Fire Chief's Report for January 2024

FIRE & EMS Report

Response calls: 53 Fire runs, and 127 EMS calls were made in January for a total of 180 calls for service.

CPR: No CPR classes were taught in January. We will be scheduling some community CPR classes in the upcoming months.

Training: Members completed 103 hours of training in January. Topics included Aerial operations, Instructor Certification, FF Rescue, and the EMS training included Medication review, OB/GYN, and EKG review. Our training requirements restart every January and include at least 100 hours of Fire, and 40 hours of EMS training per person.

FIRE INSPECTIONS

Crews completed 7 inspections in January.

KNOX BOX PROGRAM

No new Knox Boxes were installed in January.

BURN PERMITS

No burn permits were issued in January. Any open burning within the city limits must have a burn permit issued from the fire department.

PUBLIC ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS.

One of our officers started his training to get certified as an instructor. This will allow him to teach classes within our department. We require our officers to obtain and maintain certifications above and beyond the basic requirements. I attended a table-top mass casualty exercise here in Northern Kentucky as an evaluator. Stakeholders from several different areas of local and regional government took part in this training. Taking part in this also fulfills our annual requirement from KBEMS that we participate in a form of mass casualty training.

As mentioned last month, one of our members has started paramedic school. He attends 8 hours a day, two days a week. This training will last the entire year.

We have our regularly scheduled fire board meeting on February 21, at 6:00 P.M., at the Callahan Center in Bellevue. It's open to the public.
