HARDENBERGH

Hardenberg is an ancient family name of Greek origin. The name probably refers to the Hartz mountains, the German Hartzgebirge. In Hanover, Germany, near Gottingen, and just outside the village of Norten, may be seen the ruins of Castle Hardenberg. They are considered among the largest and finest ruins of Germany.

The annals of the noble ancestry reach back into the twelfth century, to 1174, when the old castle was the home of Dietrick von Hardenberg.

In the fifteenth century the branch of this noble family whose descendants finally came to America, removed to Holland. In Holland the letter "H" was added to the German name. They have left as a memorial of their presence in that country, the town of Hardenbergh on the River Vechte, twenty-three miles from Zwolle, the capital of Overysse.

in 1644 the first Hardenbergh to appear on record in America was Arnoldus von Hardengergh, a free merchant of New Amsterdam. He cast anchor off Manhattan Island, bringing a cargo for his brother Jan. In 1645 he was chosen as one of the "Nine Men" to govern the new colony.

The Hardenbergh Family has been one of the most respected and influential in Ulster County, New York, its members occupying positions of trust and responsibility in church and in state, in peace and in war.

The branch of the family moving to Cass County, Iowa, came here in 1858, and were among the earliest settlers in the county.

Following are some who have borne the name and who are not included in the lineage.

Carl August, Prince of Hardenbergh, born at Enenroda, Germany, 1750, died Genoa 1822. An illustrious Prussian Statesman.

Albrecht Hardenbergh, born 1510, at Hardenbergh, Holland. An eminent divine who gained notoriety in church history for his attempt to introduce into the Republic of Bremen, the doctrine of Calvin respecting the Lord's Supper.

Jan von Hardenbergh

brother to Arnoldus, cam to America prior to 1664 from Maarden, Near Utrecht. Held a land deed given April 30, 1659 to what is now the corner of Broad and Stone Streets, New York City. His son:

Gerritt Janse Hardenbergh

owner and captain of sloop, the Royal Albany. appears on record at Albany 1667. Married 1666 to Jaepie Schepmoes, Dau. Jan Jansen Schepmoes. His children: Seven Daughters and one son, Johannes.

Johannes Hardenbergh

Trustee of Kingston 1707-12; Major Ulster County Militia 1728; Member of Colonial Assembly 1737-45. One of the proprietors of the Great or Hardenbergh Patent of two million acres of land in Ulster, Greene, Sullivan, Orange and Delaware counties. Offered his services in Queen Anne's War 1702, and for his bravery at the Battle of Blenheim was awarded the title of Sir. Born about 1670 at Albany.

Married 1 - Hillegarde Myers 1696, daughter Andries Myers and Vrouwtje Van Vorst, 2- Catherine Rusen, 1699, daughter Col. Jacob Rutsen and Maria Hansen Bergen. His children: Catherine, Johannes, Jacobus and Gerardus, Marryte, Abraham, Jacob Rutsen, Jacoba, and Jacob. Johannes was a Colonel

in the Revolution, a member of the Colonial Assembly, and trustee of Queen's, now Rutgers College, New Brunswick, N.Y. His home was at Rosendale at which place he entertained General and Mrs. Washington in June 1782. His son Jacob Rutsen Hardenbergh who married Dinah Van Bergh Frelinghuysen, was the first president of Rutgers College. He was pastor of the Rariton Church, and first church of New Brunswick.

Abraham Hardenbergh

born about Jan. 7, 1711, died 1771. Married 1 - 1706, Marretje Roosa, daughter of Nicholas Roosa. Two children: Johannes or John A. and Sara. Married 2 - Mary Hasbrook, widow of James Gasherie, in June 1752. Four children: Nicholas, Elias, Maritje, and Rachall. All born at New Paltz, New York from 1745 to 1758. Johannes married Rachel Du Bois. He was Lieutenant in 1st Co., 3d Regiment, N.Y. during the Revolution. Sara married Charles Wessel Brodhead. Abraham Hardenbergh's house was on the Walkill just below Tuthill. He was Supervisor New Paltz 1743-58. His land descended in the family for several generations and was owned in later years by Josiah Le Fevre. His son:

TEATOR - TEETER Family

In 1703 and 1710 a number of Germans came to this Country from the Palatinate, from where they had been driven on account of religious persecution and political oppression. Some settled on the east and west side of the Hudson. Others went to Pennsylvania and Virginia. The first mention of a Teter is of a George Teter on the east side of the Hudson, near the town of Rhinebeck.

