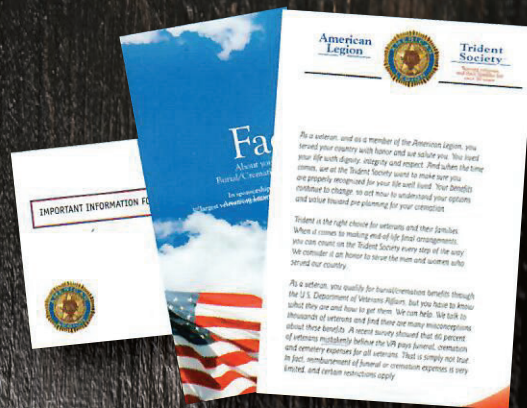

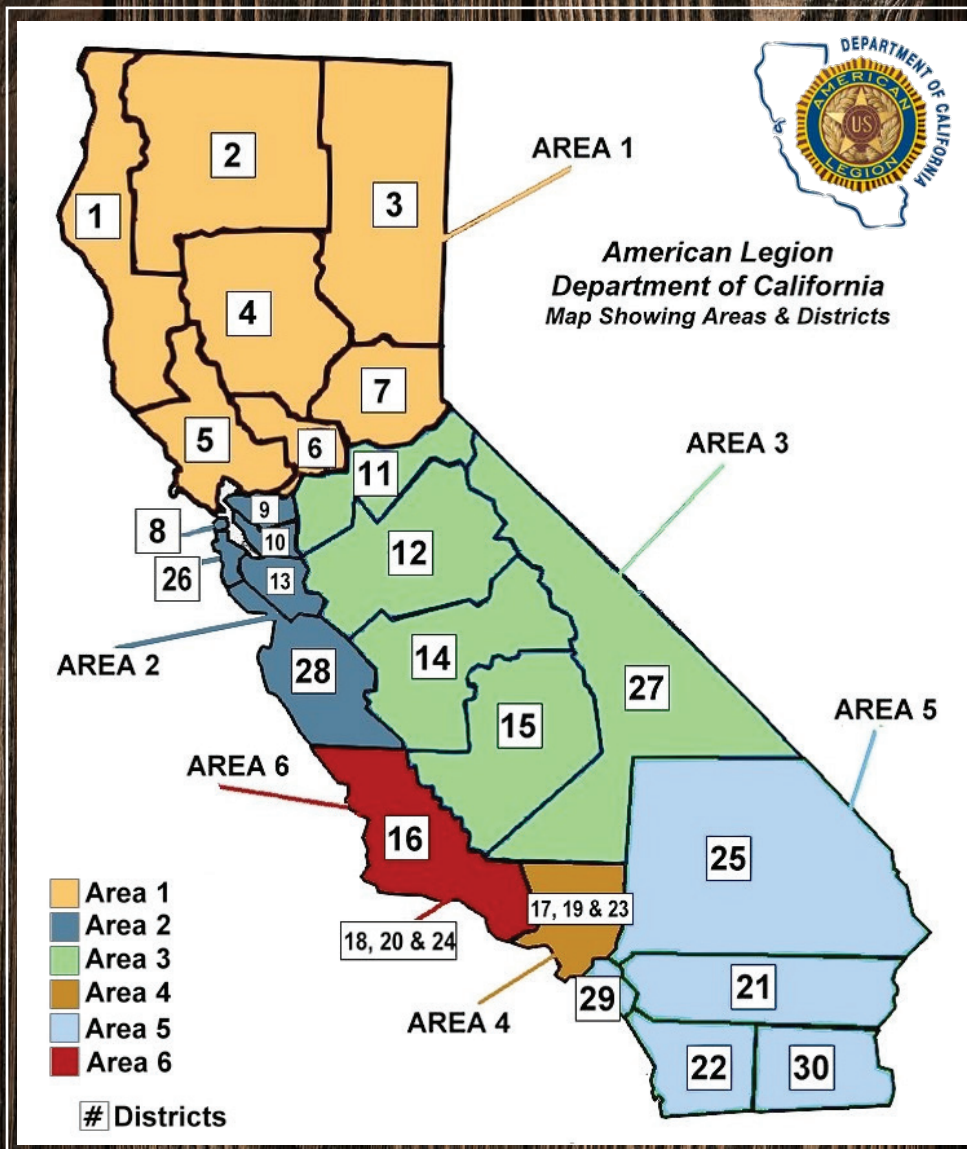

JAMES W. OXFORD,
NATIONAL COMMANDER OF THE AMERICAN LEGION

Welcome



James W. "Bill" Oxford was elected national commander of The American Legion on Aug. 29, 2019, in Indianapolis, during the organization's 101st national convention. He has been a member of the nation's largest veterans' organization since 1986.

A native of Lenoir, N.C., Oxford is a paid-up-for-life member and past commander of Post 29 in Lenoir. He served as department (state) commander of the North Carolina American Legion from 2010 to 2011. A veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps, Oxford was an aviation electronic technician for the A-6 Intruder and served in Vietnam during his initial enlistment. After being discharged as a sergeant in 1970, Oxford joined the North Carolina National Guard. He subsequently attended officer's candidate school and transferred to the U.S. Army Reserve, where he ultimately retired as a colonel after more than 34 years of military service.

Oxford has served at every level of The American Legion. A former mayor and city council of Cahaj's Mountain, N.C., he has worked since he was a high school student, with most of his career choices being in the maintenance and engineering field. He earned a bachelor's degree in environmental studies and multiple safety and environmental certificates.

Oxford has volunteered as a coach, umpire, referee, and administrator in several youth athletic programs, including service as the public address announcer for the Post 29 American Legion Baseball team.

An active volunteer with several organizations, Oxford is a member of Masonic Lodge-York Scottish Rite and the North Carolina Army Retirees Council. His theme as national commander of The American Legion is "A Foundation for the Future," as the organization enters its second century of service.

Oxford and his wife, Frances, have been married since 1967. They have a son, Charles (married to Deah Reid), and a daughter, Jackie (married to Mike Carr). They also have four grandsons, Isiah, Micah, Jaggar and Dawson.

