Of disjointed PTI leadership



THERE is a saying that behind every successful man, there is a woman. However, in the case of Imran Khan, it appears the opposite might be true. It is widely believed that during his three- and half-year tenure as Prime Minister, his wife, Bushra Bibi, played a significant role in decision-making. Allegedly, under her influence, close associates such as Farah Gogi and others benefited immensely through questionable practices involving transfers, postings, land acquisitions, housing schemes, and more. One prominent controversy linked to this dynamic is the Toshakhana case, which has landed the PTI founder in jail. Reports suggest that it was Bushra Bibi who insisted on retaining valuable

gifts, including the high-profile watch gifted by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, and later suggested selling it. This decision not only tarnished Imran Khan's reputation but also provided the government with a strong basis to initiate legal action against the former prime minister. The recent D-Chowk debacle is closely tied to Bushra's intransigent stance. Despite clear instructions from Imran Khan to avoid the location, she insisted on marching towards D-Chowk. PTI leaders claim that Imran Khan had agreed to hold a sit-in at Sangjani, but Bushra reportedly compelled Ali Amin Gandapur to head to D-Chowk at all costs. What unfolded at D-Chowk is now part of history—tragically, numerous lives were lost on both sides, and many others suffered serious injuries. Notably, both Bushra and Gandapur managed to make a safe exit from the scene, leaving others to bear the consequences. Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi explicitly alleged that these figures are acting under the direction of so-called "hidden hands"—a term often used in Pakistan's political lexicon to refer to unseen forces, frequently implying elements of the establishment or other influential actors operating behind the scenes. Nagvi's remarks further frame Bushra and Gandapur as symbolic rather than substantive leaders, portraying them as "puppets" whose actions are controlled by these unseen forces. This perspective not only undermines the credibility of PTI's internal decision-making but also casts doubts on the role of Imran Khan as the central figure of the party. The broader implication of this narrative is the perception of political maneuvering by shadowy entities to destabilize or redirect PTI's trajectory, potentially to align with their strategic interests. Such allegations, if unsubstantiated, may be viewed as politically motivated rhetoric aimed at discrediting PTI leadership during a period of heightened political tension. However, for PTI supporters, such claims are likely to be dismissed as part of a broader campaign to weaken the party's position and its influence over its voter base. The noticeable absence of PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar and Secretary General Salman Akram Raja from key protests, including the recent D-Chowk episode, raises questions about the leadership's commitment to leading from the front during pivotal moments. Their absence is not just a matter of optics but one that directly impacts the morale and enthusiasm of party workers and supporters on the ground. In any political movement, especially one reliant on mass mobilization, the visible presence of the top leadership is crucial. It not only energizes the participants but also sends a strong message of unity and resolve to opponents and onlookers. Without the leadership at the helm during such critical junctures, the movement risks appearing disorganized or lacking resolve. The government's handling of the PTI protests has drawn widespread criticism, with many condemning the excessive use of force employed to suppress the dissent. This approach not only resulted in the tragic loss of numerous lives but also severely damaged the reputation of the country's security forces, both domestically and on the global stage. It is imperative for the government to reconsider its approach and prioritize dialogue and reconciliation over force. A failure to address the root causes of discontent risks deepening the divide, potentially pushing the country into further turmoil.

Pakistan, Belarus pledge to solidify relations in all fields

Joint Statement between the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and the Republic of Belarus

1. The President of the Republic of Belarus Aleksandr Lukashenko paid an official visit to the Islamic Republic of Pakistan from 25 to 27 November 2024, at the invitation of Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif. During the visit, the two leaders comprehensively reviewed the full range of bilateral relations and reaffirmed their mutual commitment to deepening friendly ties between the two countries across political, trade, economic, cultural, social, and other areas.

