BHHS CAMPUS

Beverly Hills High School (BHHS) is a college-oriented high school unique in its international population, high achievement, and emphasis on career education. BHUSD's mission is to deliver a rigorous and enriching quality education, and prepare all students to thrive as productive citizens in a complex, changing world. BHHS is the only comprehensive high school within the district. Students attend a **hybrid block schedule with four block schedule days in addition to late start days for staff professional development. Grades 9-11, students carry a minimum of six courses and in grade 12, students take at least five courses.**

63.90% of students are college ready meeting the A-G requirements for four year universities. On average 46% attend four year institutions including UCs, Cal States, Out of state, public/private, and a small percentage of international institutions while 44% of students choose to attend community college each year. On average 10% of students not attending a 2 year or 4 year choose Gap Year options, work, military/other. [Matriculation history found here.](#)

Faculty consists of 1 principal, 3 assistant principals, 21 athletic director, 2 school psychologists, 1 speech pathologist, 5 counselors, 1 college counselor, 2 wellness counselors, 1 career education coordinator, 1 nurse, 82 teachers, 9 special education teachers, and 2 on site technology coaches. To note: counselors write letter of recommendations for college.

GRADING

Grades at BHHS are given on an A - F scale:
90-100 = A 80-89 = B 70-79 = C 60-69 = D Below 60 = F

GPA CALCULATION

A cumulative grade point average is computed using a 4-point scale (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0; plus and minus grades are neutral). If a course is repeated, the highest grade received will be reflected in the student's overall GPA. Honors courses and Advanced Placement courses carry an additional grade point for calculation purposes. For example, an "A" in an Honors or AP course is worth 5 points.
