*New Scholarship

Clemson University Lyceum Scholarship (seniors) This renewable \$2500 scholarship is for students accepted to Clemson that are interested in becoming part of a cohort that studies the moral, political and economic foundations of a free society. Information and application is available at www.clemson.edu/capitalism/lyceum.html. **Deadline: December 15.**

COCA-COLA SCHOLARS PROGRAM (seniors) This scholarship is an achievement-based scholarship awarded to students in their final year of high school. Students are recognized for their capacity to lead and serve, as well as their commitment to making a significant impact on their schools and communities. 150 Coca-Cola Scholars are selected each year to receive this \$20,000 scholarship. Application and information available online at <https://www.coca-colascholarsfoundation.org/apply/>. **Deadline: September 30**

David M. Cline Scholarship (seniors): This is a one year \$2000 scholarship is for students who wish to further their education in law enforcement, criminal justice or forensic science and plan to attend a SC university/college. Applications and details are available at www.HamptonWildlifeFund.org/scholarship.html. **Deadline: January 31**

Davidson College John Montgomery Belk Scholarship (seniors) This scholarship is for seniors interested in attending Davidson College. Outstanding students will be selected based on integrity, intellectual enthusiasm and excellence, global awareness, and leadership ability and potential. Dormans may nominate two students to apply for this scholarship. **Deadline: Students interested in being nominated for this scholarship must submit a resume to Ms. Polson in Guidance by October 7.**

Harry Hampton Scholarship and Thomas W. Hardwick Jr. Scholarship (seniors) This a four year \$5000 per year scholarship. Students must be a full-time SC resident, plan to major in the natural resources (wildlife biology, fisheries biology, forestry or marine science), plan to attend a SC university/college and have a minimum 2.5 GPA. Applications and details are available at www.HamptonWildlifeFund.org. **Deadline: January 31**

James O. Thomason Scholarship (seniors) This a four year \$2000 per year scholarship. Students must be a full-time SC resident, plan to major in print or photo journalism, advertising, public relations or mass communications plan to attend a South Carolina university/college and have a minimum 2.5 GPA. Applications and details are available at www.HamptonWildlifeFund.org. **Deadline: January 31**

North Carolina State University Park Scholarship (seniors) This a four-year scholarship to NC State University awarded on the basis of outstanding accomplishments and potential in scholarship, leadership, service and character. Information and application available online at <https://park.ncsu.edu/apply/>. **Deadline:** Student must complete NC State Early Action and Park Scholarship application by **November 1.**

SOUTH CAROLINA HOPE SCHOLARSHIP (seniors) This is a state-awarded scholarship for year colleges/universities valued at \$2,800 for the first year only. Students that have a final minimum 3.0 GPA but do not qualify for the LIFE are eligible to receive this scholarship. Students who receive the SC HOPE and earn a 3.0 and earn and average 30 credit hours at the end of the first year of college may receive the LIFE Scholarship for the second year of college. No application is necessary for this scholarship. Eligibility is based on your final transcript.

SOUTH CAROLINA LIFE SCHOLARSHIP (seniors) This is a state-awarded scholarship valued at \$5000 per year. Students must meet two of the three requirements (1) your final, cumulative grade point average must be a minimum 3.0; (2) minimum 1100 SAT (combined critical reading and math sections) or 22 ACT; or (3) rank in the top 30% of your class at graduation. For a two year college students must have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA (the test score and class rank requirements are waived.) No application is necessary for this scholarship. Eligibility is based on your final transcript.

SOUTH CAROLINA PALMETTO FELLOWS SCHOLARSHIP (seniors) This is a state-awarded scholarship valued at \$6700 per year. Students may be eligible to apply if they meet the following **three** criteria: 1200 SAT/25 ACT, 3.5 GPA, top 6% of the class at the end of the sophomore, junior, or senior year; **or** meet the following **two** criteria 1400 SAT/31 ACT and 4.0 GPA at end of the junior or senior year. If you meet these criteria then please see Mrs. Polson in Guidance to complete an application. **Early Deadline: April 15**

QuestBridge National College Match (seniors) This program pairs high -achieving students with early admission and full four-year scholarships to top-ranked colleges. Student should be ranked in the top 5-10% and family's earnings are typically less than \$65,000 annually. Apply online at www.questbridge.org. **Deadline: September 26**

***UNC Thomas Wolfe Scholarship** (seniors) This is a full four -year scholarship to the University of North Carolina sponsored by the Creative Writing Program. Information and application is available at <https://englishcomplit.unc.edu/creative-writing/scholarships-and-awards/the-thomas-wolfe-scholarship/>. **Deadline: Students must apply to the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill by October 15 and submit an application to the Thomas Wolfe Scholarship by November 15.**

***University of Virginia Jefferson Scholarship** (seniors) This scholarship is for seniors interested in attending the University of Virginia. This scholarship seeks to find students who possess exceptional ability in leadership and scholarship and who show promise of making a significant contribution to UVA and to the society at large as graduates. Dormans may nominate **one** student to apply for this scholarship. **Deadline: Students interested in being nominated for this scholarship must submit a resume to Ms. Polson in Guidance by October 17.**

Wallace F. Pate Scholarship (seniors): This is a one-year \$2500 scholarship. Students must be a full-time SC resident, plan to major in the natural resources (wildlife biology, fisheries biology, forestry or marine science) and plan to attend a South Carolina university/college. Applications and details are available online at www.HamptonWildlifeFund.org. **Deadline January 31**
