







VINCENT "JIM" TROIOLA, NATIONAL COMMANDER OF THE AMERICAN LEGION

DEPARTMENT SERVICE OFFICER (DSO), INTERIM END OF THE YEAR REPORT 2022-2023

Greetings comrades, for those of you who do not know me, my name is Mark Campos and I have been acting as your Department Service Officer on an interim basis since October 2022. As we draw to the close of another American Legion year, it brings me great pleasure to come before you all and provide you with the updates of progress and accomplishments of the Service Officer Division of the American Legion Department of California.

As reported in April, the Service Officer Division has increased production of benefit grants for veterans is over 90% in all benefit categories we assist with since January 2023, with the most recognizable benefit categories being Compensation benefit for veterans who developed life-long disabilities as a result of their service and deserve recognition for their sacrifices, Pension benefit for veterans who have become physically unable to work due to disabilities that are not related to service but still have qualifying service to grant them eligibility for the benefit to supplement an otherwise inadequate income, and the Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (or DIC) benefit for eligible survivors who have lost their veteran loved one as the result of their service connected disability/ies. As I am sure it is noted by the reported increase in benefit grant percentage, it is clear that the Veteran Service Officers who join this division of the American Legion develop an unprecedented passion and drive for the charged task of improving veterans lives and the lives of their loved ones by assisting them in attaining the appropriate recognition from the Veterans Administration for their overall sacrifices, and for this we should all commend their tireless and unwavering efforts.

I would like it to be noted, that with this consideration of the positive progression in productivity of the Service Officer Division, the consideration should also be made that this all comes at a time where the Service Officer Division is spread extremely thin and is in dire need of support. It has been previously reported that there are many vacancies in American Legion held VSO offices throughout the state of California, and this creates an extreme overload for the VSOs currently towing the line throughout the state. We need to do better for our VSOs. For this, the Department Service Officer for the 2023-24 Legion year will be constructing a training platform to create a system of support for the VSOs throughout the state, and that system of support will be coming from the district, and potentially post level. By identifying individuals who may share the passion of the Veteran Service Officers and provide them adequate training to effectively build and potentially develop claims before passing the claim along to an accredited Service Officer to actively work the claim, and building a level of trust and confidence in said individuals, I believe that we can not only alleviate a great volume of strain from the workload our Service Officers see on a daily basis, but also show our Service Officers that we care and do keep their better interests in mind.

The reach that the Service Officer Division continues to establish with assisting veterans and their loved ones only continues to grow since the implementation of the VetPro platform which has proven to be an extremely great tool in today's world of claim development and claim working. This tool has not only allowed us to continue effectively and actively assist the veterans and their loved ones throughout the state of California, but based on referrals from these countless California veterans who have received more than satisfactory assistance from our Service Officers referring veterans they once served with or their loved ones to us, we have developed the ability to actively assist veterans from Arizona, Nevada, Utah, Washington, Texas, Missouri, Tennessee, Georgia, and Florida as well as outlying countries such as Mexico and Japan. This can only more so solidify the fact in our minds that the American Legion needs to not only allow but assist in the growth of our Service Officer Division.



We also managed to persuade this member to take the training to become a VSO and is interested in filling the vacant position in our Oakland office.

All in all, I had a great year as the Area Vice Commander and will always make the legion a part of my life. I will push for the intervention of suicide for veterans and make myself open for guest speaking events in the department and National organization.

Below are some accomplishments of the Area Five team toward that end: We

- Arranged for Tunnels to Towers to contributé 1.7 Billion dollars to provide U.S. Vets with housing for needy Veterans and to finish building out the March Air Reserve Base Veterans Village complex, which will add more buildings with a clinic and cafeteria and fund the West VA Los Angeles Housing Village,
- Arranged for Henry Rifle, Inc. to donate \$50,000.00 and a commemorative rifle to our headquarters in Indiana during last vear's convention.
- Added American Legion, District 21, Post 519 Baseball organization with "Elite teams."
- Had a representative travel to Medellin, Colombia; American Legion Post to establish regulations un the Pact Act.
- Had a representative journey to Porta Vallarta, Mexico American Legion Post 12 to assist them in promoting the opening of a clinic for Veteran treatment. And help secure DOD IDs for Veterans and their spouses and their benefits under the Foreign Medical Program.
- Obtained two Pop-up tents with American Legion logos for area posts use.
- Created an Area 5 youth Drone Program for training and exposure to Flight, math, and science Technology.
- Had a representative attend a Federal International Drome Association meeting in South Korea as a keynote speaker representing the United States