In 1775, April 26, George Thater of Lehuburg Co. of Giglengen, Wurtenburg, and Anna Maria, daughter of the late John Frederick Meyer, of Rohoback, near Sintsen, Soveringty of Baron, were married. There was also a Lawrence Thater there and his wife Margaretha. They evidently had married in Germany and no doubt had children back in Germany, but no record of them is found.

Lawrence died in 1737. It is thought that the widow, with her children, went over into Pennsylvania, near New Hanover, Mountgomery County, as a John George Deeder is found, where in 1738, he signed a petition in company Joist Hite, Rev. Anthony Hinkle and others: Also a girl, Marie Ann Deeder is married there to

a John Phillip Hoffman in 1735. This is found among the marriage records of Rev. John Casper Stover.

Teters in Virginia

According to John Casper Stover's records, a John George Teter in Frederick Co., Va. in 1733. He had a daughter Maria, who was born in 1734, a daughter, Sussana, born in 1737 and a son John George, born 1724- or 1740. We find the first John George signing a road petition there in 1738. Then in 1749 we find a Jacob Teter signing a road petition. This was all in Orange County, Virginia at that time. On Jan. 10-1735, a land grant was given to George Teter for 200 acres of land in Orange County, on the south side of the river.

In 1743 this George Teter-Teator died, and found in the will book of Orange Co., is the administration bond of Margaret Teater, administratrix of George Teater, Deceased.

Dated March 22, 1743, George Utz and Michael Glouse signed it with her, witnessed by James Portius, on May 23, 1744. An Appraisalment is made "the total amount

is 32 pounds, 10 shillings. In addition to the usual live stock, farming implements ect.

Feb. 12, 1768, George Teator bought land from Frederick Stern for ten pounds, a track of 85 acres, patented Aug. 22, 1733, lying in Augusta Co., near Crabb Creek, a branch of Neu River; recorded Aug.-17-1868 and witnessed by William Davis and John Taylor and John Buchanna.

Later this county was divided into Washington, Montgomery and other counties. George Teater lived in Washington County in 1777. He served as ensign in the Revolutionary War from Washington Co., Virginia. and was at Kings Mountain.

George Teater was appointed a Sergant in Col. Byrd's Regiment in the year 1761 and continued such until he was regularly discharged. He obtained his right to land under the King of Great Britain's Proclamation in 1763.

In 1781 George Teator and Family in company with Lewis Craig, Saunders and others, went to Lincoln County, Kentucky, over the Cumberland Gap Trail and reached there Dec. 3rd, 1781. They stayed at Craigs Station first then at Downings. The trouble from the Indians sent them to the fort, all but Teators, who would not go. Little Robert (or Robin) Teater was almost captured by the Indians.

Samuel Teater had land on Dicks River and George Teater on Salt Creek. Here George Teater bought more land and finally had a large plantation with good fields, apple orchards ect. He had brought his slaves from Virginia and owned about 24. He had one son who was a Methodist Preacher and was in the War of 1812.

His son, Samuel owned land first in Madison County, then in Gerrard County and the little town of Teatersville was named for him. He built a large brick house which is standing to day (1926). At one time he was very wealthy.

and bought stock from all over the state and drove it to Virginia where he sold it, but later he lost all his wealth.

A strict Episcopalian, judicious in his counsels, humane in his advice and a reprover of immorality. He left a folio, volume, 80 pages in his own writing, Parish Registers.

JOHN McCADDON FAMILY

John McCaddon was born in Chester County, Pennsylvania, June-27-1757. He served in the War of the Revolution under Capt. Porterfield and was with the army under Washington at the surrender of Cornwallis, after which his company was discharged at Shepadstown, Virginia. He remained here until the spring of 1780 when he went with Squire Boone, a brother of Daniel Boone, to Kentucky. Here he helped to form Selby County, one of the first settlements of the state.

