EDITOR'S COLUMN

We have received quite a few letters and telephone calls inquiring about LUMINUS and if it would continue to be published. We wish to assure all Association members that LUMINUS will retain its prime function of keeping alumni informed about their University and their Association.

LUMINUS, since its inception in 1971, has been published four times a year. We have reduced the number of issues to three times per year and are giving serious consideration to altering the present format. These decisions were not made on an arbitrary basis. Production costs have been soaring. We have a distribution list in excess of 14,000 and it is growing at the rate of 1100 per year. Add to this increased postal rates and it becomes apparent that we had to either cut drastically our mailing list or reduce the number of issues. The first option was not acceptable and we had no alternative but to change the frequency of publication. Other changes may yet be made but LUMINUS will continue to be sent to Association Members.

Alumni Annual Fund Report

Every one can be proud of the accomplishments of the Memorial University of Newfoundland Alumni Fund in 1978. A great deal of progress has been made over 1977, the first year of the Fund, when gifts from alumni totalled \$12,500. The total for 1978 came to \$44,262 with 47 gifts in excess of \$100.00.

Your Annual Fund Council has followed the mandate given it in 1978 by the Executive Committee of the National Board of Directors to allocate most of the funds to the new Library.

As many of you are aware, the University has launched a five year fund appeal, The Anniversary Fund. It is designed to help build the Library; the School of Business Administration and Commerce; to assist in the creation of the Peter Gardner Institute of Small Business; to create research enrichment and of course to establish scholarships.

All alumni will be asked to contribute to the Anniversary fund through the Alumni Annual Fund. You may designate the area in which you want your gift used.

We have a great University and we would like to thank you for your support.

W. Arden Hall

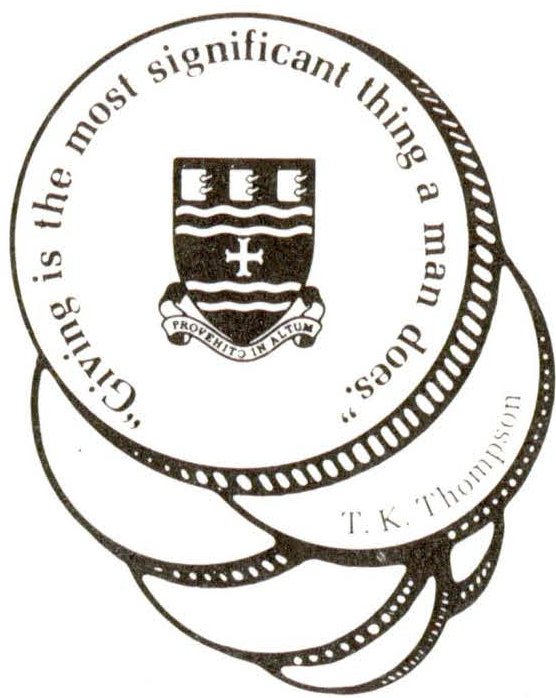

OBITUARIES

We regret to record the following deaths:

Dr. Cater W. Andrews, MUC '37, former Head of the Biology Department at M.U.N., who died November 25, 1978. He was born in 1916 in Wesleyville and after graduating from MUC went on to obtain his B.Sc. from Mount Allison University; his M.A. from the University of Western Ontario and his Ph.D. from the University of Toronto. He returned to teach at MUC in 1947. Following a three year period teaching at New York University, Dr. Andrews returned to M.U.N. in 1951 as Head of the Biology Department. Since 1963, he had devoted himself full time to teaching and research.

Dr. Leslie (Les) Tuck, J.L. Paton Professor (Research), Department of Psychology, who died May 11, 1979. born in Shoal Harbour, Trinity Bay, Dr. Tuck was educated at MUC and Harvard University. An internationally known ornithologist, Dr. Tuck published widely in scientific journals on birds of Newfoundland, his best known publications being **The Murres** 1961 and **The Snipes** 1972. At Confederation, he was appointed the province's first Dominion Wildlife Officer, a post with the Canadian Wildlife Service that lasted 27 years until his retirement in 1976. He was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Science by Memorial in 1965 and received an Honorary Doctor of Science degree from Acadia University in 1977. In recent years he had been at work on a definitive study of birds in Newfoundland.

