"I love the visual effect created by the juxtaposition of a piece of modern abstract art with the French antique sconces." Amy remarks. In the process of crafting the seating area, Amy selected the round table shape and bench-style seating to accommodate a large number of family and friends while still maintaining an intimate feel.

The stunning living room area in the 5,000-square-foot, four-bedroom Nunez home is a sight to behold, especially during the holiday season. "Our informal living area was designed as a conversation area to gather around the stone fireplace," Amy says. A cream velvet sofa and chair embellished with chenille bullion trim provides the main seating in the room. The sofa is flanked by a round vintage side table of gold metal and glass and a round antique mahogany occasional table. A rectangular mahogany coffee table offers both form and function by adding warmth against the stone fireplace backdrop.

The sheared Douglas Fir Christmas tree that Amy decorated with her mother is gracefully positioned near two hand-carved gold gilt Louis XIV armchairs. The festive tree is adorned with a combination of heirloom vintage ornaments and new ornaments collected from the homeowners' travels.
