We find in our social studies that all people have value in God's sight, and that interdependence is the way of humanity.

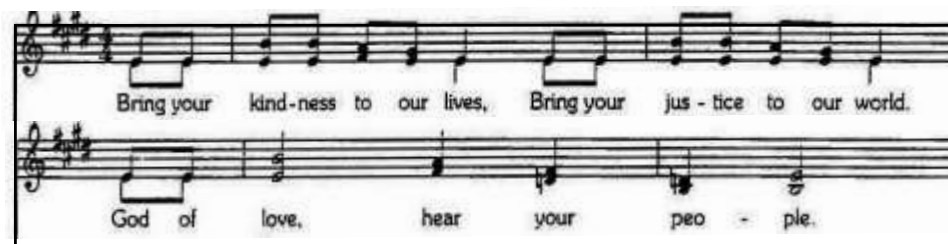
And we feel through music and art a creative union with the imagination of God.

Tai Chi—Beginning Sept, 6th

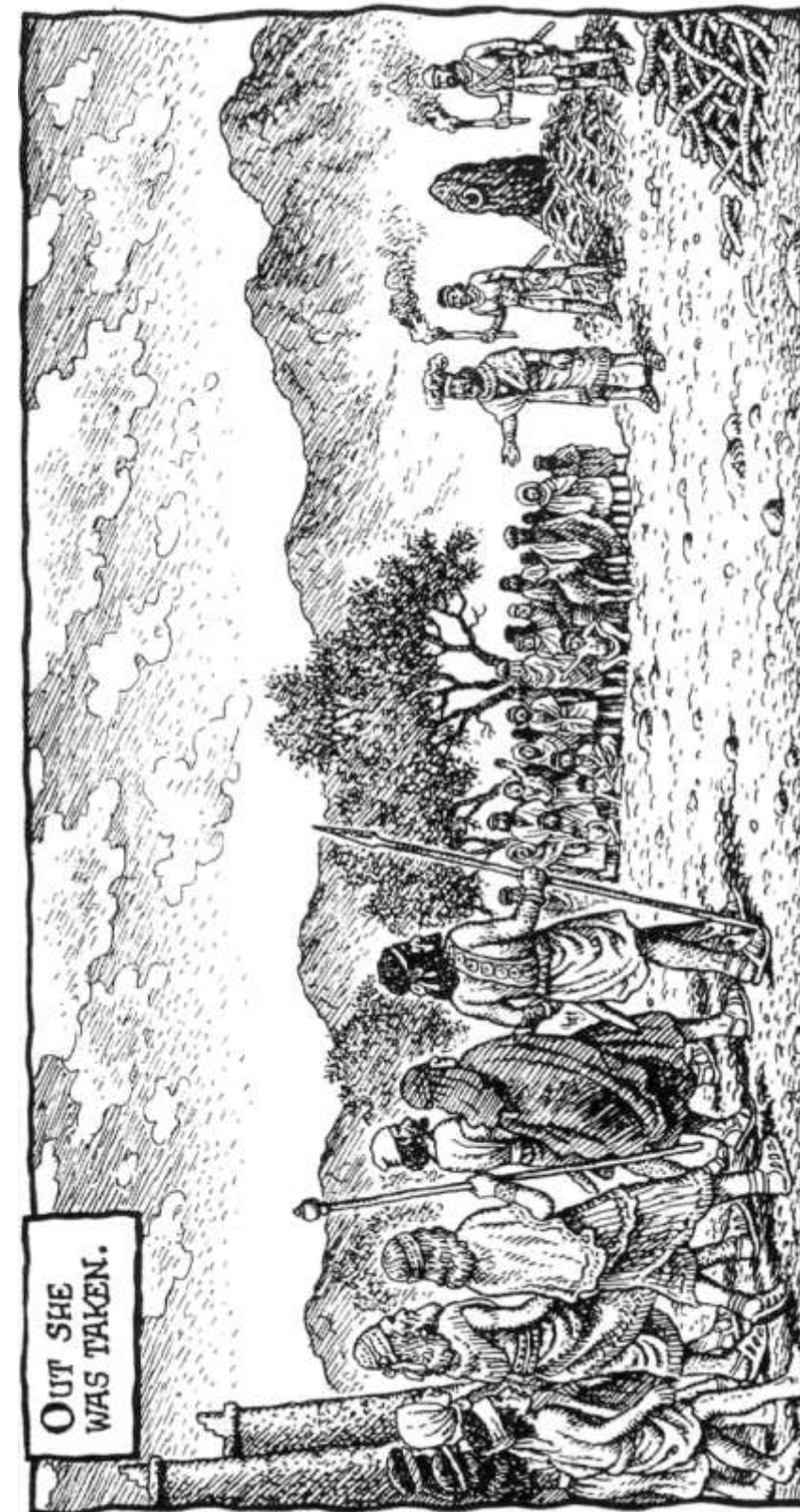
