Dear Majority Leader Schumer, Minority Leader McConnell, Chairman Manchin, and Ranking Member Barrasso:

On behalf of our organizations, the millions of supporters we represent across the country and our city and local partners in the parks and conservation, we write to express our strong support for passage of the EXPLORE Act this Congress. The EXPLORE Act will expand recreational opportunities across the country and enable more Americans to experience the benefits of green space and parks.

The EXPLORE Act includes the Outdoors for All Act which codifies the Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program (ORLP) and will provide much needed access to close to home recreation in parkpoor neighborhoods. ORLP, established in 2014, and administered by the National Park Service, provides grants to cities for park projects in underserved communities. Through direct grants, the program aids communities with little or no access to outdoor recreation spaces. Funds can be used for the acquisition or development of public outdoor recreation spaces and facilities. Parks and green space play an essential role in our communities by fostering better physical and mental health, increased workforce development opportunities, local economic growth, a more resilient environment, and community cohesion. Despite the profound and widespread benefits that parks and outdoor recreation offer, they are chronically underfunded with many systems facing a significant backlog of capital improvement projects.

In September, The National Park Service (NPS) announced the single largest ORLP grant round ever: \$254.68 million for 54 projects in 24 states for the redevelopment or creation of much-needed new local parks. The EXPLORE Act will further this progress, and we're closer than ever to ensuring access to parks and green spaces for everyone, regardless of zip code.

Passing the EXPLORE Act this Congress would help ensure that all everyone can reap the benefits of parks and recreational opportunities. We urge you to prioritize this legislation and pass it into law. Thank you for your consideration.
