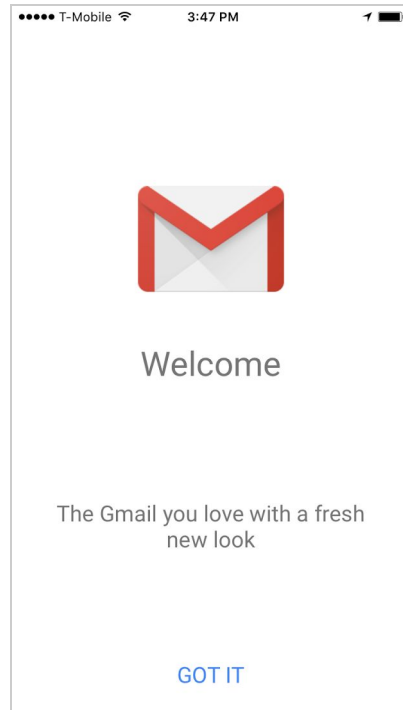

The new app also includes popular features like undo send and swipe to archive (or delete), as well as faster search and various accessibility improvements.

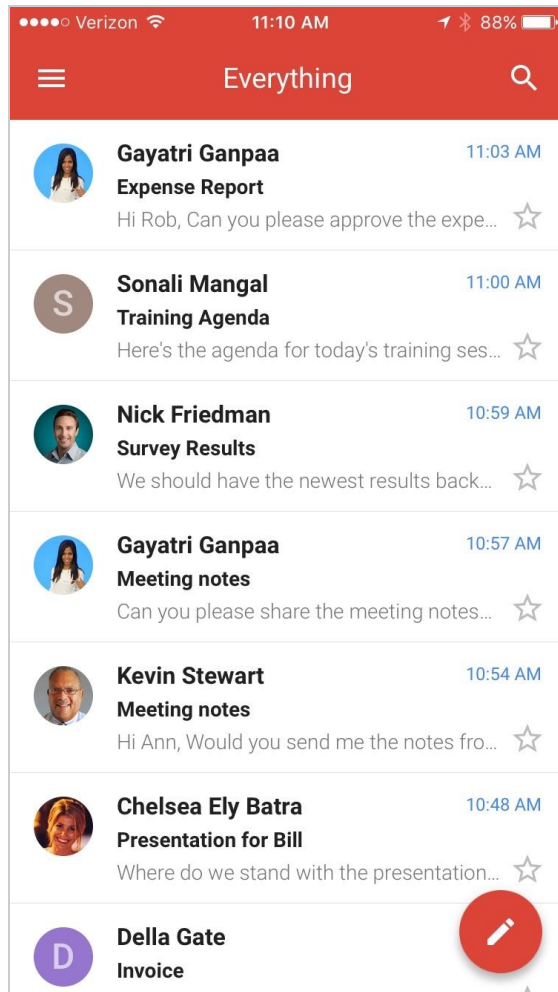
Here's a review of the UI changes and how they impact familiar Gmail tasks.

First-time users of the new Gmail app for iOS will see a warm welcome screen introducing them to the new version of the app.

