# EBENSBURG WELCOMES CHIEF JOE LOUGHRAN AND OFFICER JIM BOGUS

Born and raised in Patton, Chief Joe Loughran joined the borough police department in August after a 25 year career with the Pennsylvania State Police. Most recently, he was promoted to Captain in 2021 and served as the Troop Commander Troop A in Greensburg from 2021 to August 2023 before retiring. Prior to that, he held the rank of Trooper in Uniontown, Rockview and Hollidaysburg; was promoted to the rank of Corporal in 2006 and served in the Bureau of Gaming Enforcement in the Chester Downs Casino and in Patrol Units at Troop C, Punxsutawney and Troop A, Ebensburg; was promoted to Sergeant in 2011 and served as the District Office Commander in the Pittsburgh Office of the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement and as Station Commander Ebensburg; was promoted to Lieutenant in 2015 and served as the Central Section Commander in Events and Section Comma

2015 and served as the Central Section Commander in Everett, Station Commander in Greensburg, Patrol Section Commander in Greensburg, and Station Commander in Indiana.

Loughran's goals for the department — keep it professional, progressive, responsive and service-oriented. "I want to give back to the community with those values in mind. I raised my family in Cambria County for a reason. We don't have any of the bigcity problems here, and I want to keep it that way," stated Loughran.



Officer Jim Bogus started in October as a full-time officer with Ebensburg Borough Police Department. Prior to coming on board, Bogus worked part-time with the borough, and full-time as a campus police officer with Saint Francis University. Before starting at the university, Officer Bogus worked for 10 years as a full-time officer with Carrolltown Borough Police Department.

Officer Bogus is a member of the Laurel Highlands Crisis Intervention Team and has also held parttime positions as an officer with Patton, Hastings and Northern Cambria Boroughs.

#### What is a Backflow Prevention Device?

The Borough of Ebensburg and the Ebensburg Municipal Authority are not responsible for the backup of water or wastewater into residences, whether or not caused by blockages in the municipal system. Customers are cautioned that such backups will occur from time to time, and are advised to install what is called a back flow prevention device to protect their personal property. Customers are further advised that homeowners insurance does not normally cover such a loss, but that additional coverage may be purchased to provide coverage for backup of water/wastewater.

<u>The YPCC</u> – The primary mission of the Young Peoples Community Center (YPCC) has always been to provide activities and a safe, inviting place for the areas youth to play and hangout with their friends. While still keeping this at the core of the mission, the YPCC has evolved into a Health & Wellness Center as mentioned above. Adding various exercise classes into the daily activities at the YPCC. There is open gym daily (hours vary) at no cost for kids under 18 to play in the gym.

<u>Cross-Country Ski & Bike/E-Bike Rental Programs</u> — Both cross-country skis/equipment and bike rentals are now offered through the YPCC at an hourly rate of \$8/adult or \$6/youth; or full day rate of \$32/adult or \$24/youth. A waiver of liability must be signed before renting. E-Bikes rentals are offered at a rate of \$15/hour. Instructional clinics will be available for cross-country skiing. Stay tuned to Facebook or the website for more information.

<u>Pavilion Rentals</u> – The Borough rents out three pavilions at Lake Rowena and two at the Ebensburg Borough Swimming Pool. The cost to rent a pavilion is \$100.00. A \$25.00 cleaning deposit is now required. Call the YPCC to check availability and to make a reservation.

<u>Outdoor Skate/Hockey Rink</u> – Located at Lake Rowena, the rink is open year round for street or in-line hockey. There are hockey goals provided and lights for evening play too. Best part is, it's FREE and open to the public.

<u>Swimming Pools</u> – Since its renovation in 2011, the Borough Swimming Pool has been enjoyed by many. The area is fortunate to have a public pool that is up-to-date, heated, kid friendly and handicap accessible. The Borough Pool is available for after hour private party rentals. In addition to the outdoor Borough Pool, the YPCC is also managing swimming lessons and open swims at the Central Cambria High School Pool.

Council Adopts 2024 Budget - Borough Council has adopted a \$7,266,390 budget for 2024. The general fund budget is balanced without an increase in real estate taxes. There are several projects planned in 2024 including:


- 1. Begin renovations to the pool to secure the stability of the structure for
- 2. Refinish benches, bollard lights, trash receptacles, pole bases as needed.
- 3. Monitor and repair/replace wastewater mains as needed.
- 4. Begin an annual program of customer water meter replacement.
- 5. Secure funding for the construction of a significant stormwater project in the northern quadrant of town.
- 6. Continue with inspection of lines and laterals and complete paperwork involved to abide by mandated Lead-Copper Rule.
- 7. Resurface indoor tennis courts and refinish gym floor at the YPCC.