Later in the same year, 1780, he went with General George Rogers Clark on his expedition against the Indians on Mad River and while there assisted in the erection of a block house on the north side of the Ohio River, which was the first house built on the ground where Cincinnati now stands.

He returned from this campaign to Virginia and in the following year located at Brownsville, Pennsylvania, where he married Elizabeth Silverthorn, daughter of William Silverthorn. In 1827 he emigrated to Ohio, locating at Newark, which was his home until his death on June-8-1845 in his 89th year.

JOHN McCADDON FAMILY

His son, John McCaddon was born June-1798 at Brownsville, Pennsylvania. He was married there in June-1818 to Susanna Patterson. Their home was a farm 6 miles from Newark, Ohio until 1847, when they moved to Iowa City, purchasing a farm $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles east of town, which was their home for many years.

His daughter, Mary McCaddon was married April-11-1845 to Benjamin King, who was born Nov.-6-1818 on a farm near Newark, Ohio. They came to Iowa City in 1846, driving the entire distance from their home at Utica, Ohio, in a wagon. Mr. King enlisted in the Civil War and served 3 years as Capt. of Co. F 6th Reg. Iowa Vol. Cavalry. He died Oct.-17-1893 in his 74th year.

JOHN L. WALDRON FAMILY

John L. Waldron, one of the worthy pioneers of Johnson County; His ancestors also took a prominent part in the early history and development of the country. His grandfather, Samuel Waldron, was one of the loyal patriots who took up arms in the defense of the Colonies against the tyrannies of the Mother Country. He lived to the advanced age of 96 years and was the sixth generation removed from one Byron Van Waldron, who emigrated from Holland about 1640, to America. A home which he erected in New York soon after his arrival remained standing until 1874, and some of the material of which it was composed, was brought from Holland. This ancestor, it is said, had the honor of naming the Harlem River which he called from his old home in the Fatherland.

The parents of John L. Waldron-were John and Maria (Ludsay) Waldron, the father was born in New Jersey, 1795 and the mother was a native of Ireland. They had a family of eight children of whom John L. Waldron was the sixth child. He was born in Butler Co., Pennsylvania in 1818 and grew to mature years in the place of his birth; At the age of eighteen he went to Pittsburg, Pa. where he served an apprenticeship in carpentry, remaining in that city nine years. In 1844 he married Isabel Stewart, daughter of

George Stewart, both natives of Pennsylvania. In the spring of 1849 he returned to his old home in Butler Co., where he engaged in farming for five years. In the spring of 1855 he came to Iowa and located in Johnson County, Pleasant Valley Township on a farm.

In the severe winter of 1856 he had a terrible experience, one which comes to few men, even the pioneers whose lot is one of extreme hardship. On the 21st of December, while on his way home from church with his wife, and eldest son, they were caught in one of the terrible blizzards which sweep down from the northwest. Though only three miles from home so dense was the storm and so dark the atmosphere became that they lost their way. It was impossible to draw the wagon through the increasing snow drift. And at last in desperation, Mr. Waldron unhitched the team and assisted his wife and son upon the horses. Then endeavored to find their way home or to arrive at some place of shelter, but the wife was soon overcome with the bitter cold and was frozen to death. The son who was about twelve years of age, also met the same fate. So badly frozen was Mr. Waldron that part of one foot and one ear

had to be amputated. His four young children were thus early bereft of a loving mother's care.

Samuel Cozine was twenty-six years of age and in the vigor of his youth, when with his wife he journeyed to Iowa and located upon one hundred and forty acres of land, situated upon section 32 Graham Township. Many years have passed since in the fall of 1851. He here entered with ardor into the fields of agriculture. He first entered the bonds of matrimony in Dearborn County Indiana, there marrying Elizabeth Holloway, who became the mother of five children.

