220 PM EST SUN NOV 10 1985

HEAVY RAINS MAY CAUSE SOME STREET FLOODING AND SMALL STREAM OVERFLOW IN LOW LYING AREAS OF CENTRAL OHIO THIS AFTERNOON.

SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WITH RAIN HEAVY AT TIMES ARE EXPECTED FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE AFTERNOON.

A SLOW MOVING COLD FRONT ACROSS NORTHERN OHIO WILL CONTINUE TO MOVE SOUTH THROUGH THE AREA TONIGHT.

PEOPLE DRIVING IN CENTRAL OHIO SHOULD BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR STREET FLOODING AND BE PREPARED TO TAKE ACTION.

THIS IS THE WETTEST NOVEMBER THIS CENTURY..WITH THE MONTH LESS THAN HALF OVER. THE PREVIOUS WETTEST NOVEMBER THIS CENTURY WAS 6.19 INCHES IN 1927 AND THE ALLTIME WETTEST 7.54 INCHES IN 1897.

RAINFALL BETWEEN ONE HALF AND ONE INCH MAY CAUSE SOME URBAN AND SMALL STREAM FLOODING IN THE CENTRAL OHIO AREA TONIGHT.

AT 1140 PM RAINFALL AT PORT COLUMBUS TOTALLED .62 FOR TODAY AND RAIN IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE OFF AND ON THROUGH THE NIGHT. PERSONS LIVING NEAR SMALL STREAMS OR IN POOR DRAINAGE AREAS SHOULD BE ON THE ALERT FOR POSSIBLE FLOODING TONIGHT.

445 AM EST SAT NOV 16 1985

A FLASH FLOOD WATCH IS IN EFFECT THIS MORNING FOR EAST CENTRAL AND SOUTH CENTRAL SECTIONS OF OHIO FOR TODAY. IN CENTRAL OHIO, THE FOLLOWING COUNTIES ARE AFFECTED..MUSKINGUN...MORGAN AND ATHENS.

AT 400 AM RAINFALL AT PORT COLUMBUS TOTALLED .93 SINCE THE RAIN BEGAN YESTERDAY AFTERNOON AND RAIN IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE THROUGH THE DAY. THE GROUND IS ALREADY SATURATED AND LITTLE ADDITIONAL RAINFALL IS NEEDED TO PRODUCE SMALL STREAM FLOODING AND POSSIBLY FLOODING OF LARGER CREEKS AND RIVER.

THE OHIO STATE HIGHWAY PATROL HAS ADVISED US THAT STATE ROUTE 752 IS CLOSED DUE TO FLOODING BETWEEN U. S. ROUTE 23 AND ASHVILLE PIKE AT THE RAILROAD UNDERPASS. ADDITIONAL FLOODING IN THE BALLOH ROAD AREA. ADDITIONAL STATEMENTS WILL BE ISSUED AS CONDITIONS WARRANT.

705 AM EST SAT NOV 16 1985

RAINFALL AT PORT COLUMBUS FROM MIDNIGHT THROUGH 7AM EST TOTALLED 0.24 INCHES. THIS BRINGS THE TOTAL RAINFALL FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER TO 7.70 INCHES.

THIS IS THE WETTEST NOVEMBER SINCE RECORDS WERE STARTED IN COLUMBUS ON JULY 1, 1878.

THE PREVIOUS RECORD WAS 7.54 INCHES SET IN 1897.

1230 PM EST MON NOV 18 1985

AS THE RAIN CONTINUES TO FALL IN COLUMBUS..SO DO PRECIPITATION RECORDS. SHOWERS MOVED THROUGH THE COLUMBUS AREA THIS MORNING..AND DROPPED AN ADDITIONAL .03 INCHES..BRINGING THE NOVEMBER 1985 TOTAL TO 8.20 INCHES. NOT ONLY IS THIS THE WETTEST NOVEMBER ON RECORD IN COLUMBUS..BUT WITH THIS MORNINGS RAINFALL..THIS MAKES NOVEMBER 1985 THE 13TH WETTEST MONTH ON RECORD...EDGING OUT THE JUNE 1969 TOTAL OF 8.19 INCHES.

THE PREVIOUS GREATEST AMOUNT IN A 24 HOUR PERIOD FOR NOVEMBER WAS 2.18 INCHES..BUT NOVEMBER 10-11,1985 SURPASSED THAT FIGURE WITH 2.47 INCHES. THERE IS A BRIGHT SIDE TO THIS SOGGY NOVEMBER..TEMPERATURES HAVE REMAINED ON THE MILD SIDE.

THROUGH THE 17TH OF NOVEMBER..THE DEPARTURE FROM NORMAL FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER IS PLUS 117 DEGREES..FOR AN AVERAGE OF ABOUT 7 DEGREES ABOVE NORMAL FOR EACH DAY.

THE LATEST FORECAST FOR COLUMBUS AND VICINITY CALLS FOR A HIGH ON TUESDAY OF AROUND 70 DEGREES. THE RECORD HIGH IN COLUMBUS FOR NOVEMBER 19TH IS 72 DEGREES..SET IN 1942.
