Dear Friend,

Last year, East Africa continued to suffer one of its most persistent droughts and faced an invasive pest, the Fall Army Worm. There was no rainfall for eighteen months, or three growing seasons. When the rain finally did arrive, the earth was so parched that instead of feeding the crops, the fields were washed out.

For our partner, Fr. Riwa at Nchiru Children's Village in Kenya who serves 3,000 meals daily, this was a solemn experience. Food prices doubled for staples like beans and flour, and at times, staple foods such as maize weren't even available for purchase. Food portions had to be cut in size.

Your donations carried the children at Nchiru Children's Village through this difficult time. Last year, you responded by funding staple food purchases and expanding our partner's food security programs to feed more than 900 orphaned and vulnerable school children and youth. You even made it possible to provide relief food to children in Northern Kenya, where the drought was most intense. Without your support, these children and young people would not have been able to stay in school. In Kenya, education is the key to breaking the cycle of poverty. Thank you for keeping these children on that path forward. *We thank you for making a positive difference in the lives of more than 900 orphaned and vulnerable school children and youth in Kenya.*

Your Accomplishments

- Provided 1,500 meals per day to 570 school children and youth (ages 6-23)
- Provided 5,000 meals of relief food to children from a semi-nomadic community most affected by the drought
- Purchased school uniforms for 160 boys at St. Francis Boys' Home
- Purchased school uniforms for 120 HIV+ children at St. Philomena Homes of Hope
- Upgraded bore hole water source for improved access to drinkable water
- Expanded partner's fish farming program with cages, nets and fish feeds
- Planted 3,500 moringa trees across 4 acres
- Procured implements for growing fruits, vegetables and fish consumed at centers for 922 children and youth

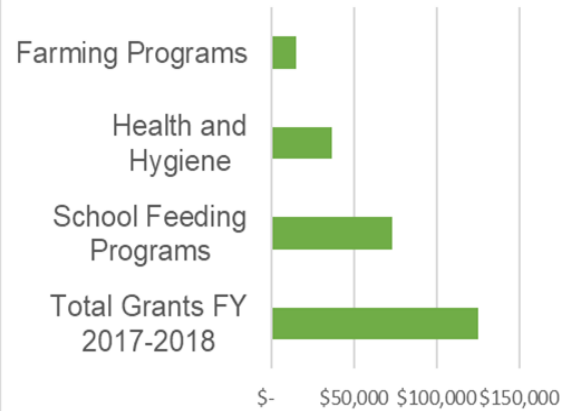
