



### 1. Universal Health Coverage (UHC)

UHC means everyone, everywhere can receive the quality health services they need across the life course without facing financial hardship.


Reaching the goal of UHC by 2030 requires proactive, targeted and accelerated efforts building on strong data and evidence.

To track progress towards UHC with the highest possible quality data WHO is conducting this consultation

### 2. Service coverage and lack of financial protection indicators

Advances in Universal Health Coverage are tracked through indicators on:

- Service coverage (SDG 3.8.1)
- Lack of financial protection (Financial hardship, SDG 3.8.2 and related)





### 1. UHC is an SDG target:

- ✓ Target 3.8: Achieve universal health coverage, including financial risk
  protection, access to quality essential health-care services and access to safe,
  effective, quality and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all
- ✓ Target 3.8 has <u>two sub-targets</u>: 3.8.1 is focused on the coverage of essential health services while 3.8.2 aims to capture the financial protection dimension of UHC




### 1. UHC is an SDG target:

- ✓ The United Nations recognizes WHO as the custodian agency for SDG indicators
  3.8.1 and 3.8.2 and the World Bank as the co-custodian agency for 3.8.2.
- ✓WHO support for monitoring financial protection and service coverage is
  underpinned by a World Health Assembly resolution\* on sustainable health
  financing, universal coverage and social health insurance.
  - \* Several regional resolutions exist

uhc\_stats@who.int UHC Service Coverage Index =  $(RMNCH * ID * NCD * Capacity)^{1/4}$  <- Nested geometric average of 14 tracer indicators

### 2. Lack of financial protection indicators

### (Financial hardship-SDG 3.8.2 and related)



### Incidence of catastrophic OOPs:

- All regions SDG 3.8.2-budget share approach: Proportion of the population with *large* household expenditures on health: greater than 10% of total household's expenditure or income. greater than 25 % of total household's expenditure or income(budget share approach)
- In WHO/Europe- food, housing, and utilities approach: The proportion of households with out-of-pocket payments greater than 40% of household capacity to pay

## Incidence of Impoverishing health spending (related to SDG 1):

people are impoverished or further impoverished below a poverty line because of OOPs

### 3. Consultation process

- Consultation on Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) indicators of Universal Health Coverage (UHC) happens every two years
- Circular letter (C.L.48.2022) informed countries/territories/ areas that the consultation would be virtual through <a href="mailto:uhc\_stats@who.int">uhc\_stats@who.int</a>, the WHO UHC monitoring mailbox
- Two SDG indicators: SDG 3.8.1 (service coverage) and Financial Protection (3.8.2 and related)
- Each country/territory/area nominated at least one focal point, but ideally, there should be one for service coverage and another one for financial protection indicators
- Countries/territories/areas have about 5 weeks to review the documentation pack



### 3. Consultation process

- Once the consultation is closed, there will be no other opportunities to incorporate the feedback in the planned update of global international databases
- The country/territory/area level data is based on WHO's quality standards for data publication, as adopted by the Executive Board members during its 111th session.
- The eligibility of the estimates included in the consultation is based on a comparison of statistics produced during the data analysis and those publicly available.

### 4. Consultation objectives

- To inform the country/territory/area about WHO's efforts to support the monitoring of UHC at a global, regional and country level and to obtain feedback on this work
- Countries/territories/areas are asked to:
  - comment on the service coverage and financial protection methods, data sources, and estimates and support comments with evidence or by new data for which the source and method of collection are documented
  - ✓ provide advice on primary data sources that may not have been previously reported or used.
  - ✓ share information about any national framework adopted to monitor financial protection in health