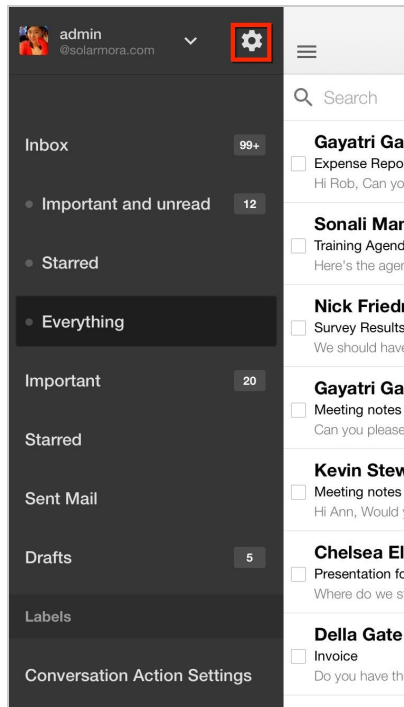

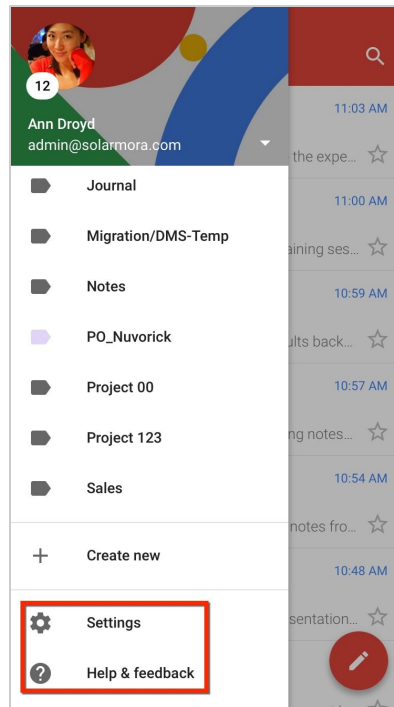

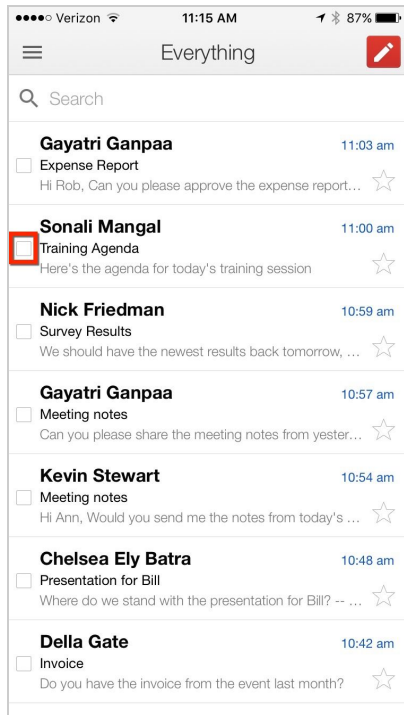

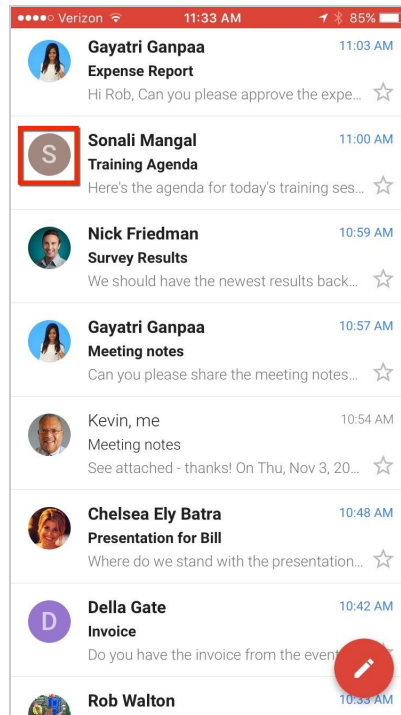
- “Settings” and “Help & Feedback” moved to the bottom of the drawer

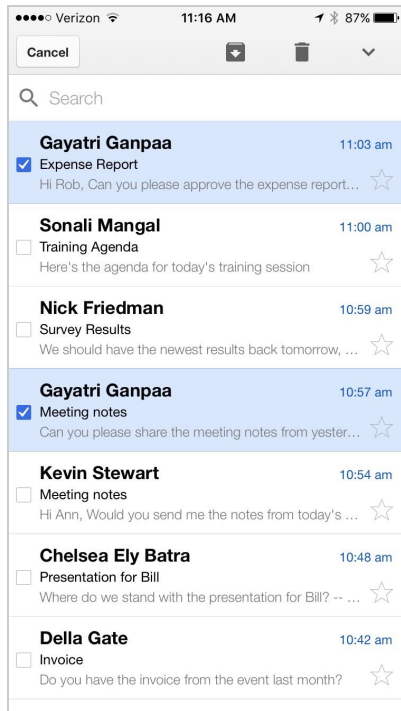

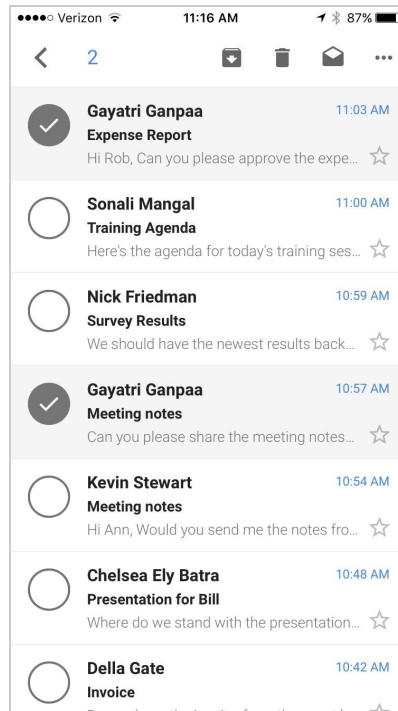
- Checkboxes restyled to selectable Avatars

