"A Genuine, Equal and Passionate Love in The Song of Songs" Rabbi Daniela Szuster

Have you ever read the biblical book of Song of Songs?

If you have not, you will have a great opportunity to read it and learn it for the first time. If you have, you will have a great opportunity to read it again and learn interesting insights about the book.

On Thursday, January 9th, I will start teaching a course about the Song of Songs. The course has five sessions: January 9^{th} , 23^{rd} and 30^{th} and February 6^{th} , 27^{th} , 7:00-8:15 pm,

in person only.

First, we will have an introduction to the book and then we will study it from both a traditional and a feminist perspective. Each class we will have the opportunity to learn and sing a song from the Song of Songs.

The book of Song of Songs is unique, the only one in the Tanach (Hebrew Bible) which consists of love poems. In addition, we can find there a totally different kind of relationship between men and women compared to other books of the Tanach. The language is more like that of a Jewish feminist of our times than a writer from a patriarchal society.

You will be surprised by this beautiful, passionate and treasured book of the Tanach.

No Hebrew or previous knowledge is required.

I hope you can join me in this "lovely" journey.

This past week Erica Bouldin and I went to see the incredible movie *Wicked* by John Chu, which was adapted from the musical. *Wicked* reimagines *The Wizard of Oz* from the perspective of Elphaba. Far from wicked, Elphaba is a moral force who stands against injustice. Yet her green skin marks her as an outsider, an object of fear and derision. In the film, Elphaba is manipulated and tricked by the Wizard (Jeff Goldblum) and Madam Mirabelle (Michelle Yeoh) into casting a spell that inflicts pain on animals. Once Elphaba (Cynthia Erivo) realizes what she did she refuses to help the Wizard in his persecution of talking animals and flees the Wizard's Emerald City. However, the Wizard and his co-conspirator Madam Mirabelle try to discredit her before she can tell the Ozians about the Wizard being responsible for the disappearing animals. Elphaba becomes the scapegoat for all of Oz's troubles, a tragic

figure.

In many ways this mirrors the Jewish experience across millennia. One line from *Wicked* hits particularly hard: "The best way to bring folks together is to give them a real good enemy." When societies falter, they often seek a convenient scapegoat. And more often than not, that scapegoat has been the Jews.

As an example, consider Dr. Dillamond, the kind-hearted goat professor whose voice – literally – is taken away under Oz's anti-Animal policies. His dehumanization is met with indifference, even from his students. "Once they take your voice away, they can do anything to you," he laments. As the police come into the classroom and arrest the goat, the students sit there in shock but in silence. Elphaba, the one branded as the "other" is the only student to question what was happening and to look around and say are we going to sit here and do nothing? Sound familiar? The Wizard's authoritarian propaganda echoes the tactics of Nazi Germany, while the marginalization of animals recalls the dehumanization of Jews. These parallels are not incidental. They are integral, offering a poignant reminder of the stakes of silence in the face of hate.

But why do the Ozians so easily believe the words of the Wizard? As *Wicked* portrays it, it's because the Wizard has built himself up as an omniscient, omnipotent and benevolent being. He lives in the splendor of the Emerald City which parallels the splendor the Wizard has brought to the Ozians. However, he lied about having magic. The booming voice and giant wooden face he uses to talk to Oz obscure the fact that he is actually a pretty physically unimposing, powerless guy.

Similarly, Hitler also carefully crafted his persona, and would practice his speeches to the most minute detail to make sure every part of his performance emulated power. In Nazi Germany, aesthetics was core to conveying the gloriousness of Hitler's regime. Like the Emerald City, Nazis used architecture to symbolize an era of power and strength Hitler claimed to have ushered into the country. In both these cases those who were losing their lives in the process were ignored.

The story of *Wicked* is a lesson against counting people out without having the full story as well as leaders who practice populism over policy. Antisemitism is resurgent, fueled by social media distortions and political opportunism. So, let us take a page from this movie/musical/book. Be bold. Be righteous. Be unyielding in the face of lies. Because if *Wicked* teaches us anything, it is this: silence is complicity. The fight for truth, though lonely, is the only fight worth having.

Synagogue Etiquette for Services in the Sanctuary

Temple Beth Torah Sha'aray Tzedek hopes that by observing the rules of decorum of our congregation you will enjoy worshiping with us. We ask that you conduct yourself in a respectful and modest manner befitting the sanctity of our synagogue.

Dress in the synagogue should reflect the holiness of the sanctuary. We ask that men wear long pants and collared shirt, and women wear modest clothing (no shorts, mini-skirts, mini dresses, sleeveless dresses/tops, or backless dresses/tops.).