GREETINGS FELLOW LEGIONNAIRES,



In June 2019, after being sworn in as your Department Commander, I laid out three objectives and one goal:

Inspire someone through kind words and deeds.

Motivate someone through encouragement

and appreciation.

Lead, true leaders don't create followers; they make more leaders.

Our goal was to enhance our capabilities to serve our veteran community, continue to promote Americanism, advocate for a robust National Defense and solid Children & Youth Activities. It's who we are and what we do.

Never did we imagine the devastating challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. The virus has impacted nearly every facet of our daily lives and presented several challenges at all levels of our great organization. It has forced us to change the way we communicate, pass information, and support our veterans. By respecting and adhering to social distancing guidance and complying with the stay-home mandates, we had no choice but to cancel most of our programs and discontinue the daily physical interactions with veterans in our respective communities.

Our newly formed training committee lead by Autrey James did an outstanding job in

introducing online video conferencing as a great way to conduct department training, hold meetings, and pass information. This has and will continue to serve us well during these times of uncertainty.

After the National Executive Committee canceled the 2020 National Convention, the Department Executive Committee held an emergency meeting via video conference on 25 April. At this meeting, the DEC elected to have me, and only me, meet at the convention site at the stated date and time and declare our meeting adjourned to meet again at the call of the commander. Secondly, we directed the Adjutant to renegotiate the contract with Visalia to reflect conventions to be held in 2021, 2022 and 2023. Lastly, the DEC recommends that we amend Article IX, Section I of our department by-laws, which will give the

DEC authority to change such time and place of the convention only when a state of emergency is declared according to California's code.

We will miss the camaraderie, team building, and great deeds normally accomplished at National and Department conventions. Still, the safety of our members and compliance with our state and federal public health guidelines made this decision prudent and necessary.

I am incredibly proud of our Legion family's devotion and commitment to supporting

veterans' programs. Despite the COVID-19 pandemic, the California American Legion family continues to serve our veterans and our communities. Despite stay at home mandates, our Legion family continues to work our programs by holding blood drives, food distribution centers, providing face masks to frontline medical workers and care packages for seniors, buddy checks, assisting the elderly, providing takeout meals for locals. Our membership numbers continue to be strengthened by our revitalization efforts despite this crisis.

Before the COVID-19 stay at home order, I enjoyed my travels throughout this great state of California. I've visited various posts, districts, and area events. It gives me great pride when I see members working as a team to accomplish the American Legion's four pillars of service.

Although my travels have been limited, you can rest assured that I have been working behind the scenes attending virtual meetings at the national and state level to ensure I represent you and to fulfill the promise I made to you when I assumed command.

Although social distancing has been challenging for most of us, it has been a great pleasure to take part in our Buddy check program, and I encourage

Legionnaires to continue to reach out to one another and to veterans' that are of the social grid. I've taken the initiative to check on the health and welfare of our fellow veterans with a simple phone call, text, or message. It's easy and enjoyable!

I am incredibly proud to be a member of our American Legion **TEAM!** Our **TEAM** of members represents all walks of life, national origin, sex, religion, and age. Our diversity makes us special; our diversity makes us unique; and together we are a powerful and beautiful body doing great things for our community, state, and nation. Thanks to every one of you for making a positive difference in this world! It has been a pleasure serving you, and I hope that I have made you proud. There is still much more work to be done with the American Legion, and I encourage your continued support.

DEPARTMENT ADJUTANT'S
END OF THE YEAR REPORT

What a year.



If anyone would have told me last June what the organization was going to have to survive this year, I would never have believed them. The Coronavirus Pandemic has swept into our cultural dynamic and has exposed challenges in our organizational foundation which have existed since the organization was founded in 1919. Our lack of consistent, outlined process in our Constitution and Bylaws regarding how to conduct meetings when government mandates brought many post, district, and department operations to a halt. Our collective lack of foresight to amend our organizational documents to include current technological advancements such as online meetings, a process to modify department convention during a declared emergency, and having back up plans for many of our programs was an eye-opener which gives us the opportunity as we come out of this crisis to make those plans and changes to operate

with full functionality for the future. I encourage all posts, districts, and areas to review your organizational documents and update them this year.

At Department Headquarters, despite effects of the pandemic, we continue to improve our level of operations to better serve our posts, members, and veterans of the state. The updated forms process has proven a great addition to how we gather the mandated reports. This is the second year we have had this updated option and the first year we have 100% submittal of the **POST DATA REPORT** in over twenty years! Currently, we are on our way to getting 100% compliance on the **CONSOLIDATED POST REPORT** and are ranked 4th in the nation in current percentage of CPR's submitted. We expect similar results with the **POST CERTIFICATION OF DELEGATES** and the **POST CERTIFICATION OF OFFICERS**. There are similar reports required of districts and areas and we appreciate the efforts made by all to provide us this information.

We are dedicated to getting this information and using it to update your post information in both the Department and National databases and create greater success for all.

Our new administrative post member engagement program, being run out of department headquarters has experienced a very successful first full year. Last year, we barely got under the wire with one mailing in late April which resulted in transferring about 5,500 members from Post 1000 into local posts. This year, we have been able to transfer close to 12,000 Post 1000 members into local posts! We do this through weekly texts, emails, regular mail, and phone calls from department using department staff and volunteers for bigger mailings. As a result, we reached our department membership goal and placed 11th in the nation. This year we surpassed last year's membership and we are ranked 10th in the nation. To make this new member engagement and transfer program work, we are relying on posts to engage their members on a local level to best retain them.

As an administrative arm of the Department, we are asking our district commanders and officer teams to step up. It is your responsibility to ensure your posts are functional. These means processing member dues payments, turning in mandated reports, and being a positive addition to the local community. In that line, the Finance Commission has recommended an allocation to fund District Officer Training and Membership Team Training for next year. With this training, the bar will be raised on the expectations from the district, as they are the backbone of the functionality of our Department.