Esau E. Thoms, LL.D. '78, died June 3, 1979. Born in St. Anthony, Dr. Thoms was employed by the Newfoundland Railway and Canadian National Railway from 1943 to 1966. Widely known in the trades union movement in Newfoundland and Labrador he served as General Chairman of the Brotherhood of Railway and Airline Clerks and was for eight years President of the Newfoundland Federation of Labour. Dr. Thoms had been a member of the Board of Regents since 1973 and was awarded the Honorary Doctor of Laws degree at Fall Convocation 1978.

Memorial University's Anniversary Fund Drive, with an objective of raising \$10 million, was officially launched at a Celebration Concert in The St. John's Arts and Culture Centre on May 26th.

In a short ceremony President M.O. Morgan reiterated the pressing needs of Memorial: for a new library, for a permanent building for the School of Business Administration and Commerce and for research enrichment and scholarships. President Morgan pointed out that since M.U.N. has no large endowments, we lose some of our brightest students to mainland universities better able to provide scholarships. This, he said, is not just a loss to Memorial but a loss to the entire province.

Mr. Anthony Brait, President of the Newfoundland Telephone Company Limited and Chairman of the Newfoundland and Labrador Campaign, introduced Dr. William Mulholland, President of the

Bank of Montreal, who heads the National Campaign.

After expressing pleasure upon being "back in the loving arms" of his honorary alma mater, Dr. Mulholland thanked the performers, The M.U.N. Chamber Choir, The M.U.N. Jazz Ensemble and The Breakwater Troupe. He also thanked the management and staff of the Arts and Culture Centre and others who had contributed their time to make the evening's concert a success.

In opening the campaign Dr. Mulholland gave a breakdown of targets set and of amounts already contributed:

\$5.5 million already contributed

In his convocation address President M.O. Morgan expressed his deep appreciation for the support the Anniversary Fund has received from within the University.

"I am not by nature a beggar," he said, "but beg I will, if I must, since, by law, I can neither borrow nor steal. I am greatly encouraged, however, by the remarkably generous response of the University

community to our initial campaign."

He pointed out that at no other university in Canada have the faculty and staff contributed so much to a university campaign. "When one compares the percentage contribution here with elsewhere, the response becomes phenomenal," President Morgan said.

\$624,922 from within the University community

Contributors, Fund Targets Set and Amounts Already Contributed:

From university students, regents, faculty, staff and alumni: Target set is one and three-quarter million dollars, of which one and a half million has already been contributed.

From Newfoundland and Labrador business firms and personal gifts: Target set is two and one-quarter

million dollars, of which over one million has already been raised.

From foundations: Target set is one and three-quarter million dollars, of which more than nine hundred thousand has been raised.

From national corporations: Target set is four and one-quarter million dollars, of which in excess of two million has already been contributed.

"As you can see from these figures we have already raised over half of our \$10 million goal — this is remarkable indeed and I would like especially to comment on the contribution from members of the University community, the students, regents, faculty, staff and alumni," Dr. Mulholland said. "A university, like a church, is something you should cherish — and since Memorial is the only university in this province it is to be doubly cherished. It seems indeed that this is so."

TELETHON



Memorial University Alumni Association's first fund-raising campaign ever conducted by telephone has turned out to be an unqualified success. Over 75 per cent of those contacted agreed to support the Alumni Annual Fund in 1979. At the same time, \$2240 was received in actual pledges.

"We are very pleased with the outcome of the telethon," said Gerry Tilley, B.Com. '68, Alumni Annual Fund Chairman. "I think it is most significant that there exists in the province a large group of people who feel nothing but goodwill towards the University".

The telephone campaign was under the chairmanship of Ed Hunt, B.Com. '68, Comptroller of Newfoundland Telephone Co. Ltd.

"We wanted to see how effective our efforts would be on a one-to-one basis in fund raising," said Mr. Hunt. "Our past approach has been to canvass all alumni by mailings but we felt this year that a more personal approach was needed. We believed that we could get our message across more effectively if we told former students personally just how important the Queen Elizabeth II Library was to the future of the University. The success of our campaign shows that alumni of the university still care for Memorial and they have expressed themselves in a very tangible way."

