# THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH

When a Sunday does not occur between December 25 and January 1, this feast is celebrated on December 30 with only one reading before the Gospel.

#### **FIRST READING**

Those who fear the Lord honor their parents.

A reading from the Book of Sirach

3:2-7, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons.

Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them.

When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother.

Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard.

Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother.

My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives.

Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life;

kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins

—a house raised in justice to you.

#### **SECOND READING**

We proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to many, but to those who are called, the wisdom of God.

A reading from the first Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians

1:22-25

Brothers and sisters:

Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom,
but we proclaim Christ crucified,
a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles,
but to those who are called, Jews and Greeks alike,
Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.

For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom,
and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.


A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

#### **FIRST READING**

They read from the book of the Law and they understood what was read.

A reading from the Book of Nehemiah

8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women,

and those children old enough to understand.

Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate,

he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law.

Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform

that had been made for the occasion.

He opened the scroll

so that all the people might see it

—for he was standing higher up than any of the people—; and, as he opened it, all the people rose.

# THE SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING

#### FIRST READING

As for you, my flock, I will judge between one sheep and another.

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel

34:11-12, 15-17

Α

Thus says the Lord God:
I myself will look after and tend my sheep.

As a shepherd tends his flock

when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep.

I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark.

I myself will pasture my sheep;

I myself will give them rest, says the Lord God.

The lost I will seek out,

the strayed I will bring back,

the injured I will bind up,

the sick I will heal,

but the sleek and the strong I will destroy,

shepherding them rightly.

As for you, my sheep, says the Lord God, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats.

These sequences are for optional use, with the exception of Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday, when the text proper to those days is obligatory (Cf. General Instruction of the Roman Missal, n. 40). The Latin text is given here for use in those particular circumstances where it may be pastorally suitable, and especially when they are sung according to the plain chant melodies found in the Graduale Romanum.