There will be some changes to Department Headquarters over the next year. The Department Executive Committee approved moving forward on securing solar panels on the building which will be installed by the end of summer. Installing these panels will reduce our electrical costs at the headquarters by a few thousand each year until the loan is paid. Once the loan is paid, we will see

a savings of over \$12k a year or more as electrical costs continue to rise. The Department Executive Committee also allocated funds to be spent improving the flooring, electrical, air conditioning, and employee workspaces. This improvement has been in needed ever since the department headquarters was relocated here in 2015. There is flooring missing, exposed wiring in the wall, and other issues which create potential hazards and hindrances for the employees located there. Plans are getting approved by city and bids will be received to complete the work sometime this next year. The changes will allow us to provide adequate workspace for up to thirteen people in addition to the Department Commanders office. We currently employ nine staff at the office (including the Department Adjutant) and the Department Service Officer is expected to be working out of this office by January of 2021, bringing the total to ten. This allows us space to grow while maintaining a productive environment until the long-term vision for the property can be developed. Long term, once hotels become available in the surrounding area, a plan could be developed to expand the footprint of the building to include space to conduct Department Executive Committee Meetings, Commission Meetings, and training.

I am proud of how much we have progressed as a department over the last year, especially while facing the pandemic impact. I look forward to the improvements we will see next year.

Honor. Care. Prepare. That is how we Legion in California!

We honor those who served before us. We care for those who are serving now. We prepare the way for those who are yet to serve.

Thank you for your commitment to this mission.

my report for our 2020 (electronic) Book of Reports.

With the end of my second year as your National Executive Committeeman, I must sincerely say it has been an honor, an adventure and a true pleasure to have served you and our Department of California for the past two years. I remain humbled by the opportunity to continue to serve.

You were promised communications between our National American Legion offices in Indianapolis and our Department. Here are a few selected resolutions from two sources since we last talked: 1) Our last official in-person National Executive Committee meeting, 16-17 October 2019, and; 2) Items handled electronically online after our Spring 2020 NEC session was canceled in mid-March for health reasons:

• **From the Fall 2019 National Executive Committee meeting, 16-17 October 2019**

Resolution No. 1: Amendment to the Preamble of the Constitution of The American Legion.

Amended the Preamble to replace "...the Great Wars..." with "...all wars..."

Resolution No. 11: Abolish Premium Penalty for Delayed Enrollment in Medicare Part B for Veterans Eligible for Medical Benefits from the Department Of Veterans Affairs Resolved...that The American Legion promote appropriate legislation or administrative rulemaking action to abolish the ten percent (10%) annual premium penalty for all veterans delaying enrollment in Medicare Part B while eligible for Department of Veterans Affairs medical benefits.

Resolution No. 15: Support Greater GI Bill Outcomes by Closing 90-10

Loophole Whereas, Veterans and military students are targeted for deceptive and aggressive recruiting ...because of a loophole in federal education law through which the GI Bill and DoD student program funds are able to be counted as “private funds” to offset a cap the schools face on federal funds;

Resolved...That The American Legion encourages legislation and federal agency action to ensure better quality and student outcomes for institutions approved for use of Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) education benefits by adding Department of Defense and VA funds to the Title IV revenue sources 90/10 calculation as defined by section 487(a) of the Higher Education Act.

• **From the Spring 2020 National Executive Committee meeting (by e-mail):**

Resolution No. 3: Cancellation of 2020 American Legion Convention in Louisville, Kentucky and Awarding of 2026 National Convention

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 2 of the National Constitution of The American Legion calls for a National Convention to conduct business at a location and time as determined by the National Executive Committee of The American Legion; and

WHEREAS, Article V, Section 2 of the National Constitution of The American Legion allows for the National Executive Committee of The American Legion to change such location and time for sufficient reasons to it appearing; and WHEREAS, A gathering of the members of The American Legion at the National Convention in Louisville, Kentucky would be in conflict with the imposed restrictions

set by local and federal authorities and therefore place our members at an unnecessary health, safety and medical risk; and

RESOLVED, By the National Executive Committee of The American Legion, by electronic mail vote pursuant to Rule 12 of the Rules of the National Executive Committee, That due to the uncertainty of the duration of the disease known as Coronavirus (COVID-19), the numerous government regulations being enforced to contain it and concern for the safety of all members of the American Legion Family, the American Legion National Executive Committee (NEC) agrees that present circumstances constitute sufficient reasons to cancel the 2020 American Legion National Convention; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That due to these serious and sufficient reasons, the following American Legion events in Louisville, Kentucky, are cancelled: (1) the Pre-Convention National Executive Committee meeting scheduled for August 31, 2020; (2) The American Legion’s 2020 National Convention scheduled for August 28–September 3, 2020; (3) the Post-Convention National Executive Committee meeting scheduled for September 3, 2020; and (4) all regular- scheduled national commission and committee meetings that would have been held in Louisville; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That all nationally elected and appointed officers continue serving in their current positions until the close of the next National Convention scheduled in Phoenix, Arizona, from August 27 through September 2, 2021; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That all national commission and/or committee chairpersons and the current

commission and committee members continue serving in their current positions until they resign or are either reassigned or reappointed at the 2021 Fall Meetings scheduled in Indianapolis, Indiana, October 12–15, 2021; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the National Executive Committee recommends that departments retain their current member of the NEC if they so desire until the post-Convention meeting of the NEC at the Phoenix, Arizona, National Convention on September 2, 2021; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That due to the community of Louisville, Kentucky, accommodating the American Legion 2020 National Convention’s cancellation decision in such a prompt manner without penalty or other financial cost to The American Legion, the American Legion National Executive Committee is hereby awarding the 2026 National Convention to the community of Louisville, Kentucky, via the American Legion Department of Kentucky Convention Corporation.

That is about it from our National Executive Committee since we last spoke. The NEC in Fall is still being planned for mid-October. Whether that will be an in-person or electronic session remains to be seen.

MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR'S END OF THE YEAR REPORT



Since the DEC in Bakersfield in August of 2019, I have had the opportunity to travel all over the Department with the Department Adjutant, Paul Brown, and attend each area meeting. This was done to spread the message that the Department is united on membership. Training was performed at each meeting on membership processing, the compliance report, and most importantly, membership engagement and retention.

