#### In the Interim...

The Lord says, "I will guide you along the best pathway for your life. I will advise you and watch over you. – Psalm 32:8

Dear Friends,

In just a few weeks of serving as the interim minister at Federated, I already feel so at home and so much a part of this warm community! Thank you for your kindness, for your grace as I stumble to recall names, and for your support as I offer my theological point of view during tumultuous times. In the days ahead, as we begin a new liturgical year with Advent, we will also begin a worship series that invites us to anticipate the coming of Emmanuel. The dramatic expectation of this season reminds me of an experience with one of my friends.

Rod has a pair of very well-trained dogs with whom he loves to perform. One of the best examples of their training is demonstrated at dinner time. My friend will call the dogs to eat and they sit at attention in front of him as he pours their food. They wait expectantly, watching his every move. Then, as the anticipation builds, Rod places a dog treat on each of their front paws. He waits, just a second or two, as the moment reaches a crescendo. You can almost feel the tingling expectation coursing through the animals before, on my friend's command, the dogs are finally able to snap up the treat and begin their meal.

This heightened sense of anticipation is mirrored in the season of Advent: we know what is coming and we can hardly contain ourselves. Yet it is the expectation, the preparation for the coming of the Christ child, which makes the season so special. In a world of instant gratification, the tingle of expectation is a feeling to be treasured.

Over the next several weeks, as we prepare for and await the arrival of the messiah, I invite you to reflect on the meaning of this big event. What does the birth of Jesus mean for you? As the Advent candles are lit each week, consider their meaning in your life. For what are you hoping? Where do you find peace? What brings you joy? What is it that you love, and how do you receive the love of others?

Waiting is nearly a lost art in our society today. As we begin the season of expectation this year, soak up the moment. Enjoy the tingle of expectation. Reflect on its meaning in your life. And then, when Christmas comes, you will be ready to snap up the treat of Jesus' love and begin to feast on the meal of living in the realm of God that Jesus brings near.

I look forward to waiting, preparing and tingling with you this Advent season!

During the Advent season, we will invite the children forward for special time with the pastor. After the message, the children will be dismissed to Sunday school as usual (except for December 15 when they will remain in worship for children's choir Christmas musical!). During this time of transition, we will try some new things and seek your feedback. Please be sure to let Pastor Vicki know what your family thinks about this addition to the worship service.

#### Let's Be Close to Home this Advent!

When something hits close to home, it affects us deeply. During the Advent and Christmas season, we journey through scriptures and rituals that are tender, heavy with emotion, and vulnerable. We carry the memories and truths of this season close to our hearts, particularly in this time of transition when many are filled with a sense of sadness and grief.

During the Advent season, we will engage *Close to Home*, a worship series that enables us to reflect on the "already but not yet" tension of our faith: Emmanuel is with us, and yet, God's promised day – our everlasting home – is not fully realized. Throughout these weeks of waiting and anticipation, we will focus on what it means to be Close to Home as we name our deep longing for God to come near to us.

Throughout the season, we will feature images of home, especially home during the holidays, but we need your help! Please send images, reflections and pictures of what being close to home means to you during Advent and Christmas. We would love to see pictures of your family gathered around the Christmas tree or enjoying other beloved holiday traditions, see a recipe for your favorite Christmas cookie, or hear what your favorite carol is and why.

We will gather these images into a moving video that will run along with the announcements each Sunday before worship, so please be sure to arrive a few minutes early to enjoy these times of reflection. One week will feature children, so those faded pictures of you and your siblings visiting Santa or waiting for your present under the tree, and pictures of children or grandchildren will be especially welcome. **As you gather with family on Thanksgiving, how about pulling out some pictures, old and new, and reflecting on family at Christmas . . . then sending a few to pics@fedchurch.org** as soon as possible and no later than December 10? #### **Christmas Eve Offering Recipient**

For more than 60 years Federated Church has looked to support an organization that impacts the lives of people in profound ways. Many worthy nominations were received for the 2024 Christmas Eve Offering and there was a great deal of prayerful discernment.

The Mission and Services Commission is pleased to announce the selection for the 2024 Christmas Eve Offering: RE:Source Cleveland.

Fourteen years ago Refugee Response was founded to serve the newcomer populations of Greater Cleveland. In 2023 the name was changed to Re:Source Cleveland. The core mission stayed the same, but since its inception 14 years ago the nature of immigration to the US and our region has changed. The scope of the work has grown, and the reach of Re:Source Cleveland has expanded.

Historically, the United States has welcomed refugees into the country recognizing their justifiable fear of persecution in their own country. Refugees legally enter the U.S. seeking freedom, peace and an opportunity for themselves and their families. After resettlement, they start their new lives with limited resources knowing that they must transition from their past and the lives they once knew.

Re:Source Cleveland empowers resettled families to grow roots, supporting them in becoming engaged, self-sufficient and contributing members of their new communities.

Through respect and collaboration, high quality individualized education and personal support, Re;Source Cleveland promotes a better quality of life for the entire community.



Recycle your Live Christmas Tree