On Wednesday June 27, 22 volunteers and student assistants in St. John's and Corner Brook began placing calls from the University and the Sir Wilfred Grenfell College to Alumni. They explained who was calling and why they were calling. Calls were made over a two hour period each evening on June 27 and 28 and July 3 and 4. Of 388 alumni actually

Desmarais Appointed Chancellor, Frecker Retires



The appointment of **Dr. Paul Desmarais, Q.C., B.Comm., LL.D.**, of Montreal as Chancellor of Memorial University of Newfoundland was announced Friday, February 27, 1978.

Dr. Desmarais is an outstanding Canadian. He was born in Sudbury, Ontario, in 1927 and grew up in the Northern Ontario town. Following graduation from the University of Ottawa he returned to Sudbury to manage the family's transportation business. His success in this endeavour was the beginning of a phenomenal business career that is perhaps unrivalled in Canadian History. Dr. Desmarais is today one of Canada's most dynamic businessmen, holding office in some of the nation's most influential corporations.

Dr. Desmarais is chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of Power Corporation of Canada, Shawinigan Industries Limited, and Trans-Canada Corporation Fund. He is chairman of the Board of Canada Steamship Lines (1975) Limited, Power Corporation International, Wabanex Energy Corporation, and LaPresse Limited. He is chairman of the Executive Committee of Consolidated-Bathurst Limited, and holds office as President, Vice President or Director on many other Canadian Companies, including Domglas Inc., Hilton Canada Ltd., Great West Life Assurance Company, Montreal Trust Company and The Investors Group. His business interests include transportation, finance insurance, broadcasting, newspapers and manufacturing.

In recognition of his enterprise and contributions to Canadian Society, Dr. Desmarais was awarded an honorary LL.D. by the University of Moncton. He is a sponsor of the Lester B. Pearson College of the Pacific, and an officer of the Order of Canada.

Dr. G.A. Frecker retired as Chancellor of the University January 31, 1979 because of ill health.

Dr. Frecker, was born at St. Pierre and Miquelon. He received his early education at St. Pierre and attended St. Mary's College, Halifax, University St. Mary's and Nova Scotia Technical College.

Dr. Frecker began his career as teacher and lecturer at St. Mary's University in 1932 and joined the faculty of Memorial University College in 1934 as Head of the Engineering Department. In 1935 he joined the Department of Education as Assistant Secretary and Research Officer and served in various positions including that of Superintendent of Education. He served as a member of the Board of Regents of Memorial University from 1949 to 1959.

He represented the District of Placentia East in the House of Assembly from 1959 to 1971 and during forty-five years of public service held such key positions as Secretary of Education, Deputy Minister and Minister of Education, and Minister of Provincial Affairs.

His contribution to the field of education has been recognized with honorary degrees from Laval University, the University of Montreal, St. Francis Xavier University and St. Mary's University. In 1972 Dr. Frecker was awarded the Order of Canada Medal of Service.

