The Care Management Coalition of WNY is a collaborative network providing a wide range of human services to individuals and families, while improving access to organizations and systems. Conversation around the creation of the coalition began in 2015, a capital campaign was launched, and the final capital funds were received in 2020. Construction began in March of 2020 allowing for EPIC – Every Person Influences Children, Parent Network of WNY and Mental Health Advocates of WNY to move in October of 2020 while construction was nearing completion. The remaining agencies moved in during February of 2021. Phase 1 of the Capital Campaign is complete; however, additional funding is being pursued in Phase 2 for expansion and accessibility investments. Additionally, funds have been received for operations and programming, as well as to hire staff.