The Department Adjutant and I have also had direct contact with each District Commander at least twice since the DEC in Bakersfield to determine the status of the posts in their respective districts. This was extremely helpful for us to talk with each commander and determine the extent of their commitment to their districts and what steps they are taking or should be taking to reach membership goals. It was enlightening to hear the accolades the District Commanders gave about their posts. We acknowledged and gave praise to the District Commanders when it was due and encouraged others to step up and use the tools available to improve district membership. It was also determined that many additional posts, not already identified, need revitalizing, merging, or closing. It was also important for us to get feedback on the various reports, i.e., the Membership Report, the Post Renewal Report, and the Compliance Report and determine whether or not they are being used by the District Commander, whether they are helpful, and any suggestions for improvements.

In our conversations with the District Commanders it was stressed how vitally important it is to close or merge dead or dying posts. The necessary closing documents, once hard to find and even more difficult to figure out how to do them, are now on the department website in PDF format to help District Commander streamline the process. Currently, 14 posts are being closed at this DEC, another 2 are merging with other posts. This may sound alarming but think of the members of these posts who

At the beginning of this membership year, I introduced a Department Membership Strategic Plan. As outlined in that Plan, the overall objective was to grow membership by using Membership Recruiting and Retention; Education/Training/Leadership Development; Post Development and Revitalization; and Communication. Have we met that objective?

Membership Recruiting and Retention - Although I challenged each district to have at least two recruiting events during the year that the membership team would facilitate, very few districts participated in this

challenge and Covid-19 brought any events to a halt. More work needs to be done to develop and execute this part of the plan. Retention, however, the Department Adjutant and I have, through training on the importance of retention and the creation of the Post Renewal Report, enlightened the District Commanders on this aspect of membership.

Education/Training/Leadership Development - The Department Adjutant and I have stressed the need of training, particularly as it relates to membership processing and membership engagement. The various membership reports that have been created are to educate everyone on every aspect of membership. Other aspects of training will increase since establishing a training committee at the Department Convention.

Post Creation, Development and Revitalization - We have had a few new posts this year, but some seem to be struggling to meet the required membership numbers to obtain permanent status. There is also some interest in starting prison posts, and in fact, several posts have accepted members in prison and conduct satellite meetings at the facilities. Post Development and Revitalization - Again, we have worked hard to identify those posts that need development and revitalization, and in


some instances, closure. But, closing a post and transferring members to another active post is in my mind a revitalization for that member.

Communication - The membership team and Department have messaged unity from the beginning of this membership year. Establishing and developing training, forms, weekly newsletters, and reports have all been in an effort to facilitate better communication with all leaders in this department.

Covid-19 - I have no doubt that the Department would have made its goal of 100% if not for Covid-19. The Department currently has 84,212 members for 2020. We have surpassed our year-end numbers for last year, which was 82,732. In fact, California is the only department in Division 1 (85,000+ members) to do so. We are currently ranked 10th out of 55 Departments. Last year we finished 11th. This is a testament to all of you for your commitment to improve membership retention and engagement at the District and Post level. This, along with the transfer engagement campaign coming from Department truly improved the way we do membership. Which, incidentally, has not gone unnoticed by other departments. The only area showing decreased numbers is new members and that I believe is due to Covid-19. I commend everyone for using the Covid-19 stay at home order to contact current members and expired members using Buddy Checks. This effective tool has helped the Department achieve 94.58 percent in this very challenging year. Kudos to all of you.

Clearly we will build on these numbers for next year. We have new and exciting ideas being planned and implemented to help you with membership. It has been my distinct honor and privilege to serve as the Department Membership Director for 2019-2020, and I look forward to working with you next year.

These numbers only summarize the Service Officer Divisions workload, not considering the inability to work from our respective offices due to the current pandemic and local riots. Other Veteran issues such as discharge upgrades, advising Veterans how to obtain military medals and records, and essentially serving as an informed source to California's Veterans and their families about Veterans Affairs Programs are not represented in this report.

With the closing of the VA Regional Offices to the public, and the VA employees working remotely, the American Legion has continued with our promise to serve those who have served and their families. The implementation of the VetPro program could not have come at a better time. Although times are difficult, this platform has allowed us to stay engaged and continue to serve. The increase in some of the numbers noted above were solely due to the use of VetPro. It has proven to be a vital asset in this new normal that we have had to adhere to. We, The American Legion Department of California, have adapted and overcome and have maintained our relevancy during these trying times. It is what we do in the most challenging times that defines our culture as an organization and our legacy as public servants. Continue to support each other to support our veterans.

DEPARTMENT HISTORIAN END OF THE YEAR REPORT 2019-2020



The American Legion Department Historian is responsible for history and assists District & Post Historians coordinate, unify, and promote their work. Historians can be perceived differently by each individual person. Some refer to historians

as storytellers; others would perceive historians to be data collectors and trained professionals who have duties to provide explanations of the past. One of the main aims of any historian is to educate and attempt to explain events of the past rather than to recite stories. We are constantly attempting to piece together history that does not always appear to fit together; our job essentially is to fill in the gaps to create a complete picture.

This particular year has been full of American Legion Family excitement and activity. Never has social media been constantly used through mediums like Facebook, Twitter, and other methods to share their stories. Many Legion Family members are also cranking out monthly bulletins as well in order to share their stories and documenting their activities for history sake. Our Media and Communications Team is consistently modernizing our Department Website in order to keep all Legionnaires informed. Which I believe has made us a more informed American Legion as a whole.

With the assistance of my partner, Assistant Department Historian Fred J. Shacklett (Whittier Post 51), who was covering the southern part of the state, we were able to document the majority of Department Commander Grimsley's travels. I will be forever grateful to him for his expertise and guidance in photography and as a Historian. Additionally, I would be remiss if I did not also acknowledge Past National Historian James Higuera and Past Department of California Historians Lillian Moss and Dee Shick for all their advice and help as well. Thank you!

Lastly, a major highlight for me was to be part of the escort team as we traveled with the National Commander James "Bill" Oxford in December 2019 to various areas of Southern California. I would like to first thank Don Harper and the Legislative Commission for all their hard work. After we identify bills of interest to Legionnaires, we send them to the Chair of the Legislative Commission with information about the bill and a recommendation.

