- If you have lost or found items, report it to Public Safety.

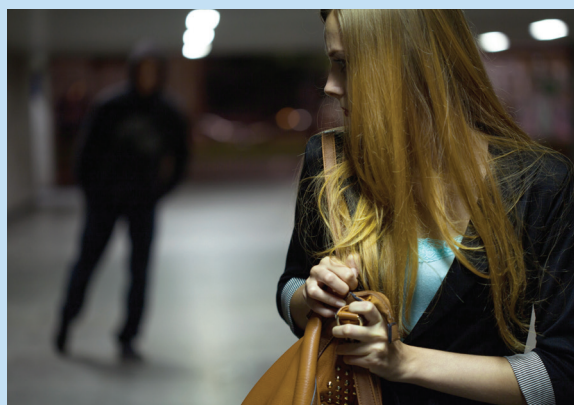