WILLIAM BEAUMONT FAMILY

William and John Beaumont, aged respectively 27 and 23, boarded the ship Elizabeth of London, at London, England, April-15-1635. It is not known where the ship landed its passengers, but presumably at Salem or Boston. At any rate, William met Lydia Danforth of Cambridge, whose brother was Deputy Governor of Mass. and they were married Dec.-9-1643. William and Lydia moved to Saybrook, Conn., where they acquired considerable property.

On May-20-1652, William was chosen "Freeman" of Conn. at a General Court of Election at Hartford.

Samuel, son of William and Lydia, married Hester Buckingham, daughter of Rev. Thomas Buckingham, and Esther Hosmer. Thomas Buckingham was one of the founders of Yale College, or the Collegiate School of Conn. which later became Yale College.

Little, if anything is known of Samuel and Hester.

William, born 1725 and Sarah Everett had 9 children, five of their sons, and all served in the Revolutionary War. A family legend has it that William, himself, hauled powder to Washington's forces which were besieging Boston.

Isaiah and Fear Alden had 8 children of whom Fear was the oldest. Andrew was the 5th child, and the elder of two sons.

Andrew married Julia Colt of Wilkes Barre in 1813, They had 10 children, EUGENE, being the 9th, John the third child and eldest son, became a Rear Admiral, U.S.N. He died in 1892.

Eugene was graduated from the Military Academy in May-1861, served through the Civil war and in the Army until his retirement as Lt. Col. in 1892. He died 1916.

JOHN McHENRY FAMILY

(Ancestors of Emily Thankful McHenry Stevens,
A Real Grand daughter, D.A.R.)

The Pelican is found in the McHenry coat of arms, because it is said that that bird will pick her own breast and feed her young to keep them from starving. A free translation of the McHenry motto is "For my own family till the last drop of blood".

The McHenry family is descended, through the line of his son, Hermon. The founder of the family in Ireland, "Enna of the Northern Hey; Neals(Asle called Neals) son of Nela of the nine hostages King of Ireland 379 A.D.

The ancient name was "O Cahane", signifying, "Son of the Beloved", the title of the clan was "Chief of the Clan Magnus Na Bauna."

Found in a history of Ireland, Mrs. Stevens great great grandfather was Morris McHenry (wife unknown) born at Giants Causeway town of Coleran, County Autuin, Ireland, 1696. His only son was Major John McHenry, born, as was his wife, Susannah McHenry, at the same place; he in 1725 and she in 1726. They took sail for America in 1739 on the same ship with James Clinton, father of DeWitt Clinton, arriving at the Province of New York, the same year.

JOHN McHENRY FAMILY

Major John McHenry served as Major of the First New York Battalion in the French war of 1788-9-. Mrs. Stevens grandfather, Capt. Rev. Henry McHenry, was born at Wall Kill Valley, Orange Co., N.Y. July-1762. He served as Capt. in the 2nd U.S. Infantry from 1797 to 1798. He had command of a post near Cleveland, Ohio. He moved to Almond, Allegany- Co., N.Y. with his family, July-1797, coming partly by keel boat, then drove the cattle through the block house settlement to Hornell. From this point, there being no roads, they cut down trees, making themselves a road to point three miles west of Almond, N.Y., where they located, and which is still known as McHenry Valley.

His wife was Priscilla McClure. Their son James McHenry, (Mrs. Emily Steven's father) was born at Fishing Creek, Northumberland Co., Pa. Dec.-13-1786. He came with his father to Almond, N.Y., where he built his home-stead on his farm in the McHenry Valley, in July 1797. The house was strongly built of timbers from trees grown on the farm; was two stories high, besides a large attic, and is still standing. Here he lived until his death, June-16-1841. Here were born his thirteen children.

JOHN McHENRY FAMILY

He served as First Lieutenant in Cape Vancampinis Co., of Rifles in the War of 1812. He had three wives:- Elizabeth Wilcox, Abigail Vincent and Sarah Alexander. By his first wife he had four children:- Benjamin, Josiah, Priscilla and Roswell.

The children of the second wife were:- James Vincent, Elizabeth, Richard, Charles, Amelia, Morris, Mary Eleanor, Emily Thankful and Abigail.

By his third wife one son was born:- William Alexander.

