

# LEWIS (32) LEADS DIABLOS PAST FULLERTON ST., 74-54

FULLERTON — Raymond Lewis scored 32 points in 31 minutes, 31 seconds Tuesday night to propel Cal State (L.A.) to an easy 74-54 conquest of Cal State Fullerton.

A crowd of 850 turned out to watch the highly publicized sophomore guard, who scored 88 points in a freshman game last year.

Lewis is a 6-2, 170-pound athlete whose sleepy-eyed appearance makes him look like he's been pulled out of bed at 3 a.m. But his moves with the ball are eye-popping. They are also unstoppable, as Fullerton discovered early Tuesday night. He had 20 points at halftime.

The bulk of his 32 points were manufactured in three streaks. The first and most important was a 10-point spurt he put together in five minutes that hiked Los Angeles' lead from 10-6 to 20-8.

### Pad Advantage

Later in the half, L.A. went from 22-16 to 34-22 with Lewis accounting for 8 of those points, all on 25-foot jump shots.

Defeat left Moe Radovich's Titans with a 1-4 record. Fullerton plays at Chapman Friday night. Los Angeles improved its record to 4-2.

Radovich used his quickest athlete, Ori McLemore on Lewis for the most part Tuesday. McLemore did what he could, but the kind of quickness Lewis has is not containable.

Radovich opened up with a new center against the Diablos, Bob Smith, a 6-7 junior from Dallas, started in place of 6-10 Dave Feenstra, who had started Fullerton's previous four games.

The Titans' most productive player against the Diablos was 6-4 forward Ed Gibbons, who kept Fullerton from being blown

completely out of the gym early in the second half. He scored 8 straight points while Los Angeles was building a 43-34 lead. Gibbons finished with 16 points.

The Diablos steadily padded their margin with the final, 74-54, being their

largest lead. Lewis, after scoring a 3-point play with 8:29 to go, took only three more shots the rest of the way, missing them all.

Just as remarkable as Lewis' statistics were Fullerton's free throw statistics. The Titans were awarded two free throws by the officials, and that occurred with 7:47 left in the game.

The Diablos were 16 of 22 from the line.

Lewis connected on 12 of 23 from the floor. At the line, he was 8 for 8.