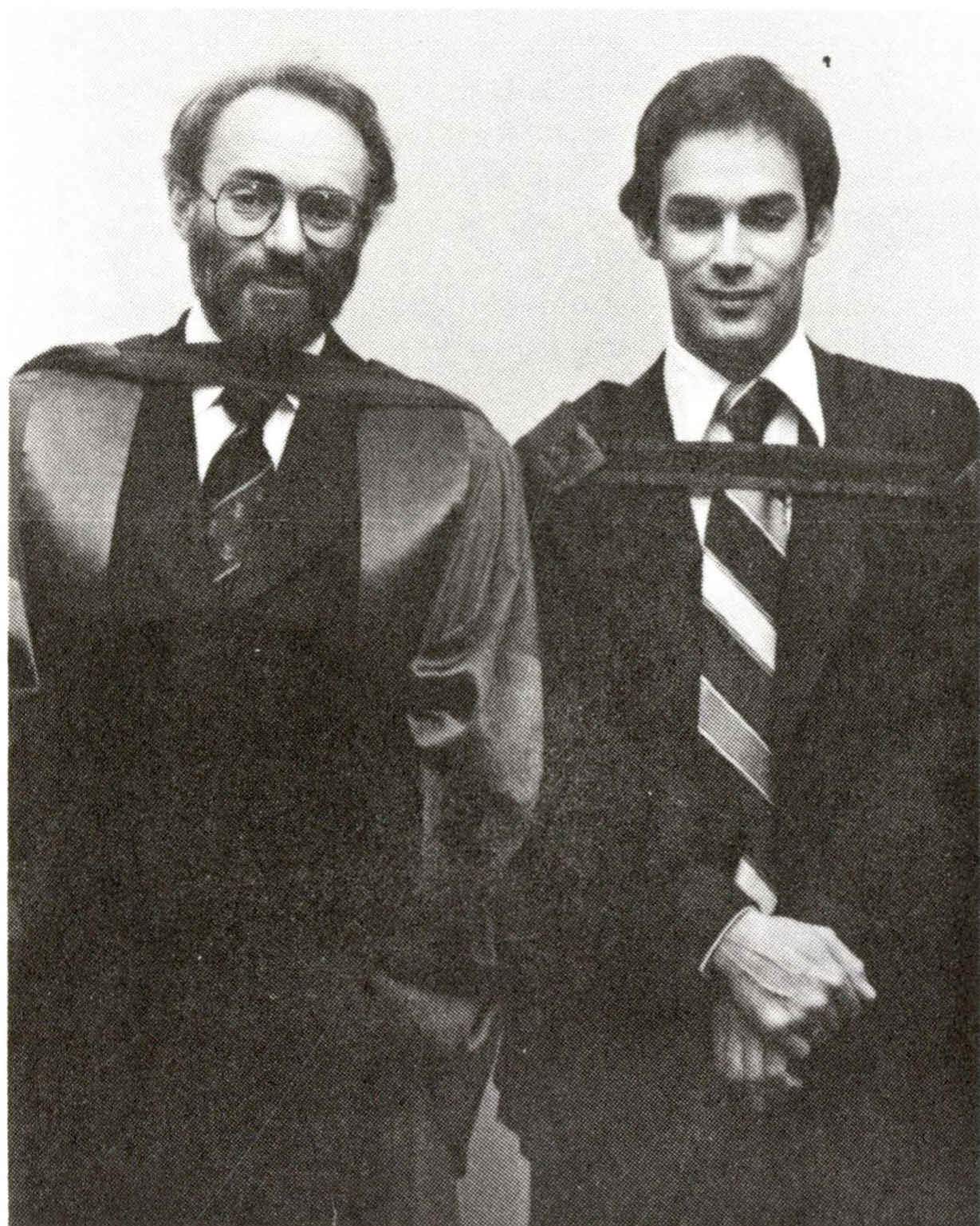


President M.O. Morgan issued the following statement:

The St. John's Arts and Culture Centre was the setting for the three Convocation sessions, held at 3 p.m. Friday, May 25 and at 10:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. Saturday, May 26.

For the first time, Memorial awarded the Degrees of Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Music (Education); thirty-six prizes, awards and medals were awarded to members of the graduating class.

President Morgan addressed the three sessions of Convocation.

Friday, May 25, Northern Explorer Maxwell John Dunbar received an Honorary Doctor of Science Degree and Newfoundland boatbuilder Eleazer Hiscock an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree. Dr. Dunbar was Convocation Speaker for the session.

At 10:30 a.m., Saturday, researcher and author Averil Margaret Lysaght was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Letters Degree and Clarence Wilhelm Powell, Newfoundland public servant, a Doctor of Laws Degree. There was no Convocation Speaker, as the M.U.N. Chamber Choir presented a selection of little-known Newfoundland music.

On the final session of Convocation at 3 p.m. Saturday, educator and former Chancellor of Memorial University George Alain Frecker, and Churchman George Halden Earle, were awarded Honorary Doctor of Laws Degrees. Convocation Speaker for the session was Canon Earle.

Many of Memorial's recent graduates in geology and geophysics played leading roles in Calgary's celebration of National Geoscience Day, October 1st. In fact, twenty-four strong, they were the largest single group of ex-geology club members among the hundreds of geoscientists present. One of several similar happenings that took place in major cities across the country, the Calgary event took the form of a mass rally in a foothills wilderness area of the Bow-Crow Forest Reserve. The day's activities included geological hikes over an interesting group of folded rocks and a series of short talks on some of the founders of Canadian geology.