Emily Thankful married George H. Stevens of Almond, and to them were born one daughter, Maise Mrs. John Frampton.

Mrs. Emily Steven's mother, Abigail Vincent was from the famous Vincent Family, who through another branch, has given to the world Bishop Vincent of the Methodist Church. He founded the wonderful Chautauqua. A French Priest, Father Vincent, later canonized Saint Vincent, De Paul, lived a wonderful life, and his greatest work was the organizing the famous society of the Sisters of Charity.

JOHN McHENRY FAMILY

Great were the services rendered by these women and their revered leader, to the France of the 17th century, which was suffering from the evils and persecutions of the civil war of the Fronde. Father Vincent sent the Sisters of Charity by twos and threes to the battlefields and insisted on four cardinal points as practical, as if they had been planned last year, instead of three hundred years ago. First-rescue the starving, and for this he started the first soup kitchen known in history. Second-to bury the dead, for the decaying bodies of the awful war were dangerous to health. Third-to buy and collect seed for the land; and the fourth-was to attend to the welfare of the souls. This good priest died in 1660, having by his life compelled the great ones of the earth to recognize his divine mission.

Father Vincent's ancestors were traced back to the third century, when in 304 St. Vincent suffered martyr-com. From his day on, devotion to religious principles seems inherent in his descendants. Besides Father Paul Vincent, were others among the Huguenots in the south of France, who by persecutions were driven from their country, for their adherence to their religion.

JOHN McHENRY FAMILY

Every generation seems to have had its representative in Law, Literature and religion. The earliest Vincents in America were Adrian, passengers from London in 1634, Humphrey from Cambridge in 1634, John of Syam 1639, and John of New Haven 1639, Phillip from the south of York-shire, who settled in New England and probably saw actual service in the Pequot war. For he sent an account of it which was published in London.

William, who in 1651, had a grant of land at New London which he improved, but settled in Providence in May 1666. This last is the ancestor of the Rhode Island and Conn. families, one of whose descendants, Joshua Vincent, brought his family to Almond among the Seventh Day Baptist people, a far cry from the Catholic Martyr St. Vincent, but all were true to the faith in their own particular form of worship and loyal to their Christ.

Joshua Vincent was Mrs. Steven's grandfather. Mrs. Stevens grew to womanhood in Almond, was educated at the Alfred University, Alfred, N.Y. She married George Stevens Dec.--2-1868 and they with their only child moved to Boone, Iowa in 1865, when the city was just being laid out.

JOHN McHENRY FAMILY

STEVENS LINE

Mr. George H. Stevens was descended from two old families.

The Stevens trace back to Nicholas Stevens, an officer under Cromwell. His son Henry fled to America to escape the Royalist, and he settled at Stonnington, Conn. He and his wife, with 43 other inhabitants organized a Congregation at church in 1674 at Stonnington.

Their children were:-

Thomas, Phineas, Uuah, Andrew, Benjamin, Samuel, Zebulon, and Jesse.

Uuah settled in Canistes, N.Y. and later in Almond where his son Phines was the first white child to be born. Phineas' son George built the first saw mill in Almond and about 1809. Incidentally his nephew, George H. was the only millwright living around Boone in 1900 who was able to rebuild the large wheel used in a mill on the Des Moines, River near by.

Uuah was Capt. in the French war. The whole of the land now occupied by Almond and much more was owned by the Stevens family and they deeded a park to the town.

Levi, son of Uuah Stevens, was the father of George Stevens. His mother, Jemima Dike, descended from Capt. Nathan Dike who was educated at Yale and served in the Revolutionary War on General Warren's staff at Boston, and later on that of General Washington's.

He was a native of Connecticut, but moved to Tioga Point, Pa. and afterward in 1795, to New York state, near Almond. His son, James Dike served in the war of 1812, and his family was prominent settlers of south western New York. He with his company of men were at Queenstown at the time of the death of General Brock.

George H. Stevens and his wife, Emily McHenry, moved to Boon, Iowa in 1865, when the town was first laid out, thus like their ancestors, becoming pioneers of a new country.

