About the District

With an enrollment of around 2,700 in grades K-12, the Rocky River City School District provides students with the benefits of a smallschool setting and all the resources of a larger school district. Long known for its tradition of academic excellence, the District continues to excel academically and received an overall 5-star rating, the highest possible, on the 2023 state report card. The District also received 5-stars for Student Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing and Graduation Rate, and a 4-star rating for Early Literacy. In addition, Rocky River High School earned the highest Performance Index score among all high schools in Ohio in 2022 and 2023.

Beach Preschool is consistently named a 5-star Step-Up to Quality preschool and Kensington Intermediate School, Rocky River Middle School and Rocky River High School have been selected as Best Elementary, Middle and High Schools according to U.S. News and World Report.

Nearly 92-percent of Rocky River High School Class of 2024 graduates continued on to colleges or universities across the country. The Rocky River City Schools are consistently ranked in the prestigious Top-10 List of Cleveland Area Schools in Cleveland Magazine.

The National Blue Ribbon Schools award was earned by Kensington Intermediate School in 2011 and 2023 and by Rocky River High School in 2012 and 2020.

Student Services

Rocky River City Schools is proud to provide student instruction tailored to individual needs by a variety of highly qualified personnel, including teachers, intervention specialists and tutors. Research-based, tiered levels of intervention and enrichment provide opportunities for students of all ability levels to participate in rich, meaningful learning in a variety of settings. Federal grant funding supports the early childhood education and the preschool, intervention for students with disabilities, Title I and early literacy intervention (K-5), tutoring for English Learners across the district and high-quality professional development for P-12 staff.

The District set up pantries in each of its five buildings, stocked with food, clothing, supplies, toiletries and other items for any family in need. Executive Director of Pupil Services Jennifer Norman started the pantries using funds from the American Rescue Plan (APR) to support the cause. The pantries are filled with items such as backpacks, deodorant, soap, shampoo, detergent, food, healthy snacks, toilet paper, paper towels, clothing, jackets and more. They are open daily at each school and students and families in the district are invited to visit the pantries and pick out what they need.


