# **UPDATE- The Merger**

Our congregation voted to merge with Pine Street United Methodist Church on Sunday, June 2, 2024-unanimously. The Pine Street Church congregation voted unanimously to merge with Faxon-Kenmar Church on the same day. What a big decision for both churches. May we continue to move forward in taking those steps for God's kingdom through joining forces with other disciples of Christ here in Williamsport.

After months of exploration, praying and discerning, our congregation determined that our best path forward is to merge with Pine Street Church to enhance and expand our ministry and mission. Due to the decline of membership, finances and people to carry out the ministry, mission and administration of our congregation, we took a brave, faithful step to merge.

The team of 8 (four people from each congregation), our consultant and two Project Managers, Lisa McGinniss from Pine Street and Jan Warren from our church, met on June 9, 2024. During our afternoon meeting, we framed out the plan for the next two months for our transition. Our last Sunday worship as Faxon-Kenmar Church is at 10 a.m. on June 30. The first Sunday worship of the newly merged Pine Street Church is at 10 a.m. on July 7. Let us trust that God will open the way to work through us to bring love and peace and hope to our Williamsport community and places around the world.

Jan Warren will be our "point person" to guide us through our necessary steps of transition, as she consults with Lisa McGinniss and Rev James Wooster at Pine Street Church. If you need help with that, please reach out. Soon you'll start receiving our "weekly news" and monthly newsletter via email.

There are a number of places you can jump into ministry right away. We would love to have you as part of our Sunday morning Hospitality team or our Sunday morning Kids team. We'll be happy to have you by our side when we volunteer at the food bank or helping with a blood mobile. If you like working outside, our building and grounds team will be able to find a place for you. We'd be blessed if you participated in our special music through the summer or joining the choir come fall.

Our choir, the Inspirational Singers will also sing.