2. This year marked the 30th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Pakistan and Belarus. Both sides acknowledged that their relationship had grown into a durable, broad-based, and comprehensive partnership of increasing significance. Pakistan congratulated Belarus on its full membership in the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), with Belarus noting Pakistan's early support for its accession. The Prime Minister appreciated the active participation of the Prime Minister of Belarus in the SCO Council of Heads of Governments meeting, hosted by Pakistan in October 2024. The two sides agreed to work closely within this important forum to further strengthen their cooperation.

3. During their meeting, the two leaders emphasized the importance of advancing political dialogue and strengthening interparliamentary relations. They also focused on expanding trade and economic cooperation, adopting a collaborative approach to regional economic integration and connectivity and enhancing the legal framework to facilitate bilateral collaboration.

4. Recognizing Belarus's advanced agricultural manufacturing capabilities and the needs of Pakistan's agriculturebased economy, the two sides agreed to promote the establishment of joint ventures in the agriculture and industrial sectors, including for the production of high-tech and largescale agricultural machinery.

5. Both sides also agreed to collaborate in sales, manufacturing and servicing of vehicles, including through partnerships between private and public organizations of both countries. This initiative aims to leverage the strengths of both countries in automotive manufacturing and technology, boosting industrial growth and innovation.

6. Both sides also agreed to cooperate in expanding the network of sales and services of Belarusian agricultural machinery in various Pakistani cities, including through partnerships with Pakistani private and public organizations. Additionally, they considered initiating educational programs in sphere of agricultural machines manufacturing.

7. During the visit, the Trade Development Authority of Pakistan (TDAP) and the Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI), in collaboration with the Belarusian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BelCCI), organized

a Belarus-Pakistan Business Forum. The event saw participation from over thirty Belarusian companies and nearly one hundred Pakistani counterparts from various sectors, fostering valuable interactions and potential business opportunities. 8. The two leaders expressed their satisfaction at the successful organization of the forum. They also agreed to encourage both government and private sectors to collaborate and organize series of seminars on "Doing Business with Each Other" aiming to reduce trade barriers and facilitate market access.

9. To enhance trade linkages, both sides welcomed signing of an MOU between the National Logistics Corporation (NLC) and Beltamozhservice and agreed to encourage other stakeholders, including logistics companies, to develop optimal maritime and land routes for efficiently delivering goods to each other's markets. This initiative aims to streamline transportation, reduce costs, and improve the overall efficiency of trade between the two countries.

10. Recognizing the immense potential for expanding collaboration in science and technology, and noting the progress made over the past decade, both sides agreed to establish stronger ties between their scientific communities. The sides plan to focus on joint scientific and technical projects under the umbrella of the Joint Commission on Science and Technology. During the visit, two agreements in this domain were signed to formalize and promote this enhanced collaboration. 11. Both sides emphasized the importance of enhancing bilateral trade in pharmaceutical products, medical devices, health-related items, and over-the-counter products. Both parties agreed to develop strategies aimed at improving trade facilitation by identifying and addressing trade barriers, particularly regulatory challenges, to streamline market access. Additionally, the







sides committed to exploring and implementing policies that enhance mutual market access for these sectors, ensuring compliance with national regulations, while promoting growth and cooperation. 12. The two sides underscored the importance of strengthening cooperation in the field of education and culture, including the promotion of cultural exchange programs, boosting people-topeople contacts through art, music, literature, and other cultural activities. Both countries also committed themselves to enhancing academic collaboration. facilitating student exchanges, and supporting joint research projects between universities in the two countries.

13. During the visit, the two sides signed fifteen important agreements and MOUs, including the "Roadmap for Comprehensive Cooperation between the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and the Republic of Belarus for the period 2025-2027." This roadmap focuses on enhancing bilateral economic cooperation through various initiatives, such as high-level meetings, timely meetings of inter-governmental commissions, and promoting collaboration in key sectors of mutual interest. Other significant documents are:

- Cooperation in E-Commerce
- Cooperation in Science and Technology
- Cooperation in the field of Accreditation
- Cooperation in Auditing field
- Cooperation in the Exchange of Financial Intelligence Related to Money Laundering and terrorism financing
- Exchange of Customs Statistics Data of Bilateral Trade
- Cooperation in Science and Technology
- Cooperation in International Road **Transport**
- Cooperation in the field of Environment & Climate Change
- Cooperation in Disaster Management
- Cooperation the field of Vocational Education
- Extradition Treaty
- Cooperation in the field of Health
- Cooperation in Halal Trade
- 14. These arrangements are expected to open new prospects for the continued development of bilateral relations,

based on the principles of mutually beneficial friendship.

