## **COVID-19 Safety protocol and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for students, staffs and visitors**

The Spread of Coronavirus has created an unprecedented situation, calling for extraordinary measures to keep the college campus safe and healthy. For this purpose, Govt. Girls' PG College, Ujjain is geared up to keep the students, staff and visitors safe by following strict COVID-19 protocol procedures both on and off campus in a self-disciplined way at all times. All classes including assessments have moved to online mode.

The following mandatory protocol procedures outline necessary precautionary measures to be adopted on campus at any level of functionality as per Govt. norms:

1. Thermal scanning/ body temperature measuring
2. Wearing of gloves, mask and face shield
3. Maintaining social distancing
4. Washing and sanitizing hands frequently
5. Avoiding crowding in common/any other areas

Stock of face masks and sanitizers is placed in all department offices and administrative buildings. Electric hand sanitizer/dispenser is installed at crucial junctures.

### **SOP – Standard Operating**

#### **Procedure Main Gate Entry/Exit**

##### **Point:**

- All the students, staffs and visitors should wear mask and gloves before entering the campus.
- Vehicles entering the campus should be disinfected by spray mandatorily.
- Thermal scanning / body temperature is checked before entering the campus.
- Anyone having body temperature in excess of the normal range and/or having cough, cold, wheezing or any other corona indication will be isolated and entry restricted.
- Display boards regarding the protocols and social distancing is placed at prominent locations.

##### **Classrooms:**

- Classrooms are disinfected by spray every day.
- Wearing mask and gloves in the classrooms is mandatory for both students

and teachers.

- Social distancing is maintained between students inside the classroom.
- 6-7 ft minimum distance is maintained between teacher and first bench students.
- Sharing of stationery, food or water among the students should be avoided.
- Frequent contact with door handles, switches etc. in the classrooms should be avoided.

#### **Laboratories:**

- Laboratories and the equipment are disinfected by spray every day.
- Automatic sanitizer machines are installed at the entrance .
- All students and lab-in charges should sanitize their hands before entering the lab.
- Both Students and lab-in charges should wear mask and gloves. Social distancing of minimum 2 meters must be maintained by all students and faculty performing experiments.

#### **Library and Sports complex:**

- Library and sports complex will be functional with restrictions to ensure safety protocols as per government norms is adhered to at all times.

#### **Corridors/Common areas:**

- All the staffs, students and visitors should wear masks and gloves at all the times.
- Students and staffs should avoid crowding in the corridors/common areas.
- Frequent contact with door handles and other points in the common areas should be avoided.
- All students are advised to carry a personal hand sanitizer with them at all times.
- 2-meter distance to be maintained between students in the common areas and corridor.
- Sanitizer is stocked in the corridors of all departments and other common areas.

#### **Restroom:**

- The restrooms are cleaned and sanitized multiple times a day.
- All students, staffs and visitors should sanitize their hands at entry and exit points of restrooms.

#### **Maitreyi Hostel:**

- At present the Hostel is closed due to absence of students but once the students return to avail hostel facilities then following SOP will be applicable to Hostel Services
  - All students and hostel personnel should submit their RTPCR Negative test report before accommodating in the hostel and should be advised to remain 14 days quarantined before starting their regular activities.

- Hostel Mess and other common areas inside the hostel should be disinfected by spray every day.
- Proper hygiene and cleanliness should be ensured in the restrooms.
- Thermal scanning for all the hostellers twice a day (i.e, morning and evening) will be mandatory.
- Mess staffs and hostel warden/Caretaker should wear masks and gloves at all the times in the hostel.
- Seating arrangements should be properly done in the hostel mess to ensure physical distancing.

### **Emergency & First-Aid Support**

In case of fever or related symptoms found in the students or staff residing in the hostel

