A LETTER FROM PASTOR JOSH

Friends,

I am very excited about this coming year. We have many great things happening as we launch into this program year.

Thank you to the wonderful volunteers who painted the office over the summer; you should check it out if you haven't seen it. A huge thank you to everyone who helped cover all the many roles while Pathman was away.

This fall, we have many wonderful activities, including the Crop Walk on September 22, Rise Against Hunger on November 3rd, and Deck the Halls on December 1st.

One event that I'm particularly excited about is on Sunday, October 20th. Following worship, we will screen the film 1946: The Mistranslation that Shifted the Culture. This is a unique opportunity to learn and discuss an important topic. The film will be followed by a shared lunch, providing a chance for further conversation and fellowship.

1946 SCREENING

Sunday, October 20th after worship.



This 2022 film has won over 20 different awards. This documentary follows two researchers as they explore how the word "homosexual" ended up in the Bible. They discover in the Yale Archives that the translation team for the 1946 Bible realized their error and adjusted the translation in 1971. But the damage had already been done, and hundreds of millions of Bibles with incorrect translations had been published. It also follows the journey of the film's Director, Sharon Roggio, whose father is a Conservative Baptist Pastor, as he learns she is a lesbian and he responds by writing a letter telling her to repent. In addition, it features Hebrew Scholars, a Rabbi, and NT Greek Scholars. In addition to the screening, we will have activities and lunch for middle school and younger children.

Through the first half of the year, our personnel and finance teams have been diligently working on a plan to hire a new Children and Youth Director. We are hopeful to share an update with the congregation soon. In the meantime, the three-month-old Children and Youth Christian Formation team has been working tirelessly behind the scenes. They have been meeting weekly, reflecting on our current model and the insights gained through parent listening sessions. The committee's aim is to bolster our ministry to children and youth and pave the way for the next director. We understand that the average children and youth director doesn't stay for more than two years, so we are actively working to set the next director up for success and a longer tenure. With this in mind, we are reconfiguring some of our program offerings and actively recruiting additional volunteers; we are thrilled that 63 people have responded.

During our worship services, we will continue to offer the enriching Godly Play and Worship Bridge experiences. These sessions are designed to provide spiritual nourishment and a sense of connection.

FAITH FORMATION HOUR

After worship (10:45-11:30 a.m.), we will have opportunities for all ages during our Faith Formation Hour. During that time, we will offer the following opportunities:

Adults: Reading the Bible Together and In the News classes, fostering a deeper understanding of our faith and the world around us.

For kids & youth, starting September 15th, we are working to expand our offerings with the following:

K-2nd Grade: This class will do some singing, share a story, and do an activity together.

3rd-5th Grade: Will meet for a discussion, activities, and games.

6-8th Grade: The Middle School
Class will explore the "Echo the Story"
discussion series. They will examine
different stories from the Hebrew
Scriptures, beginning with Creation
and continuing through King David.
This promises to be a fun and
energetic time!

9th-12th Grade: We will offer a Confirmation Class. This class is meant to prepare students to join Central Presbyterian Church. There will be a confirmation Parent/Youth meeting on September 15. The class will meet twice a month from September to May. On Sundays, when we don't have confirmation, we will still get together for a lively discussion and a chance to catch up with our friends. We will be reflecting on video-led discussions and enjoying time together. Registration for Confirmation Class is required and available on our website.

WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

We will also be adjusting our Wednesday evening offerings for our Tweens & Youth.

Our Tween and Youth music program (grades 3 to 12) will meet in the choir room from 6 to 7 p.m. Following Tween and Youth Music, we will offer Impact Youth Group (6-12 grade) and 345 Tween from 7-8:15. 345 Tween will begin meeting every week starting September 11. The tweens will play games, have fun, and spend time together. Your Tween won't want to miss this.

Impact Youth Group 6-12 will continue with slight changes. We will continue to focus on games, discussions, and friendships. This year, we plan to spend most of our time together but also have agerelated breakout conversations with middle and high school students.

This promises to be a fantastic year as Central continues to be Determined to Love, Invited to Wonder, and Inspired to Serve.

This fall we are watching "The History of Christianity II: From the Reformation to the Modern Megachurch," by Molly Worthan, Ph.D. of the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. These 36 lectures explore the complex journey of the Christian faith from the turn of the 16th century to the modern and global present day. Each half hour lecture is followed by a group discussion. Each lecture can be appreciated without the context of the other lectures. This course is offered virtually through a Zoom link. All are welcome.

person and continue to pray for that individual in the days/weeks that follow.
Updates are sent out, if and as they are available. Intercessors respect the
confidentiality of those for whom they are praying.