Mrs. Stevens, a member of DeShon Chapter, D.A.R. passed away in May-1918 and her husband George Stevens, in 1919.

Andrew Pierce came from England about 1750 to New Jersey, immigrated from New Jersey to the Jersey Settlement in Rostraver Township, Westmoreland County, now Forward Township, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, where he settled in 1770 and obtained a patent from the State of Pennsylvania for 324½ acres of land under the date of May-26-1778, adjoining lands of Daniel Applegate, Thomas Applegate, Jos. Becker, Misses Bevore and John Emily or Inlay.

Andrew Pierce variously spelled Pearis, Pears, Pearse, Pearce and Pierce, married Marcy ----. She died and he married Elizabeth Johnson, and they had the following children:- Lewis, Sarah, Rachel, and one who married a man named Foster.

Lewis Pierce married Sept.-1793 to Cassander Pennic or Felix and they had the following children:- Jonathan, who married Maria Bell; Amos who married Deborah McCallie; Daniel (father of F.F. Pierce) married Elizabeth Ketcham, Dr. David who married Elizabeth Hughes, Andrew (grandfather of Mrs. Thomason) married Sarah Nicholson, sister of McKinley Nicholson, Joseph, Nancy, Mary and Marcin,

all of whom died unmarried.

Tradition has it that Andrew Pierce was buried in the old Taylor graveyard in Froward Township, Allegheny County, as a button and other things pertaining to his age were found in digging a grave for David Pierce, son of Jonathan Pierce, Frank McClure and others.

Lewis Pierce was born, according to the tombstone, in 1767. --- married by Joseph Bickett, Esq., Sept.-1793. The older sons were, James and William, probably born about 1761 and 1765. They both appear to have been living in 1801, when Andrew's estate was settled.

Joseph Bickett was one of the first Justices of Allegheny County and married many people, among them Freegift Taylor and Sarah Pierce. Oct.-1792 (?)

Lewis Pierce and Cassandra Penick of Pennick, Sept. 1793, Abram Warne and Sarah Pierce, Nov.-1796, William Caldwell and Sarah Pierce, 1798. Lewis Pierce and Lydia Bouser, Feb.-17-1801.

John Pierce of Boston seems to have been our earliest ancestor in America, and he was probably a son of John Pierce, a merchant of London, who received the first

patent of Plymouth, dated June-1-1621. He probably arrived in America a few years earlier. He had by his wife Elizabeth, twins born July-8-1643., John Jr. at the age of 14 went with his uncle J. Wyman to Enfield, Conn. and on Jan.-1-1664 married Eliza, daughter of Edmond Carter, whose wife Anna Brewster was a grand daughter of the good Elder Wm. Brewster, who came over with the Pilgrims in 1620.

John Pierce and his wife Eliza, had children as follows:- Edmond, Dec.-25-1664; Ejisha Nov.-16-1665; Joshua Jan.-16-1667; Abigail March-16-1669; Elizabeth May-22-1671; Nathaniel July-9-1673; John April-30-1682; This John with two brothers, located on Manhattan Island and on June 3, 1716 married Maria Delamater. Of this marriage a number of children were born, of whom James and John were twins and were born Aug.-8-1717.

The Pierce Homestead called the Fort Farm, was built during the Indian troubles and named from the fact it was a good rich soil and cultivated by the settlers as an act of protection from the Indians. Where it was built is now known as the Thomas Manoun place and was a

of our great great grandfather's grant from the Government. This fort commanded a fine view of the surrounding country and not easily approached without being seen, which made it a desirable location for a Fort.

Pierce is a name derived from Percy and said to have its root in pierre, the French for stone. Peter is the direst derivation. In Normandy, genealogist seek the cradle of the Pierce family, possible Percy, Forrest was their home giving the name to the first of the family. Another theory is- there is a Teutonic word pirsee, to hunt or a hunting place. In other words, if the family if not of the Norman, it is of Teutonic origin.

There is a line which tells us -"Brave Galferd who to Normandy with Rollo came, assured the Percy name."

