## SCORE VS SPEND

Fox River Classic Conference & Neighboring School Districts

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction scores school districts on prescribed benchmarks. Pulaski Community School District's score is among the best of districts of similar size in the Green Bay area. PCSD also maintains a low cost of instruction and services per pupil. **That means the district spends less for a better education compared to most schools in NE Wisconsin (and state-wide).**



## interpreting the data



### Score Tiers

- 83 - 100** Significantly Exceeds Expectations
- 70 - 82.9** Exceeds Expectations
- 58 - 69.9** Meets Expectations
- 48 - 57.9** Meets Few Expectations
- 00 - 47.9** Fails to Meet Expectations

### Calculating Per Pupil Cost

This indicator represents the amount that local, state and federal governments spend on elementary and secondary education, adjusted for the size of the student body. It is calculated by dividing the current expenditures over the entire academic year for pre-kindergarten through grade 12 by the number of students in those grades. Expenditures include instruction and instruction-related costs, student support services, administration and operations. They exclude funds for school construction and other capital outlays, debt service and programs outside of public education.