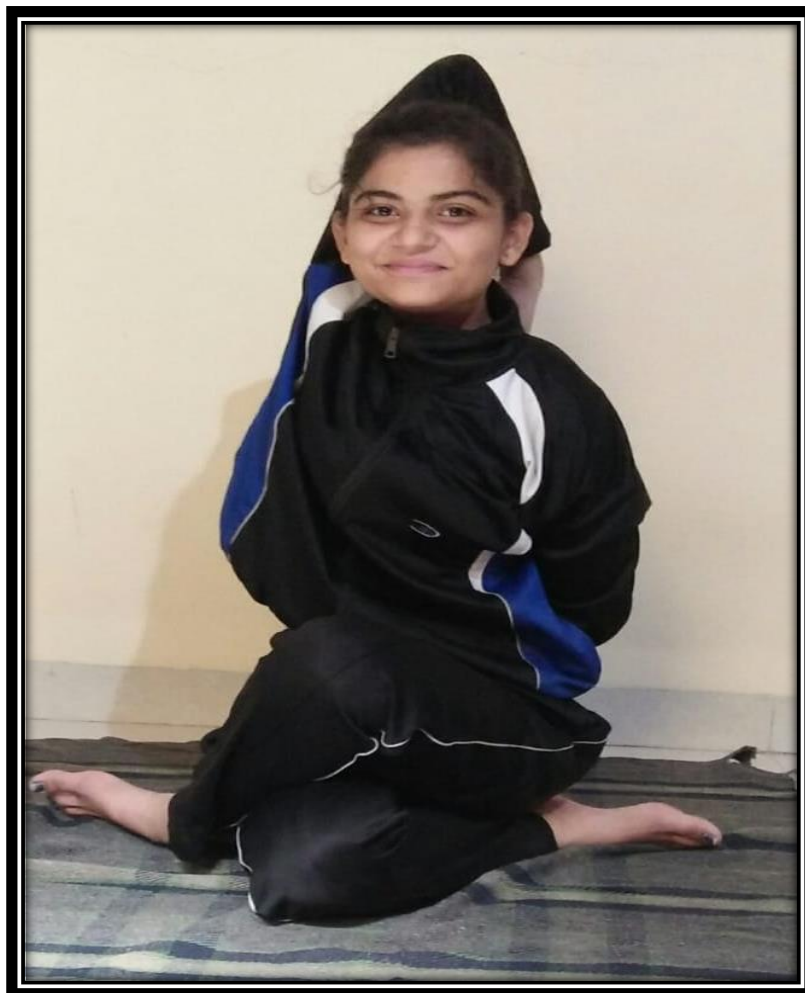
- Inform the Principal who will report to the Madhav Nagar or other Govt. Hospital and the family members immediately

- Will ensure treatment for students / employees on priority basis

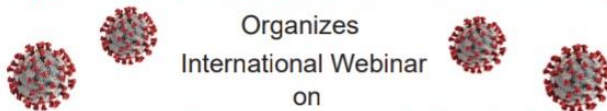

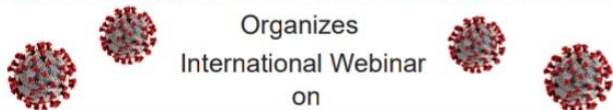

# Learn to cope with COVID crisis: VC

In the two-day international webinar on "Coping with COVID-19 Crises-Responses and Future Strategies", the speakers said positive responses to COVID-19 crisis should be our strategy. The webinar was organised by Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Government Girls' Post-Graduate College (GGPGC).

Chief guest on the occasion was Vikram University vice-chancellor Prof Balkrishna Sharma, who said: "COVID-19 has influenced various aspects of life including teaching and learning. He said that with all the capacity, research and discipline, we learnt to cope with this crisis but carelessness of a few during the unlock period can undo all our efforts. Indian traditions, values of human civilization, and lifestyle laws have been re-established due to this outbreak in the world. "Altruism practised extensively during the crisis should sustain as a life value."

On day-1 of technical session, first speaker was Dr Pradeep Prajapati, profes-

sor of economics Gujarat University. He spoke on economic aspects of COVID-19 and the recession caused by the pandemic may be quite severe. The measures taken in the economic package are supply-oriented whereas the demand side needs a big push through employment generation and for this development should be rural centric. He further added that the 4th generation reforms are required to meet

the COVID challenges. It is expected that after COVID-19, 10.5 per cent working hours will be lost resulting in 30 crore job loss. So strategy should be made in a planned manner.

Second speaker Dr Prem Chhabra, academic director of Manovikas Vishesh Education College, speaking on psychology in COVID time, said, "We are becoming introvert instead of ambivert and fear and suspicion have made us

self-centered. Due to Corona crisis and lockdown mental health is going down, time table is disturbed so one must try to regain psychological power by communicating with others, helping the needy, and try to cultivate the hidden talent. We must thank God and nature for what we have.

Third speaker Raunak Bhavsar, manager in Fortune 500 Co in the USA, speaking on Navigating

grad school, applications and courses in Covid-19 era, told that biotechnology, bioinformatics and business analysis are becoming the preferred courses. Tests are being conducted in September month for admissions and in October month university transcript is to be submitted. He also shared application procedures, examination schedules and links for admission in the US.

Fourth speaker Oorja Tapan from JNU, New Delhi spoke on governance during and after the Covid-19 era. She told that we have three major acts Epidemic Act, Disaster Management Act and IPC to face the challenges. There is a strong need for single Act to meet pandemic. Due to democratic federal structure of our country we have lesser problems as compared to China and USA in governance of policy responses like lockdown. For sustainable preparedness, to face such crises Government should adopt nexus and landscape approach of development. She discussed PM-CM-DM governance policy trilogy in fighting Covid-19 and talked about future strategies.

