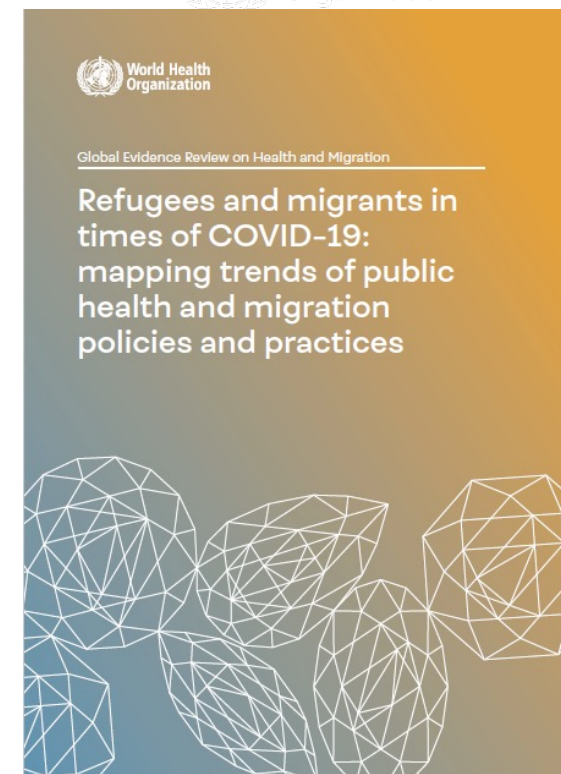

❑ Evidence gathering

- literature and systematic reviews; review of reviews; scoping review, etc.
- specific search strategy will be developed, including the list of potential sources for the literature review, white and grey literature search

❑ Screening criteria

- criteria and the underlying rationale, including languages, must be reported

❑ Quality appraisal

- Methods for assessing levels of confidence in evidence from quantitative as well as qualitative reviews should be established for each review.

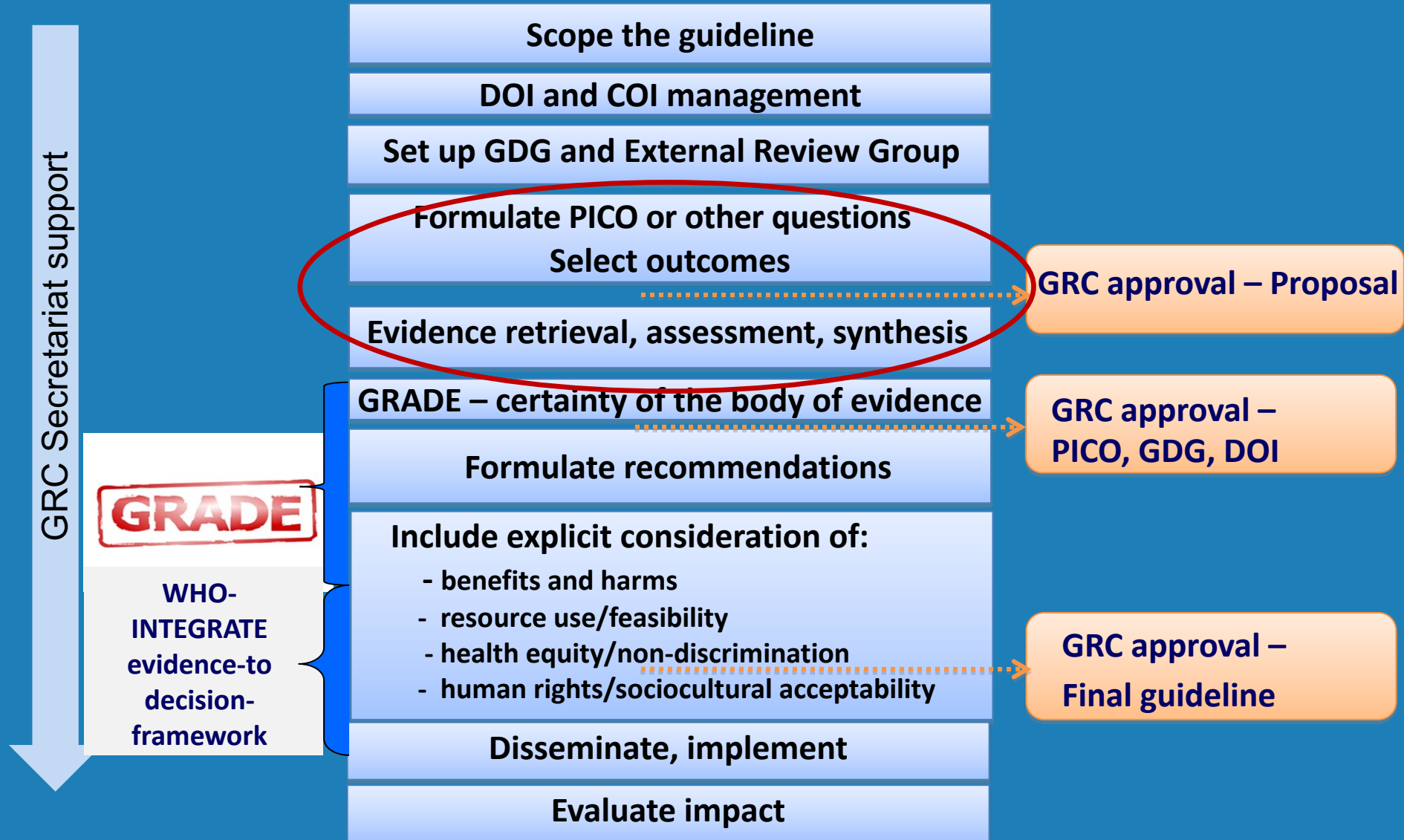
❑ Synthesizing and proposing policy considerations

- analyse findings to answer the policy question and presented as policy considerations.

GEHM is supported by Interdivisional Working Group

- **Methods and Standards Team (MST) from the Department of Quality Norms and Standards (QNS):**
 - to ensure established normative and quality standards for such products and to advise on the appropriate processes and protocols.
- **Emerging Technologies, Research Prioritisation and Support from the Department of Research for Health (RFH):**
 - to advise on research prioritization, to ensure alignment with WHO research priorities and to guide on appropriate research protocols and standards.
- **Department of Data Analytics (DNA) from the Division of Data Analytics and Delivery for Impact Division (DDI):**
 - to advise on data availability, information and evidence need, to support alignment with established indicators and to support liaison as the data hub.