Percy is a name often tragic, but always honorable and more interwoven than any other with the early minstrelsy and romance of England and Scotland. The standard bearer to Richard III at Bosworth Field, was Peter Pears. Since the time of the Norman Conquest the family

of Pierce or Perce, latter being the usual ancient form, having been large land owners in Kent, Devore, Norfolk, Somerset and Suffolk. It was from Suffolk that a Pilgrim Father, Daniel Pierce, came in 1634, in the ship Elizabeth. He lived at Wintertown, Mass. and afterward at Portsmouth, N.H. His son, Col. Daniel, was prominent in civil, ecclesiastical and military affairs of Newbury, Mass. An earlier ancestor was Abraham Pierce, who with his wife, Rebecca, settled in Plymouth Colony. He was a taxpayer in 1623. Jan.-20-1627, he exchanged with Capt. Miles Standish, two shares in a red cow for two ewe lambs. He was a soldier under Standish.

John Pierce's coming perhaps antedated Abraham's for the first patent of Plymouth Colony was granted in 1624 to John, a large ship owner, and from London. Capt. Wm. Pearce, born in Bristol, England, "A Goodly man and most expert mariner", master of the ship, Paragon, tried to cross the Atlantic in 1622, but was obliged to put back. Master of the Ann he crossed in 1623. Later he commanded the Charity and in 1629 the Mayflower. In 1630 he was commander of the Lyon and brought with him, his

brother, Richard. Both settled in Boston and Capt. Williams was author of the first almanac published in this country in 1639. It was Richard Pierce, probably a grandson of Richard the settler, who Sept. -25-1690, published the first newspaper in the United States.

Among those who fought in the Revolution, some nobly fell, were Michael Pierce, Ensign in a Company commanded by Standish. He was at the Merrimansett fight. James Pierce of Mass. minute man, responded to the first call at the Lexington alarm. Shadrack Pierce of Mass. was also a soldier in Revolution and Ebenezer, who was killed in battle. The family has given a President to the United States. He was also a soldier and a statesman of unusual ability. His father, Benjamin, served through the Revolution, attaining the rank of Major General, and became governor of New Hampshire. One historian of Franklin Pierce has said "The crowning glory of his life was his unselfishness and his true and enduring friendship." Characteristics of the Pierce Family are, shrewd, good nature, common sense, vigorous understanding, strong memory, attractive physique and a chivalrous bearing. The arms produced in three reverses rising

sable, a dove with an olive branch in its beak. Our family motto is "Dixit et Fecit", he said and he did. The representative of the Percy family in England is the Duke of Northumberland and his banner exhibits an assemblage of 900 armorial designs, among them those of Henry VII or the ancient houses of France and Castile and the houses of Normandy.

The Percy descent is traced to Agnes de Perce, who married de Louvaine, brother of the second Queen of Henry I of England and son of the Duke of Brabant.

JOHANNES (WURMLE) WORMLEY FAMILY

On Sept. 17th, 1753, Johannes Wurmle, the immigrant, came to America, sailing from Rotterdam on the ship "Patience". He landed on the above date at Port Philadelphia, where he took the oath of allegiance required by this colony. He settled in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, where all of his children were born, removing from there to Cumberland County in 1777, where he became the owner of about 600 acres of land lying on the west side of the Susquehanna, opposite the present City of Harrisburg. His wife was Anna Maria. The land at his death was divided between his four sons, and the present town of Wormleysburg was founded by his son John on that portion of the land deeded to him.

Johannes (Wurmle) Wormley was born Oct.-13-1727, presumably in Germany, immigrated to the Colonies in 1753, died at his home in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, Penn., on January 16th, 1789, and was buried in Popular Grove Cemetery, near his home.

In the name of God, amen, I, George Teter of Gerrard Co., and State of Kentucky, being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God for the same, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of all Mighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in account Christian in order at the discretion of my executor, nothing doubting, but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as touching worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me within this life. I give, demise and depose of the same in the following manner and form.

First of all, my son Samuel has received the entire of two hundred acres of land, a negro boy named Dick, with a small portion of other property.

Second, my son George received one hundred acres of land, one negro girl named Delphy, with a small portion of other property.

