

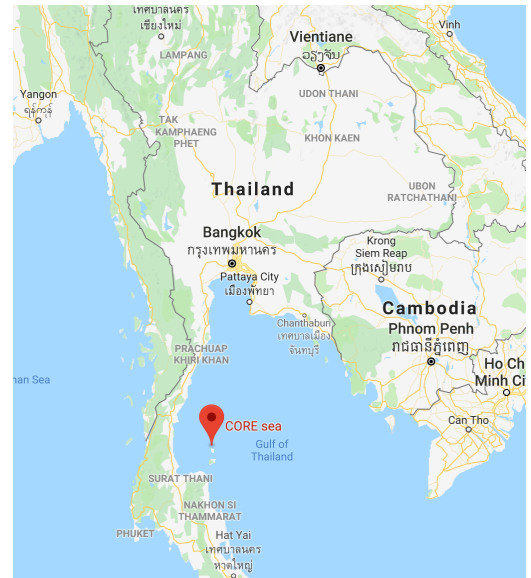
CoreSea

History...

CoreSea was founded in 2011, to help protect the biodiversity of our world's reef systems. By partnering scientific skill with environmental passion, interns, researchers, conservationists and others develop, test and apply best practices to actively help our deteriorating coral reefs.

About the area...

Our field research station in Thailand is located in the lower Gulf of Thailand, on Koh Phangan. Koh Phangan is a stunning tropical island, fringed by coral reefs and juvenile mangroves. The surface is covered by tropical forest, which grows in the mountainous inland.



Work Description...

You can focus on either Marine Research or Marine conservation during your time here. Conservation interns assist conservation oriented research, maintain and establish projects like artificial reefs and coral nurseries, remove ghost nets, clean reefs and beaches, and what ever else is necessary to make a better world. Marine Research interns assist a team of international researchers, maintain and establish experiments, collect data, but are also involved in the conservation projects. Usually work is from 9:00am - 4:00pm 6 days a week. Usually interns do 1-2 dives a day to work or collect data.

Accommodation & Food...

Accommodation is provided by CoreSea at their research center. They can host up to 11 interns at a time in shared rooms. Meals are not included, but there is a fully equipped kitchen where students can prepare their own meals, or they can go out to eat.
