SHOPPING LIST

- Dulux® Light Texture 4L
- Drop sheet
- Selleys Sugar Soap
- Synthetic Roller 12-15mm nap
- Painters' masking tape
- Paint Stirrer
- Wide Brush approx. 4cm x 14cm

Step 1: Choose your colour

- Choose from our curated range of colours or LiveChat for free personalised colour advice.



Step 2: Prep

- Clean your walls.
- If you have any cracks or holes, fill them with the appropriate filler.
- Sand them back, wipe them down and spot prime where needed.
- Mask around the edges.



Step 3: Topcoat

- Cut in around the edges.
- Roll your first coat.
- Wait two hours before painting the second coat.
- Apply the second coat by brush to enhance the effect or simply roll the second coat.



TIP:

In-between coats, wrap your brushes in tin foil and close your paint tin, storing both in a cool, dry place.

SHOPPING LIST

- Dulux Concrete Finish 4L
- Drop sheet
- Selleys Sugar Soap
- 100mm synthetic brush for cutting in
- Long nap synthetic roller
- Roller tray
- Paint stirrer
- Painter's tape
- Steel trowel
- 600 grit sandpaper

Step 1: Choose your colour

- Choose from our curated range of colours or LiveChat for free personalised colour advice.

Step 2: Prep

- Clean your walls.
- If you have any cracks or holes, fill them with the appropriate filler.
- Sand them back, wipe them down and spot prime where needed.
- Mask around the edges.



Step 3: Topcoat

- Stir Dulux Concrete Effect thoroughly prior to use.
- Work in small sections. Use a long nap roller to apply to the wall.
- Smooth the surface with a steel trowel with broad, sweeping strokes.
- Apply 3 coats using the same process. The final coat should dry for at least 2 hours, but no longer than 24 hours, before polishing. To polish, use 600 grit sandpaper in a circular motion.

TIP:

Apply enough pressure to keep the trowel edge flat against the surface. Be careful not to gouge the surface with the edge of the trowel.

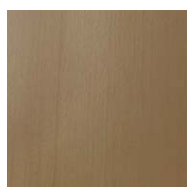

How to get the metallic look

Step 1: Choose your colour

- Choose from 9 curated colours or LiveChat for free personalised colour advice.

Step 2: Prep

- Clean your surface, then mask off the area.
- Stir the paint with a paint stirrer in up and down scooping motions, making sure to scrape the bottom of the can.



Step 3: Topcoat

- Cut in around the edges using a brush, then apply your first coat with a roller.
- Allow to dry, then apply the second coat with a roller, working in small sections.
- While the paint is still wet, texture the surface with a wide brush, dry roller or muslin cloth. Drag the paint in a random pattern.

How to get the theatre look

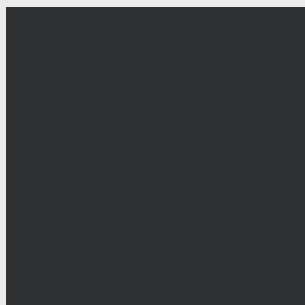
Step 1: Prep

- Clean your surface and spot prime as necessary.
- Mask off the area.
- Stir paint well with an up and down scooping motion.



Step 2: Topcoat

- Cut in around the edges using a brush, then apply your first coat using a roller.
- Lay off the area once you have covered it with paint.
- Allow two hours dry time, then repeat for the second coat.

TIP:

When cutting in, don't paint too far ahead. Keep a wet edge so your roller can blend with the brushed paint.



How to re-use and reduce wastage while painting

Responsibly dispose of your paint



1. PaintBack

Take your paint tin with leftover paint to your local Paintback collection site – there are over 160 nationally!

Paintback takes unwanted paint and packaging and recycles or otherwise responsibly disposes of it, diverting it from landfill and vital waterways.

2. Recycle your tin with waste paint hardener

Easy disposal of paint

Dulux EnviroSolutions Waste Paint Hardener is a great option. This handy product turns unwanted water-based paint back into solid waste for easy and safe household disposal in 3 steps:

Step 1

Simply scoop the desired amount of waste hardener into the paint tin and stir until paint solidifies.

Step 2

Leave for 2 hours with the lid off.

Step 3

Wrap hardened paint in newspaper and dispose of as hard waste. The clean, paint free tin can also be disposed of in recycled waste, providing a sustainable option to minimise the environmental impacts of paint products.



Re-use accessories



Save your accessories for next time! Simply give them a good clean. If you've used water-based paint you can clean your brushes in a bucket of water to remove most of the paint, ready for use next time.

Note: for solvent-based paint, mineral turpentine is required.
