

RISK DISCLOSURE AND WARNINGS NOTICE FOR CFDs

Indication Investments Limited

CYSEC License number 164/12

Version 3.0.

1. Introduction

- 1.1. Indication Investments Ltd (“the Company”) is registered in Cyprus under the Companies Law, with registration number HE 290930 and is authorized and regulated by the Cyprus Securities and Exchange Commission (“CySEC”) as a Cyprus Investment Firm (“CIF”) with license number 164/12.
- 1.2. This risk disclosure and warning notice is provided to you (our Client and prospective Client) in compliance to the Provision of Investment Services, the Exercise of Investment Activities, the Operation of Regulated Markets and Other Related Matters Law 87(I)/2017 , as subsequently amended from time to time (“the Law”), which is applicable to Indication Investments Ltd (“the Company”).

2. Risk Disclosure

- 2.1. All Clients and prospective Clients should carefully read the following risk disclosure and warnings contained in this document, before applying to the Company for a trading account and before they begin to trade with the Company.
- 2.2. The following disclosures were designed to explain in general terms the nature of the risks involved when dealing in Financial Instruments on a fair and non-misleading basis and how the Company identifies, monitors, manages where applicable disclose potential conflicts of interest that may arise from time to time. It is noted that this document does not disclose or explain all of the risks and other significant aspects involved in dealing with Financial Instruments.
- 2.3. The Company executes Client orders in relation to the following Financial Instruments:
 - Financial contracts for differences (“CFDs”) in Stocks, Commodities, Indices, Currency Pairs (forex), Agriculture, Oil and Gas, Metals, Options, ETFs and Bonds. CFDs may also be referred to as “Financial Instruments” in this Notice.

3. Charges and Taxes

- 3.1. The Provision of Services by the Company to the Client is subject to fees, available on the Company’s website at <https://libertex.com/>. Before the Client begins to trade, he should obtain details of all fees, commissions, charges for which the Client will be liable. It is the Client’s responsibility to check for any changes in the charges.
- 3.2. If any charges are not expressed in monetary terms (but, for example, as a percentage of contract value), the Client should ensure that he understands what such charges are likely to amount to.

- 3.3. The Company may change its charges at any time, according to the provisions of the Client Agreement found on the Company's website.
- 3.4. There is a risk that the Client's trades in any Financial Instrument may be or become subject to tax and/or any other duty for example because of changes in legislation or his personal circumstances. The Company does not warrant that no tax and/or any other stamp duty will be payable. The Company does not offer tax advice and recommends that the Client seek advice from a competent tax professional if the Client has any questions.
- 3.5. The Client is responsible for any taxes and/or any other duty which may accrue in respect of his trades.
- 3.6. It is noted that taxes are subject to change without notice.
- 3.7. If required by applicable Law, the Company shall deduct at source from any payments due to the Client such amounts as are required by the tax authorities to be deducted in accordance with applicable Law.
- 3.8. It is possible that other costs, including taxes, relating to Transactions carried out on the Trading Platform(s) may arise for which the Client is liable and which are neither paid via us nor imposed by the Company. Although it is the Client's sole and entire responsibility to account for tax due and without derogating from this, the Client agrees that the Company may deduct tax, as may be required by the applicable law, with respect to his trading activity on the Trading Platform(s). The Client is aware that the Company has a right of set-off against any amounts in the Client's Trading Account with respect to such tax deductions.
- 3.9. It is noted that the Company's prices in relation to CFDs trading are set/quoted in accordance to the Company's Best Interest and Order Execution Policy which is available on the Company's website at <https://libertex.com/docs/en/summary-best-interest-and-order-execution-policy.pdf>. It is noted that Company's prices may be different from prices reported elsewhere. The prices displayed on the Company's Trading Platform(s) reflects the last known available price at the moment prior to placing any Order, however, the actual execution price of the Order may differ, in accordance with the Company's Best Interest and Order Execution Policy and Client Agreement. As such, the price that the Client receives when he opens or closes a position may not directly correspond to real time market levels at the point in time at which the sale of the CFD occurs or reflect the prices of third-party brokers/providers.