15. The two sides also discussed important regional and international issues. The Pakistani side briefed the Belarusian side on the situation in Jammu and Kashmir. Both sides underlined the need for resolution of all international disputes through peaceful means and in accordance with the UN Charter and **UN Security Council resolutions.**

16. The two State leaders expressed deep concern over the escalation of the conflict in the Middle East, which has led to a devastating humanitarian crisis and significant civilian casualties in the Gaza Strip and Lebanon. The Parties called for an immediate, unconditional and permanent cessation of hostilities in the Gaza Strip and Lebanon, strikes on the territory of the Syrian Arab Republic, ensuring uninterrupted and safe delivery of humanitarian aid, restraint against the background of the threat of expanding the zone of confrontation, stressed the need to intensify their efforts to achieve peace, stability and security for the entire region.

17. The Parties reaffirmed their support to the right of the Palestinian people to self-determination and the establishment of an independent Palestinian state on the basis of the twostate formula, in accordance with the resolutions of the United Nations Security Council and the General Assembly. 18. The two leaders underscored the paramount importance of a peaceful resolution to the conflict in Ukraine, emphasizing the need for diplomatic efforts and constructive dialogue. They highlighted that the ongoing conflict has far-reaching consequences, not only for the region, but also for global stability and security. Both leaders called on all parties involved to prioritize negotiations and peaceful means to address all underlying issues, reaffirming their commitment to supporting initiatives that foster lasting peace and stability in the region.

19. President Aleksandr Lukashenko expressed his gratitude to Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif and the people of Pakistan, for their warm hospitality and invited the Prime Minister to visit Belarus at a convenient time, which was gratefully accepted by the Prime Minister. Khawaja Asif leads commemoration of Japan Self Dedense Forces Day

ISLAMABAD: TAKANO Shuichi, Chargé d' Affaires A.I. of the Embassy of Japan in Pakistan, and Mrs. TAKANO Asako hosted a reception on Wednesday, December 4th, 2024, to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the Japan Self-Defense Forces (JSDF) Day. Defense Attaché, Colonel ABE Kazuo represented the Japan Self-Defense Forces (JSDF) at the Embassy. AKAMATSU Shuichi, Ambassador-designate of Japan to the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, and Mrs. AKAMATSU Yumiko were also present at the occasion, Air Marshal Muhammad Sarfraz, HI(M), Deputy Chief of Air Staff (Projects), Air Headquarters, was the chief guest on the occasion. The reception was attended by the military officials as well as Ministers, parliamentarians, senior members of the Government of Pakistan, members of the diplomatic community and other dignitaries from the public and private sectors. In his remarks, Mr. TAKANO stated, "I am pleased to see the progress

in defense exchanges and cooperations between Japan and Pakistan" and "I believe that the deepening of the exchanges and cooperation between the JSDF and Pakistan Armed Forces will lead to strengthening the Japan-Pakistan relations."

In August this year, the Pakistan Navy PNS YARMOOK together with Japan's Counter Piracy Enforcement Unit, JS SAMIDARE, conducted a goodwill exercise in the Gulf of Oman that contributed to deterring pirate activities and ensuring the safe navigation of merchant vessels navigating in the Gulf of Oman. Next year in February, the multilateral joint exercise "AMAN25" will be hosted by the Pakistani Navy. Japan is participating in AMAN25. We regard it as an important exercise, contributing to the realization of a "Free and Open Indo-Pacific" in cooperation with like-minded navies.

