

Introduction

This lesson covers itemized deductions, including which expenses taxpayers can include in their itemized deductions. The lesson also explains how to calculate taxable income.

Objectives

Determine if a taxpayer should itemize deductions.

Determine the type of expenses that qualify as itemized deductions.

Accurately report itemized deductions on Schedule A.

Key Terms

Adjusted Gross Income (AGI): The taxpayer's total adjusted gross income (AGI) is the amount used to compute some limitations, such as the medical and dental deduction on Schedule A and the credit for child and dependent care expenses.

Itemized Deductions: Itemized deductions allow taxpayers to reduce their taxable income based on specific personal expenses. If the total itemized deductions are greater than the standard deduction, it will result in a lower taxable income and lower tax.

Standard Deduction: An amount provided by law and based on filing status, age, blindness, and dependency that taxpayers can deduct from their adjusted gross income before tax is determined.

	Ask: Who would likely benefit from itemizing their deductions? Answer: Taxpayers who have mortgage interest or a very large amount of unreimbursed medical/dental expenses compared to their income.	Link & Learn Taxes (L<) Itemized Deductions, Who Should Itemize?

Remind students that casualty and theft losses are out of scope for VITA/TCE.

Refer to Pub 4012 Interview Tips and step through the questions in order to determine if a taxpayer should itemize.

Review the Tax Map.

Medical and Dental Expenses

Refer students to Pub 502, Medical and Dental Expenses showing deductible and nondeductible expenses. Refer to Pub 4012 for the applicable percentage for the tax year.

Remind students that qualified expenses do not include life insurance premiums, vitamins, or reimbursed hospital expenses.

Step through Pub 4012, Interview Tips about medical expenses.

Ask students to read examples in Pub 502, Medical and Dental Expenses, Whose Medical Expenses Can You Include?

Review the Tax Topics.

Demonstrate TaxSlayer, Schedule A for Medical and Dental Expenses. Show students how the form walks through the computation.

Taxes that May be Deductible

Refer students to Pub 17, Taxes Paid chapter, table Which Taxes can You Deduct?

Ask: Are state sales tax or and state and local taxes deductible?

Answer: Taxpayers may deduct either sales tax or state and local income tax, but not both.

Point out Deduction of state and local income, sales, and property taxes is a combined, total deduction of \$10,000 (\$5,000 if married filing separately).

Point out that foreign income taxes may be claimed either as an itemized deduction or as a nonrefundable credit. Refer to the Foreign Tax Credit article on IRS.gov.

Interest Paid

Refer students to Pub 936, Home Mortgage Interest Deduction:

- Figure A Is My Home Mortgage Interest Fully Deductible?
- Figure B Are My Points Fully Deductible This Year?

Point out the deduction for home equity mortgage interest is not allowed unless it was used to build, buy, or improve the taxpayer's qualified residence.

Review what types of interest are not deductible.

Remind students that refinance points and personal interest are not deductible. Points from refinancing

Miscellaneous Deductions

Review Miscellaneous Deductions topic.

Ask which itemized deductions are subject to 2% limit. **Answer:** All itemized deductions subject to the 2% of AGI limitation are not allowed through the end of 2025. This includes employee business expenses.

Caution students that gambling losses in excess of winnings are not deductible.

Discuss what types of miscellaneous expenses are deductible.

Refer students to Pub 17, Miscellaneous Deductions chapter.