4. Third Party Risks

- 4.1. It is understood that the Company will promptly place any Client money it receives into one or more segregated account(s) (denoted as 'clients' accounts') with reliable financial institutions (within or outside Cyprus or the EEA) such as a credit institution or a bank in a third country. Although the Company shall exercise due skill, care and diligence in the selection of the financial institution according to Applicable Regulations, it is understood that there are circumstances beyond the control of the Company and hence the Company does not accept any liability or responsibility for any resulting losses to the Client as a result of the insolvency or any other analogous proceedings or failure of the financial institution where Client money will be held.
- 4.2. The financial institutions (of paragraph 3.1.) where Client money will be held may be within or outside Cyprus or the EEA. It is understood that the legal and regulatory regime applying to any such financial institution outside Cyprus, or the EEA will be different from that of Cyprus. Hence, in the event of the insolvency or any other equivalent failure or proceeding of that person, the Client's money may be treated differently from the treatment which would apply if the money was held in a Segregated Account in Cyprus.

- 4.3. The financial institutions to which the Company will pass Client money (as per paragraph 3.1.) may hold it in an omnibus account. Hence, in the event of the insolvency or any other analogous proceedings in relation to that financial institution, the Company may only have an unsecured claim against the financial institution on behalf of the Client, and the Client will be exposed to the risk that the money received by the Company from the financial institution is insufficient to satisfy the claims of the Client.
- 4.4. It is understood that the Company executes Clients' orders as principal to principal against the Client, i.e. the Company is the sole Execution Venue for the execution of the Client's Order. There are instances however, where the Company may decide at its own discretion to place an order for execution to a third-party Execution Venue i.e. the Company is not the Execution Venue for the execution of the Client's Orders. The Company transmits Client Orders or arranges for their execution with a third party (ies) known as Straight Through Process (STP and is explained in the "Summary Best Interest and Order Execution Policy" found at <https://libertex.com/docs/en/summary-best-interest-and-order-execution-policy.pdf>. In the event of lack of liquidity of the Liquidity Provider after a successful Order for the Client, the Company will not be in a position to settle the transaction for the Client (i.e. pay the Client the Difference of his successful trade).

5. Insolvency

- 5.1. The Company's insolvency or default may lead to positions being liquidated or closed out without the Client's consent.

6. Investor Compensation Fund

- 6.1. The Company participates in the Investor Compensation Fund for clients of Investment Firms regulated in the Republic of Cyprus. Claims of the covered Clients against the Company may be compensated by the Investor Compensation Fund where the Company is unable, due to its financial circumstances. Compensation shall not exceed twenty thousand Euro (EUR 20.000) for each entitled Client. For more details please refer to the "Investor Compensation Fund" found on our website at <https://libertex.com/docs/en/investor-compensation-fund.pdf>.

7. Technical Risks

- 7.1. The Client and not the Company shall be responsible for the risks of financial losses caused by failure, malfunction, interruption, disconnection or malicious actions of information, communication, electricity, electronic or other systems, which are not the result of gross negligence or willful default of the Company.
- 7.2. If the Client undertakes transactions on an electronic system, he will be exposed to risks associated with the system including the failure of hardware, software, servers, communication lines and internet failure. The result of any such failure may be that his order is either not executed according to his instructions or it is not executed at all. The Company does not accept any liability in the case of such a failure, not owed to the Company's gross negligence or willful default. The Company strives on a best effort basis to provide the Client with a secure and smooth online experience. However, the Client acknowledges the risk that should third parties (hackers) launch a coordinated attack against Company systems that there may be a disruption of services that may result in Client losses. The Company does not accept any liability resulting from such attacks to the extent that the Company has taken all reasonable measures on a best effort basis to fend off such malicious actions.

