

CPS ANNUAL **STAKEHOLDER** 2022-2023 SURVEY REPORT

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ABOUT THIS REPORT

The results presented in this report are from an annual stakeholder survey in Henrico County Public Schools. The survey was administered online in March through April 2023 to division students (grades 3–12), families and staff. Leadership in HCPS worked with researchers from the Metropolitan Educational Research Consortium (merc.soe.vcu.edu) in the School of Education at Virginia Commonwealth University to develop and edit the survey by reviewing together the HCPS strategic plan to develop survey items for students, families, and staff. Some additional questions were added that were not included in previous years and some questions included on previous surveys were removed due to irrelevant content.

While there are many parallel items across all three stakeholder groups, some were unique to only one or two. In total, there were 4,772 staff responses (68.2% response rate), 6,324 family responses (15.7% response rate), and 29,089 student responses (76.4% response rate). Versions of the survey in different languages were made available for families. Response totals vary by item as participant responses of "I can't answer this"

were omitted and some items only applied to a subset of respondents (for example, questions related to special education or English as a second language services). Survey items included a six-point response scale. This report contains average responses to all survey items, organized by the four cornerstones in the HCPS strategic plan. The results of this survey illustrate what went well in Henrico County Public Schools in the 2022-2023 school year and what the opportunities are for growth in the following year. Results are compared with the survey data last collected in Spring 2022. HCPS leadership will use these survey results to inform their ongoing work with students, educators, and families in Henrico.