With regard to disaster relief cooperation. Mr. TAKANO mentioned that in the earthquake in 2005 and the floods in 2010 in Pakistan, the JSDF dispatched helicopter units to transport relief supplies and affected people as part of the Japan Disaster Relief Team. He paid gratitude to the Pakistani people residing in Japan who had extended immense support to the Japanese people during the Great East Japan Earthquake in 2011 by giving food and distributing relief supplies to the affected people. In his brief remarks, AKAMATSU stated that he feels very fortunate to have been appointed as the Ambassador to this wonderful country and expressed his desire of working together to further strengthen the ties between Japan and Pakistan. "Japan and Pakistan share a long-standing friendship, built on mutual respect and cooperation. Together, we can build a future that fosters mutual growth and understanding",

The ISDF Day was originally celebrated when the Japan Defense Agency (upgraded to the Ministry of Defense in 2007) and the JSDF were established on July 1st, 1954, but the date has been changed to November 1st as the ISDF are expected to respond to natural disasters such as frequent typhoons in summer season in Japan.



During this November visit, the Board is joined by senior representatives from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, which recently pledged \$500 million to the global polio initiative. The Board's delegation includes Dr. Chris Elias, Chair of the Polio Oversight Board and President of Global Development at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation; Dr. Hanan Balkhy, Regional Director for WHO Eastern Mediterranean; Mr. Sanjay Wijesekera, Regional Director for UNICEF South Asia; Mr. Aziz Memon, Rotary International Trustee and Chairman of the National PolioPlus Committee: and representatives from the US Centers for Disease Control and the King Salman Humanitarian Aid and Relief Center (KSRelief), along with Saudi dignitaries.

ISLAMABAD: The Polish Embassy in Pakistan hosted a memorable celebration in Islamabad to mark Poland's Independence Day and Armed Forces Day, with distinguished guests including Chaudhry Salik Hussain, Pakistan's Minister for Overseas Pakistanis and Human Resource Development. The Polish Ambassador delivered a speech highlighting Poland's hard-earned independence and expressing solidarity with other nations in their fight for freedom and peace. Reflecting on Poland's turbulent history and struggle for sovereignty, the Ambassador linked these past challenges to current global events. He emphasized Poland's support for Ukraine in resisting Russian aggression, calling it vital for European stability. "The aggressor must be repelled, not rewarded," he stated, underscoring Poland's view that Ukraine's victory is essential for a just and lasting peace. He also called for civilian protection in conflict zones, particularly in Gaza and Lebanon, and expressed support for a peaceful resolution in the Middle East that respects the right of Palestinians to a state alongside Israel. The Ambassador paid tribute to the partnership between Poland and Pakistan, which has grown significantly in the areas of trade and investment. He noted that bilateral trade is approaching the \$1 billion mark, with Polish companies such as Orlen involved in gas exploration in Pakistan's Sindh region. "Polish investors in the energy sector have proven successful and resilient," he said, commending the ongoing collaboration in Pakistan's industrial sector. As part of Poland's commitment to sustainable development, the Embassy organized a recent trade mission to Pakistan, focusing on green technology solutions through its GreenEvo program. "I am happy to note that some conversations which began during this mission are continued," he added. The Ambassador congratulated Pakistan on its recent election to the UN Security Council and emphasized the two countries' shared commitment to the UN Charter's principles, such as sovereignty, territorial integrity, self-determination, and human rights. He expressed optimism for future collaboration to uphold these values in the international arena. Celebrating a longstanding cultural connection, the Ambassador reflected on the history of Polish exploration in Pakistan. He marked the 100th anniversary of Polish explorer Bronisław Grabczewski's 1888 expedition across the Pamirs and Hindu Kush. This journey, documented in Grąbczewski's book, inspired future generations of Polish mountaineers, leading to Poland's lasting fascination with Pakistan's northern landscapes. He paid tribute to iconic Polish climbers like Wanda Rutkiewicz and Jerzy Kukuczka, who achieved historic feats on Pakistani peaks, and recognized Polish glider pilots who recently flew over K2, capturing breathtaking views of the Karakoram.