- In Partnership with the DOD, arranged for Area 5 Posts to conduct Commemorative Ceremonies and did the same in Medellin, Colombia, and Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, where hundreds of Vietnam Veterans were officially welcomed home.
- Some of the more significant above ceremonies occurred in Post 291, Vets Village, and Laguna Niguel in Orange
- ACRUSURE Stadium provides Area 5 with \$2.00 for every ticket sold.
- Had an outside entity (Vet.com.U.S.) assist Veterans with difficulty obtaining their 100 percent rating from the VA.
- Had Post 742 arrange and obtain \$50,000.00 in computers for needed posts.
- Created a "Post of the Year" award for success in Legion Compliance.
- Had a Celebrity Veteran Golf Tournament to raise \$5,200.00 for needy Area posts.
- Sponsored funds for a deceased Veteran's Funeral Service.
- Are negotiating a large donation to assist all Area 5 posts to meet their wish list.
- Distributed \$300,000.00 in product donations to Riverside and Brawley communities.
- Established relationships with Area Congressional Representatives and state legislation.

The above are just a few accomplishments of the Area, and our efforts will continue.

For years District 16 have not had American Legion Baseball. This is mainly due to the High School Coaches do not allow the students to do both High School and AL baseball. However, our District continues to support the program with our donations.

Many of District 16 Posts continue to have Memorial and Veteran Days events. The Cemeteries throughout the District have flags set at the Veterans grave sites. Many also place Christmas wreaths.

District 16 had a successful phone-a-thon. This annual effort started in 2014 then called Revitalization. The difference is we no longer call P-1000 members.

Similar to many other California Districts, our 18 Posts are spread out over three Counties, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, and Ventura Counties. The travel distance from the furthest north Post, Cambria to our most southern Post, Simi Valley is about 200 miles. It is my pleasure and honor to report to you that District 29 had a very positive year and our prospects for the future are excellent.

Membership. District 29 ended with almost 100 percent of the Department's

membership goal of 8,025 members. Though one of the smallest districts in area, we are the largest district in the Department and Area 5 in membership as we are for years. We emphasize not only recruitment of new members but retention of delinquent members especially using post executive committee officers without any assigned duties. We are especially proud of Posts 257/Laguna Woods and 281/ South Orange County that exceeded 100 percent of the goal, and 291/Newport Harbor with the second largest membership (over 4000 Legionnaires) in the nation at last report.

Post Development. D29 began the year with 26 posts, one of which, Saddleback Valley/862, was not really active. The Department Executive Committee ('DEC") unanimously approved revocation of that post charter upon our application, all of the members having merged into nearby posts. A number of other posts are being revitalized by new leaders. Post Centennial celebrations continue as more posts reach the 100 year mark.

VA&R. D29 this year has been especially motivated to support the Department's Veterans Assistance and Rehabilitation Fund, so necessary for our physically and emotionally injured veterans. Our members have made it clear that this is where our emphasis should and must be placed as the need will be with us forever. Our wounded must never be forgotten.

Youth Programs. D29 actively participated in the Legion's Baseball, Oratorical, Boys/Girls State and Spring School Awards Programs.

Americanism. Every post of D29 promotes patriotic events such as Memorial Day, Veteran Day, Service Birthdays, and Independence Day activities. We are especially proud of

our District 29 and local post Four Chaplains Services.

Veteran Recognitions. D29 continued to have Korean War Veterans honored by the Korean Government in local post commemorations.

