ATLANTA — No. 1 Georgia used a 28-3 second half run to pull away from No. 14 Clemson, 34-3, in the Aflac Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.

Linebacker Wade Woodaz led Clemson with a career-high eight tackles (seven solo, one for loss), while sophomore defensive lineman Peter Woods added a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss. Antonio Williams led Clemson's offense with six receptions for 76 yards.

The game was scoreless after the first quarter, as the teams traded punts on each of the game's first five possessions. Second-quarter field goals of 30 and 55 yards by Peyton Woodring gave Georgia a 6-0 halftime edge. The tightly contested first half featured only 50 combined plays from scrimmage, 10 combined first downs and eight combined punts.

Georgia extended its lead to 13-0 on the opening possession of the second half when Carson Beck found Colbie Young for a seven-yard touchdown. Clemson scored on its first possession of the second half when freshman Nolan Hauser made a 26-yard field goal, the first of his collegiate career, to cut the lead to 13-3. However, Georgia extended its advantage to 20-3 with 3:15 remaining in the third quarter on a one-yard touchdown run by Nate Frazier.

Georgia's London Humphreys added a 40-yard touchdown reception on a pass from Beck with 9:57 to play in the fourth quarter to make the score 27-3 in favor of the Bulldogs. An interception by Georgia's Malaki Starks — the game's lone takeaway — set up Cash Jones to cap the ensuing Georgia drive with a 15-yard rushing touchdown, pushing the final score to 34-3.

CLEMSON, S.C. — Clemson scored a touchdown on each of its first eight possessions of the first half to ride a 35-0 first quarter lead and 56-13 halftime edge to a 66-20 win against Appalachian State in Death Valley.

Cade Klubnik earned Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week for his performance in which he completed 24-of-26 passes for 378 yards and five passing touchdowns and rushed for two additional touchdowns in only one half of play. According to ESPN, he became the only FBS player win the last 25 years to record five passing touchdowns, two rushing touchdowns and a completion rate of 90 percent or better in a game.

Clemson's 712 yards of offense were the sixth-most in school history. That total included a school-record 525 yards in the first half. Clemson's 35 first-quarter points were the most in a first quarter in school history, and its 56 first-half points were a modern record for the program.

Clemson recorded its first game with a 300-yard passer (Klubnik), a 100-yard rusher (Phil Mafah) and two 100-yard receivers (Bryant Wesco Jr. & Jake Briningstool) since 2012 against NC State when Clemson had a 300-yard passer (Tajh Boyd), two 100-yard rushers (Andre Ellington and Tajh Boyd) and two 100-yard receivers (Sammy Watkins and Brandon Ford).

CLEMSON, S.C. — Clemson earned its 800th victory in program history with a 59-35 victory against NC State at Memorial Stadium. Clemson became the 14th FBS program and first ACC team ever to reach 800 wins.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 16-of-24 passes for 209 yards with three passing touchdowns and added four carries for a career-high 70 rushing yards and one rushing touchdown. Running back Phil Mafah rushed seven times for 107 yards with a touchdown. Clemson's first-team offense scored points on eight of its nine drives, including seven touchdowns and one field goal.

Clemson raced out to a 28-0 first-quarter lead, becoming the first FBS team in 20 years of accessible ESPN data to hold a lead of 28 or more points after the first quarter of consecutive games. After NC State got on the board early in the second quarter, Clemson scored an additional 17 points to give the Tigers a 45-7 halftime advantage.

Adam Randall caught his first career touchdown on Clemson's first drive of the third quarter and defensive back Ashton Hampton scored on a 53-yard pick-six to push the score to 59-14 after three quarters. NC State would add 21 points against Clemson's backups in the fourth quarter to pull the final score to 59-35.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Head Coach Dabo Swinney earned his 100th home win as Clemson defeated Stanford, 40-10, at Death Valley in the teams' first matchup as conference foes.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 15-of-31 passes for 255 yards with four passing touchdowns and added seven carries for 48 yards with a rushing touchdown. Wide receiver Bryant Wesco Jr. caught two passes for a team-high 104 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, Clemson recorded four sacks while adding three takeaways and three turnovers on downs. Linebacker Barrett Carter tied his career high with 3.5 tackles for loss, while linebacker Sammy Brown recorded 2.0 sacks for his first career multi-sack game.

After Clemson turned Stanford over on downs on the game's opening possession, the Tigers opened the scoring on a 34-yard touchdown scramble by Klubnik. Red zone interceptions by Avieon Terrell and Jeadyn Lukus and a 20-yard Nolan Hauser field goal gave Clemson a 10-0 first-quarter lead. The teams traded second-quarter touchdowns to make the game 17-7 at the half.