The Ambassador also remembered the contributions of Polish aviators who helped establish Pakistan's Air Force, particularly Air Commodore Władysław Turowicz and his wife Zofia. He expressed hope that a street in Islamabad might soon be named in their honor, paying tribute to their role in Pakistan's early aviation history. In a show of friendship, the Ambassador acknowledged the achievements of renowned Pakistani climbers Nazir Sabir and Sirbaz Khan, both of whom collaborated with Polish climbers. Sabir, the first Pakistani to summit Mount Everest, and Khan, who conquered all fourteen eight-thousanders, embody the spirit of camaraderie between the two nations. The evening ended with a musical performance by women musicians from Hunza, led by Meher Angez Hunzai. The Ambassador described music, like mountains, as a universal language that transcends physical and cultural boundaries. "Both invoke mystery, spirituality, and freedom," he said, celebrating how the shared love for Pakistan's mountains has created a lasting bond between Polish and Pakistani people. The event underscored the strength of the "Pak-Polish Dosti" or Polish-Pakistani friendship, which has deepened through mutual respect, cultural exchange, and economic collaboration. With Poland's upcoming European Union presidency, the Ambassador reaffirmed Poland's commitment to peace, unity, and continued partnership with Pakistan.

With over 200,000 Pakistanis living in Malaysia, their role in strengthening ties and fostering goodwill was invaluable.

On economic opportunities, the High Commissioner highlighted the USD1.4 billion trade volume in 2023 between Malaysia and Pakistan. He emphasized the immense potential for further collaboration, particularly in agriculture, the halal industry, and technology. Malaysia's expertise in the halal sector was offered to help Pakistan become a regional hub, leveraging its agricultural strengths. Additionally, he invited Pakistani investors to explore opportunities in Malaysia, especially with the country preparing to chair ASEAN in 2025.

The High Commissioner also took the opportunity to highlight the atrocities faced by Palestinians, commended Pakistan's unwavering support, and reaffirmed Malaysia's commitment to advocating for justice on international platforms.

Attendees had the opportunity to network and explore ways to strengthen bilateral relations. The High Commission remains committed to facilitating cooperation that benefits both nations and builds a foundation for long-term partnership.

A Gamble for Peace

THE prospect of Donald Trump's return to the White House has generated significant discourse in Tehran, where the primary concern is not what policy trajectory the incoming administration might adopt toward Iran but whether the Islamic Republic should engage in negotiations with the former president. Prominent Iranian officials, including experienced diplomats, argue that Tehran must exercise its agency and signal a willingness to negotiate. This perspective posits that Trump's strong mandate, as evidenced by the electoral outcome, provides him with the political latitude to broker a mutually beneficial agreement with Iran. However, whether such calls will influence Tehran's posture in the wake of Trump's inauguration remains uncertain. In 2018, during Trump's first term, his administration's withdrawal from the 2015 Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) and the subsequent imposition of a "maximum pressure" sanctions campaign devastated Iran's economy. Supreme Leader Avatollah Ali Khamenei categorically dismissed the possibility of negotiations with Trump, labeling the American president as unworthy of engagement. Khamenei's assessment relied on the belief that Trump's presidency represented an anomaly in U.S. politics. This gamble, however, backfired as U.S.led sanctions decimated Iran's oil revenue and international trade, while escalating tensions culminated in the assassination of General Qassem Soleimani in January 2020. Today, the geopolitical landscape has shifted markedly. Trump's political position appears stronger, and Iran faces increasingly severe domestic and international challenges. The prevailing sentiment in Iranian media underscores an urgent need for recalibration. As one commentator observed, "The era of no war, no peace is over. It's now the era of either war or peace." With the Republican Party controlling all three branches of the U.S. government, proponents of negotiation assert that a potential agreement with Trump would carry more durability than the JCPOA, which faced resistance from congressional Republicans.

