General Notes

- Check Degree Works or the Catalog for course pre-requisite information.
- Minimum C- grade for major coursework required
- > 50% of major requirements must be taken at Regent University
- ➤ A minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA is required to maintain good academic standing.
- > Some majors also require a minimum grade in all major courses.
- As a general rule, 100 and 200 level courses should be taken prior to upper level (300 and 400) level courses.
- A minimum of 120 credits is required.
- > A minor may be completed in place of a portion of the general electives. Students must still earn 120 credits total.
- > Honors & on campus students will have 15 less general elective credits due to taking the C&C minor or Honors courses.

Major Related Notes

- The Government major is offered on campus and online.
- Students majoring in Government (B.A.) must complete MATH 201.
- ➤ GOVT 196 Intro. to the Study of Govt. is a prerequisite for three required major courses: GOVT 327, GOVT 329, GOVT 330
- GOVT 457 requires senior standing and a prerequisite of MATH 201.
- ➤ GOVT 493 requires senior standing and a prerequisite of GOVT 457.