Department Participation. Following the lead of our past District Commander, Bill Siler iii, who served as Department Adjutant for 12 years, D29 actively participates in all Department activities. Every DEC was attended by delegates. Our District Commander also served as Department Assistant Judge Advocate, exofficio alternate member of the Constitution & Bylaws and the Personnel commissions. and Technical Adviser to the Naturalization Commission. This could not have been done without the hard work of our Finance Commission which consists of members chosen from each Area of the Department: Area 1, Susan Johnson; Area 2, David Johnson; Area 3, Gene Hamill (Vice Chairman); Area 4, Hugh Crooks (Chairman); Area 5, Donny Brannon; Area 6, Tim Shaner, and our Technical Advisor (T/A), Steven Travali. I would be remiss if I did not mention our CPA Teresa Stephens, the outstanding Adjutant, Sam Flores who keeps the Chairman from saying the wrong words and keeping his statements diplomatic, and the person who we rely on the ensure that we can answer all technical questions, Chrystal Rangel. The Commission meets a minimum of once per month overseeing problems in the budgetary process and suggesting solutions to make suggestions to the Department Executive Committee (DEC).

This past year they have had to come up with unique and specialized knowledge and suggestions in order to solve problems that have arisen, and still stay within those limits concerning our revenue and expenses.

Each month a up to date copy of the financial statements are printed for the Finance Commission for review and review to make suggestions for changes, for example hose line items that may have been too large should be reduced or those that it appear to have some overspending should be adjusted accordingly. This is done keeping a "paper trail" of all movement within the process in order that if in the future all of these changes can be tracked.

Again your Finance Commission did it's job, and again helped to developed programs to help Post such as 'The Blue Cap Assistance Program" Which has money to help pay the bills of those Posts that qualify.

AERONAUTICS AND AEROSPACE COMMISSION END OF THE YEAR REPORT FOR 2022-2023

MISSION STATEMENT:

To promote civilian air activities in the Department, including the building of model airplanes, and if deemed advisable competition among persons so engaged. To promote Aerospace research and to keep The American Legion advised of all activity in the field of Aerospace.

The Aerospace Commission has worked diligently to promote aerospace research and to keep The American Legion advised of all activity in the field of aeronautics and space. We were the first to update our webpage to the new standard (https://calegion.org/aeronautics), and have published 15 fill-length articles for the Department Legionnaire, and more for the District newspapers over the last two years. The Department articles are posted on the webpage. We have a speaker's bureau by which we can provide presentations to Posts and community groups, and have published three newsletters which was distributed to every District. Our monthly meetings are held via Zoom so as to increase participation, and all are invited to join us. The slides and minutes from our meetings, and reports are also distributed to the Areas and Districts. There has been tremendous change in aeronautics and space over the last few decades, and we are presenting a resolution to update the bylaws to reflect the current status.

The greatest accomplishments are through the individual efforts of our participating team members. John Carlson of Area 2 and Dennis Matarrese of District 10 worked with the Oakland Aviation Museum, Moffat Air Museum, and the new Naval Air Station Museum in Alameda. Craig Cook in District 12 is leading the American Legion support in the relocation of the last US Navy "Black Bunny" F-4S Phantom to the Castle Air Museum. Amado Salinas of District 21 has established a Drone Training Camp in his district whereby they are training 40 local youth in the operation and technology behind flying drones safely in accordance with FAA rules. At the end of the camp each student has their own full size competition remotely piloted vehicle, helmet, vest, and their FAA "The Recreational UAS Safety Test (TRUST)" certification. His American Legion team was invited to represent the United States in the FIDA World Championship competition in Korea. The Drone Camp program has been documented and established so that it can be duplicated in any District. In District 24 Josh Lang has produced documentaries that tell the story of veterans and aircraft maintainers. Nic Mihojevich is keeping us informed of foreign cyber-threats to our aerospace industry, while he is between deployments.

We are also promoting our stance in public policy for veteran's workforce opportunities in the industry, inclusion and diversity in the military aerospace workforce, and developing opportunities for youth to qualify through the ASVAB for aerospace jobs in the military.

