650 AM EDT THU SEP 6 1984

A NEW RECORD LOW TEMPERATURE WAS SET AT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT THIS MORNING.

AT 644 AM THE TEMPERATURE FELL TO 40 DEGREES. THIS TEMPERATURE EXCEEDED THE PREVIOUS RECORD LOW OF 42 DEGREES WHICH WAS SET IN 1962.

AT 830AM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR AT PORT COLUMBUS INDICATED VERY STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER SOUTHERN MADISON COUNTY AND NORTHERN FAYETTE COUNTY OF CENTRAL OHIO MOVING EAST TOWARD PICKAWAY COUNTY AT 40 MPH.

FREQUENT DANGEROUS LIGHTNING..VERY HEAVY RAIN..STRONG GUSTY WINDS AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL MAY BE EXPECTED FROM THESE THUNDERSTORMS AS THEY CONTINUE EAST CROSSING PICKAWAY COUNTY BY 915AM.