Men are requested to wear a kippah at all times, especially in the sanctuary. Jewish men over the age of 13 are asked to wear a tallit upon entering the Sanctuary or chapel during services. Any Jewish man being given an Aliyah or honor on the bimah is expected to wear a tallit. If you need to leave the service at any time, please do not remove your tallit until you have exited the sanctuary.

Women are encouraged to wear a head covering in the sanctuary for services and expected to cover their heads when ascending the bimah. This applies to girls of post Bat Mitzvah age as well. Women are encouraged to wear a tallit on the Bimah.

Smoking, taking photographs, and using electronic equipment including cell phones are prohibited on synagogue premises during Shabbat and Yom Tov.

We request that you do not enter the Sanctuary and/or return to your seat during the following times: When the Ark is open; the Congregation is standing in prayer; the Haftarah is being chanted; and when the Rabbi is speaking. The usher will let you know when you can enter and/or return to your seat.

We thank you in advance for your cooperation and support of these guidelines.

We would like to introduce you to a new payment method TBTST now offers. Venmo is an easy way to remit your payment to TBTST without paying fees. Should you choose this method of payment, here are the instructions to get started.

How to Sign Up and Use Venmo

1. Go to the app store on your Smart Phone, search for Venmo and download the app for Apple or Android (**Ven-mo** does not have a Windows app)

2. Open the Venmo app.

3.Create your account using your name, email address and cell phone number. Create a secure password (between 8 and 32 characters long). A code will be sent to your phone. Enter the code in the Venmo app.

4. Verify your phone number and email address. Add your bank account. Venmo will explain how your bank account will be verified.

NOTE: You can enter a credit card into your Venmo account. **However, Venmo will charge a fee if you pay us using a credit card.** If you use your bank account, there will be **no fee** and it is the same as writing a check.

5. You will want to adjust the Privacy Settings on your app so that no one can see your transactions. Look for the 3 parallel lines in the upper right corner of the app. Touch that to open the main menu. Touch Settings, then touch Privacy. Finally, change the default settings to Private.

6. Once this is done you can start to use your Venmo account to pay TBTST.

7. To make a payment on your app find the **Pay or Request** button on the home page.

The button will either look like this:




or it will look like **a** pencil and **a** square.

8. Type in <u>Venmo@tbtst.org</u> (the "V" in Venmo must be capitalized) in the box that appears. Put in the dollar amount you would like to pay. Please do not forget to fill in the "What's it for?" box so we will know the purpose of your payment. Press the pay button. Look at the bottom of the screen and click Pay Temple Beth Torah Sha'aray Tzedek. You must do this last step, or the transaction will not be completed.

9. Once you have made a payment to TBTST, you will not have to enter the recipient again. Just look at the list of Top People and you should see Temple Beth Torah Sha'aray Tzedek. Click on that and you're ready to pay.



Yahrzeit is a Yiddish word, which literally means "time of year" or memorial. Jews of Ashkenazi descent use this term. Sephardim call this commemoration nahala, in Ladino. This custom is widely observed and based on the Jewish tradition of commemorating the death of a relative.

All the Yahrzeit rituals are deeply ingrained in the Jewish life. The common rituals that are performed in the honorable memory of the departed soul include reciting the Kaddish prayer and lighting a Yahrzeit candle.

Yahrzeit also includes the action of donating charity in memory of a deceased loved one. Through the performance of the mitzvah of tzedakah in the name of the departed, the merit of the deed is shared with the soul of the late relative, as their memory is enhanced.

Yahzreits

One of the most beautiful and meaningful customs of the Jewish people is remembering those we have lost by memorializing our beloved through acts of Tzedakah and by saying Kaddish. The following Yahrzeits will be acknowledged and Kaddish will be said during Shabbat Services on the dates below.

Traditionally, the Hebrew name of the sick person and the Hebrew name of the sick person's mother are mentioned during the prayer. It would be helpful if you would provide us with this information when you make your request.

Prayers for the recovery of the sick are customarily accompanied by a gift to a deserving charity. The merit of this kind deed arouses God's mercy and His powers of healing. Although any amount is deemed appropriate on such an occasion, a gift of CHAI - \$18 - or multiples of 18 - is particularly fitting when pleading for a person's recovery from sickness.

CHAI in Hebrew means life. The two Hebrew letters which constitute the word - CHET and YUD - have the numerical equivalents of eight and ten respectively, together yielding the sum of eighteen.