## WINTER REMINDERS FROM THE EBENSBURG BOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT

- 1. All vehicles must be parked WITH the flow of traffic. This means that your passenger side door is to be against the curb and driver side door must be open to the roadway. This violation, by itself, carries a fine of \$15.00 and will be enforced YEAR ROUND.
- 2. If the sidewalk is part of your driveway, you cannot park on the sidewalk part of your driveway. A fine of \$15.00 for blocking the sidewalk may be incurred.
- 3. When shoveling snow from your sidewalk or driveway, you cannot throw the snow onto the street. A fine of up to \$600.00 may be incurred.
- 4. You must clear your sidewalk within 12 hours after cessation of snow, sleet, or ice. A fine of up to \$600.00 may be incurred.
- 5. You are not allowed to plow snow from your property onto borough streets. A fine of up to \$600.00 may be incurred.
- 6. Shovel the sidewalks full width to the bare pavement and clear curb cuts at corners and crosswalks.
- 7. When Winter Parking is in effect and you move your car to the opposite side of the street, try to avoid lining it up directly across from another car, in case emergency vehicles need to get through.
- 8. Winter Parking regulations will once again be in effect when staff deems it necessary. This will be posted on the borough website, the Ebensburg Borough & Community Facebook page, and by calling the office and selecting option #5 to hear a recording of the status of winter parking. You may also ask borough staff during office hours of 8 am to 4 pm, Monday - Friday.

Additionally, if there are neighbors on your street who are elderly, have a disability or may have a hard time shoveling for any reason, please work with your neighbors to give a hand and ensure your entire block is safe and accessible to all. move forward with the 2024 stormwater project. All necessary DEP permits are now in hand for the project. Officials were notified at the end of December that that the Authority was awarded a \$1.263 million grant from the H2O PA Program for the project. It will include building a stormwater collection and conveyance system and making needed improvements to its Ogden tank.

Borough staff will keep residents informed of all upcoming work to be done.



## WATERLINE REPLACEMENT PROJECT - PHASE 1

Ebensburg Borough and Municipal Authority are set to begin Phase 1 of a multi-phase waterline



replacement project aimed at updating and upgrading the Authority's Public Water System. The Federal EPA has launched a nationwide initiative to replace all water mains and water services that may contain lead. Ebensburg's water system, as most water systems across the United States, falls into this category. We want our customers to know that our water is regularly tested for lead and it DOES NOT CONTAIN LEAD OR OUR LEVELS ARE BELOW THE FEDERAL LIMITS ALLOWED FOR DRINKING WATER. OUR WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK. If your property falls into the project area, you will be notified by the Borough. This project is set to begin in February and procced through the end of 2024.

Ebensburg Borough Council welcomed a new member to Borough Council; Mr. Mike Murphy. Mr. Murphy will take the seat vacated by Mr. Mike Owatt and will serve a 4-year term.



In 2023, Borough Council welcomed two Junior Councilors; Mr. Isaac Bradley and Mr. Abraham Remillard. Both are juniors in High School; Bradley at Central Cambria and Remillard is homeschooled. Junior Councilors are permitted to attend all meetings of Council (except executive sessions) and all committee meetings and are permitted to participate fully in those proceedings, except shall not be afforded the right to vote.

Ebensburg Enjoys a Successful 2023 - Council and staff were able to complete many projects during 2023:

- Completed installation of new waterlines in the main section of downtown along East and West High Streets.
- Milled and resurfaced streets in northwest area of town.
- Replaced a police cruiser.
- Applied for and received a grant for the Borough Swimming Pool.
- Oversaw construction of the Dog Park at Lake Rowena, sponsored by the Rotary Club.
- Supported the Municipal Authority in a water line replacement project for Lovell Avenue and Manor Drive.
- Completed hiring search for new Police Chief and successfully transitioned over.
- Hired an additional full-time officer.
- Maintained gold certification in PA Sustainable Community Program.
- Started negotiations with the Police Union for a new 4-year labor agreement.
- Successfully negotiated a new five-year contract with Inframark for the continued operation of the sewer and water plants, plus oversight of sewage pumping stations.
- Negotiated a contact for the provision of electrician services, including coverage for emergency /quick-response needs.
- Bid the provision of garbage collection services and executed a new 5-year agreement with Pro Disposal.

These toters will be used for the purpose of trash and recycling material ONLY. They are the property of Pro Disposal, Inc. For any lost, stolen, or damaged toter, the resident will be responsible for the cost to replace with a new toter.

Toter delivery began the week of December 11, 2023.

If for any reason you do not receive a trash or recycle toter, please call the Pro Disposal office and one will be delivered to you.

## **Beginning the week of January 1, 2024:**

TRASH PICK UP will be on FRIDAYS for all residents.
RECYCLE PICK UP will be EVERY OTHER WEEK on THURSDAY.

Example: TRASH will be picked up on Saturday 1/6/24, Friday 1/12/24, Friday 1/19/24, etc. RECYCLING will be picked up on Friday 1/5/24, Thursday 1/18/24, Thursday 2/1/24, etc.

- New Year's Holiday Monday, January 1, 2024 All collections will be picked up one day late.
- Memorial Day Holiday- Monday, May 27, 2024 All collections will be picked up one day late.
