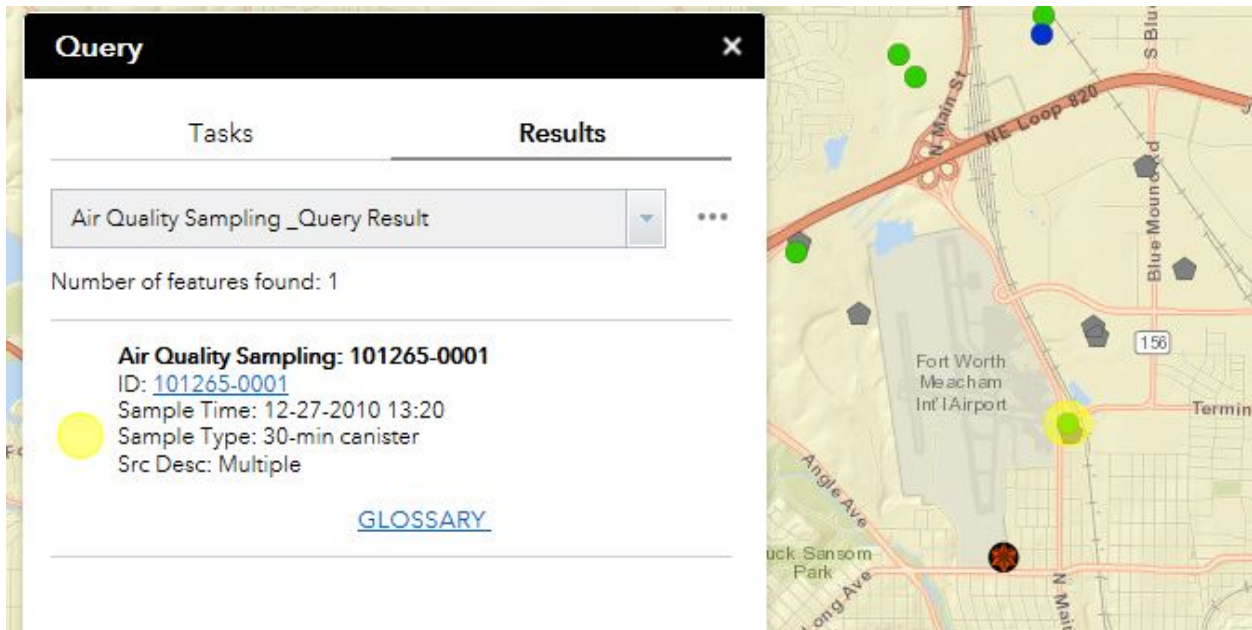


## Query tool:

- In the upper left corner, click on the **Query** tool  to search for a particular sample ID.



- The site is highlighted on the map and a summary appears in the list of results.
- Clicking on the **Glossary** link brings up the legend describing the different symbols and a glossary of terms related to the air monitors.



- In the Results list, click the **hyperlinked ID number** to view the scanned report describing the sampling at that location.