- 7.3. The Client acknowledges that the unencrypted information transmitted by e-mail is not protected from any unauthorized access.
- 7.4. At times of excessive deal flow the Client may have some difficulties to be connected over the phone or the Company's Platform(s)/system(s), especially in fast Market (for example, when key macroeconomic indicators are released).
- 7.5. The Client acknowledges that the internet may be subject to events which may affect his access to the Company's Website and/or the Company's trading Platform(s)/system(s), including but not limited to interruptions or transmission blackouts, software and hardware failure, internet disconnection, public electricity network failures or hacker attacks. The Company is not responsible for any damages or losses resulting from such events which are beyond its control or for any other losses, costs, liabilities, or expenses (including, without limitation, loss of profit) which may result from the Client's inability to access the Company's Website and/or Trading System(s) or delay or failure in sending orders or Transactions, not owed to the Company's gross negligence or willful default.
- 7.6. In connection with the use of computer equipment and data and voice communication networks, the Client bears the following risks amongst other risks in which cases the Company has no liability of any resulting loss:
- (a) Power cut of the equipment on the side of the Client or the provider, or communication operator (including voice communication) that serves the Client;
 - (b) Physical damage (or destruction) of the communication channels used to link the Client and provider (communication operator), provider, and the trading or information server of the Client;
 - (c) Outage (unacceptably low quality) of communication via the channels used by the Client, or the Company or the channels used by the provider, or communication operator (including voice communication) that are used by the Client or the Company;
 - (d) Wrong or inconsistent with requirements settings of the Client Terminal;
 - (e) Untimely update of the Client Terminal;
 - (f) When carrying out transactions via the telephone (land or cell phone lines) voice communication, the Client runs the risk of problematic dialing, when trying to reach an employee of the broker service department of the Company due to communication quality issues and communication channel loads;
 - (g) The use of communication channels, hardware and software, generate the risk of non-reception of a message (including text messages) by the Client from the Company;
 - (h) Trading over the phone might be impeded by overload of connection;
 - (i) Malfunction or non-operability of the Platform(s), which also includes the Client Terminal.
- 7.7. The Client may suffer financial losses caused by the materialization of the above risks, the Company accepting no responsibility or liability in the case of such a risk materializing and the Client shall be responsible for all related losses he may suffer, to the extent that these are not owed to the Company's gross negligence or willful default.

8. Trading Platform

- 8.1. The Client is warned that when trading in an electronic platform(s) he assumes risk of financial loss which may be a consequence of amongst other things:
- a) Failure of Client's devices, software and poor quality of connection.

- b) The Company's or Client's hardware or software failure, malfunction or misuse.
 - c) Improper work of Client's equipment.
 - d) Wrong setting of Client's Terminal.
 - e) Delayed updates of Client's Terminal.
- 8.2. The Client acknowledges that only one Instruction is allowed to be in the queue at one time. Once the Client has sent an Instruction, any further Instructions sent by the Client are ignored and the "orders is locked" message appears until the first Instruction is executed.
- 8.3. It is understood that the connection between the Client Terminal and the Company's Server may be disrupted at some point and some of the Quotes may not reach the Client Terminal.
- 8.4. The Client acknowledges that when the Client closes the order placing/ deleting window or the position opening/closing window, the Instruction, which has been sent to the Server, shall not be cancelled.
- 8.5. Orders may be executed one at a time while being in the queue. Multiple orders from the same Client Account at the same time may not be executed.
- 8.6. The Client acknowledges that when the Client closes the Order, it shall not be cancelled.
- 8.7. In case the Client has not received the result of the execution of the previously sent Order but decides to repeat the Order, the Client shall accept the risk of making two Transactions instead of one.
- 8.8. The Client acknowledges that if the Pending Order has already been executed but the Client sends an instruction to modify its level, the only instruction, which will be executed, is the instruction to modify Stop Loss and/or Take Profit levels on the position opened when the Pending Order triggered.

9. Communication between the Client and the Company

- 9.1. The Client shall accept the risk of any financial losses caused by the fact that the Client has received with delay or has not received at all any notice from the Company.
- 9.2. The Client acknowledges that the unencrypted information transmitted by e-mail is not protected from any unauthorized access.
- 9.3. The Company has no responsibility if unauthorized third persons have access to information, including electronic addresses, electronic communication and personal data, access data when the above are transmitted between the Company and the Client or when using the internet or other network communication facilities, telephone, or any other electronic means.