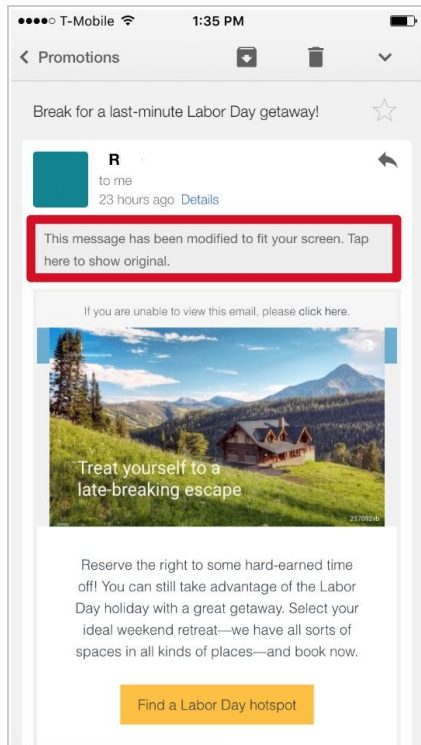

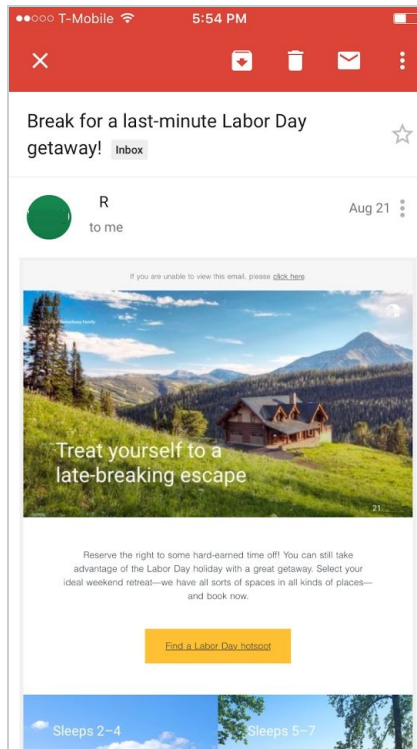
- Mark as read/unread more prominent

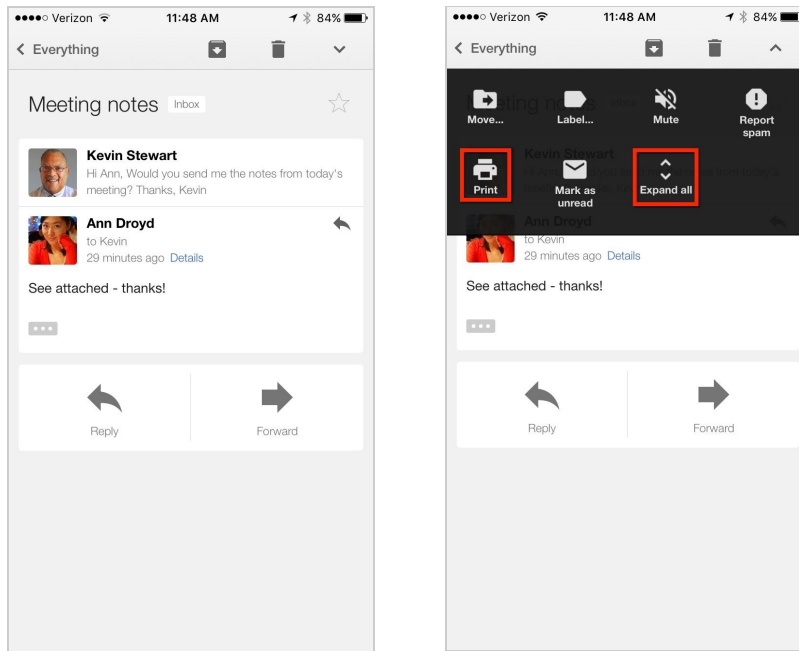
New Automatic email restyling using Media Queries



- No more modification of emails for mobile viewing. [Media Queries](#) allow for responsive formatting for every device.

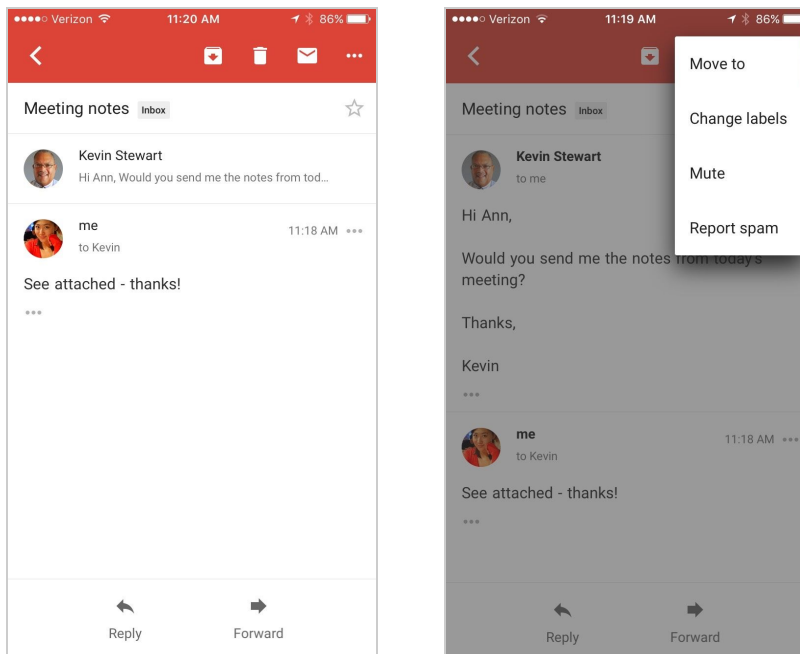