The Chair then works with his commission members to review the measure's policy and then vote on a position. This is a large undertaking and the Commission has met the challenge admirably.

The last half of the 2019-2020 legislative year for veterans was very productive. The American Legion supported, watched, or opposed 35 bills. 13 of the 35 bills you took positions on made it to the Governor's desk.

The American Legion-Department of California sponsored SB 663 (Jones); vet hall property tax and AB 368 (Quirk-Silva) Southern California Veterans Cemetery. SB 663 died due to the revenue loss to the state. AB 368 passed, and this issue continues to be worked on through the county and other interested parties. Many thanks to legionnaire, Bob Brower, for his tireless work and many trips to the capitol to work on this issue 2020 was the second year of the 2019-2020 legislative session. California's veterans will be well served by the legislators serving on the Senate and Assembly Committees on Veterans Affairs:

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a big impact on the Legislature however business has been progressing with legislators, staff, consultants, and lobbyists. The Legislature has a constitutional requirement to pass a state budget and deliberate on the business of the people and the 2020 legislative year will go on. However, the impact that the pandemic has, the state will certainly set the tone of debate for rest of the year.

Senate leadership asked Senators to "reconsider their priorities and reduce the number of bills they carry accordingly". The Senate Leader directed policy committees to compile a list of issues within their jurisdiction that need immediate attention as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Assembly leadership is leaving it to the committees to decide which bills will be heard that will best respond to the crisis.

By the time of the bill introduction deadline on February 21 there were 31 new bills we identified being of interest to veterans. The Legion has taken active positions on many of those bills and we wrote letters, met with staff, sometimes suggested amendments, and prepared to testify in committee on them. However, this was cut short by the Coronavirus pandemic, which caused the Legislature to go into a protracted recess. Because of the pandemic, the Legislature had to shelve many of its bills in order to deal with the post Coronavirus

recovery. There are still some veteran's bills moving forward through the process and we are working on supporting them on behalf of California's Legionnaires.

There will still be important legislation concerning veterans. In late April 2020 we are still getting reports of which veterans and military related bills will continue to move forward. Here is a list of bills we have compiled so far which will continue to need support.

AB 1935-VOEPEL; SUICIDE STUDY, WOMEN VETERANS.

AB 1935 seeks to direct the California Department of Veteran Affairs to conduct a study to attempt to determine why female veterans Suicide rates are so high. The measure asks to the Department to report its findings to the California State Legislature.

AB 2046-VOEPEL; DISABILITY GARNISHMENT.

Under current law, government child support agencies cannot attach more than 5% of disability income if the obligor has less than \$2,000 in assets. This protection for very low-income obligors does not apply to veteran's disability benefits recipients or to collections by private parties. Ab 2046 seeks to equalize the field by protecting disabled veterans in the same way that other non-veteran disabled obligors are protected.

AB 2494-CHOI; VETERANS TRANSCRIPT.

AB 2494 seeks to request the UC system to conform to the same rules that the state's community colleges (CCCs) and state universities (CSUs) regarding the review and creation of transferable credit from Service Member's Joint Service Transcripts. In short, the bill will urge the UC's to award course credit for prior military education, training, and service.

AB 2549-SALAS; LICENSING.

AB 2549 seeks to aid some military spouses in finding work when their husband or wife is transferred to California. Some spouses are licensed to perform services in other states but cannot engage in that business in this state because of licensing barriers. AB 2549 seeks to smooth the path for military spouses by adding registered dental assistant and registered dental assistant in extended functions licenses, and all

licenses issued by the Dental Hygiene Board, the Board of Pharmacy, and the Board of Accountancy to the program for the temporary licensure process for specified licensed professions for military spouses. The DoD, Navy, and Marine Corps are working with the author on this bill.

AB 3045-GRAY; LICENSING.

AB 3045 seeks to require most boards under the Department of Consumer Affairs to issue professional licenses to retired veterans and military spouses of active duty service members if they possess a valid and unrestricted license in that profession from another state. Military families move 2.4 times as often as civilian families, and this fact is at odds with the trend among licensed professionals to move between states nearly 40% less often than average, in part because of the difficult licensing process. Failure to recognize our veterans' unique experiences can discourage them from entering or remaining in the labor market and has led to unemployment rates among military spouses nearly four times that of the general population.

SB 907-ARCHULETA; MILITARY CHILDREN.

SB 907 would help the children of military families by improving coordination between on-base Family Advocacy Program (FAP) and county child welfare service (CWS) offices. The bill would require, upon initial intake, county CWS offices to identify military children subject to child abuse and neglect allegations, and would clarify that a county CWS office has the authority to develop memorandums of understanding (MOUs) with local military installation FAP offices to coordinate investigations.

SB 1007-HUESO; MILITARY RETIREMENT TAX RELIEF.

SB 1007 seeks to exclude from the state income tax, income received from retirement pay from the uniformed services.

It has been an honor and a pleasure to continue to serve our veterans in the American Legion.

I'd like to start by thanking the Commanders of Districts 16, 18, 20, and 24 for conducting the business of the Legion in the 6th Area during this trying time. If there is any level of success in the 6th Area this year is it due to our Adjutant Barbara Lombrano and I'm grateful for her unwavering dedication.

I started my year as the 6th Area Vice Commander excited to begin the vision part of our long-promoted mantra of Legacy and Vision. My concept for moving the Department of California into a second century of service sure was a lot different than phone calls and online meetings during a quarantine.

I was alarmed at the spring meetings as COVID-19 was in its infancy, but we met in Oceanside despite increasing concerns about the scope and impact of the pandemic. I'm delighted to report that I have heard of no illness despite our decision to gather together during this time. As I write this report moments before deadline, I still don't have any idea if a decision about convention will ever come, or if this group will continue clinging to bylaws they had no trouble dancing around at last year's convention. You may be reading this at convention: as of this writing, I still don't know.