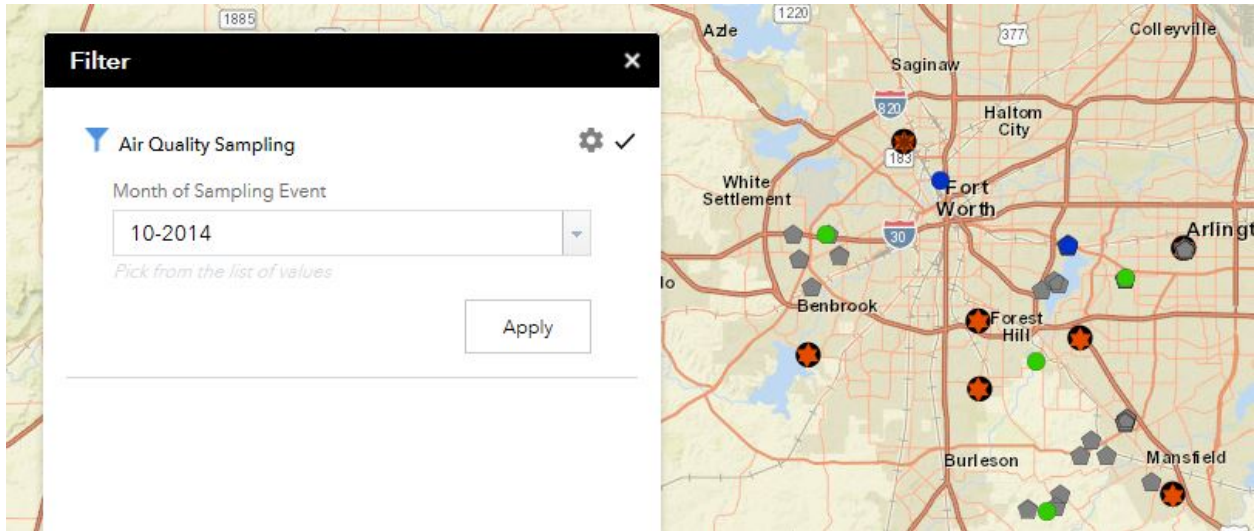

## Filter tool:

- In the upper left corner, click on the **Filter** tool  to select a particular month of sampling events from a drop-down list.





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# *Navigating Around the Map*

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## **Zoom Tools:**



**Pan** – Click and drag the cursor anywhere on the map to move the map up, down, left, and right.



**Zoom In** – Click this button once or multiple times to **zoom in** at fixed increments.



**Zoom Out** – Click this button once or multiple times to **zoom out** at fixed increments.



**Default Extent** - Clicking this button will take you to the full extent of the Barnett Shale Area.



**My Location** – If accessing the viewer on a mobile device, this button will zoom to your location.

## **Get Coordinates:**



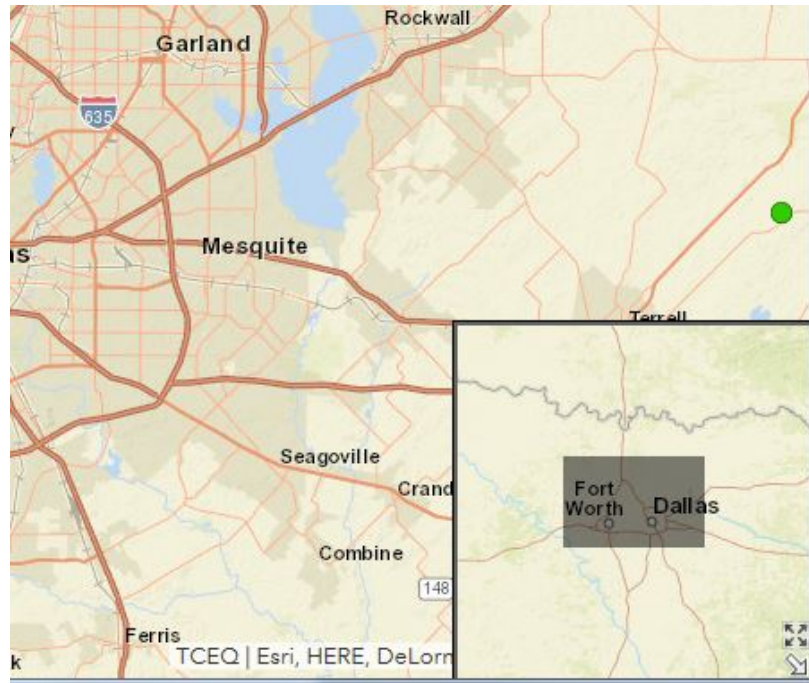
**Coordinate Tool** – Click this tool, then click anywhere on the map to obtain the coordinates in decimal degrees.

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# Overview Map

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## Overview Map:



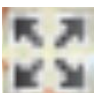
- **Click and drag** the gray box to reposition the main map.



**Close Overview Map** – Click white down arrow to turn off the overview map.



**Open Overview Map** – Click white up arrow to turn on the overview map.



**Maximize Overview Map** – Click to expand overview map to full screen.



**Minimize Overview Map** - Click to minimize the overview map back to the corner.