Clemson pulled away in the second half thanks to three of Klubnik's four passing touchdowns on the day. Wide receiver Cole Turner and tight end Olsen Patt-Henry each recorded their first career receiving touchdowns, as the former rose up to haul in a 43-yard pass from Klubnik and the latter snagged a two-yard Klubnik throw in the end zone. Wesco scored on a 34-yard catch-and-run and joined Sammy Watkins as the only players in Clemson history to record multiple 100-yard receiving games in the first four games of a career.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Phil Mafah ran for 154 yards as the No. 15 Tigers defeated Florida State in Doak Campbell Stadium. The victory was the 174th career head coaching win for Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney, who broke College Football Hall of Famer Bobby Bowden's conference record for career victories as an ACC head coach.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik finished 19-for-33 for 235 passing yards and a pair of first-half touchdowns and added 62 rushing yards on 11 carries. Wide receiver Antonio Williams tallied career-bests in receiving yards (84), rushing yards (36) and all-purpose yards (157). Freshman Nolan Hauser hit five field goals, becoming the first Clemson kicker to hit five in a game since Chandler Catanzaro in 2011.

Clemson jumped out to a 17-0 lead on the 1-4 Seminoles, as the Tigers supplemented Hauser's first field goal with Klubnik touchdown passes to Williams and T.J. Moore. The 17 points pushed Clemson's edge in first quarters through five games to 90-0.

A Brock Glenn touchdown pass cut the Clemson lead to 17-6, but a pair of Hauser field goals in the final two minutes brought the halftime score to 23-7.

Florida State scored early in the fourth quarter, but a two-point conversion attempt to try to cut the lead to eight fell incomplete. The Tigers leaned on their running game to close out the victory, as the Tigers gained 109 yards on 11 carries — with zero pass attempts — in the final frame to tack on two more Hauser field goals and earn the 29-13 win.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — A pair of interceptions fueled a 28-point second quarter as No. 10 Clemson pulled away from Wake Forest for a 49-14 win at Allegacy Federal Credit Union Stadium. The win was Clemson's 16th straight against the Demon Deacons.

Cade Klubnik completed 31-for-41 passes for 309 yards and three touchdowns. Phil Mafah ran for 108 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and tight end Jake Briningstool hauled in seven catches for 104 yards and a score.

Additionally, Antonio Williams became the first Tiger since C.J. Spiller in 2009 to throw and catch a touchdown in a game, hauling in a 22-yarder from Klubnik in the second quarter and hitting Briningstool on a 28-yard double pass in the third quarter.

The Tigers rolled up 566 yards of offense and 37 first downs —third-most in school history — and held possession for a season-best 36:29 while holding Wake Forest to just 233 yards of offense and 16 first downs.

Wake Forest opened the scoring on the game's fifth possession, when quarterback Hank Bachmeier found Horatio Fields for a 31-yard touchdown late in the first quarter. The touchdown represented the first points surrendered by Clemson in a first quarter this season. The Tigers would outscore Wake Forest 49-7 over the next three quarters.

Six different Tigers (two by Mafah, one each by Williams, Troy Stellato, Adam Randall, Briningstool and Keith Adams Jr. scored touchdowns in the contest. Safeties Kylon Griffin and Khalil Barnes recorded interceptions, and Barrett Carter notched a sack in a third consecutive game.

Junior quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 23-of-35 for 308 yards with three passing touchdowns and added six carries for 29 yards. Sophomore tight end Olsen Patt-Henry caught two passes, scoring on both, for 51 yards, while senior Phil Mafah ran for 78 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Clemson tied its then-season high with four sacks and added six tackles for loss. Linebacker Wade Woodaz was credited with a team-high seven tackles including one sack and a forced fumble.

UVA took a 10-3 lead early in the second quarter, but a pair of Mafah touchdown runs gave Clemson a 17-10 halftime lead. The Tigers took control of the game with a 21-0 third quarter. Virginia scored three touchdowns in the final frame to cut the final margin of Clemson's victory to 17 points.

The day included recognition of one of Clemson's legends and the return of one of its native sons. Prior to the game, former running back C.J. Spiller was formally inducted in the Clemson Ring of Honor. But after Louisville recovered an onside kick attempt, Isaac Brown rushed 45 yards for a touchdown to push the Cardinals' lead to 33-14. The teams opened the game with a scoreless first quarter. In the second quarter, a 46-yard Clemson field goal attempt was blocked and returned 77 yards for a Virginia Tech touchdown by Quentin Reddish to give the Hokies a 7-0 lead they would carry into halftime.

