TIGs are coordinated by a subject matter expert from a member state, with objectives, duration, and membership approved by the ENLETS Core Group.

## **About TIGs**

Based on the strategic goals of the European Network of Law Enforcement Technology Services, the community established Technology Interest Groups. The TIGs work in a structured way and are led by an expert from a member state.

TIGs are formed to achieve ENLETS' objectives and support front line policing, crime and public protection as well as procurement-related challenges. Objectives, duration and membership are described in a Project Initiation Document (PID), approved by the ENLETS Core Group.