10. Force Majeure Events

- 10.1. In case of a Force Majeure Event the Company may not be in a position to arrange for the execution of Client Orders or fulfill its obligations under the agreement with the Client found at <https://libertex.com/docs/en/cfds-trading-client-agreement.pdf>. As a result the Client may suffer financial loss.
- 10.2. The Company will not be liable or have any responsibility for any type of loss or damage arising out of any failure, interruption, or delay in performing its obligations under this Agreement where such failure, interruption or delay is due to a Force Majeure event.

11. Abnormal Market Conditions

- 11.1. The Client acknowledges that under Abnormal Market Conditions the period during which the Orders are executed may be extended or it may be impossible for Orders to be executed at declared prices or may not be executed at all.
- 11.2. Abnormal Market Conditions include but not limited to times of rapid price fluctuations of the price, rises or falls in one trading session to such an extent that, under the rules of the relevant exchange, trading is suspended or restricted, or there is lack of liquidity, or this may occur at the opening of trading sessions.

12. Foreign Currency

- 12.1. When a Financial Instrument is traded in a currency other than the currency of the Client's country of residence, any changes in the exchange rates may have a negative effect on its value, price and performance and may lead to losses for the Client.

13. Conflicts of Interest

- 13.1. When the Company deals with the Client, the Company, an associate, a relevant person or some other person connected with the Company may have an interest, relationship or arrangement that is material in relation to the Transaction/Order concerned or that it conflicts with the Client's interest.
- 13.2. The following includes the major circumstances which constitute or may give rise to a conflict of interest entailing a material risk of damage to the interests of one or more Clients, as a result of providing investment services:
- a) the Company may execute Clients Orders with entities belonging to the Company's Group of Companies where the revenues of those entities is largely generated from Client's trading losses;
 - b) the Company may receive or pay inducements to or from third parties due to the referral of new Clients or Clients' trading;
- 13.3. For more information about the conflicts of interest and the procedures and controls that the Company follows to manage the identified conflicts of interest, please refer to the Company's Summary of Conflicts of Interest Policy found on the Company's website at <https://libertex.com/docs/en/summary-of-conflicts-of-interest-policy.pdf>.

14. Appropriateness

- 14.1. The Company requires the Client to pass through an appropriateness test during the application process and warns the Client if trading in CFDs or is not appropriate for him, based on the information provided. Any decision whether or not to open a Trading Account, and or whether or not you understand the risks lies with you.

15. INFORMATION ON RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH COMPLEX FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS OVER THE COUNTER (OTC)

15.1. Trading CFDs can put Client's capital at risk as CFDs are categorized as high risk complex Financial Instruments and Clients may lose the amount invested. Trading CFDs may not be suitable for all investors (refer to section 13).

The investment decisions made by the Clients are subject to various markets, currency, economic, political, business risks etc., and will not necessarily be profitable.

The Client acknowledges and without any reservation accepts that, notwithstanding any general information which may have been given by the Company, the value of any investment in Financial Instruments may fluctuate either upwards or downwards. The Client acknowledges and without any reservation accepts the existence of a substantial risk of incurring losses and damages as a result of buying or selling any Financial Instrument and acknowledges his willingness to take such risk.

Set out below is an outline of the major risks and other significant aspects of CFDs trading:

Trading CFDs is VERY SPECULATIVE AND HIGHLY RISKY and is not suitable for all members of the general public but only for those investors who:

- a) understand and are willing to assume the economic, legal and other risks involved.
- b) taking into account their personal financial circumstances, financial resources, lifestyle and obligations are financially able to assume the loss of their entire investment.
- c) have the knowledge to understand CFDs trading and the Underlying assets and Markets.
- d) you have experience with trading in volatile markets.