Clemson scored on its opening possession of the second half on a 29-yard touchdown pass from Cade Klubnik to Cole Turner. After Clemson forced a Virginia Tech punt on its next possession, Klubnik spun to evade a sack on third-and-7 and connected with T.J. Moore for a 41-yard touchdown to give the Tigers a 14-7 lead.

After a remarkable one-handed interception by Ashton Hampton, Klubnik drove the Tigers 93 yards in 10 plays, connecting with tight end Jake Briningstool for a 12-yard score. The touchdown came on Briningstool's 113th career reception, breaking Jordan Leggett's school record for career receptions by a tight end.

Late in the fourth quarter, Clemson recorded its third takeaway of the game, as R.J. Mickens intercepted Coltin Schlee in Virginia Tech territory. Nolan Hauser then added a 34-yard field goal, pushing the lead to 24-7.

Virginia Tech scored its first offensive points of the game with 1:43 remaining but Clemson earned a seventh straight victory against Virginia Tech with the 24-14 win.

PITTSBURGH - With the Tigers trailing 20-17 and on their own 25-yard line with 1:36 to play, junior quarterback Cade Klubnik scored on a 50-yard draw with 1:16 left to lift Clemson (8-2, 7-1 ACC) to a 24-20 win at Pittsburgh (7-3, 3-3 ACC) at Acrisure Stadium. Clemson's defense sealed the win as Khalil Barnes recorded an interception on the final play.

Clemson's defense registered season highs with 16.0 tackles for loss and 8.0 sacks, including a school-record-tying 4.0 sacks from T.J. Parker. Antonio Williams had career bests of 13 receptions and 149 yards and a pair of first-half touchdowns.

Clemson opened the scoring on its second possession, using an eight-play, 93-yard drive capped by a 14-yard Klubnik touchdown pass to Williams to take a 7-0 lead. Pitt with a two-yard touchdown run by Daniel Carter. In the second quarter, a 28-yard Klubnik strike to Williams gave Clemson a 14-7 lead. Nolan Hauser's career-long 51-yard field goal with three seconds remaining in the first half made the score 17-7.

Pitt cut into Clemson's lead with 10:55 to play with a field goal after the Tiger defense held at the goal line. Pitt tied the game on its next drive on a Nate Yarnell touchdown pass to Gavin Bartholomew. Clemson drove into Pitt territory on the following drive, but was stopped on 4th-and-1 to give the Panthers the ball with 4:17 remaining. Pitt took a 20-17 lead on a Ben Sauls 47-yard field goal with 1:36 remaining in the contest.

After initially being held to 27 yards in the second half, Clemson then went 75 yards in three plays, capped by Klubnik's game-winning 50-yard run with 1:16 to play. Pitt's final drive covered 73 yards in 10 plays, but Barnes' pick as time ran out ended the game.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Running back Jay Haynes ran for 118 yards and two touchdowns on just five carries as Clemson cruised past The Citadel on Senior Day and Military Appreciation Day. The win gave Clemson nine wins in 14 consecutive seasons, tying Florida State for the third-longest streak in major college football history.

The Tigers scored three touchdowns of 55 yards or longer in the first half. Defensive tackle Payton Page intercepted a pass and took it 57 yards for a touchdown, freshman wide receiver Bryant Wesco Jr. scored on a 55-yard pass, and Haynes broke free for a 70-yard rushing score. The Tigers established a 42-0 lead with 13:13 to play in the second half before removing the majority of its first unit.

Linebacker Barrett Carter found his way into the end zone on a running play with 6:25 to play to go along with six tackles. Freshman linebacker Sammy Brown added a team-high 11 stops.

Clemson scored touchdowns on each of its first five possessions and added a 32-yard Nolan Hauser field goal on its sixth possession. The Tigers held a 45-7 lead after three quarters.

The Citadel opened the fourth quarter with a blocked field goal followed by a 66-yard touchdown reception by Javonte Graves-Billips on a flea flicker to cut the score to 45-14. The Tigers answered with a nine-play, 70-yard touchdown drive, with Carter rushing four yards into the end zone on the first offensive snap of his career to bring the final score to 51-14.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Cade Klubnik led No. 12 Clemson (9-3) inside the 20-yard line with less than a minute to play, but a deflected pass was intercepted by Demetrius Knight Jr. to seal a 17-14 win for No. 14 South Carolina (9-3) at Memorial Stadium.

