An Invitation for Food, Film, and Fellowship on October 25

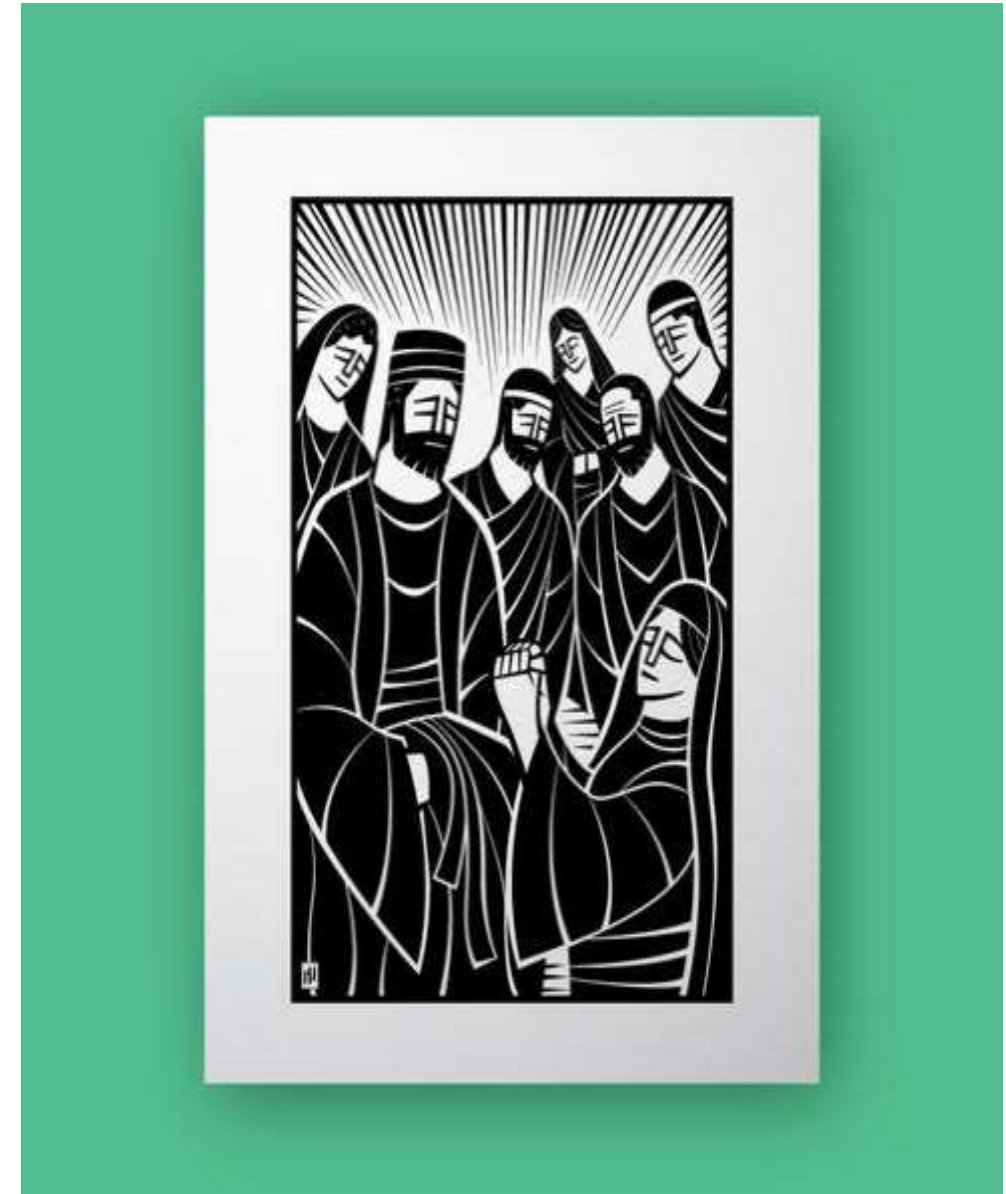
Lexi and John Eagles, Alice Stewart, and Charlie Wilson invite you to a potluck
