game against Cloverleaf. Kudos to the Comets and the Colts for exhibiting great character and making it about more than just football.

**GOLF:** Senior **Ryan Dinan** proudly represented the Comets for the 2nd year at the OHSAA Division II Golf Championship held in Sunbury, Ohio, at the North Star Golf Club. Dinan showcased remarkable skill, securing the tournament's 11<sup>th</sup> out of 72 golfers. Ryan plans to further his golf career at Cleveland State in the upcoming season.



BASKETBALL: The Varsity Basketball team posted an outstanding record at home, finishing 8-1 for the season. The 6th man student section's contagious energy was key to their success, igniting the atmosphere at every game with their incredible spirit. Coventry beat each team in The league had the best performance since 2018.

Entering the state tournament, we hosted the first round against league opponent Cloverleaf with a comeback win. After losing twice to rival Norton during the season, we beat them to claim the Sectional Championship, advancing to the Districts, which hasn't been done since 2016.

The All-Academic team comprised 21 players with a GPA of 3.0 or above. Four players were recognized with MAC honors: Reggie Edwards (First Team), Jaden Keenan (Second Team,) and Luke Futrell and Alex Meinen (Honorable Mentions). Reggie Edwards is ranked #2 in Ohio in total block shots, #1 in Division II and #103 in the Nation!



victories and a top-10 finish, three Comets earned league honors this year: Sophomores **Evan Owen** (First team), **Kaden Orndorff** (Honorable Mention), and Freshman **Dalton Keith** (Honorable Mention). Kaden and Evan placed in the top four at sectionals and scored district victories.



SOFTBALL: The varsity softball team traveled for the 2nd year to Pigeon Forge, Tennessee, over Spring Break. The Ripken Experience offers turf fields and great conditions to play 5 games against teams from Wisconsin, Illinois, and Pennsylvania. The young Comets played in some top-tier schools and gained valuable experience to take back to Ohio. The team finished 2nd in the Metro Athletic Conference.

## TRACK RESURFACING

The 2024-2025 school year brings an exciting and necessary upgrades to our track. We look forward to hosting high school and middle

school events, especially senior night! This summer 2024 project includes removing the old track surface and replacing the 6-lane track with a polyurethane surface made from rubber particles bound with latex or polyurethane poured over an asphalt base will require the least maintenance and repairs over time. The bleachers will also be replaced, and a concrete pad will be added for handicap accessibility.

#### What's the difference between GENERAL, P.I., ESSER?

Many have asked how the district spent its **COVID-19 ESSER Fund**. Great question! First, we must understand the difference between the *General Fund*, the *Permanent Improvement (P.I.) fund* and the *ESSER* fund.

- **General Fund:** The General Fund is the primary financial source for operations, including salaries, utilities, and supplies, and is funded mainly by local taxes and state funding.
- P.I. (Permanent Improvement) Fund: This is a designated fund for long-term capital improvements include renovations, major equipment purchases, and other infrastructure projects that enhance the school's facilities and assets.
  - ESSER Fund: Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) is federal emergency relief funding intended to help schools manage COVID-19-related expenses, such as PPE, remote learning, and addressing learning loss, with specific usage guidelines.

We received **\$3.52 million in ESSER Funds**, but there were certain restrictions on its use. The Board of Education and Administration worked with the directors of operations, facilities, and curriculum to determine what needed to be purchased, replaced, fixed, updated, etc. It was a long list with a hefty price tag. Starting last summer, the district worked with local contractors, vendors and our custodial staff to complete the projects.

This list represents major projects (paid out of the appropriate fund) to ensure fiscal responsibility, prepare our facilities for long-term use, and provide a safe environment for our students and staff.

**Elementary:** Bathrooms (lowering toilets, urinals & sinks), rooftop compressors, roof (with warranty), pavement in maintenance cycle, walk-in freezer and cooler, replaced front and exterior doors, frames and safety glass, replaced carpet in the main hall with tile, installed new security cameras and alarm system, and rekeyed all doors for building safety.



**Middle:** Chiller, bathroom (urinals & sinks), roof (with warranty), brick tuck point entry to the gym, pavement in maintenance cycle, dishwasher, security cameras, alarm system, security fencing and gates at the bus garage, painted the lunchroom and rekeyed all doors for building safety. *Mr. Johnsen holds the former ring of 90 keys and the NEW universal key!* 

**High School:** Recrowned the field at the Coventry Memorial Stadium, painted bleachers, fieldhouse, concession stand and press box, installed handrails, replanted grass on the practice field, and in the summer of 2024 track project: resurfacing, lighting and bleachers.



Did you know the last time the track resurfaced was in 2001?

Due to its deterioration, we have not been able to host track events on school grounds since 2019.



**Specials give students opportunities to find their passions.** Students at CES participate in a four-day specials rotation throughout the school year: **Art**, **Physical Education**, **Music**, and **iLearn**. These classes are memorable for students due to their hands-on nature. In Art, their work is displayed at the end-of-year Art Show, with the "**Art in the Dark**" room being the big hit. Thanks to **Mrs. Wulff** for her amazing ideas to help our students foster creativity. In Physical Education, **Mrs. Antram** teaches students how to play games, and students show off their skills on Field Day each May. **Mrs. Galemmo** has a way with music! Students participate in an annual grade-level performance, typically drawing a standing-room-only crowd. Our kids sing, dance, and perform with smiles and confidence. **Mrs. Lorence** provides hands-on learning in the iLearn special. It is a S.T.E.A.M.-based class where students learn all about bugs and space and grow crops in a hydroponic system.



### The Science of Reading

All Coventry staff members will participate in the Science of Reading training. This Ohio Department of Education mandate aims to provide educators with evidence-based scientific information about how students become skilled *readers*.

This training aligns with our new elementary reading curriculum, Core Knowledge Language Arts® (CKLA). We are committed to ensuring that all Comets have access to instructional practices that work. Elementary School Principal **Mr. Savage** says, "Our new curriculum and Science of Reading training has improved early literacy at CES!"

# FINANCES

#### ~ from The Office of the Treasurer

In 2021, the Coventry Local School District was released from the state's Fiscal Emergency designation. After decades of financial hardship, we finally reached fiscal stability. Since then, the district has maintained positive year-end balances while addressing significant facility needs, improving safety and security measures, and, most importantly, providing students with a well-rounded education.

Credit Rating: Within one year, Coventry earned two credit rating improvements with Moody's Investor Services. The first improvement was in November 2022, when our "Baa3" rating was improved to a "Baa2." In April 2023, Moody recognized us again and upgraded our ratings to a "Baa1" with a positive outlook.

Clean Audit: On May 15, 2024, the Coventry Local School District received one of Ohio's highest honors, the Auditor of State Award for accounting excellence. The Auditor of the State presents this award only to those entities that meet the state's rigorous reporting requirements and criteria for a "clean" financial audit.
