### Visit Macon 2023 Highlights

#### **ECONOMIC IMPACT**

- Record hotel-motel tax collections in 2022 exceeding \$6 million for the first time
- Over \$6 million in sales tax revenue was generated for Macon-Bibb County
- \$448.8 million in total visitor spending up 21.7% in 2022
- Visitor spending has increased by over \$53 million since 2018
- Visitors generated \$34.4 million in state and local taxes in 2022
- \$585 in tax savings for every Macon-Bibb household due to visitor spending