John Maher (B.Sc. '69, M.Sc. '72), chief geologist of Sceptre Oils Limited and a past president of M.U.N.'s Alexander Murray Geology Club, talked on the club's namesake and proposed a toast to Murray. Maher, who has

just been elected to the executive of the Canadian Society of Petroleum Geologists, traced the history of Murray's career from the time he started as the first assistant to Sir William Logan, the Father of Canada's geology, through his memorable career as Newfoundland's first government geologist until his retirement and death in Scotland. He noted that many Murray Club members had visited Murray's birthplace and grave, and that the ties created through membership in the Club had tended to persist throughout professional life. He also suggested that some of these ties might transcend Murray Club membership because not only several past executive members of that Club were present but several emeritus members of their arch rival, the M.U.N. Physics Society, were also on hand!

BUILDINGS OFFICIALLY NAMED

The S.J. Carew Building

In a ceremony on May 30, the Engineering/Geology Building of Memorial University of Newfoundland was named in honour of the late **Dr. S.J. Carew**.

Dr. Carew, who was born on Bell Island in 1914, was at the time of his death on December 2, 1977, Deputy to the President and Chairman of Conferences for Memorial University of Newfoundland. In 1941 Dr. Carew became Head of the Engineering Department at Memorial and Dean of Engineering in 1949, remaining at this post until 1967 when he became Master of Paton College.

Dr. Carew was involved in the design and layout of the Elizabeth Avenue Campus and was very active in the preparation of the case for the implementation of the degree programme in Engineering at Memorial University.

In his opening remarks **President M.O. Morgan** referred to the years of intense work Dr. Carew had devoted to the building of the Engineering programme at Memorial and of his dedication to the University and to its students.

"It is fitting," President Morgan said, "that this building should be named for him. First, because it houses the Engineering and Geology divisions of the University and to both of these Dr. Carew gave his best. Second, because of the students who throng its halls, for they were always his special concern; third, because this building is a symbol of the University's belief that Newfoundland can produce the professional people she needs to take her place in the forefront of progress. Stan Carew devoted his life to that belief."

Dr. F.W. Russell, Chairman of the Board of Regents at Memorial University, then declared that the building, henceforth, would be known as The S.J. Carew Building. A portrait of Dr. Carew, painted by Helen Parsons Sheppard, was unveiled by Mrs. Carew.

Professor J.M.C. Facey made a presentation of \$8625. to the University. Donated by friends and associates of Dr. Carew, this amount will form the basis for a S.J. Carew Memorial Scholarship.

Dr. Carew's son Robert thanked the University and members of the academic and engineering community on behalf of the Carew Family.

The Sir Wilfred Grenfell College

The Provincial Government has announced that the Regional College at Corner Brook has been named The Sir Wilfred Grenfell College. The name was chosen on the recommendation of an advisory committee, made up of thirty residents of Western Newfoundland and Labrador, to the nomenclature committee, a sub-committee of the Board of Regents, which, in turn, recommended it to the Provincial Government.

Wilfred Thomason Grenfell was born in 1865 at Parkgate, England. He was educated at Marlborough College and received his medical degree from Oxford in 1889. After an encounter with the famous evangelist D.L. Moody the young doctor joined the Mission to Deep Sea Fishermen and sailed on a hospital ship to Iceland.

In 1892 he was transferred to Labrador and began his long career as medical missionary and community leader. He outfitted a hospital ship and sailed back and forth along the coast of Labrador and Northern Newfoundland. Dr. Grenfell became, in his own lifetime, a legendary figure and began making lecture-tours in America and England, to raise funds for the International Grenfell Association and to attract other medical workers to the North.

In addition to his medical work, Dr. Grenfell established agricultural centers and schools. In 1928 he was named Rector of St. Andrew's University. He was the author of several books including his autobiography 'A Labrador Doctor'. Grenfell was awarded many honorary degrees including one from Oxford, which was the first honorary degree ever awarded by that university.

Dr. Cyril Poole, Principal of The Sir Wilfred Grenfell College, pointed out that the area served by the College at Corner Brook includes the whole of Western Newfoundland, the South Coast, Western Labrador and the Great Northern Peninsula — the area in which Dr. Grenfell did most of his work.

"I am especially pleased that this name underlines the fact that this is not just a Corner Brook College but a college for all of Western Newfoundland and Labrador," Dr. Poole said.

"Dr. Frecker was not our first Chancellor, but he was the first Newfoundlander in that office and the first resident Chancellor. His appointment climaxed a career in which he had served Memorial as Lecturer in Engineering, member of Senate, member of the Board of Governors and of the Board of Regents.

