To all sons and their family, I hope this finds everyone in great health. This was a great year with the SAL. We got a lot done and everyone worked well together.

It is hard to believe it already has been 50 years since the US Military left Nam. I guess I am older than I think. As I look back and remember it and the Soldiers that never made it back home to have a life, I realize I was very lucky. Freedom is great but not free. Here is a reminder of what happened 50 years ago. On January 27<sup>th</sup>,1973 the United States and the other three official combatants of the Vietnam War signed the Paris Peace Accord, providing for the withdrawal of U.S. forces within 60 days, and the implementation of a ceasefire with South Vietnam. On March 29<sup>th</sup>, 1973 United States Combat Forces ceased operations and left Vietnam, coinciding with the release of all remaining POWs from North Vietnamese prison camps. The Ceasefire would not hold, and Saigon ultimately fell to the People's Army of Vietnam and the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam on April 30<sup>th</sup>,1975.

In 2008, President George W. Bush signed the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008, of which Section 598 provided that the Department of Defense conduct a program to commemorate the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Vietnam War. Subsequently, President Obama, President Trump, and President Biden have all reinforced the commitment of our nation to pay tribute to and honor the memory of all who served during the Vietnam era.

#### **Attack on Pearl Harbor**

On Sunday morning, December 7, 1941, the Imperial Japanese Navy Air Service attacked the neutral United States at Naval Station Pearl Harbor near Honolulu, Hawaii, killing 2,403 Americans and injuring 1,178 others. The attack sank four U.S. Navy battleships and damaged four others. It also damaged three cruisers, three destroyers, and one minelayer. Aircraft losses were 188 destroyed and 159 damaged.

#### **Aftermath**

Canada declared war on Japan within hours of the attack on Pearl Harbor, the first Western nation to do so. On December 8, the United States declared war on Japan and entered World War II on the side of the Allies. In a speech to Congress, President Franklin D. Roosevelt called the bombing of Pearl Harbor "a date which will live in infamy."

#### **Pearl Harbor Tributes**

In 1990, leading up to the 50th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, Congress established the Pearl Harbor Commemorative Medal. This is also known as the Pearl Harbor Survivor's medal and was awarded to anyone who was in the U.S. Armed Forces and who was present in Hawaii on December 7, 1941, and participated in combat operations that day against the attack. The medal was also awarded to civilians who were killed or injured in the attack. A few years later, Congress amended the law to allow any person who was present in Hawaii on December 7, 1941, and was involved in combat operations against Japanese military forces attacking Hawaii, to receive the award. In both instances, there was a limited time period to apply for the award, and it is no longer issued.
