INFORMATION ON CLOXACILLIN

What is Cloxacillin?

• Cloxacillin is an antibiotic which is effective in treating certain bacteria.

How is Cloxacillin prescribed?

- Dr. Donovan will describe how he or she would like you to use Cloxacillin..
 You should take it on an empty stomach. Do not take with fruit juice or carbonated drinks.
- For children older than 1 year the dose is according to weight:
- It is important to take Cloxacillin for the full period it is prescribed. Take it for the full period (unless you feel unwell, in which case you should stop)

Can I use Cloxacillin with other treatments?

- It is sometimes recommended that those on an oral contraceptive use a back-up method of protection while on Cloxacillin
- Tell your physician if you are on these medications:
 - Antacids

Beta-blockers

Blood thinning drugs

Chloramphenicol

Erythromycin

NSAIDs like Aleve or ibuprofen

Oral contraceptives

Probenecid

Tetracycline, doxycycline, minocycline,

- o methotrexate, cholostyramine,
- allopurinol

Drugs other than those listed here may also interact with cloxacillin. Talk to Dr. Donovan before taking any prescription or over-the-counter medicines

Who should not use Cloxacillin?

- Do not take Cloxacillin if you are allergic to Cloxacillin or Penicillin or Cephalosporin type antibiotics. Tell Dr. Donovan if you have ever had asthma, colitis, diabetes, or kidney or liver disease before taking Cloxacillin.
- All women must inform Dr. Donovan and health care team if they are pregnant or breast feeding before using Cloxacillin.
- Before taking this medication, tell Dr. Donovan if you have kidney disease, stomach or intestinal disease, or infectious mononucleosis. You may not be able to take cloxacillin because of an increased risk of side effects.

What side effects are possible with Cloxacillin?

- upset stomach, diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, anxiety, colitis, confusion, convulsions, dizziness, hives, liver problems and jaundice, fungal infections, rash, tooth discoloration in children appetite loss.
- white patches on the tongue (thrush/yeast infection);
- itching or discharge of the vagina (vaginal yeast infection); or
- black, "hairy" tongue or sore mouth or tongue.
- Side effects other than those listed here may also occur. Be sure to let your doctor know about any side effect that seems unusual or that is especially bothersome.
- Rare irritation of liver (hepatitis)
- Rare drop in blood counts (with long term users)
- Rare infectious diarrhea called pseudomembranous colitis

What side effects should prompt me to STOP Cloxacillin?

- Stop taking Cloxacillin if you experience reactions such as rash, fever, itching, joint pain, swollen lymph nodes, and or sores on the genitals.
- Stop taking Cloxacillin if an allergic reaction develops (shortness of breath; closing of your throat; hives; swelling of your lips, face, or tongue; rash; or fainting);
- Stop taking Cloxacillin if you get seizures
- Stop taking Cloxacillin if you develop severe watery diarrhea and abdominal cramps; Stop taking Cloxacillin if you develop unusual bleeding or bruising