None of this could have been possible without the advice, guidance, and support of our Technical Advisor Harley Santos; and the encouragement of the Department Commanders Autrey James and Jere Romano

CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS COMMISSION END OF THE YEAR REPORT FOR 2022-2023

"To review and help write the Constitution and Bylaws of the Posts, Districts, and the Department of California through Training and Administrative Support."

Since the 2022 convention, the Constitution and Bylaws Commission has met 11 times and has accomplished a lot. These were our goals:

- To update all reference material concerning writing and maintaining Bylaws for Posts and Districts.
- To establish an Operational Guide for the Commission.
- To help as many Posts as possible become compliant with the Department Bylaws Article V, Section 21.
- To review and make recommendations for updating the Department Bylaws.
- To have all Post and District Bylaws available online for
- To conduct training when and where needed for writing bylaws.

A contest was initiated to help encourage all the Posts to bring their Bylaws up to date. At the Department Convention, there will be a drawing for the winning prize of \$1000.00, payable to the Post's general fund. The rules were well publicized.

An up-to-date Post Sample Bylaws was posted online twice. We've tried to make it so that each Post will be aware of some of the choices they can make with setting up their bylaws along with clarifying some of the language. A revision of the District Bylaws Sample were posted, but a better revision is pending.

As of May 12th, 2023, out of the 409 Posts in the Department, 181 of them are currently compliant within the 7-year limit established in the Department Bylaws. This is a compliance ratio of 44.3%. There are 28 additional Posts with Bylaws awaiting corrections. If all these clear by Convention, then could have a potential of a compliancy of 51.1%. We are working hard to help all Posts in the Department become compliant with the requirements. I expect around 15-25 more sets prior to convention.

A thorough report was given at each DEC during the past year. District Commanders were told that they are the key to helping Posts update their Bylaws. They were told that the Commission will provide whatever support they can in achieving this goal. We have helped many Posts rewrite their Bylaws over the past year and will continue to do so. Bylaws must be submitted by the Post directly to the Department using bylaws@calegion.org. Districts are also not a part of the approval process for bylaws.

This past September, with the help of Rick Pushies from the Web Team, we were able to make available online copies of the most recent Bylaws for all Posts and Districts within the Department. He has also helped us keep the online files up to date as new bylaws are approved. Bylaws date have also been maintained online in the Administrative Compliance Report with the help of Crystal Rangel from the Department Staff.

With the help of Department Judge Advocate Jay McCann, the Commission worked on some proposed revisions to the Department Bylaws. They focus was mainly on Article IX. Most of the recommendations involve a reorganization with some minor bylaw changes. The recommendations were completed and submitted to Department before April 1st and notice was given (with availability) prior to May 1st.

Part of the revision was to remove unnecessary references to the Department Convention and establish a "Uniform Code of Procedures for Department Convention"; a process that was approved at the April DEC. A viable working copy should be available for review by the Fall DEC.

We also wrote a Department Resolution Process Guide, which was approved at the April DEC. This document deals with how resolutions are generated, approved, and processed in California from a Post level on up to National.

Training was done at the 2022 Department Convention on writing Post bylaws. This was also part of the curriculum the of California American Legion College at each class. The training is scheduled to be repeated at the 2023 Convention.

The "Operational Guide for the Constitution and Bylaws Commission" was accomplished last fall and has been posted online since then.

LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION END OF THE YEAR REPORT FOR 2022-2023

MISSION STATEMENT:

To consider legislative matters, making recommendations to the Department Convention and the Executive Committee, and generally supervise the legislative program of the Department during the state legislation session. Our Department Commander and the Department Executive Committee (DEC) are briefed on the bills we review. When possible, we present them at the DEC for a formal vote. Otherwise, due to the fast paced nature of the legislative session, the Legislative Commission reviews the bills sent to us by our legislative advocates, whereupon we review their analysis and develop an official postion on the bill.