"Dr. Frecker brought the Chancellorship close to the University family and to the people of Newfoundland and Labrador. His interest in Memorial and all its activities was deep and apparent. Whenever we called upon him for advice or assistance, it was freely and generously

offered. On behalf of the University, I thank him for this, and for the warmth and humanity which he brought to the office of Chancellor.

"In the performance of his official duties, Dr. Frecker has always had the constant and strong support of his wife, Helena, first graduate of Memorial University College and a former member of the faculty of the University. On behalf of the University, I express our sincere and deserved gratitude to her also.

"We wish Dr. Frecker a speedy return to good health and hope he will continue to maintain his association with us. He will always be a welcome visitor within these walls."

Dr. Frecker was awarded an Honorary LL.D. at Spring Convocation.

contacted, 299 agreed to pledge their financial support for 1979, while only 86 elected not to do so.

"We initiated the telethon as a pilot project," Mr. Hunt continued. "It has proven to be so successful that we will expand it to other centres in the Fall. We intend to contact more alumni in the Corner Brook area, in Grand Falls-Gander, Clarenville and the St. John's metropolitan area. We are also giving consideration to making use of telephone solicitation in other communities."

David Smallwood, B.A., B.Ed. '69, M.Ed. '71, Director of Public Relations, Bowaters (Nfld.) Ltd. supervised the campaign in the Corner Brook area.

"I am delighted that alumni living in Corner Brook have not forgotten Memorial," he said. "We contacted 67 alumni here and 52 pledged their financial support. It is most encouraging."

In St. John's, 247 of the 321 contacted agreed to make a financial commitment to Memorial University.

The Alumni Annual Fund was established in 1977 to give alumni an opportunity to support the University. Since then, alumni have contributed \$60,000 to the University with most of the funds being earmarked for the Queen Elizabeth II Library. Meanwhile, here is the full text of a letter written by **Mr. Gerald Tilley**, to the President endorsing Alumni participation in the University's Anniversary Fund. Mr. Tilley is the Alumni Representative on the Anniversary Fund.

It is with great pleasure that members of the Alumni Annual Fund Council of the Memorial University of

Newfoundland Alumni Association support and endorse your proposal that, during the five-year period of the national drive, the Alumni Annual Fund will be an essential segment of the overall campaign. This approach will ensure that the Alumni Annual Fund will retain its identity. We share your confidence that the special emphasis of a national campaign will have long-term benefits for the Annual Fund.

It is our understanding that the approach to the alumni will be through the Alumni Annual Fund Council which will be represented on the Provincial Management Committee of the National Fund. We also understand that members of the faculty and staff who are alumni will be encouraged by you to make their contributions through the Alumni Fund channel.

We agree that each member of the alumni should have the right, as other donors to the National Fund, to designate gifts according to the approved Table of Needs. It is reaffirmed, where gifts are **not** designated, that in accordance with the earlier commitment of the Alumni Annual Fund Council, a minimum of 90 percent of these gifts will be specifically assigned to the Library.

The Council sees the Alumni Annual Fund as giving a sense of identity and purpose to the M.U.N. Alumni Association. The growing strength of the Association is directly linked to the Alumni Annual Fund which we believe is essential to preserve and foster this growth.

The Alumni Association is solidly behind the National Drive and we expect to be able to demonstrate this in a tangible and effective way.

Universities Use Co-op as Model

Memorial University's Co-operative Programme is being used as a role model by a far-flung group of universities and colleges.

According to Director of Co-ordination Peter Young, universities as near as Halifax's Mount Saint Vincent and as distant as Nigeria's University of Ibadan or those on the Indian subcontinent have contacted and visited the Memorial programme.

Mr. Young indicated that recognition coming from other institutions is a result of recommendations from major employers, who have suggested that new co-op programmes should study Memorial's mode of operation.

Among the universities which have studied Memorial's programme:

- In 1975-76, Messrs. Babs Okuyemi and Pade Fadare, Nigeria's University of Ibadan, visited Memorial for a 3 day period and later, Mr. Okuyemi alone for a nine month span.
- A four month visit by Mr. Fred Beeken of Trent Polytechnic, Nottingham, England, was followed by two visits in 1976 by the Dean of Engineering.
- Three members of Wilfrid Laurier University's School of Business studied Memorial's programme in 1976 and in late 1978 visited again to compare results.
- In late November, 1978, Mr. Young advised the faculty on establishing a co-operative programme, in Sydney, Nova Scotia.
- I.P. Anand, chairman of a Northern Indian Committee on Technical Education visited Memorial in 1977 and identified the Memorial model as most appropriate to the Indian scene.