I apologize for my failure to move this decision forward as a member of this Department Executive Committee. I was not able to motivate enough members to pick a direction and go with it. After an initial five-hour meeting that resulted in no decision, motions and resolutions were carefully thought out and drafted by our legal counsel to support either decision in advance of our second meeting, but no decision was ever made. Instead the proverbial can was kicked even further down the road with motions that will not accomplish what they are intended to do. This, in my opinion, is a result of legislating on the fly without sufficient forethought or buy-in from legal counsel or any type of bylaws committee. The motion that has been circulated at great cost and effort has us no closer to a decision. So, it is with great regret that my report is that there is in fact no action to report.

CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS COMMISSION
END OF THE YEAR REPORT FOR 2019-2020

COMMISSION GOALS AND TASKS:

The six Area Commissioners for the Department review submitted by-laws, returning to the requesting post or district specific recommendations for bringing them into compliance if not approved and submitting them to Department for entry into the record if approved. The Commission also provides other support directly to the Department when requested to do so by the Department Commander or Adjutant.

In September 2019, an updated sample/template version of Post Bylaws was forwarded to all the Commissioners of the Constitution and Bylaws Commission for review. This process was done to comply of Article V, Section 21 of the Department of California Bylaws. In addition, a sample/template version for District Bylaws was established and reviewed. The samples/templates were posted on the Department Web Site in both Word and PDF format to made available to all posts and districts within the Department. They were last updated in March 2020 to meet the needs of the Posts/Districts during the pandemic.

Next, an instruction sheet for the submission of Constitutions and Bylaws for posts and districts was established (including a sample amendment/change form) and posted on the Department website as well. An email was sent out to all Area and District Commanders and Adjutants within the Department letting them know all these documents are available online. District Commanders/Adjutants were asked to forward this all to posts within their respective districts.

An updated method of submitting Constitutions, Bylaws, changes, and/or updates was established. All entities are requested to submit their documents for review to Department in electronic format (preferably PDF) using the email bylaws@calegion.org. The documents will then be forwarded to the appropriate Area Commissioner for review, approval, or disapproval. If the document is disapproved, they will be returned to the post or district for correction with a detailed list of what needs changing to gain approval for submission. Approved documents will be forwarded to Department for entry into the record using the same email address. Submitted Constitutions, Bylaws, changes, and/or updates will only be reviewed by a member of the Commission and not by Department Headquarters. (NOTE: Around 50 sets of new bylaws were reviewed and recorded since the close of the 2019 Convention by the Commission)

I expect some challenges getting the new procedures implemented and used on a regular basis. I believe each Commissioner will act accordingly when dealing with these documents. Some flexibility may be needed under some special circumstances in assisting posts and districts with establishing a proper Constitution and/or Bylaws. The main goal of the Commission is to provide a quality service to the posts and districts in establishing these important documents.

Finally, I conducted an online training class on Constitution and Bylaws on April 19th which was recorded as a training tool. I will be conducting a commission meeting to look at the goals for the upcoming year.

1. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- a. Meetings — Since the 2019 Department Convention, The Media & Communications Commission has conducted 1 in-person meeting and 3 teleconferences, an average of one per quarter. This accomplishment was a big first one considering the commission had been inactive for several years.
- b. Goal — Development of a roadmap to improve the Department of California’s internal and external communications and solidify the Media & Communications Commission’s role in that

2. HINDRANCE

- a. It has been said that perhaps the reason the commission had been inactive for several years is that its commissioners were inexperienced in the practices of media and communications. Granted, having skilled technical advisers is key, but getting them and the commissioners to carry out tasks can prove difficult. Possible Solution: Develop Key Roles & Responsibilities for commissioners and advisers to agree to before being appointed.

3. OBJECTIVES, STRATEGIES, TACTICS

- a. Newsjacking — The Department of California needs to do a better job of inserting itself into the “news of the day.” The simplest way to do that is to have the commander or a designated spokesperson take a position on a subject on behalf of the organization. For example, veterans who have been deported: Does the American Legion Department of California think those veterans deserve some sort of assistance? It’s a complicated issue, but one that could be resolved after some research and a meeting. Think of the headline that would come of it. It would garner some media attention. We can’t be afraid to take positions. This organization needs bold action.
- a. Help develop guidelines for how the commission interfaces with the Department and its “Web Team”
- b. Find a better way to address our marketing & communications needs for our internal and external markets
- c. Continue development of online webinars, podcasts and videos for training and marketing
- d. Develop a list of requirements for commissioners and advisers to agree to upon accepting appointments from commander
 - i. Maintaining a list of news stories about their Legion posts
 - ii. Writing monthly reports (doesn’t have to be long) on any media progress made in their areas
 - 1. This can make submitting to the Book of Reports that much easier
 - iii. Develop a plan to have commissioners and advisers assigned to collaborate with staff members on specific & communications issues (i.e. Web Maintenance, Event fliers, Emails, Post Directory, Book of Reports, Media Awards, etc.)
- e. Help posts market to their local communities through the continued improvement of the Department website
 - i. Increase the Department website’s reach through standard search engine optimization tactics
 - ii. Post online the media contact document national publishes.
 - iii. Create a page with public relations materials and tutorials.
- f. Develop strategy to assist other commissions carry out their charges
- g. Explore the potential for converting the Media & Communications Commission to a committee.
 - i. This could allow more Legionnaires in large population areas to be involved and could also expand the role and expectations of technical advisors

NATURALIZATION COMMISSION
END OF THE YEAR REPORT FOR 2019-2020

MISSION STATEMENT:

To promote naturalization among un-naturalized residents of the State of California; to urge the broadening of the programs now established in schools for the education of un-naturalized residents so that they can pass the required tests for naturalization, including the teaching to un-naturalized persons of the history and background of the United States of America, and through the Posts and Districts to cooperate with the officials of the Naturalization Department of the United States and the courts when classes of persons are naturalized.

On March 18, USCIS temporarily suspended routine in-person services at its field offices, asylum offices and application support centers (ASCs) to help slow the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). USCIS is following the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's guidelines to protect our workforce and the public.

We have been busy assisting at ceremonies, Libraries and Other immigration forums. During ceremonies in the Sacramento Region over 800 citizens-to-be were being naturalized monthly prior to Covid 19. The American Legion Naturalization Commission is committed to carrying out its goal. Some programs that we assist in are in Preschool and Library programs, helping the families with study materials and test preparation. Department of Homeland Security Customs and Immigration officials have lauded the American Legion efforts.