The Commission works closely with Reeb Government Relations, the Department's legislative advocates at the State Capitol. Registered lobbyists Seth Reeb and Dana Nichol do a very professional job tracking and advocation for legislation and share a longstanding working relationship with our Commission.

Even though COVID-19 has passed, the legislative annex of the state capitol building is closed for a multi-year renovation project. The Governor's and Lt Governor's offices, legislator's offices, some hearing rooms, and some committee offices have moved to a temporary, recently constructed state building two blocks from the Capitol.

The legislature is in the first year of a two-year session. To date, there have been over 50 bills identified which are veteran or military related. Specific legislation will be covered in the report of our legislative advocate's report in the Book of Reports.

I would like to thank our Department Commander Jere Romano and Department Adjutant Sam Flores for their much-appreciated support of this Commission.

I would like to thank my fellow legistive commissioners for their commitment, knowledge, and willingness to delve into the complexities of legislation and respond to the large numbers of legislative requests. The members of this outstanding team are: Vice Chair Eric Measles (Area 6), Bob Brower (Area 5), Patricia Jackson-Kelly (Area 4), Dave Smith (Area 3), and Alfred Gordillo (Area 2), and technical advisors, Seth Reeb and Mike Brimer.

I am proud to report that we were able to have our American Legion-Department of California Capitol Advocacy Day this year on April 19, 2023 in Sacramento.

This event took place after a three-year hiatus because of state and local COVID-19 restrictions. Reeb Government Relations organized the event and did an outstanding job. This event was attended by Department Commander

Jere Romano, Department Adjutant Sam Flores, and 45 Legionnaires from across the state.

During the morning porton of the program, we had a number of elected officials attend and talk about the veteran bills they were authoring. After lunch, the Legionnaires walked across the street to the temporary legislative offices to visit legislators, staff, and committee consultants to educate them on what the Legion does for veterans and the community. During these visits, Legionnaires also share a listing of all the bills supported by the Department of California as well as other information and data on veterans issues and priorities. Another important aspect of these visits is to develop or build upon personal relationships with legislators and staff. Some Legionnaires made pre-scheduled appointments with their legislators and others visited as many offices as time allowed.

Feedback from the Legionnaires is that they enjoyed the return of Captol Advocacy Day. Again, we thank Government Relations for an event well done.

It is always my honor and privilege to Chair this Commission.

Our Legion Voice matters and is very well respected at our State Capitol. We will continue to fight for good legislation that improves the lives of our Legionnaires, their families, and our military.

LAW AND ORDER COMMISSION END OF THE YEAR REPORT FOR 2022-2023

The mission of The American Legion Department of California Law and Order Commission is to foster, within the scope of American Legion principles and policies, an affirmation program of respect for and support of law and order in general, and law enforcement agencies in the legitimate function and performance of their offices and duties.

The true intent of a Law and Order program is to demonstrate appreciation to those men and women who swore an oath to protect our communities. These first responders, whether they be police officers, deputy sheriffs, federal and state officers and agents, firefighters, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, and others, put their lives on the line on a daily basis. As an American Legion Post or District, it is incumbent that each show their appreciation and gratitude in the form of an established Law and Order program. This practice is in keeping with our principles of the American Legion, and is in keeping within the pillar of Americanism.

To put things into perspective, in 2022, a total of 246 law enforcement officers lost their lives in the line of duty. Year to date numbers for 2023 show 42 officers have lost their lives in the line of duty. For firefighters, the last whole number available is for 2021 wherein 70 firefighters lost their lives in the line of duty. To date in 2023, 27 firefighters have lost their lives in the line of duty. It is incumbent on us all as Legion members to honor the living first responders through our Law and Order program.

In a change from years' past, the Law and Order Commission amended the judging criteria for the Firefighter Valor Award. Previously, only one firefighter would have been recognized; however, given that firefighters often work in teams, it was difficult to identify a candidate suitable for the award. Beginning with the 2023 award presentations, a team of firefighters will now be considered for the Firefighter Valor award.

