Rule of Law Report 2024

- Continued progress, but differences per MS

- Criminal justice and track record- importance proposal for a Directive on combating corruption
- Prevention of corruption, e.g. lobbying, revolving doors, asset and interest declarations
- Eurobarometer surveys for citizens and businesses : 2-3 % improvement



Draft Rules of Procedure

The EU Network Against Corruption brings all stakeholders together to stimulate cooperation and synergies, avoid duplication

Information on all matters of EU relevance

Build anti-corruption policy at EU level

Rules of Procedure for clarity, transparency & integrity

Consultation open until 18 November





Draft Rules of Procedure

Article 2 Mandate and objectives

- 1. The Network aims to unite key stakeholders in the prevention of and fight against corruption in the EU. Its general objective is to enhance cooperation, promote transparency, and foster the exchange of knowledge and good practices in the area of anti-corruption and integrity.
- 2. Specifically, the Network aims to facilitate collaboration among stakeholders by offering a platform for dialogue on common challenges and solutions; develop and disseminate good practices, guidelines, and policies related to anti-corruption efforts and address specific anti-corruption topics based on the evolving needs of the EU and its Member States, supporting the continuous development of anti-corruption policies.





Draft Rules of Procedure

Membership criteria (article 8)

- Proven experience and/or expertise in the prevention of and fight against corruption with a clear relevance for the European Union as a whole or related to cross-border cooperation.
- Applications for membership always open