Military Personnel and Veterans Can Now File United States service members and veterans can now file Form N400, Application for Naturalization, online. Those currently serving or who have served in the armed forces may be eligible to apply for naturalization under special provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA). Under these special provisions, the naturalization application fee is waived for military members and veterans, as are some of the requirements. Until now, U.S. service members and veterans filed a paper Form N-400. Provisions of the law extend some immigration benefits to the family member of a service member. Please see our website for additional information.

Legionnaires can assist in this commissions' goal by urging their Representatives in the 116th Congress to support H.R.4890 - Veteran Deportation Prevention and Reform Act. This Act may be cited as the "Veteran Deportation Prevention and Reform Act". This Act recognizes military service to the United States is a sacrifice that demonstrates loyalty to the Nation. That if a noncitizen who takes an oath of enlistment or an oath of office to join the United States Armed Forces—promising to support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic—deserves facilitated access to naturalization. It also provides for the service members family also giving them consideration in immigration removal proceedings. A noncitizen veteran who is deported after consideration under this Act should be provided the same veterans' benefits to which a similarly situated United States citizen veteran would be entitled

VETERAN AFFAIRS & REHABILITATION COMMISSION
END OF THE YEAR REPORT FOR 2019-2020

At present Covid-19 pandemic has impacted veterans' abilities to move about but know that virtual visits with your VA Doctor is the safest way to connect for non-urgent care. The number of veterans infected with the coronavirus continues being reported has climb and the VA reports a big increase in Coronavirus deaths. Currently, VA facilities are open to eligible veterans, but the VA urges to obey local travel restrictions and to avoid unnecessary travel. Know that VA now has 4 specific missions: Healthcare, Benefits, National cemeteries, and support to the federal government in times of natural disasters and pandemics

This year Commission members were asked to visit Veteran homes in their areas to see if the Legion could be of any assistance to them or advocate any concerns on their behalf. The request to visit homes was prompted by some problems/complaints of veterans residing at Yountville such as; hot water heaters being intermittently operational for three months; elderly residents had to shower in another building; one was transferred to a hospital room where only one elevator was operational; and so on... During my visit I found out that Yountville veteran home was preparing for some construction and renovation of buildings. I believe the completion of renovations will remedy the problems/complaints. Veteran Homes are now closed to guests due to the Coronavirus pandemic.

On January 15th I attended a Cal Vet board meeting at their office in Sacramento (Hugh Crooks presiding Chairman). The Chairman stated that he would like to have meetings in locations that will promote veteran involvement and that he welcomed suggestions for future meeting sites. Also, at that meeting, the Board announced a "Master Plan 2020" publication for Veteran Homes of California (a 300-page document). There are eight (8) veteran homes in California (Yountville, Redding, Barstow, Chula Vista, Lancaster, Ventura, Fresno, and West Los Angeles). Critical feedback from the veteran home residents contributed significantly in the accomplishment of the Master Plan 2020 publication. The purpose of the plan is to prepare California Veterans Homes for the future. This publication can be found on the Cal Vet website.

In Alameda county (Area 2), Steven Johnson reports that the Alameda Point Partners planning board met in December 2019 to review and discuss Site A amendments to Block 11 and Phase I Waterfront Park Design. Changes were proposed for residential unit size, amount of retail space and storm water drainage on Block 11 and proposed changes to landscaping and drainage for the waterfront park.

A new VA Clinic is under construction in Redding. The clinic will be 77,000 square feet and will have 520 parking spaces of which 52 spaces will be designated handicap. The estimated opening date of the clinic is summer of 2021.

This concludes my year-end report. I thank the Department Commander for appointing me to this Commission and I thank the members of the Commission for their service and devotion to assisting veterans and their families. I am Praying for the health, safety, and prosperity of all veterans. Prayer changes things.

The Sheriff said if they had waited any longer, they would have died. He is now doing well and in a home recovering.

This was a growing year for the American Legion here in Central California. We started out the year with many Post struggling to maintain membership numbers. There were 22 Post with very few meeting goals for members. By the end of the year we ended up with

20 Post with 11 hitting 100% membership. 75% of these folks had were only short by two or three members.

Our first district meeting was in Fresno at the 509 post. We asked all the posts to be active in the membership recruiting area and to take advantage of the training that was made available at the Department in Sanger. The emphasis was leaning to use the My Legion tools. The participation at the District level is about 75% currently. We now have less posts not active at this level.

In October District 19 participated in Fleet Week that was held in San Pedro with Post 61, (Battleship Iowa Post) as one of the hosts. This was second year that the District participated. We supported a booth which allowed inner action with current service members that were visiting the port. It also allowed us to talk about the American Legion.

In December, e District was on hand to welcome the National Commander for a visit at the Battleship Iowa. The District also went to the Long Beach VA on Christmas morning to distribute socks and other items of clothing to our veterans. We visited veterans at the spinal ward, blind ward, and the general hospital. This event is very special to the district.

The District held bingo at the Long Beach VA hospital on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month. Bingo was held at the L1 ward which cared for our veterans with PTSD. The Posts brought in pizza and soda and awarded prizes to the winners. Unfortunately, it was shut down for the rest of year due to the coronavirus pandemic.

The District did have issues with some Posts. The post commander of 359 resigned along with the commander of post 411. Post 723 (Holly dale) post was shut down to build Veterans Housing by LA County. The post has now merged with Post 134. Post 120 and Post 323 have been closed this year because of inactivity.

Post 359 hosted a meeting to educate new Post Commanders and adjutants for the upcoming year. A meeting was also held at Post 411 to instruct members on the use and advantages of Legion.org.

Currently membership in the district is 100% and have 10 posts that are 100% or better in their goals. The other 8 posts are 90% or better to their goal. Post 27 and Post 833 are 115% in membership. The district continues to work on membership. **District issues that must be addressed in 2020/2021.**

On the average our district meetings are attended by 8-10 posts. The district had 21 posts at the start of the year. It's very important that we have higher participation.