# 'Positive changes, digital revolution need of the hour'

"To meet the new challenges in economic, social and health areas due to the coronavirus, several measures have been taken but still many affirmative changes and digital revolution need to be adopted."

These views were expressed by the speakers at the international webinar on 'Macro challenges of COVID-19' jointly organised by chemistry, pharma chemistry department and IQAC of Government Girls Post-Graduate College (GGPGC).

Key speaker Dr Rakesh Dubey, director Disaster Management Institute Bhopal, explained the difference between environment and disaster management. He suggested to form disaster management group of students at college level in the guidance of teachers and to in-

clude it in the curriculum. Second guest speaker retired VSM major general Suresh Jain, director Online and Distance Education Amity University Gwalior, told that in this crisis time all the students are getting education through online mode. There are pros and cons of online system. There is need of improvement in it.

Dr Aarti Parihar, director BIOEXONS LLC Washington USA, stated, "Research at all levels - vaccine, treatment and virus structure - is going on and we will see positive results very soon. This virus is most complex and deadliest of all the known viruses."

Dr Neeta Tapan associate professor of economics GGPGC explained through power point presentation that we should make villages growth centers by mapping skill and resources that will be a base

for self reliance. Public sector should not be weakened due to privatisation because in such a time of crisis they play important role.

Dr Rajendra Dagia visiting faculty of Welingker College Mumbai said that global trade has reduced by 12 per cent it is alarming. To meet it export-im-

port and supply chain management must be improved.

Utkarsh Gera software engineer in Amazon Seattle USA said that due to COVID-19, work from home culture has been increased. IT sector has a great potential to keep pace with such time. Dr Dinesh Chandra Khandelwal

professor sociology GGPGC stated that it is a time of social change. It is urgent to reduce tension and negativity by re-establishing family values and lessening show off. One should not avoid corona patient.

Dr Swapnil Mehta pulmonologist Hiranandani Hospital Mumbai said that number of doctors according to population is still less. Nearly 2 percent of our GDP is spent on medical facilities. In slum areas Cause of spread of infection is lack of sanitation and nutrition.

Dr Avinav Batra, doctor of dental medicine in Nashville Tennessee USA, said that one must follow additional precautions and protocols so that pandemic may be controlled. Dr Karuna Hingori assistant manager in Healuis Pty Ltd Perth Australia gave a brief account of health management in

Australia. She further added that we should follow isolation instructions strictly and this should be started from self. In her presidential address principal Dr Ulka Yadav told that this harsh time has affected all sectors. Through such webinars bring experts' thoughts on a single platform to make affirmative thinking possible. It is time to change our lifestyle, she said.

In this webinar three speakers from America, one from Australia and six from India participated. Total participants were 195. Dharmaresh Rathore, Shawn Manchandia, Kajal Pandey and Mayuri Soner provided technical assistance.

Dr Rashmi Bhargava, Dr GD Agrawal and Dr Sameena Qureshi conducted the webinar. Convener of the programme Dr Anita Manchandia expressed the vote of thanks.

She told that one should keep oneself away from alcohol, smoking, processed food, insomnia etc. and one should adopt balanced diet, consume sufficient lukewarm water, citrus food etc. We should boost immunity by easily available tulsi, jaggery, turmeric, ginger, cloves etc things. Timely expulsion of toxic materials from the body is also essential. Immunity is the medicine for the Covid-19

infection. In the third lecture Dr. Aparna Rajwani, physical therapist from North Carolina USA, stated that physiotherapy helps the patient to go back to normal condition. Breathing exercise and cardiovascular exercises are beneficial for Covid-19 infected patient. Physiotherapy may be given at school, home and also online. The load of regular patients coming to the hospital is significantly reduced in America so these are treated online through physiotherapy. Fourth speaker Ruchika

Patidar speaking on impact of Covid-19 on international trade told that this is hard time for global trade supply chains. Since China had become a manufacturing hub so the pandemic affected the whole world. Companies are ready to shift from china. India has a trade benefit in services. Less Developed Countries (LDC) like Nepal, Bhutan, Myanmar have suffered the most as they are dependent on foreign visitors for tourism. In her presidential address Dr. Ulka Yadav, principal GGPGC told that re-

source persons enlightened us and added to our knowledge. In the beginning, Saraswati Vaidhana was performed by the research scholar of music department Saumya Saxena. Following this the publication of IQAC name "Resilience" containing the poems, drawings, and articles written by the students of the college during lockdown period was released by the Vikram University vice-chancellor Prof. BK Sharma, principal and the senior member of IQAC Dr. Ravindra Bhardwaj.
