.32 INCH OF RAIN HAS FALLEN AT PORT COLUMBUS IN THE FIRST 12 HOURS OF JULY WHICH IS MORE THAN HALF THE TOTAL RECORDED HERE FOR LAST MONTH.

A STEADY LIGHT RAIN WHICH BEGAN SHORTLY AFTER MIDNIGHT HAS ENDED AND PRODUCED MORE THAN HALF THE TOTAL OF .71 INCH RECORDED HERE FOR THE ENTIRE MONTH OF JUNE. THAT TOTAL MADE JUNE 1984 THE DRIEST JUNE SINCE RECORD KEEPING BEGAN HERE IN 1878. THE PREVIOUS DRIEST JUNE WAS IN 1926 WHEN .96 INCH WAS RECORDED.

THE DRIEST SUMMER MONTH OF JUNE..JULY OR AUGUST ON RECORD WAS IN AUGUST OF 1924 WHEN .33 INCH OCCURRED. THE DRIEST OF ANY ONE MONTH ON RECORD WAS A SCANT .10 INCH IN OCTOBER OF 1924.