15.2. The Company will not provide the Client with any advice relating to CFDs the Underlying Assets and Markets or make investment recommendations including occasions where the Client shall request such advice and/or recommendation. However, the Company may provide the Client with information and tools produced by third parties on an "as is" basis (i.e. the Company does not approve, or endorse, or affect the said information and or tools), which may be indicative of trading trends or trading opportunities. The Client accepts and understands that taking any actions based on the information and/or tools provided by third parties may result in losses and or general reduction of value of the Client's assets. The Company does not accept liability for any such losses resulting from actions taken by the Client on the basis of information and or tools produced by third parties.

15.3. CFDs are derivative financial instruments deriving their value from the prices of the underlying assets/markets in which they refer to (for example currency, equity indices, stocks, metals, indices futures, forwards etc.). It is important therefore that the Client understands the risks associated with trading in the relevant underlying asset/market because fluctuations in the price of the underlying asset/market will affect the profitability of his trade. 15.4. Information of the previous performance of CFDs the Underlying Assets and Markets does not guarantee its current and/or future performance. The use of historical data does not constitute a binding or safe forecast as to the corresponding future performance of the CFDs to which the said information refers.

- 15.5. Volatility: Some Financial Instruments trade within wide intraday ranges with volatile price movements. Therefore, the Client must carefully consider that there is a high risk of losses. The price of a Financial Instrument is derived from the price of the Underlying Asset in which the Financial Instruments refers to. Financial Instruments and related Underlying Markets can be highly volatile. The prices of Financial Instruments and the Underlying Asset may fluctuate rapidly and over wide ranges and may reflect unforeseeable events or changes in conditions, none of which can be controlled by the Client or the Company. Under certain market conditions it may be impossible for a Client Order to be executed at declared prices leading to losses. The prices of Financial Instruments and the Underlying Assets will be influenced by, among other things, changing supply and demand relationships, governmental, agricultural, commercial and trade programs and policies, national and international political and economic events and the prevailing psychological characteristics of the relevant market place.
- 15.6. Liquidity: Liquidity risk refers to the capacity to readily monetize assets without suffering a significant discount in their prices. The Client accepts and acknowledges that the Underlying Instruments on some Derivative Products on offer by the Company may be inherently illiquid or sometimes face persistent liquidity strains due to adverse market conditions. Illiquid Underlying Assets may exhibit high levels of volatility in their prices and consequently a higher degree of risk, this typically leads to larger gaps in ASK and BID prices for an Underlying Instrument than would otherwise prevail under liquid market conditions. These large gaps may be reflected on the prices of the Derivative Product the Company offers.
- 15.7. Off-exchange transactions in Derivative Financial Instruments: CFDs offered by the Company are off-exchange transactions (i.e. over-the-counter). The trading conditions are set by us (in line with the trading conditions received by our liquidity providers), subject to any obligations we have to provide best execution, to act reasonably and in accordance with our Client Agreement and with our Best Interest and Order Execution Policy. Each CFD trade that the Client opens through our Trading Platform(s) results in the entering of an Order with the Company; such Orders can only be closed with the Company and are not transferable to any other person.
- While some off-exchange markets are highly liquid, transactions in off-exchange or non-transferable derivatives may involve greater risk than investing in on-exchange derivatives because there is no exchange market on which to close out an Open Position. It may be impossible to liquidate an existing position, to assess the value of the position arising from an off-exchange transaction or to assess the exposure to risk. Prices need not be quoted, and, even where they are, they will be established by dealers in these instruments and consequently it may be difficult to establish what a fair price is.
- The Company is using an Online Trading System(s) for transactions in CFDs which does not fall into the definition of a Regulated Market or Multilateral Trading Facility and as such does not have the same protection.
- 15.8. No Clearing House protection: The Transactions in the Financial Instruments offered by the Company are not currently subject to exchange or clearing house requirements/obligations.
- 15.9. No Delivery: It is understood that the Client has no rights or obligations in respect to the Underlying Assets/Instruments relating to the CFDs he is trading. There is no delivery of the Underlying Asset and all CFD contracts are settled in cash.
- 15.10. Suspensions of Trading: Under certain trading conditions it may be difficult or impossible to liquidate a position. This may occur, for example, at times of rapid price movement if the price rises or falls in one trading session to such an extent that under the rules of the relevant exchange trading is suspended or restricted.