Third, my son William has received one hundred acres of land, with a negro girl named Hester, and a small portion of other property.

Fourth, my son Robert has received one hundred acres of land, a negro boy named Caleb, and a small portion of other property.

Fifth, my daughter Sally has received a negro woman named Dinah with 40 pounds worth of horses and a small portion of other property.

Sixth, my son Paris has received one hundred acres of land, one negro boy named Banlin, and a small portion of other property.

Seventh, my son Lewis is to have a negro boy named Joe, and a third part of the price of the land and plantation that I live on, with a cow and calf, one feather bed with the furniture and beddings.

Eighth, my daughter Lucy is to have two negro children, Syntha and Phillip, with one-third part of the price of my said land and plantation.

Ninth, my daughter Nancy is to have two negros, a woman named Franky and a child named Sally, with a third part of the price of said land and plantation.

Tenth, the remainder of all my moveable property of every description, I do leave to my wife, Estes (this name may be Hester) to be entirely at her disposal, without interruption, also she is to have peaceable possession of my horses and farms, apple orchards and posts, all but the lower field next to the river, also said negro woman, Franky, during her life, then Nancy to have with her all her increase, all my land I have sold to Paris for the sum of three hundred dollars, to be paid in five years at equal annual instalment, and hereby otherwise and appoint my beloved wife and Paris as executors to this my last will and testament, ratifying and confirming this, revoking no others. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 25th day of July, 1815. Signed, sealed and delivered by the said George Teters.

N.B. My negro woman Milley, at my death is to be her one free woman.

NEAR SIGOURNEY, IOWA
-----Oldest German M.E. Church in Iowa

Back in the year of 1844, while the Indians were roaming the plains of Iowa, and in the year in which the territory of Iowa was purchased from the Indians a little group of German Immigrants, recently settled in this part of the country, established the German creek Methodist Episcopal Church, now known as the Bethel Methodist Episcopal Church.

Realizing the need of a religious training for the children, one man, a Peter Helwig, from Marion, Ohio, was instrumental in obtaining for this little group, a minister. He wrote to his father, a minister in Marion, Ohio, and told him of the need of a pastor in this new community, Thus the Rev. John Mann became the first minister of the German Creek Methodist Church, in Iowa.

Through his zeal and endeavor the little church thrived and in the following year a 16x18 ft. log cabin was built where services were held. Prior to this, meetings were held in the home of John Helwig.

HISTORY OF BETHEL METHODIST CHURCH

The first church was soon out grown so that in 1848 a new log building had to be erected. At this time a circuit was formed with Dutch Creek and Walnut Creek and the charge was self supporting. God's blessing was manifest in this church from the beginning and many souls were saved who worship God, many of whom have gone to their reward.

In 1866 the present church was erected as the second could no longer accomodate the congregation. The charter members were: Peter Helwig and wife, John and Anna Brewer, Martin and Julia Mohland, John and Anna Snakenberg, Sr., Dietrich Snakenberg, and wife, John Snakenberg, Jr., Louis Snakenberg, Maria Beinhardt, Anna Grieme, Margaret Wolf. This congregation supplied seven ministers who went into the active work, viz., Peter Helwig 1847, John Brewer 1850, John Snakenberg 1861, Jacob Keller 1872, Franz Piehler, 1882, Will Wolf 1915, Edward Wolf 1917, all of whom have done faithful work for the Master and all but William and Edward Wolf have gone to their reward, the latter two are still active and successful soul winners.

Bethel has had four local pastors of whom two should have more than a passive notice, viz; Dietrich Snakenberg and Andrew Hoffman who were local pastors during the years of the circuit, as they supplied one of the three churches every Sunday, often riding a horse all night to reach Walnut Creek for Sunday services, then late at night back home. Bro. D. Snakenberg has preached more sermons and conducted more funerals than any other man in Keokuk County. Theirs were long and devoted lives and God's richest blessings rested upon them. The other local pastors were Andrew Hoffman, Jr. and the historian whose work was not so strenuous as there was but one congregation and always supplied by a pastor. Thirty-nine pastors have supplied this charge during the past 85 years.
