

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

BACKGROUND

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- Chinatown Vision (2002)

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
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Approximately 100 Chinese Societies in Vancouver, many that own property in and around Chinatown



CONTEXT – Built Heritage Stewards

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
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
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Societies are critical in preserving the unique cultural and heritage assets of local, national, and global significance.

Provide space for housing, office, recreation, and ground floor retail


Hold cultural activities and traditional festival celebrations

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



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ALIGNMENT WITH DTES PLAN

Public Benefit Strategy

- Chinatown Society heritage buildings identified as heritage priority
- Estimated \$150M total cost to rehabilitate 12 heritage buildings (approx. \$50M shortfall/funding gap)
- Projected \$15M City contribution

Policies and Directions

- Consistent with DTES Plan, including:
 - Chinatown revitalization
 - encouraging residential intensification
 - upgrades to SROs
- Quick start action Grant program to support rehabilitation of Societyowned heritage buildings in Chinatown.