Placing a Stop Loss will not necessarily limit the Client's losses to the intended amounts, because market conditions may make it impossible to execute such an Order at the stipulated price. In addition, under certain market conditions the execution of a Stop Loss Order may be worse than its stipulated price and the realized losses can be larger than expected.

15.11. Slippage: Slippage is the difference between the expected price of a Transaction in a CFD or, and the price the Transaction is actually executed at. Slippage often occurs during periods of higher volatility (for example due to news events) making an Order at a specific price impossible to execute and also when large Orders are executed when there may not be enough interest at the desired price level to maintain the expected price of trade.

15.12. Leverage: In order to place a CFD Order, the Client is required to maintain a margin. Margin is usually a relatively modest proportion of the overall contract value. This means that the Client will be trading using "leverage" (the "multiplier feature"). This means a relatively small market movement can lead to a proportionately much larger movement in the value of the Client's position, and this can work either against the Client or for the Client.

At all times during which the Client opens trades, they must maintain enough equity, consider all running profits and losses, for meeting the margin requirements. If the market moves against the Client's position and/or Margin requirements are increased, may result in closure of the Client's position(s) by the Company on his behalf and he will be liable for any resulting loss or deficit.

It is important that you monitor your positions closely because the effect of leverage (the "multiplier feature") ,speeds the occurrence of profits or losses. It is your responsibility to monitor your trades and while you have open trades you should always be in a position to do so.

15.13. Margin: The Client acknowledges and accepts that, regardless of any information which may be offered by the Company, the value of CFDs may fluctuate downwards or upwards and it is even probable that the investment may become of no value. This is owed to the margin system applicable to such trades, which generally involves a comparatively modest deposit or margin in terms of the overall contract value, so that a relatively small movement in the Underlying Market can have a disproportionately dramatic effect on the Client's trade.

The Company may change its Margin requirements, according to the provisions of the Client Agreement found on the Company's website at <https://libertex.com/docs/en/cfds-trading-client-agreement.pdf>.

15.14. Risk-reducing Orders or Strategies: The Company makes available certain Orders (e.g. "stop-loss" orders, where permitted under local law, or "stop-limit" Orders), which are intended to limit losses to certain amounts. Such Orders may not be adequate given that markets conditions make it impossible to execute such Orders, e.g. due to illiquidity in the market. We aim to deal with such Orders fairly and promptly but the time taken to fill the Order and level at which the Order is filled depends upon the underlying market. In fast-moving markets a price for the level of your Order might not be available, or the market might move quickly and significantly away from the stop level before we fill it.

Strategies using combinations of positions, such as "spread" and "straddle" positions may be as risky as taking simple "long" or "short" positions. Therefore Stop Limit and Stop Loss Orders cannot guarantee the limit of loss.

15.15.Swap Values: If a Client holds any positions overnight then an applicable swap charge will apply. The swap values are clearly stated on the Company's website at <https://libertex.com/specification/> and accepted by the Client during the account registration process as they are described in the Company's Agreement.

The swap rate is mainly dependent on the level of interest rates as well as the Company's fee for having an open position overnight. The Company has the discretion to change the level of the swap rate on each CFD at any given time and the Client acknowledges that he will be informed by the Company's website. The Client further acknowledges that he is responsible for reviewing the CFDs specifications located on the Company's websites for being updated on the level of swap value prior to placing any order with the Company.