"Mr. Anand is president of a large corporation which does business in the U.S. and Canada. His decision to look at the Memorial model was based on the fact we are in an area of low industrialization. We're also in an area of high unemployment and therefore the things we developed to make our programme work, Mr. Anand felt were much more applicable to the Indian scene than, say, Waterloo, Ontario, an area of high industrialization," said Mr. Young.

Contacts made by outside universities for information and advice differ.

Mr. Young explained how Mount Saint Vincent, as one example, contacted Memorial, studied its co-op programme and then emulated it.

"It's largely female and has competition in Halifax from other institutions. Mount Saint Vincent was looking for options which would give them a distinctive educational process," said Mr. Young. The co-op programme was one of these options and after university officials contacted a number of major employers in Halifax area, one of them, a bank, suggested they contact Memorial.

Alumni Update

Dr. Harry D. Roberts, MUC '31, St. John's was recently named a member of the Order of Canada. Born in St. John's Dr. Roberts was educated at the Methodist College, Memorial University College, Dalhousie University and McGill University. Dr. Harold Williams, B.Sc. '56, M.Sc. '58, has received an I.W. Killam Senior Research Scholarship from the Canada Council valued at \$57,000. The award will

enable him to complete a lithic structural map of the Appalachian mountain belt, from Newfoundland to Alabama and supplementary gravity, magnetic and mineral occurrence maps. Born in St. John's, Dr. Williams received his Ph.D. from the University of Toronto. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and is considered an expert on the Geology of Eastern North America.

David Smallwood, B.A., B.Ed. '69, M.Ed. '71, has been appointed Director of Public Relations of Bowaters (Nfld.) Ltd., Corner Brook. Before joining Bowaters, Mr. Smallwood was Student Affairs Officer at Memorial moving to the Sir Wilfred Grenfell College in Corner Brook in 1975. He was co-ordinator of MUN's Extension Service in Corner Brook before joining Bowaters (Nfld.) Ltd. He has a Ph.D. in counselling pending from the University of London.

M.U.N. Grads to Teach in Nigeria

Flying off to teach at Jama'are, Bauchi State Northern Nigeria and Ogun State, in the southern section of that African state, are three recent graduates of Memorial's Faculty of Education.

Norah and Ronald Woodman (a married couple, originally from Placentia and Dunville areas respectively) and Patricia Fowler, will all be at teachers' colleges... Ron as an English teacher, Norah (who has been teaching since 1976) in Primary Methods and Pat as a Science teacher.

"We're the fifth, sixth and seventh graduates from Education to go with C.U.S.O.," volunteered Pat Fowler, who has both B.Sc. and B.Ed. degrees and is a graduate of Mount Carmel High School, St. Mary's Bay.

Ronald Woodman said they were by no means the only Newfoundlanders in Nigeria, however. With a sawmill operation sited on a flat-bed truck, an 81 year old Newfoundlander is currently teaching Africans how to set up sawmill operations.

The young Woodmans are looking forward to their opportunity to learn Hausa, language of the area where they'll be teaching. They plan to take courses in it, in addition to the exposure they'll get during orientation in Ottawa.

All three M.U.N. graduates will be teaching in English in Nigeria, but look forward to the experience of living in the communities where they work and getting to know their

special milieu.

"We'll be living at the same economic level as the teachers in the country," said Pat Fowler, adding that she will be the first expatriate at her school.

All three teachers are committed for a two year period.

Their reasons for going with C.U.S.O.? "The challenge of a new learning experience", "an experience in another culture", "I've always been interested in world development"...were a few of their comments.

Ron looked forward to being a minority in a country..."it'll be the first time I've been that". His hope is also that he will learn about life in an underdeveloped country. "I hope someday to do a Master's in Supervision and Human Relations; I think there's a job in Newfoundland for that."

The Woodmans made their decision to take C.U.S.O. positions after travelling in Europe this past year and realistically assume there will be difficulties in teaching in Africa.