The difficulty of filling district offices has been a major problem. Members do not want the stress or the additional duties.

One of the other problems is also getting qualified personnel to step up to Post Commander. This issue is similar to the difficulty at the district level. The PCC will have to get more involved with additional training and support for these commanders. Some of the current commanders were looking to the district to solve their problems with the posts.

The district has also tried to get the more posts to get involved with district bingo, support for our baseball program and Law & Order programs. This continues to be an ongoing issue.

The District e-board meetings were held on the 1st Wednesday of the month and the general meeting was held on the 2nd Wednesday of the month. The meetings were held at the following Posts. Post 51, Post 61, Post 134, Post 272, Post 314, Post 359 and Post 411.

In October District 19 participated in Fleet Week that was held in San Pedro with Post 61, (Battleship Iowa Post) as one of the hosts. This was second year that the District participated. We supported a booth which allowed inner action with current service members that were visiting the port. It also allowed us to talk about the American Legion.

In December the District was on hand to welcome the National Commander for a visit at the Battleship Iowa. The District also went to the Long Beach VA on Christmas morning to distribute socks and other items of clothing to our veterans. We visited veterans at the spinal ward, blind ward and the general hospital. This event is very special to the district.

Post 359 hosted a meeting to educate new Post Commanders and adjutants for the upcoming year. A meeting was also held at Post 411 to instruct members on the use and advantages of Legion.org.

Currently membership in the district is 100% at this time. We currently have 10 posts that are 100% or better to their goal. The other 8 posts are 90% or better to their goal. Post 27 and Post 833 are 115% in membership. The district continues to work on membership.

On the average our district meetings are attended by 8-10 posts. The district had 21 posts at the start of the year. It's very important that we have higher participation.

The difficulty of filling district offices has been a major problem. Members do not want the stress or the additional duties.

One of the other problems is also getting qualified personnel to step up to Post Commander. This issue is similar to the difficulty at the district level. The PCC will have to get more involved with additional training and support for these commanders. Some of the current commanders were looking to the district to solve their problems with the posts.

The district has also tried to get the more posts to get involved with district bingo, support for our baseball program and Law & Order programs. This continues to be an ongoing issue.

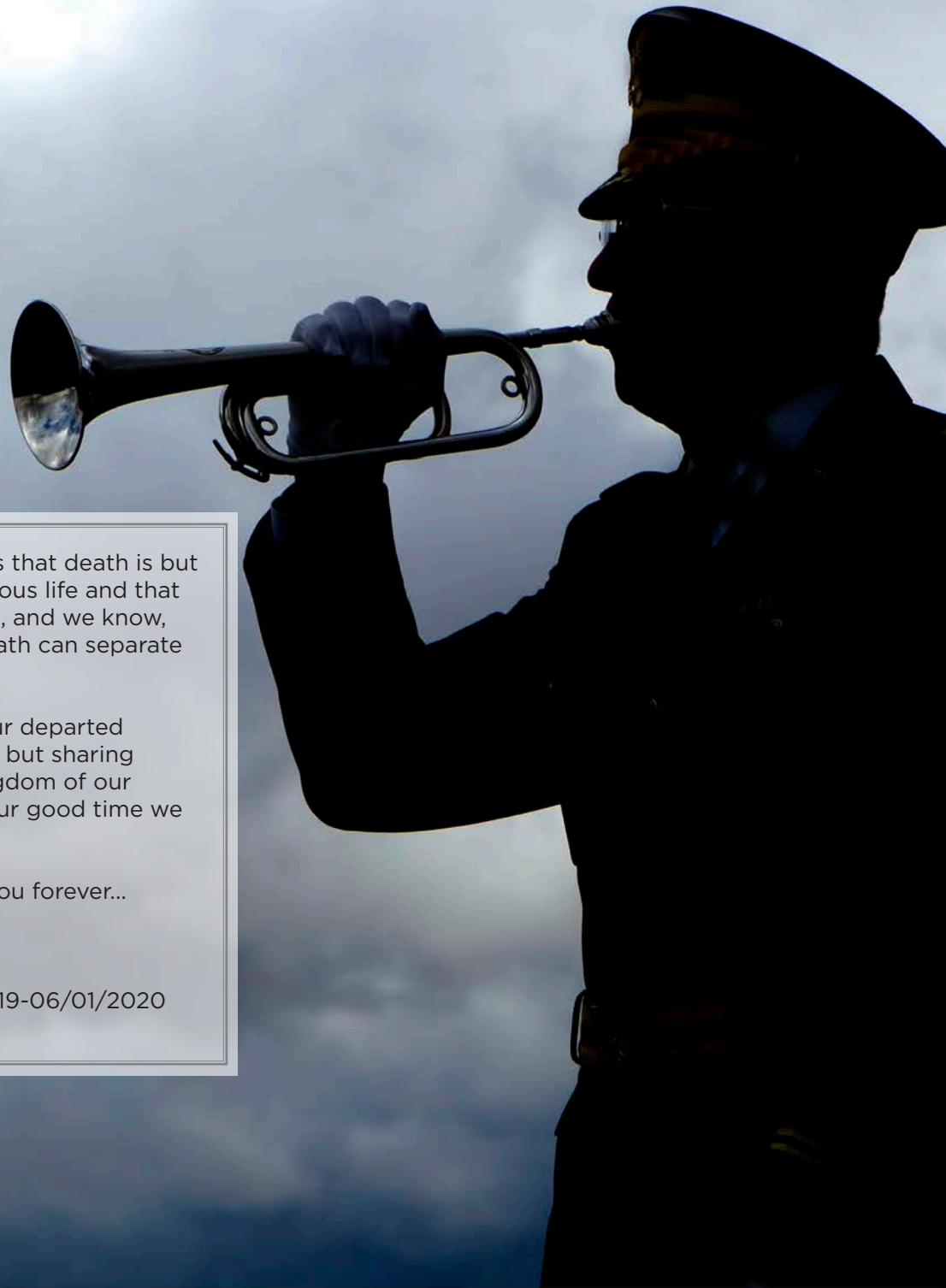