16. Advice and Recommendations

- 16.1. When placing Orders with the Company, the Company will not advise the Client about the merits of a particular Transaction or give him any form of investment advice and the Client acknowledges that the Services do not include the provision of investment advice in CFDs or the Underlying Markets. The Client alone will enter into Transactions and take relevant decisions based on his own judgment. In asking the Company to enter into any Transaction, the Client represents that he has been solely responsible for making his own independent appraisal and investigation into the risks of the Transaction. He represents that he has sufficient knowledge, market sophistication, professional advice and experience to make his own evaluation of the merits and risks of any Transaction. The Company gives no warranty as to the suitability of the products traded under this Agreement and assumes no fiduciary duty in its relations with the Client.
- 16.2. The Company will not be under any duty to provide the Client with any legal, tax or other advice relating to any Transaction. The Client should seek independent expert advice if he is in any doubt as to whether he may incur any tax liabilities. The Client is hereby warned that tax laws are subject to change from time to time.
- 16.3. The Company may, from time to time and at its discretion, provide the Client (or in newsletters which it may post on its Website or provide to subscribers via its Website or the Trading Platform(s) or otherwise) with information, recommendations, news, market commentary or other information but not as a service.

Where it does so:

- the Company will not be responsible for such information;
- the Company gives no representation, warranty or guarantee as to the accuracy, correctness or completeness of such information or as to the tax or legal consequences of any related Transaction;
- this information is provided solely to enable the Client to make his own investment decisions and does not amount to investment advice or unsolicited financial promotions to the Client;
- if the document contains a restriction on the person or category of persons for whom that document is intended or to whom it is distributed, the Client agrees that he will not pass it on to any such person or category of persons;

- the Client accepts that prior to dispatch, the Company may have acted upon it itself to make use of the information on which it is based. The Company does not make representations as to the time of receipt by the Client and cannot guarantee that he will receive such information at the same time as other clients.

16.4. It is understood that market commentary, news, or other information provided or made available by the Company are subject to change and may be withdrawn at any time without notice.

17. No Guarantees of Profit

17.1. The Company provides no guarantees of profit nor of avoiding losses when trading in Financial Instruments. The Company cannot guarantee the future performance of the Client's Trading Account, promise any specific level of performance or promise that Client's investment decisions, strategies, will be successful/profitable. Customer has received no such guarantees from the Company or from any of its representatives. Customer is aware of the risks inherent in trading in Financial Instruments and is financially able to bear such risks and withstand any losses incurred. The Client acknowledges and accepts that there may be other additional risks apart from those mentioned above.

18. Virtual Currencies

18.1. Before proceeding with any CFD trading in virtual currencies (i.e: Bitcoin, Bitcoin Cash, Litecoin), clients are warned on the following:

- such products are complex and high risk and as such come with a high risk of losing all the invested capital
- virtual currencies values can widely fluctuate (high volatility) and may result in significant loss over a short period of time

19. Risks

19.1. **Counterparty Risk:** In relation to CFDs, we are the counterparty of all your trades. None of our CFD products are listed on an exchange, nor can any rights, benefits or obligations be transferred to anyone else. While we undertake our obligation to provide you with the best execution and to act reasonably and in accordance with our published terms and conditions, CFDs opened on your account with us must be closed with us, based on our prices and conditions. CFDs are contracts with us as your counterparty, are not traded on a regulated exchange and are not cleared on a central clearinghouse. Thus, exchange and clearinghouse rules and protections do not apply to trading CFDs with us.

19.2. **Counterparty Credit Risk:** As a counterparty to your CFD trades, you are exposed to the financial and business risks, including credit risk, associated with dealing with us. That is, in the unlikely event that we were to become insolvent, we may be unable to meet our obligations to you.

19.3. **Market Risk:** CFD trading associated with the risk of sudden market fluctuation. CFD trading depends on the price movement of an underlying asset and therefore you are exposed to risks equivalent to holding the underlying assets.

19.4. **Volatility Risk:** The markets for CFDs can be extremely volatile. The prices of CFDs which depend on the prices of the underlying assets may fluctuate rapidly and over wide ranges. The prices of CFDs are influenced by the market price of an underlying asset, the earnings and performance of a company or companies whose shares comprise the underlying asset or a related index, the overall performance of the economy, changes in supply and demand for the underlying asset or related instruments and indices, governmental, commercial and trade programs and policies, interest rates, national and international political and economic events and the prevailing psychological characteristics of the relevant marketplace.