Some of their C.U.S.O. applications had been made a year ago, so the three education graduates have had an opportunity to think about the experience of working in Africa. Ron, who has ten brothers and sisters, is first among them to go abroad and admits to an "urge to travel".

There'll be thirty young Canadians from across Canada who will join the three Newfoundlanders in their trek abroad.

Signe Anne (Butt) Kubiseski, B.A. (Ed.) '73 is living in Labrador City where she is a teacher at C.E. McManus School.

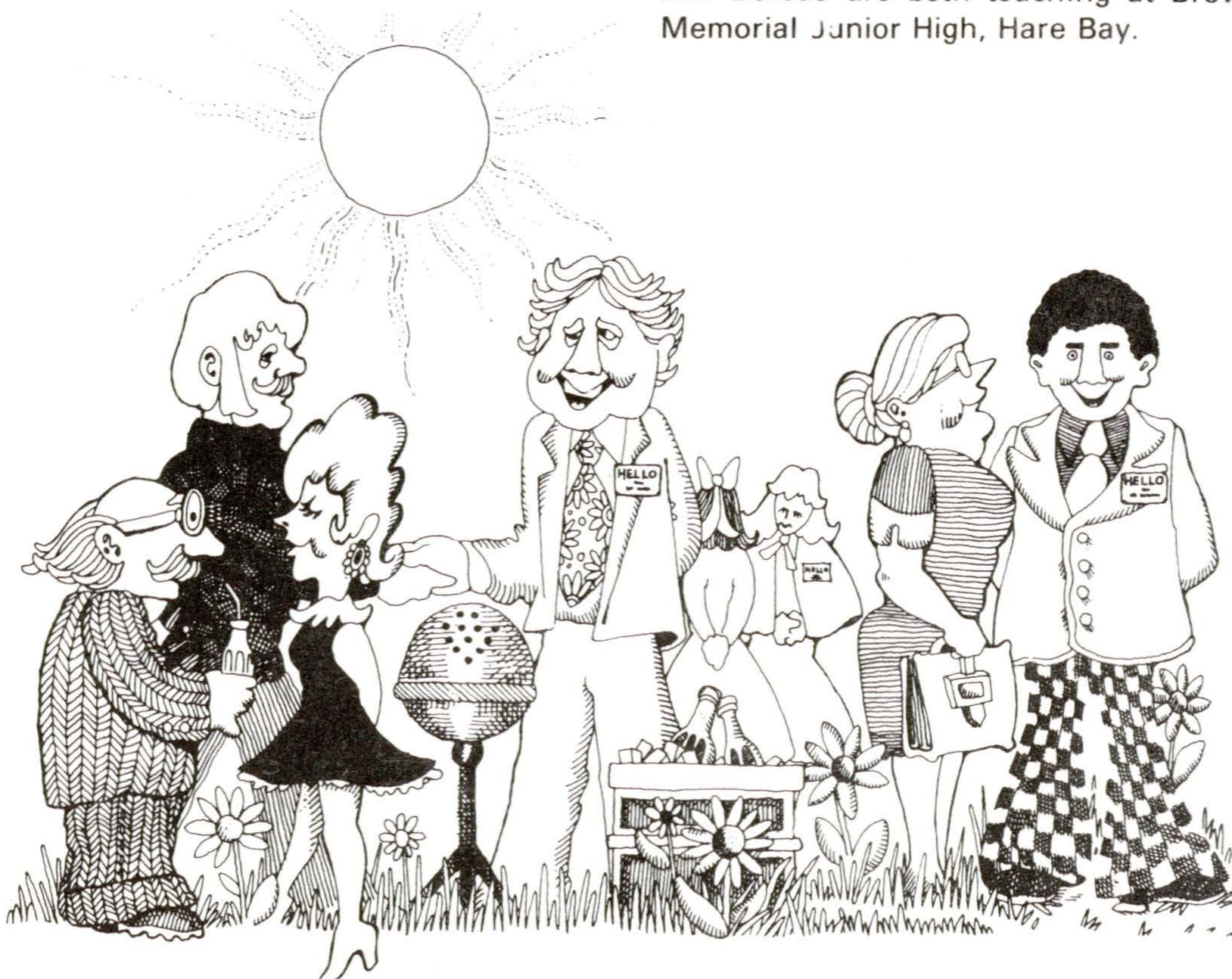