Iranian commentators also highlight Trump's unpredictability. While his rhetoric often aligns with anti-war sentiments, his unconventional governance style leaves the possibility of military confrontation open. A Republican-controlled Congress affords Trump significant latitude in foreign policy, potentially allowing him to initiate military action without the constraints faced by previous administrations.

This dynamic poses a significant risk to Iranian strategic assets, including its nuclear facilities, should Tehran resist engagement. At the same time, the possibility of a negotiated settlement remains on the table. Figures close to Khamenei suggest a cautious approach, advocating for a wait-and-see strategy to evaluate Trump's intentions. For instance, Ali Larijani, a moderate advisor to Khamenei, has suggested that Trump may adopt a more constructive approach in his second term. Similarly, Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi has encouraged Trump to abandon his "maximum pressure" campaign in favor of "maximum wisdom." signaling that Tehran could reciprocate constructively to avoid conflict.

The Iranian government harbors deepseated grievances from Trump's first term, which saw measures such as the "Muslim ban," the designation of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) as a terrorist organization, and the targeted killing of Soleimani. Despite these hostilities. Trump consistently expressed willingness to negotiate with Iran albeit on terms perceived as highly unfavorable by Tehran. Iranian officials as tantamount to a call for capitulation dismissed his administration's infamous 12-point demand list. Nonetheless, there are signs that Trump's second administration might adopt a different approach. His decision to exclude former Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, a staunch Iran hawk, from his new team has been interpreted in Tehran as a potential olive branch. However, the composition of Trump's national security team remains fluid, leaving uncertainty about the influence of hawkish versus isolationist elements within his administration.

A straightforward compromise between Trump and Khamenei could center on Iran's nuclear program. Trump's primary demand is the prevention of Iranian nuclear weaponization, a position ostensibly aligned with Khamenei's 2012 fatwa declaring nuclear weapons un-Islamic. However, tensions extend beyond nuclear issues, encompassing Iran's regional activities and its role in supporting allied groups across the Middle East. Addressing these broader concerns will likely require concessions from both sides. In this context, regional developments could play a pivotal role. Tehran is reportedly optimistic that Trump might pressure Israel into accepting a ceasefire in conflicts involving Gaza and Lebanon, potentially creating space for dialogue on select regional issues. Larijani's recent visits to Damascus and Beirut, where he conveyed reassurances to

Iran's allies while advocating for a ceasefire, suggest that Tehran is exploring options to de-escalate regional tensions.

Despite these overtures, Tehran faces a profound strategic dilemma. Should it prioritize preserving the Axis of Resistance a network of regional proxies-or pursue a reorientation of its regional agenda to align more closely with international expectations? While immediate priorities appear to favor the former, growing domestic and international pressures may necessitate a broader rethinking of Iran's strategic framework. Khamenei's reluctance to engage with Trump during his first term reflected confidence in Iran's ability to withstand external pressures. However, the cumulative impact of sanctions, regional setbacks, and domestic unrest has significantly eroded Tehran's position. Consequently, there is increasing recognition within Iranian policymaking circles that negotiations with Trump, while fraught with uncertainty, may offer a pragmatic pathway to alleviating external pressures. The return of the maximum pressure campaign, albeit under a different guise, remains a central concern for Tehran. While the Biden administration maintained existing sanctions, it did not enforce them with the same vigor as Trump's first administration. Tehran anticipates that Trump's renewed emphasis on sanctions could lead to the reactivation of snapback provisions under the JCPOA, particularly if European powers frustrated by Iran's support for Russia in the Ukraine conflict align with Washington.

At the same time, Tehran sees potential opportunities in the shifting geopolitical landscape. China, a critical buyer of Iranian oil, is unlikely to abandon its partnership with Tehran given its own tensions with Washington. Similarly, Arab states appear inclined to avoid entanglement in U.S.-Iran conflicts, prioritizing regional stability over alignment with American strategies.