The awards which are presented at the Department Convention are now Law Enforcement Officer of the Year – Valor, Law Enforcement Officer of the Year – Community Service, Firefighter(s) of the Year – Valor (group award), and Firefighter of the Year – Community Service (individual award).

We invite each Post and District to submit your nominations to your respective Area Law and Order representatives for consideration of the Department of California awards.

Army Strong!

The Battle

When veterans get together at the American Legion, you can expect to hear all kinds of stories about their time in the service, a lot of them humorous tales, others not so. And some will grudgingly tell you about their combat experiences, admitting to the gnawing fear most men feel in combat.

Army veteran Francisco "Frank" (aka "Sarge") Ortiz has his own reflections on the time he spent in both Afghanistan and Iraq. But, at the same time, he'll share that of all the firefights he was in, nothing had him more fearful than when his daughter, Ellie Maria, got sick.

Ellie was a typical baby... smiling, jovial and cute, but by the time she'd reached half a year she started having diarrhea with everything she consumed. It took a while for the doctors to pinpoint the cause. But, after a CT scan, a tumor was discovered in her tummy.

What a scary and stressful diagnosis for any parent to face! And, it was all the more compounded when little Ellie was



transferred to a specialty hospital in Fontana, an hour and a half away, requiring a lot of back and forth driving for Frank and his wife, Jackie, who still had to look after their other two kids at home in Indio... Cali, 10 and Frankie, 4.

While the tumor turned out to be malignant, the gifted surgeons were able to get it all and today, Ellie is cancer free as she gets ready to celebrate her 3rd birthday on September 2nd.

"She showed a lot of bravery back then," says Frank, "and continues to amaze us all with her resiliency and upbeat attitude." It would, of course, be a sure bet to say she inherited those traits from her Dad.

The Back Story

Ellie's father came from the "school of hard knocks". Frank had a tough guy attitude when he was younger, hanging out with the wrong crowd, engaging in vandalizing vehicles and even petty theft which led to his being arrested a couple of times. However, as a juvenile, all he got was a stern admonition from the Court as punishment.



Then, he got kicked out of high school, kept getting into trouble, and eventually got grazed by a bullet when riding in a car stolen by a friend.

"It was at that moment, I knew I was living a stupid life and making stupid decisions," Frank relates. "If I was going to die, I wanted it to to be for a bigger cause than something with no meaning." And so, the next day when watching TV, he saw the "Be AII You Can Be" U.S. Army commercial which prompted him to pick up a phone and call the local recruiting station.

Before you know it, the Army had him enrolled in an Adult High School program which enabled him to receive his diploma and get inducted into the service.

The rest, of course, is history. He saw combat in both Afghanistan and Iraq, rose to the rank of Sergeant and would have made it a career except for a compelling need to take care of family back home.



Years later, he found himself the father of four girls and a boy and now, the owner of two barber shops... one in Indio and another in Bermuda Dunes aptly named...





But how did a guy with his background end up in the barber biz? "Well," he says with a shrug, "it's just something I did in the Army. First, I cut my own hair. Then, other guys asked me to cut theirs and it just spring-boarded to where it seemed a logical transition.

Hanging Tough

One wouldn't have expected Francisco Javier Ortiz to have turned his life around like he did, but thanks to Army discipline and training, he acquired a self assurance to do what he had to do to make it. So, it's no wonder then that little Ellie's also a fighter and survivor just like him.

Being around her, one simply can't help but notice her bubbly persona and infectious smile, amazed at how fate took one spiraling downward young Hispanic and turned him into the parent he is today.



Now when we veterans sit around the American Legion reminiscing, Ellie's journey is one of those special moments we'll remember. After all, her Dad came through his own personal battles and passed that same don't-give-up toughness onto his daughter. For us all... she's the littlest "soldier"... Army strong!

TEMERICAL EGY WHAT THE WOKE???!!!

Critical Race Theory in the U.S. Military

When you ask American Legion veterans what they most remember about basic training, their responses, especially Marines and Army, often include what the drill instructors pounded into their heads... that "there's only one color in the military and that's GREEN! There ain't no white, black, red, yellow, brown or any other color... just GREEN!"