In addition to the above, unexpected movements in the underlying asset price may result in substantial profit and loss on your trades. It must be noted that markets might not move effectively, and price gaps could appear when quotes are given widely apart from one another. It's possible that you won't always have the opportunity to place an order or that our platform will execute your order at the price you've chosen. One of the consequences of this could be that Stop Loss orders are executed at unfavourable prices that are either higher or lower than you may have anticipated.

19.5. **Currency Risk:** When you are trading CFDs on an underlying asset in a different currency from the currency that your account is based on, fluctuations in the exchange rate affect your profit and loss.

Trades in CFDs that are denominated in a currency other than the base currency or the currency that your account is based on, all margins, profits, losses, credits and debits in relation to that CFD deal are calculated using the currency in which the CFD is denominated.

19.6. **Interest Rate Fluctuation Risk:** Interest rates are subject to fluctuation, which could have an impact on financing expenses or rebates associated with long or short CFD positions. This will impact your overall gains or losses as well.

19.7. **Regulatory and Taxation Changes Risk:** Changes in taxation and other laws, government, and regulatory policies might affect the value of your CFDs. The tax you pay on CFDs and the total return on the products.

19.8. **Liquidity Risk:** You may not be able under certain circumstances to close your position at the current price. The Company is not obligated to provide quotes for any CFD at any time and does not guarantee the continuous availability of quotations or trading for any CFD. The Company may at its sole discretion cease quoting CFDs and/or cease entering new CFD transactions at any time based on lack of market data, halts or suspensions or errors or illiquidity or volatility in the market for the underlying asset, or the Company's own risk or profit parameters, technical errors, communication problems, market or political or economic or governmental events or for other reasons.

19.9. **Uninvested Funds Risks:** When you keep uninvested funds on your Libertex account, the Company may deposit your money with EU financial institutions (Term Deposits or Regular Bank Deposits) and/or hold it with (fund name) on your behalf, and you might be eligible to receive interest from the Company on uninvested cash.

It should be noted that when the Company deposit your uninvested funds with EU financial institutions while your uninvested funds will continue to protected as Client's funds, that can still expose them to certain risks, such as:

- Regular Bank Deposits

- a) **Inflation:** Inflation risk occurs when the rate of inflation outpaces the amount of interest received, and may result in your money gradually losing value due to inflation. In this scenario the interest rate you may be capable of receiving from the Company might not increase at the same rate as rising costs.
- b) **Credit Risk:** Credit risk occurs when the financial institution that your uninvested cash is deposited becomes insolvent, you might lose a part of your funds. The Company always carefully selects financial institutions and monitors their creditworthiness and reputation in order to manage this risk. However, you might be eligible to recover a part of your money from a protection scheme.

19.10. **Qualifying Money Market Funds:** Uninvested funds that are held by the Company with QMMFs, the relevant units or shares will be considered Clients' assets and will be held in safe custody assets in line with the Client asset rules. It must be noted that QMMFs are money market funds, managed by a fund manager and typically invest in low-risk vehicles such as government bonds. QMMFs must meet higher regulatory standards for quality and liquidity than other market funds and offer an alternative way to hold your funds without compromising their security. Despite the above, as with any investment, there are particular risks that apply:

- a) **Credit Risk:** If the QMMFs that your uninvested cash is deposited becomes insolvent, you might lose a part of your funds. The Company always carefully selects highly regulated QMMFs and monitors their creditworthiness and reputation in order to manage this risk.
- b) **Management Risk:** The performance of an investment can be affected in the scenario that the QMMFs fund manager makes poor investment decisions or strategies that may result in lower returns or increased risk.
- c) **Interest Rate Risk:** Variations in the base interest rate may have an impact on the value of the units or shares in QMMFs. The value of existing underlying assets, such as government bonds with lower interest rates, may decrease in such a situation where base interest rates rise.
- d) **Liquidity Risk:** QMMFs are intended to be highly liquid, allowing investors to withdraw their money at any time. However extreme market conditions could impact this. In certain circumstances a large volume of withdrawal requests could possibly lead to delays.