Klubnik completed 24-for-36 passes for 280 yards and added 10 carries for 62 yards and both of Clemson's touchdowns on the ground. Clemson had six tackles for loss, three sacks and forced three turnovers.

After a scoreless first quarter, Clemson opened the game's scoring on the Tigers' third drive. Klubnik scampered 13 yards to give Clemson a 7-0 lead. The Gamecocks responded on their ensuing possession with a 25-yard touchdown run by LaNorris Sellers. The six-play, 75-yard drive evened the score at 7-7 as the teams remained tied heading into halftime.

On Clemson's first drive of the second half, Klubnik capped an 11-play, 80-yard drive with his second touchdown run of the day, this time covering 18 yards.

After a T.J. Parker strip-sack in the first quarter, Clemson recorded its second and third takeaways of the day in the second half. Avieon Terrell forced a third-quarter fumble that was recovered by Barrett Carter, and Khalil Barnes ended a scoring threat with a fourth-quarter interception as Clemson carried a 14-7 lead into the fourth quarter.

South Carolina notched back-to-back scoring drives late in the contest when kicker Alex Herrera converted a 42-yard field goal to cut the lead. A 20-yard touchdown rush by Sellers with 1:08 left in the fourth quarter ended a nine-play, 75-yard drive by putting the Gamecocks ahead, 17-14.

Klubnik then led a seven-play, 45-yard drive to put the Tigers inside the 20, but South Carolina secured the win with Knight's interception with 12 seconds left on the clock.

CHARLOTTE - Freshman Nolan Hauser made a 56-yard field goal as time expired as No. 17 Clemson won the ACC Championship Game and earned its seventh College Football Playoff berth with a 34-31 victory over No. 8 SMU at Bank of America Stadium.

Clemson led 31-14 after three quarters, but SMU scored 17 in a row and tied the game 31-31 with 16 seconds remaining. But Clemson responded as Adam Randall's 41-yard kickoff return got the Tigers to the Clemson 45-yard line. After quarterback Cade Klubnik hit Antonio Williams for 17 yards, Hauser put the 56-yarder down the middle to capture the title. It was the longest game-winning field goal in Clemson history and the first game-winning field goal of 50-plus yards in conference championship game history.

Klubnik went 24-of-41 passing for 262 yards and an ACC Championship Game record-tying four passing touchdowns to earn Most Valuable Player honors. He became only the third player ever to win multiple ACC Championship Game MVP honors (Deshaun Watson and Tyrod Taylor, two each).

Freshman wide receiver Bryant Wesco Jr. had eight catches for 143 yards and two touchdowns, and junior tight end Jake Briningstool recorded four catches for 23 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Clemson forced two first-half turnovers, a strip sack by sophomore defensive end T.J. Parker, who also recorded eight tackles (3.5 for loss), and an interception by sophomore safety Khalil Barnes. Sammy Brown led the defense with 14 tackles (0.5 for loss).

The conference title was Clemson's 28th all-time and its 22nd as a member of the ACC.

AUSTIN, Texas - No. 12-seed Clemson cut a 21-point deficit to a touchdown early in the fourth quarter, but fifth-seeded Texas held off a pair of potential scoring drives late to hold on for a 38-24 win in the College Football Playoff First Round.

The Tigers had two fourth-quarter drives stall as they made a bid to cut into the lead again, including a fourth-down stop on the one-yard line. Texas ran 48 times for 292 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 6.1 yards per carry, including a 77-yard touchdown run two plays after the Tigers cut the lead to 31-24.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik, playing in his hometown, threw for 336 yards and three touchdowns, while freshman wideout T.J. Moore had career highs of nine receptions and 116 yards, and added a touchdown. Linebacker Sammy Brown led Clemson with 10 tackles.

Clemson got out to a 7-0 on its opening possession, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Klubnik to Antonio Williams. But Texas responded with touchdown runs on each of its first three drives and added a 19-yard Quinn Ewers touchdown pass in the final minute of the half to carry a 28-10 lead into halftime.

After a Texas field goal midway through the third quarter, Clemson touchdowns by Jarvis Green and Moore late in the third quarter and early in the fourth quarter trimmed the Texas advantage to 31-24. However, Clemson surrendered a 77-yard touchdown run on the second play of Texas' ensuing possession, and two Clemson turnovers on downs — including one at the Texas one-yard line — secured the victory for Texas. Clemson finished the season 10-4.