The reality was exactly that... a mixed bag of humanity all tossed together like a big ol' caesar salad... white guys, blacks, hispanics, asians and even native Americans...learning a new way of doing things... one which required unit cohesiveness and teamwork... where reliance on ones fellow recruits was the key toward surviving another day.

Racial divisiveness simply didn't exist in their military for that very reason. All ethnic identities were obliterated from the moment they arrived in bootcamp and had their hair shaved off! So why is it now perceived to be an issue? What happened? Why all of a sudden is there this misplaced assumption that "wokeness" now pervades our military, engendering countless headlines over the past year such as:

America's Military and our Country Won't Survive if Wokism Continues to Rule Is the Military too 'Woke' to Recruit?

But what exactly is being "woke" all about and where did it come from?

Woke has it underpinnings in Critical Race Theory (CRT) which, by definition, means to be aware and well informed of systematic racial prejudices, injustices and inequities in American society. CRT started percolating in academic circles in the 60's & 70's with the premise that racial bias is historically embedded in our nation's laws, policies and institutions. And now? It's become so pervasive that it's even being injected into military training.

As a result, in June of this year, Congressman Matt Gaetz of Florida, during a House Armed Services Committee hearing, observed that critical race theory is "undermining cohesiveness in the services". And, Senator James Lankford of Oklahoma took it a step further by suggesting that funding should be withheld for critical race theory training for our service members because it "politicizes our military." Why? Because racial bias is relatively nonexistent in the military.

And yet, Air Force Academy cadets, for instance, have been instructed to avoid committing "micro-agressions" referencing the need to replace terms such as "you guys" and "terrorists" with terms that are considered "less offensive".



Instructors have been noted as actually telling cadets that they should use the term "parent" or "caregiver" rather than say "Mom and Dad".

Even the U.S. Navy released a training video to "help sailors understand the proper way of using personal pronouns." This is lunacy. This is wokeness... differentiating service members along racial, ethnicity and gender lines, promoting the idea that somehow there's an inherent inequality based not only on race, but also on differing views of personhood, family life, gender and sexuality.





Thomas Spoehr

Retired Army Lieutenant General and current Director for National Defense at the Heritage Foundation, Thomas Spoehr, put it this way: "The largest threat to our current military is the weakening of its fabric... introducing questions about whether promotion is based on merit or quota requirements. It leads to military personnel serving in specialties and areas for which they are not qualified or ready." From Spoehr's viewpoint, critical race theory actually runs counter to the team-centered culture of the military by teaching service members to be so cognizant of the basic differences between them that those in the minority can somehow justify feeling victimized and even feeling entitled to special treatment.

According to Spoehr's colleague Dakota Woods, a Marine Corps veteran and Senior Research Fellow for Defense Programs: "Such initiatives destroy the fabric of military service that otherwise unites an extraordinary diverse population in common purpose and identity. Identity politics is a cancer that corrodes good order and discipline. When we view people through the lens of race, gender or religion, we embrace the polar opposite of everything

the U.S. military strives for, being a colorblind, race-blind, genderblind team. Thinking less about teams and more about individuals is a recipe for failure."

What's the fall out effect? Sixtytwo percent of Americans stated during a recent Reagan Institute poll that they feel the military has now become so "politicized" that it lessens its ability to effectively respond to world crisis. It's trickle down effect is impacting military readiness to the point where one service member observed: "I see minorities, overweight people and men and women not adhering to military standards daily and yet nobody corrects them out of fear of being labeled a racist or sexist."

Going woke has gotten so bad it's caused the military to lower it's enlistment requirements or waive them entirely in order to maintain it's readiness force. Just this past year, for instance, the Army missed it's recruiting goal by 25%, the worst miss on record since the U.S. military became an all-volunteer force nearly 50 years ago. It's felt by the other services as well.



Former Secretary of State and CIA Director Mike Pompeo puts it in perspective when he writes...

"How can we ask young men and women who have decided to risk their lives for America, even die for America, to affirm that our country is inherently racist?

How can we ask them to view their brothers and sisters in arms through the narrow prisms of race or gender? The clear and obvious answer is that we cannot - not without putting their lives at risk on the battlefield. A woke military is a weak military."

According to Spoehr, "Wokeness in the military also... acts as a disincentive for many young Americans in terms of enlistment. And it undermines wholehearted support for the military by a



significant portion of the American public at a time when it is needed most.

Is anyone surprised that potential recruits - many of who come from rural or poor areas of the country - don't want to spend their time being lectured about white privilege? The bottom line is that precious time and money are being poured into woke programs and projects that would be better applied towards making the military more capable."



Those of us American Legion veterans who served during an era where wokeness had yet to raise its divisive head, well remember the way it was. We were organized, equipped and trained to "uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America against all enemies foreign and domestic" - not to find ourselves enmeshed in nonsensical ring-around-the-rosy identity clarifiers. It's damn well time for a return to business as usual where there's only one color in the military... GREEN!*

The Veteran Affairs & Rehabilitation (VA&R) Commission's mission is to assist veterans and their families with direction and guidance in acquiring benefits they have earned (benefits, health care, memorial affairs). In other words, put them in touch with the right qualified individual who can assist them. Secondly, volunteer to serve at or visit VA facilities and California Veterans Homes (CDVA) to ensure quality care for veterans. Third, keep the veteran community updated with the latest news releases concerning benefits, health, and national cemeteries. Lastly, assist and or serve communities in times of emergencies and disasters. (Wildfires, floods, riots, etc.) Further, the Commission commits to providing fair, honest, and objective advocacy for veterans, in an ethical manner. Most importantly, the Commission and its representatives demonstrate compassion, care, and concern when dealing with veterans and their families. The VA & R program operates on an annually approved budget developed by the Department's Finance Commission and approved by the Department Executive Committee (DEC).

The VA& R Commission held 4 Commission meetings via Zoom video this year. Its first meeting was on August 11, 2022. Commission members continually discuss individual accomplishments and future plans. Members visited VA facilities and CA Veteran Homes to observe and ensure veterans are receiving quality care. We let veterans know that the American Legion cares about them.

Commissioners gave no unfavorable or negative reports from their observations at Veteran Homes or VA Facilities.

The Commission participated in ceremonies at Sacramento Valley National Cemetery (SVNC), giving proper military honors to all unaccompanied veterans interred there during the pandemic. I performed Chaplain duties at the cemetery. From my observations, the

VA staff there does an outstanding job. No problems

The VA & R Commission submitted their annual Budget request with justification to the Department. The Commission updated its continuity folder to help future incoming Commissioners, so they do not have to re-invent the wheel to do the work of the Commission.

The Commission attended regularly scheduled CalVet board meetings via video conferencing. CalVet kept the Commission updated on progress made at Veteran homes. Currently, guests are allowed to enter the Yountville Veterans Home compound (some Covid restrictions still apply). However, isolation for resident's changes as conditions change. Other Homes have similar conditions for visitors. Legionnaires throughout the state donate gifts and care packages to veterans residing in Homes.

On the week of March 6th , the National VA & R Commission met in Sacramento, California for a System Worth Savings (SWS) visit of Northern California VA facilities. They also conducted a townhall, led by Chairman Autry James. The SWS town hall visit is held by the Commission to hear from local veterans about their health care concerns. During the town hall, local veterans conveyed a wealth of information to the Commission (some good and some not so Good). All of the information gathered through open discussion is helpful in evaluating and ensuring VA progress or lack thereof.

The Commission also regularly attends virtual town halls hosted by VAGLAHS.

An ad-hoc committee established by the Department to study and research Veterans Mental Health under the VA & R Commission. That committee will make a report of its findings to the Department.

All information obtained by Commissioners is immediately communicated to members during Area and District meetings.

I thank each member of the Commission for their service and devotion to assisting veterans and their families.
